Episcopal Church in the United States of America, meeting in Minneapolis, Minnesota, September 11, through September 23, 1976, strongly supports the continuance of financial support through the budget at no less than the present level and, if possible, at an increased level, to Voorhees College, Denmark, South Carolina; St. Augustine's College, Raleigh, North Carolina; and St. Paul's College, Lawrenceville, Virginia; and be it further

Resolved, that financial support of these institutions be recognized as an important part of the ongoing missionary and educational work of the Church.

Resolution adopted (Communicated to the House of Bishops in HD Message #38)

House of Bishops

On the Sixth Day, the Bishop Suffragan of New York, Chairman of the Committee on Education, moved concurrence with the House of Deputies Message #38 (B-117, Financial Support for Certain Black Colleges).

The Bishop of Western Kansas moved the following amendment to (B-117): that the words "at no less than the present level" be deleted.

The amendment was seconded by the Bishop of Pittsburgh.
