WORK SUMMARY

The task of the Joint Standing Committee on Planning and Arrangements is to arrange for the meeting of the next General Convention and to propose an agenda which the Convention may accept or reject, with or without amendments. The Committee also investigates sites for future meetings of the General Convention and makes recommendations to the General Convention.

The full committee held its first meeting in Minneapolis, Minnesota on January 10th and 11th of 2001. The first order of business was a tour of the Minneapolis Convention Center, site of the 74th General Convention. The group then reviewed learnings from the 73rd General Convention around orientation, worship, facilities, secretariats, legislative process, communications, exhibits, and related events. All of these areas were examined for applicability towards making the 74th General Convention even better than the 73rd. An initial draft calendar was distributed.

Looking forward to the 75th General Convention, Lori Ionnitiu reported that the sites for 2006 had been narrowed to Baltimore, MD, Charlotte, NC, Columbus, OH, and San Antonio, TX. The Executive Committee agreed to travel to these sites in May of 2002.

The second meeting took place in San Antonio, Texas on February 21, 2002. The theme of the 74th General Convention was discussed in terms of "new confidence" expressing itself in an outward-looking stance toward the world, which one might capture in the word "mission." The ECW reported that their theme will be "A New Light is Shining." The calendar was reviewed again, and further refined.

Columbus and Charlotte were selected as primary possibilities for the 75th General Convention, with Baltimore as a back-up if Charlotte were to fall through for any reason. In May, site visits were conducted, and the visiting group voted to recommend Columbus because of the configuration of the Convention Center, its technology infrastructure, and the 50% break in the price which was offered for the Convention Center. This recommendation was then forwarded to the Provincial Presidents and the Executive Council, with the proposed dates of June 12-21, 2006.

The third meeting of the full committee was conducted via conference call. The draft GC Calendar was again reviewed and refined. The theme for General Convention, "Engage God's Mission," was discussed. It was agreed that the ECW schedule would be added as a link on the ECUSA website.

Columbus has been approved by the Provincial Presidents and the Executive Council, and a resolution will be presented to Convention for final approval.

The site selection process for the 76th General Convention has begun. The group agreed to propose that the 76th Convention be nine days in length. The sites proposed for 2009 include Salt Lake City, UT; Reno, NV, Portland, OR, Charlotte, NC and Anaheim, CA.
