CONSTITUTION

I. NAME

This organization of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be known as the Albany Diocesan Branch.

II. OBJECT

The object of this Branch shall be, by united and systematic effort, to organize the women of the diocese in support of the missionary work of the church. In furtherance of this there shall be maintained:

- (a) A storage house as an emporium for the sale of goods at cost prices to accredited missionaries, and to parish branches for such purposes as come under the Board of Missions, this method insuring lowest rates on materials and goods of all kinds in the interest of missionary work.
- (b) A diocesan lending library to provide books on missions and mission fields, as well as those on subjects conducive to intellectual growth along spiritual lines, which may be used by the clergy and women of the church.
- (c) A department in the periodical newspaper of the diocese, which shall be devoted to the interests of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (d) A branch of the church periodical club for the distribution of religious and secular literature to missionaries.

III. MEMBERSHIP

Any woman may become a member by paying an annual fee of \$1.00 to the diocesan treasurer. Any person may become a sustaining member by paying \$5.00 annually, and a life member by a single payment of \$25.00.

All members of parish branches shall be invited to the general meetings, but only regularly elected delegates and diocesan members shall be entitled to vote.

Any parish society shall be recorded as a member of this

Diocesan Branch when its written application has been approved by the president, and the annual membership fee of from \$1.00 to \$10.00 has been paid to the diocesan treasurer. The officers of parish branches shall correspond with the diocesan officers, and shall send to the treasurer all membership fees, pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes, and shall report to the corresponding secretary before May 1, each year, all work done, with value of boxes and money given.

Every parish branch shall be entitled to send delegates and to have one vote as a branch in the diocesan meetings.

IV. OFFICERS

The officers of this Diocesan branch shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer, all to be appointed by the bishop at each annual meeting, to serve one year, or until their successors are appointed. These officers, with two managers from each archdeaconry, chosen by the archdeacon and approved by the bishop, together with the chairman of standing committee, shall constitute the executive committee.

1. The president, or in her absence the vice-president, shall call and preside over all meetings.
2. The recording secretary shall keep a correct copy of the corresponding secretary's list of diocesan addresses, shall keep minutes of all branch meetings and of the executive committee.
3. The corresponding secretary shall keep a correct list with addresses of all diocesan officers, members, parish secretaries and clergymen in the diocese; shall send out all notices of meetings; shall conduct the correspondence of the diocesan branch; shall make an annual report, and shall be responsible for issuing the annual report of the branch.
4. The treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the diocesan branch, and shall collect, by correspondence if necessary, all sums payable to the same; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report of the same at each regular meeting; she shall pay out money only as directed by the diocesan branch, or executive committee, except moneys received

for a definite purpose, said moneys to be disposed without formal directions. All money received for purposes outside the diocese shall be forwarded through the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Bishop shall annually appoint an auditor who shall examine the accounts of the treasurer before they are presented at the annual meeting.

V. MANAGERS

Managers shall call and preside over meetings in their own archdeaconries; shall stimulate the formation of new parish branches; shall strive to infuse greater missionary spirit into all the branches, and shall seek to increase intelligent interest in the missionary work of the church.

To this end each parish branch should be visited by its manager and at least one general meeting be held during the year in each archdeaconry.

Each manager shall present a written report of her work for the year at the annual meeting of the diocesan branch.

VI. MEETINGS

There shall be semi-annual diocesan meetings the second Wednesday in May and in October, at a place fixed by the executive committee, who may also, for sufficient cause, change the time. The May meeting shall be the annual meeting for appointment of officers and receipt of annual report.

Special meetings shall be called by the president on the request of five of the executive committee. Notice of all meetings shall be sent to every officer and parish branch to be read in church the Sunday before each meeting. A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of the members present at any meeting regularly called.

VII. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for this meeting.

Constitutions recommended for parish branches and junior auxiliaries can be had on application to the corresponding and junior auxiliary secretaries.

MINUTES

Minutes of the 13th annual meeting, held in St. John's Church, Troy, Wednesday, May 13, 1896.

10:30 A. M.—Address of the Rector, Rev. H. R. Freeman; followed by the celebration of the Holy Communion, in which Rev. E. M. Babcock, Rector of Holy Cross, Troy, assisted Mr. Freeman.

12:00 M.—Business meeting, the President in the chair.

The roll-call showed thirty-four parishes to be represented by 182 delegates.

Report of the corresponding secretary, Miss Lacy. Adopted.

Report of the junior auxiliary secretary, Miss Gray. Adopted.

Report of the treasurer, Mrs. Palmer. Adopted.

Report of the manager of the first division of the Albany archdeaconry, Mrs. Miller. Adopted.

Report of the manager of the second division of the Albany archdeaconry, Mrs. Van Nostrand. Adopted.

No reports of the work of the first and second divisions of the Troy archdeaconry.

Archdeaconry report of the manager of the first division of the Susquehanna, Miss Hughes. Adopted.

Report of the manager of the second division of the Susquehanna archdeaconry, Miss North. Adopted.

First and second divisions of the Ogdensburg archdeaconry. No reports.

Encouraging report of the correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, Miss Burt. Adopted.

The diocesan buying committee made no report.

Report of the diocesan lending library, Mrs. Dewey, chairman. Adopted.

At the request of the president the report of the storage-house committee was made by its chairman, Mrs. Byington. A full expo-

sition of the plan was given and the success which had attended its inception and development was evidenced by the financial statistics and letters read. The report was unanimously adopted.

1:30 P. M. Adjournment for lunch.

2:30 P. M.—Business meeting resumed; the president in the chair.

Explanation of the sewing credit by the chairman of the storage-house committee.

Pledges taken.

Description of the general work being done in each field for which pledges were asked, given by Miss Emery.

Pledges satisfactorily filled.

Special fields recommended for the junior branches by Miss Emery were those under Dr. Glenton, of Alaska, Miss MacRae, in China, and Miss Sabin in Alaska.

It was voted to pay from the current expense fund the balance to make up the pledge for the fund for materials.

Appeal from Rev. Mr. Pendleton for the salary of the diocesan missionary and the lay missionary for deaf mutes

Address by Miss Emery. Vote of thanks to the rector and ladies of St. John's church for their hospitality; also one to Miss Emery for her address.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Freeman.

Meeting Adjourned.

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING

Minutes of the semi-annual meeting held in Christ church, Hudson, Friday, October 23, 1896.

10:30 A. M. Celebration of the holy communion by the rectors of Christ church, Hudson, and Grace church, Albany.

Address of welcome by the rector of Christ church in behalf of himself and the rector of All Saints'.

11:30 A. M. Business meeting—the president in the chair.

The roll call showed that twenty-four parishes were represented by eighty-seven delegates and eight clergy.

Announcement of the resignations of Miss Purdy, Miss Lacy and Miss Cusack, and the appointment of Mrs. Louis H. Baker as recording secretary, Mrs. Emma Gibbons Hicks as corresponding secretary and Miss Pauline Wilson as Storage House secretary.

Reading of the minutes of the thirteenth annual meeting. Minutes approved.

Report of the corresponding secretary. Adopted.

No report from the junior secretary.

Report of the treasurer. Adopted.

No reports from the managers.

Report of the chairman of the church periodical club. Adopted.

No report from the lending library.

Report of the editor of the Woman's Auxiliary department in "The Diocese of Albany." Adopted.

Report of the chairman of the storage house committee. Adopted.

Report of the executive committee—Mrs. Van Nostrand in the chair.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the report of the executive committee be adopted.

Report of committee on the revision of the constitution.

It was moved and seconded that these amendments be adopted as a whole.

A motion was then moved, seconded and carried that an adjournment be made until two o'clock.

An enjoyable luncheon was then served, after which the meeting reassembled, the president in the chair.

The motion to adopt the amendments to the constitution as a whole was withdrawn with the consent of the seconder.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the amendments be considered one by one and that the vote on the amendment concerning membership and voting privileges be postponed until the annual meeting next May.

Each amendment, with the exception of that upon membership and voting privileges, was then considered, and adopted by vote.

The amendment, whose consideration was postponed to the annual meeting, is as follows:

1st. (a) The payment of one dollar annually shall constitute membership.

(b) The payment of five dollars annually shall constitute sustaining membership, with the right to vote, and include the annual report, all leaflets issued by the executive committee, and the periodical newspaper of the diocese.

(c) The single payment of twenty-five dollars shall constitute a life membership.

2d. The written application of a parish organization, approved by the president, shall constitute said parish a branch of the diocesan organization, the annual membership fee to be from one to ten dollars, as agreed upon later by the diocesan executive committee and the parish branch, and entitling said branch *pro-rata* to delegates, with voting privileges, at diocesan meetings.

Mrs. Pell-Clarke made some interesting remarks upon work in southern Florida.

A motion was made that a vote of thanks be offered the rectors of Christ church and All Saints', for their kindly entertainment of the auxiliary. Carried.

Adjournment of business meeting.

After the adjournment of the business meeting a missionary session was opened by a short service, followed by an address by Bishop Doane, who concluded by introducing Bishop Garrett, of Texas, for whose work a pledge of \$100 was offered, through the president and the bishop.

Adjournment of the missionary meeting.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

To the Women of the Auxiliary :

A careful study of the records of last year's work shows a marked increase in the scope and efficiency of the work of our diocesan branch, to which in detail I feel it my duty to call your attention.

The books of the storage-house show a saving of more than one thousand dollars to those branches and missionaries who have availed themselves of its privileges this year, that is to say, without the advantages offered by the storage-house it would have cost those branches and missionaries a thousand dollars more to have made the same purchases.

The increase in the total value of boxes sent by all affiliated branches of the auxiliary in this diocese, both those working through the storage-house and those working independently, has been about eleven hundred dollars.

The approximate correspondence of these totals strongly suggests, that with only a slight increase of work on the part of the parish branches, they have been enabled by the existence of the storage-house to add several hundred dollars to the value of their gifts.

It should not, however, be forgotten that a thousand dollars many times multiplied, would be inadequate compensation for the devoted labors of the members of the storage-house committee.

This organization having been officially recognized and established, by amendment to the constitution, is now an assured fact and on a firm footing.

In cash the diocesan branch has given about three hundred dollars more than last year, and has besides in the bank belonging to its several departments, a balance of over two hundred dollars.

It will be seen from this statement that there has been a total

increase of about sixteen hundred dollars in boxes and money combined.

Another department of auxiliary work which has been recognized and developed this year is the Diocesan Lending Library. The plan of work prepared by The Very Rev. W. L. Robbins, chairman, will be explained by him at the annual meeting. Most members of our auxiliary have been conscious of a lack of spiritual insight into missionary work and intellectual comprehension of it. The plan of the chairman is designed to meet this need.

The monthly department in "The Diocese of Albany" and the Albany branch of the "Church Periodical Club" have continued to grow in efficiency and value.

The income of the diocesan branch has been materially increased by the accession of individual members. It is, however, highly important that all women in the diocese should feel the personal responsibility of becoming voting members, whether annual or sustaining, since from the fund raised by their membership fees must be paid henceforth the administration expenses of the diocesan branch and its several departments and all our gifts to diocesan objects.

The meetings of the executive board, held throughout the winter, have been full of interest and inspiration, and the responsibility and the praise for the winter's work rests with the members of that board.

In the list of pledges prepared for members to fill at the annual meeting, no diocesan or administrative objects are included, but work in every missionary jurisdiction of our church, both foreign and domestic, is listed.

To the faithful and untiring efforts of the present corresponding secretary, to her clear and business-like methods of work and to her able handling of the missionary interests intrusted to her care the increased usefulness of this organization is in no small measure due.

The books of the treasurer are models of accuracy and neatness. All bills have been promptly met, and there has always been a fair balance in the treasury.

The work of the junior secretary has been beautiful in its

thoroughness, precision and accuracy. The important results in this somewhat difficult field prove the value of the methods employed.

The hearty co-operation and good fellowship of all has made the work of the year, instead of the burden which it would otherwise have been, a pleasure and a benediction.

REPORT OF STORAGE-HOUSE COMMITTEE

The Storage-House Committee would report through its several Divisions for the year ending April 30, 1897, as follows:

The Secretary has received 293 letters from, and written 346 letters to Branches and Missionaries; has forwarded 79 apportionment lists to Branches for their annual reports, and has answered inquiries from 5 Dioceses with reference to the Storage-House plan.

The Finance Division has handed to the Treasurer \$1,744.15. There have been sent out to Missionaries and Branches 167 bills. Sewing-credits, rated as cash, used in settlement of indebtedness to the Storage-House, have amounted to \$346.85, representing a total of \$2,091.00.

The Purchasing Division has added to stock goods to the amount of \$692.30, outside of special orders filled for Branches and Missionaries.

The Cutting Division has cut out 1,056 garments; 2,453 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards of material, 195 yards of trimming and 177 $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen buttons have been disposed of through the Storage-House to Branches and Missionaries.

The Distributing Division has sent 229 cut-out garments to 12 Branches on sewing-credit, and no sewing-credits have been allowed since January 26th.

The Selling Division has filled 36 cash orders from Missionaries and 115 cash orders from Branches at cost rates amounting to \$1,290.69.

The Receiving Division has examined 229 completed garments, representing this year's sewing, and sewing-credits have been awarded to corresponding Branches to the amount of \$77.78, which is \$203.34 less than last year.

The Apportionment Division has entered on the books 2,568 articles for missionary boxes, according to instructions from the Storage-House Secretary.

The Packing Division has packed 50 boxes for Missionaries and mission schools, valued at \$1,610.88.

The Forwarding Division has shipped 174 boxes and packages through the American and National Express companies at half rates; by Merchants' Despatch; by city express and messenger service, at an aggregate expense of \$115.13; 39 boxes and packages have been received at the Storage-House, involving \$14.25 in express; 79 parish Branches and Junior Auxiliaries have been notified of the shipment of missionary boxes accredited to them. Express on packages sent out and returned to the Storage-House on sewing-credit, not included in bills, has amounted to \$6.95.

The Executive Division has held 8 meetings. Among questions that have come up for discussion none has had more consideration than the "sewing-credit." The over-stocked shelves show a necessity for a reduction in prices to be paid hereafter to Branches for making these garments, and by a vote of the Committee those in stock have been marked down accordingly. Upon the sale of these depends the restoration of the sewing-credit.

There have co-operated with the Storage-House 47 Branches and 10 Junior Auxiliaries.

Missionaries in the Diocese to the number of 14 have availed themselves of Storage-House rates. One Missionary in another Diocese, referred by Miss Emery, has had the privilege of these rates. One Missionary Bishop has had the same privilege for one of his clergy, also three Missionaries in a neighboring Diocese have profited by these cost rates.

Hosiery, underwear, clothing of all kinds, household and hospital supplies, have been sent out from the Storage-House for missionary purposes, as well as 16 suits for clergymen, 4 cassocks, 2 surplices, 14 overcoats, cloaks and capes, 29 boys' suits and 27 pairs shoes, at a total valuation of \$2,490.52, a total cost of \$1,479.30, and a saving to Missionaries and Branches of \$1,011.22. It was this possibility of assisting the Branches to make their money reach further and to insure a more prompt response to missionary appeals that suggested the Storage-House plan, and now not only Branches may have the benefit of its methods, but accredited Missionaries in our own Diocese may have the privilege of its rates.

The cost of garments in stock at reduced prices, the result of sewing-credits, is \$289.18. The cash receipts from such garments at regular prices have been \$185.80. From these figures it is evident why the sewing-credit scheme has been almost inoperative this year. When the sewing-credit idea is better understood, Branches will purchase from the shelves to fill their missionary appeals in that line, and later will make up garments to replenish the shelves. Credit and purchasing being interchangeable and prices paid for sewing reduced, in order to offer garments at lower rates, should insure satisfactory sales and thus make it possible to restore the sewing-credit to its place in the Storage-House plan, for the encouragement and assistance of all Branches, particularly those in the weaker Parishes.
