## MINUTES.

---

The eleventh annual meeting of the Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, was held in S. Paul's church, Troy, on Wednesday, May 9, 1894. At 10:30 the Holy Communion was celebrated by the bishop, assisted by Rev. Dr. Enos. The rector's welcome followed, which was heartily and unreservedly extended to the Auxiliary as co-workers in the bonds of Jesus Christ. Rev. Dr. Enos then introduced the Ven. Archdeacon Crook, of Salt Lake City, who spoke earnestly in behalf of the Indians so far removed from any Christian influence.

Mrs Brierly, of Cape Mount, Africa, in a short address, with touching pathos, beautifully described that country; its hills and lakes, its acres of palm trees and the difficulties to be overcome in settling. She pleaded for special gifts, for schools and teachers, to help those who are striving with all the self-denial that they can learn, to help themselves.

Bishop Doane added that a medical missionary would go with Mrs Brierly to Cape Mount.

Rev. W. Ball-Wright, of Rouse's Point, next gave interesting experiences of his journeyings and sojourns in China and Japan.

The address of the bishop of the diocese was intensely earnest, reminding us that "when the *ends* of the earth *meet*, these many-tongued mortals meet in the one tongue of Christianity, representing the 'oneness' of our work."

The officers of the past year were re-appointed by the bishop, with the addition of Mrs C. H. Disbrow, of Cohoes, as junior auxiliary secretary. He announced that the last payment had been made for the Church Missions House in New York.

Contributions for missions showed a slight increase, no one had been cut off. He acknowledged the help of the Woman's Auxiliary in all this, and pleaded that this out-reaching spirit might continue.

At 1:15 P. M., luncheon was generously and elegantly served in the rooms of the Young Woman's Association building, Second street.

At 2:30 the business meeting was called to order. Twenty-four parishes, represented by 139 delegates, responded to the roll call, while about 200 members were present at the services and luncheon.

The reading of the minutes was waived.

The address of the president, Mrs Dewey, ably evinced her usual strong, clear and comprehensive interest in all the work of the Auxiliary.

Pledges were next in order. The bishop recommended that Diocesan Missions be included.

The report of the corresponding secretary was read and accepted. She regretted the small number of women workers in proportion to the 20,000 communicants of the diocese.

The treasurer, Mrs. Fine, read her report, which, with the auditor's statement, was accepted.

The reports of the managers were read and accepted.

Miss Burt, correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, reported some increase of contributions. Added: New Branch, Glens Falls; Jun. Aux., Hoosick Falls. The report was accepted.

The Diocesan Buying Committee had no special report.

In the absence of both vice-presidents, Mrs Charles Patterson was called to the chair, while Mrs Dewey, chairman of the Diocesan Lending Library, made her report, which, with that of the treasurer, Miss Boyd, was accepted.

It was voted that bills for membership fees be sent to branches whose dues remained unpaid to first of April each year.

A motion to appropriate \$250 for current expenses was carried.

It was announced that constitutions can be obtained by application to Miss Lacy, corresponding secretary.

Mrs Byington desired to have the members consider the question of postage paid for the work of the Church Periodical Club. If a parish branch pays any considerable sum for postage, can such amount be entered in the annual report of Auxiliary work? Answered in the affirmative.

It was suggested by the president that as there was now a separate organization for the Junior Auxiliary, it might be wise to print extra copies of their report for special distribution. Referred to the executive committee.

There was also referred to the same committee the question: shall the fund for materials for junior societies be included with that for small parishes, and what proportion shall be given to the Juniors?

The president asked for an expression of opinion as to the proper valuation of the contents of missionary boxes sent to schools and hospitals. It was suggested by a manager that the lowest market price be fixed. Another manager thought a fair valuation might be reached by doubling the cost of the materials. It was decided to refer the matter to Miss Emery.

An invitation was accepted to hold the next annual meeting at S. Peter's church, Albany, the second week in May, 1895.

A rising vote of thanks was extended to the speakers; also to the rector and members of S. Paul's church, Troy, for their hospitality.

The meeting adjourned after prayers and benediction by the Rev. Dr. Enos.

## PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

In entering to-day our second decade as a diocesan branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, we need most carefully to study the mistakes and failures of the past in their relation to the opportunities of the future. There is no danger more fatal to our progress than a spirit of satisfaction with what has been accomplished. Only the highest standards can result in excellence of work.

As yet we have branches in scarcely more than one-third of our parishes, not counting the eighty or more missions, and too many of these branches are content to do a little work without any vital interest or enthusiasm in the history, growth and development of this power which is aiming to evangelize the world.

While there has been marked improvement in organization and business-like methods in our work there is still very much to be desired in this direction. Parish officers are constantly changing and all do not understand or remember that they should write to the diocesan corresponding secretary for work and all general information; that all money, pledges and membership fees should be sent to the diocesan treasurer; that materials are furnished by the diocesan buying committee; addresses for magazines are supplied by the correspondent of the Church periodical club; and that the junior auxiliaries now have a diocesan secretary.

A colored mission in the south received in one year over 120 boxes valued at more than \$5,000 and did not even know what to do with many things which had been sent, not because really needed, but because the material was cheap and the garments easily made. Some schools and missions are supplied for five or six years ahead with articles for which others are really suffering, and the only way to avoid this unequal distribution is for Miss Emery at the central office to guide the intelligent co-operation of diocesan secretaries who must in turn know what their parish branches are doing.

Most women have little or no experience in book-keeping and bank accounts and so do not realize that it makes any difference whether their branches send money direct to the missionary, to Miss Emery, to the diocesan corresponding secretary or any other officer as chance may dictate. If sent to the missionary it cannot be acknowledged in the *Spirit of Missions* or reported by our treasurer, or in Miss Emery's annual report. If sent direct to Miss Emery or to any diocesan officer except the treasurer, about double the number of letters are required to straighten out the complications that arise. The rule is invariable that all money contributed by the Woman's Auxiliary for mission work, should pass thru the hands of the diocesan treasurer.

Then there is great delay in paying pledges and in sending in reports of money and boxes for the year. The first of May is the latest date which will enable the officers to have their reports in suitable condition for the annual meeting and printed report. Yet branches wait till the last moment, even the hour of meeting, and then are disappointed because an auditor who must do his work some days before, cannot include their gifts.

A list of pledges recommended for the year is given on each program and printed in the minutes of the annual report. Branches desiring to aid other objects than those named need only to designate their gifts as "specials," but it has sometimes happened that objects of several years past are named which no longer exist as needs. Occasionally a branch omits to keep any record of pledges made, a report has not been preserved and it is necessary to write and find out at the last moment, what has been promised.

Less than one half of our branches remember the annual membership fee of one dollar, or more as they feel inclined, which supplies them with annual reports, copies of constitutions, and pays for printing, postage, speakers, and all incidental expenses of the diocesan branch. It can scarcely be a burden to any but should it seem to take from their fund for boxes, the diocesan buying committee stands ready to double any sum they may send for materials, to the limit of \$10.

It has been suggested that annual due bills be mailed to all branches which have paid no fee by the first of April each year, as it is usually simply an omission of memory. In some cases the contingent fund for Miss Emery has been confused with our current expenses.

Leaflets which will make clear the duties of each parish and diocesan officer, and their relations to each other, would be valuable and would save the repetition in our annual reports each year, of much that is necessary for new branches and officers, but is wearisome to those already familiar with the details of our work. These leaflets might be combined in a small hand book of postal card size, which would be practically a little guide book for more efficient administration.

The aim of the diocesan branch is to aid each individual parish, in every possible way, to do its most efficient work and to grow in knowledge and interest for the cause of missions; and none need fear that parish work will be less, at home, because sympathies are broad enough to remember the needs of others. The power of doing good is increased in proportion to the use which is made of it.

#### OFFICERS

Since the last report was printed there has been but one change in the list of our efficient officers. The resignation of Mrs Wm. S. Wheeler, of Ballston Spa, who has met with us but once as manager for Warren, Essex and Clinton counties, was received with regret. We welcome in her place to-day, Mrs. Wm. Ball Wright, of Rouse's Point, who has had a large experience in mission work in Japan and other fields.

We miss from our number to-day one who has been a constant attendant at all diocesan meetings ever since the branch at Hoosick Falls was organized. Mrs. Silliman was deeply interested in the work of the Auxiliary, and as no good influence is ever lost, we carry on with us the spirit of her devotion.

## MEETINGS

At the invitation of the Archdeaconry of Albany the Woman's Auxiliary met with them in joint session at Christ church, Hudson, on Tuesday, Jan. 16. Though the attendance was small it was felt by those present that the interests of the Archdeaconry and Auxiliary are largely identical and that with a wider understanding of the purpose and aim of these meetings we may hope for a larger attendance and increased interest and activity in both parish and mission work. Now that we have semi-annual diocesan meetings, it is very desirable that there should be one such joint session every year in each Archdeaconry. Such arrangements as are necessary on the part of the Auxiliary would be entirely in the charge of the managers, who are virtually the chairmen, or presidents, of their Archdeaconries.

Personal acquaintance and interchange of thought is always valuable in such work as ours, while interesting papers and addresses from missionaries give a healthful stimulus.

## PLEDGES

Our encouraging growth in numbers and amounts given, renders it almost impossible to take pledges in the old verbal way. The plan tried to-day is only tentative and suggestions as to improved methods will be gladly received. These annual meetings should be times for gaining information, interest and inspiration for our work, that we may carry away that spirit of unselfish devotion which gives true dignity to any labor of love. "It is only the most pitiable of heart poverty that feels as if it could do nothing to add to the happiness of other lives, and does not even care to make the attempt. And where no love is given, the life shrivels and narrows until none can be received. \* \* \* God never gives us anything for our individual self alone. The divineness of His gifts is proved by our desire to share them with others."

Phillips Brooks said: "To be at work, to do things for the world, to turn the currents of things about us at our will, to make our existence a positive element, even though it be no

bigger than a grain of sand in this great system where we live—that is a new joy of which the idle man knows no more than the mole knows of sunshine, or the serpent of the eagle's triumphant flight into the upper air. The man who knows, indeed, what it is to act, to work, cries out: 'This alone is to live'."

Working in this spirit we shall feel no need of reward, recognition or approval of man.

There is an ancient legend of a saint, so good that the angels asked the Lord to grant him the gift of miracles. He was offered in turn the power to heal the sick, to convert guilty souls, to become a model of patience and virtue, but declined all. When told that he must choose a miracle or one would be forced upon him, he said: "That I may do a great deal of good without ever knowing it." After great perplexity the angels planned that every time the saint's shadow should fall behind him or at either side, so that he could not see it, it should have the power to cure disease, soothe pain and comfort sorrow. And so it came to pass, but the saint simply went about his daily life, diffusing virtue as the star diffuses light and the flower perfume, without ever being aware of it. We receive that we may give and with what measure we meet, it shall be measured to us again.

## REPORT OF DIOCESAN CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

The record of work accomplished during the past year is, perhaps, as satisfactory as could have been expected considering the financial crisis. Some few parishes have failed to make a report, in others there has been greater interest manifested than last year, and as a consequence a large increase in the total amount of work reported.

Forty-eight societies, including parish guilds, have prepared 90 boxes valued at \$4691.72, to which amount must be added \$1444.73 given for diocesan expenses, pledges and other offerings, making a total for money and boxes of \$6756.45. As compared with last year there is a decrease in the total values amounting to \$1067.61.

Again an appeal is made for more careful attention to the details of the business of the Auxiliary. Every item should be given its proper place, especially those items which are supplied by the treasurer of the parish branch. It is not sufficient to enter a sum of money in its column and then omit to state the purpose to which it was applied. Thus it comes that the money expended for materials is again entered as money given, and unless the managers' blank can be had for reference there is a probability of inaccurate returns.

From April 19th, 1893, to May 1st, 1894, 231 letters and postals have been written by the corresponding secretary.

A manager asks what "given in pledges" means? and adds, "I think many parishes report what is taken in from the members during the year, most of which is spent on boxes." It would seem that only money given towards the pledges suggested at the annual meeting should be entered as "given in pledges"; the expression was not intended to include the pledges of individuals made weekly or monthly.

The managers' reports indicate that there are 1228 "active members" of the Woman's Auxiliary in the diocese. By "active members" is understood those who give their time,

contribute their money, or give both time and money. In comparing these figures with the communicants reported as numbering 20,000, and remembering that at least one-half of this number must be women, very much remains to be done to arouse interest in this work of the Church.

## REPORT OF JUNIOR AUXILIARY SECRETARY

This year 19 branches have reported, and of this number three were organized during the winter. Several others have expended their money and energy in charitable work in their own towns or cities. The totals for the year indicate a slight increase in the value of the work accomplished, \$985.14 having been reported; last year the total amount was \$960.30.

Seventy letters have been written by the junior secretary since last September, the greater number accompanied the blanks sent for this report.

In this first year of a diocesan representative in the junior work perhaps it may be looking for too much to expect the junior secretaries to apply to their own officer, but it would be a great convenience and saving of time if this were done.

It is suggested that much work for Christmas boxes might be done by children in country parishes during the long summer vacation.

Many children's papers, magazines and books now lying idle, might be made to do much good by having junior branches of the Church Periodical Club, with a librarian in each parish.

There may be societies of young people doing missionary work which are unknown to the secretary, but the number reporting is small in our diocese. They are asked to make themselves known, and all officers of junior branches are urged to attend the annual meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary that they may keep themselves informed in this great work and thoroughly embued with the true spirit of missions.

## DIOCESAN BUYING COMMITTEE

## STATEMENT.

Materials have been supplied to three parishes from the fund pledged for this purpose. Two of the number were parishes where there were only junior branches, and to encourage these young members of the Auxiliary, it was thought wise to increase the sum they were able to forward to the treasurer, by adding to the amount sufficient to cover the cost of their work, to the limit of \$10. In both instances the result was satisfactory.

It is suggested that for the coming year the junior societies inform themselves with regard to the help that is offered to them through this committee.

Materials have been purchased for two branches in the Archdeaconry of Troy, one giving \$2.50, which was doubled; the other, a junior society, sending \$4, and to this amount \$10 were added. In the Archdeaconry of Ogdensburg a junior branch has been supplied with materials valued at \$8.62.

The Albany and Susquehanna Archdeaconries have nothing to report.

Last year one pledge of \$5 was paid to the treasurer, and with the balance on hand of \$57.50, the fund amounted to \$62.50. There was expended for the year's work, \$20.62. Total value of materials supplied, \$27.62. A balance remains in the treasury of \$41.88.

REPORT OF THE CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB  
DIOCESE OF ALBANY

At the close of a year whose keynote has been retrenchment, it is with devout thankfulness that the C. P. C. of the diocese of Albany reports an increase in every line of its contributions. A branch formed in the Church of the Messiah, Glens Falls last May, is doing excellent work under the leadership of an active librarian, and is the only new one to be reported. The librarians now number 13, representing the parishes named in the tabulated statement.

The Junior Aux. of S. Mark's, Hoosick Falls, sets an example which might well be followed by others, for it not only makes the gathering up and sending away of periodicals a special department of its work, but has this year paid postage to the amount of \$16.

From missionaries, lay workers, church schools, mission Sunday schools, soldiers, sailors, and those in isolated homes, far from church and church influence, there still come words of gratitude, not alone for the helpful literature received, but also for this sign of *remembrance*, the fruit of that spirit of love which binds together in one family, the members, however scattered, of the Holy Catholic Church.

The C. P. C. has not yet reached the limit of its influence as a power in missionary work. Its greater possibilities are suggested in the following extract from the annual report:—"In many of our jails no work of any kind is furnished, and enforced idleness to those with guilty consciences or saddened hearts, generally, if long continued, eventuates in insanity. Thus we see that the C. P. C. can keep people from the mad-house, if not from prison. Perhaps the latter is not impossible if we can occupy the ground early enough. A clergyman connected with such work says 'cards are thrown aside when books and papers are furnished.' He asks us to adopt the alms-houses—indeed it would appear that we could, with beneficial results, adopt one half of the world if the other half would assist us by contributions."

## DIOCESAN CONSTITUTION

## NAME

1. This association shall be called the Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

## OBJECT

2. Its object shall be, by united and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women, to unite previously existing parochial societies in a common interest, and to encourage the formation of new parish branches for missionary work.

## DIOCESAN MEMBERSHIP

3. Any woman may become a member by paying an annual fee of \$1.00 to the diocesan Treasurer. Any person may become a sustaining member by paying \$5.00 annually, and a life member by a single payment of \$25.00.

All members of parish branches shall be invited to the general meetings but only regularly elected delegates and diocesan members shall be entitled to vote.\*

## OFFICERS

4. The officers of this Diocesan Branch shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer, all to be appointed by the Bishop at each annual meeting, to serve for one year, or till their successors are appointed. These officers, with two Managers from each Archdeaconry, chosen by the Archdeacon and approved by the Bishop, shall constitute the Executive Board.

5. The **President**, or in her absence a **Vice-President**, shall call and preside over all meetings.

6. The **Recording Secretary** shall keep a correct copy of the Corresponding Secretary's list of diocesan addresses;

shall give notice of all diocesan meetings and record all their proceedings; and shall notify officers and members of any action requiring their attention.

7. The **Corresponding Secretary** shall keep a correct list of all diocesan officers, members, parish secretaries and clergymen in the diocese, with addresses; shall conduct the correspondence of the Diocesan Branch, specially with missionaries, the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, the diocesan officers and parish secretaries; and shall prepare for printing an annual report of the work in the diocese.

8. The **Treasurer** shall have the custody of all money belonging to the Diocesan Branch; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements, with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report of the same at each regular meeting; she shall pay out money only as voted by the Diocesan Branch or Executive Board, except that money received for a definite purpose may be paid for that purpose without a formal vote. All money given for purposes outside this diocese shall be forwarded through the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Bishop shall annually appoint an Auditor, who shall examine the accounts of the Treasurer, and report the result to the annual meeting.

9. Managers may call and preside over meetings in their own Archdeaconries, and shall try to increase a missionary spirit by rousing the Branches to greater efforts, by diffusing intelligence concerning past and present missionary work of the Church, and by stimulating the formation of new parish branches.

If practicable, each parish shall be visited and at least one general meeting shall be held annually in each Archdeaconry. Each Manager shall make to the diocesan annual meeting a written report of the work of the past year in her Archdeaconry.

#### PARISH BRANCHES

10. Any parish society shall be recorded as a member of this Diocesan Branch when its written application has been approved by the President, and the annual membership fee of

from \$1.00 to \$10.00 has been paid to the diocesan Treasurer. The officers of parish branches shall correspond with the diocesan officers, and shall send to the Treasurer all membership fees, pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes, and shall report to the Corresponding Secretary before May 1 each year, all work done, with value of boxes and money given.

Every parish branch shall be entitled to send delegates and to have one vote as a branch in the diocesan meetings.

#### MEETINGS

11. There shall be semi-annual diocesan meetings the second Wednesday in May and in October at a place fixed by the Executive Board, who may also for sufficient cause change the time. The May meeting shall be the annual meeting, for appointment of officers and receipt of annual reports.

12. **Special meetings** shall be called by the President on the request of five of the Executive Board.

13. **Notice** of all meetings shall be sent to every officer and parish branch, to be read in church the Sunday before each meeting.

14. A **quorum** for the transaction of business shall consist of the members present at any meeting regularly called.

#### AMENDMENTS

15. This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for the meeting.
