The fourteen branches in my division have been very prompt in answering my inquiries for reports of their work, so that I have some word from all.

CAMBRIDGE — S. LUKE'S:

This branch is a new one, and the Secretary's report shows enthusiasm. They began with a large meeting held at the Rectory to bring the object of the Auxiliary before all the Church people. They have held fourteen meetings, and have visited and entertained two sister Auxiliaries, besides having a Missionary service when Dean Talbot told of work in the Philippines, and the offering of \$20 was given for that work.

FORT EDWARD — S. JAMES':

This branch has nine active members, and raises funds by food sales and taking orders for aprons and comfortables. As their church has been refurnished, they thought best to give a pew in memory of Mrs. Twing, founder of the Auxiliary. They subscribe for the "Spirit of Missions" and pay their parish assessment for Diocesan Missions.

GRANVILLE — TRINITY :

This branch has a system of Missionary study. A programme is made out for the year, and papers are read and questions answered by the members in turn.

HOOSAC -- ALL SAINTS' :

This branch has sixteen members. They hold a monthly Missionary meeting at which articles are read from the "Spirit of Missions" and other Church papers. They raise some of their money by orders for sewing, and support a scholarship in Japan.

SALEM — S. PAUL'S :

This new branch of sixteen members is flourishing, having two Junior departments. The women have met regularly and worked faithfully, giving a generous sum to the United Offering. The Juniors are divided, having a meeting in the evening for older members. They meet every week, and the Rector's wife, who is their President, has devised many ways of interesting and instructing them.

TROY — S. JOHN'S :

All the parish societies and guilds work for the Auxiliary and during the year send a large number of boxes to missionaries, hospitals and institutions.

TROY — HOLY CROSS :

This branch has been working as usual along the three lines of Auxiliary work. A series of short papers on Alaska and Africa have been written and read by the members, and we should be glad to lend them to others.

We held our usual weekly meetings in Lent for the purpose of developing the spiritual side of our work, and hope this year to have a Quiet Day held for branches in and near Troy.

I wish every woman in these branches would take a United Offering box, and have part in that wonderful offering. It was the greatest inspiration to be present in Boston last month, and see the women who had come from China, Japan, and all parts of our country to present their offerings.

REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB

Because of the failure of six librarians to send in their report, the Diocesan Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club is unable to give her annual report. There are some facts, however, to be noted with satisfaction and thankfulness.

The branch newly organized last year in Christ Church, Cooperstown, is keeping up and increasing its work. New branches have been organized this year in S. Mary's, Springfield Centre, and Holy Cross, Troy, the latter sending in an excellent report.

The Juniors of S. Mark's, Green Island, have remembered the needs of the club with their annual gift of \$2, and S. John's Church, Troy, again gave the "Mann Bequest" of \$25, which has been used, according to the terms of the bequest, for the purchase of educational books. A contribution of \$3.50 has been received from a member of S. John's, Troy, for subscriptions (10) to the "Parish Visitor."

Boxes of magazines have been sent from S. George's, Schenectady (2), S. John's, Cohoes (2), Christ Church, Hudson (1), Holy Cross, Troy (1), Christ Church, Cooperstown (1), All Saints', Hoosac (1), S. Mark's, Green Island (2), and boxes of books from S. Peter's, Albany, and from the G. F. S. of S. John's, Cohoes (1).

At the annual meeting the correspondent spoke of the "traveling libraries," which are a new feature in the work of the C. P. C., and suggested the equipment and sending out of one of these libraries, to be named for our Bishop, and to mark the fifteenth year of the C. P. C., in this diocese.

One parish has offered to contribute the case for holding the books. Will other parishes help to fill it?* This should be a gift from the whole diocesan branch of the Auxiliary and not alone from those branches in which the C. P. C. has an organized channel of work.

The correspondent has had the privilege of addressing the branches of the Auxiliary of Holy Cross Church, Troy; S. John's, Cohoes; the G. F. S., also of S. John's; the Woman's League of S. Peter's, Albany; and the Conference of Church Workers at Richfield Springs.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this society is "The Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of this society is, by means of mutual and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the diocese, and to encourage the formation of new branches. In furtherance of this there may be maintained:

- (a) A department in the periodical newspaper of the diocese to be devoted to the interests of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (b) A branch of the church periodical club for the distribution to missionaries of religious and secular literature.
- (c) Such other work as from time to time may be deemed expedient for the further development of the society.

ARTICLE III.

Any woman who is a member of a parish branch becomes thereby a member of the Diocesan branch.

The officers of each parish branch shall send to the treasurer all pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes. They shall make to the corresponding secretary, before May 1st of each year, a report of the number and value of their missionary boxes.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, a secretary for the junior department and a treasurer, and a treasurer for the United Offering.

These officers shall be appointed by the Bishop at each annual meeting and shall serve one year. In addition there shall be one or more managers from each archdeaconry, chosen by the Archdeacon and approved by the Bishop. These officers, together with the chairmen of standing committees, shall constitute the executive committee.

1. The president, or in her absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall call and preside over all meetings.
2. The recording secretary shall send all notices, keep the minutes of all meetings and shall send a copy of the minutes of every executive meeting to each manager not present at such meeting. She shall be responsible for the issuing and distributing of the annual report.
3. The corresponding secretary shall assist in preparing the annual report and conduct the correspondence of the society with parish branches, with missionaries, with the managers and with the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.
4. The secretary of the Junior Auxiliary shall conduct all the business of her department and shall make a report at the annual and semi-annual meetings. She shall make an annual report of missionary boxes to the corresponding secretary and of all money to the treasurer.
5. The treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the Diocesan Branch, and shall collect, by correspondence if necessary, all sums payable to the same; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements, with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report of the same at each regular meeting. She shall pay out money

only as directed by the Diocesan Branch or Executive Committee, except such sums as may be received for a definite purpose and which may be disposed of without formal directions. All money received for purposes outside the diocese shall be forwarded through the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

The Treasurer of United Offering shall be responsible for the collection and disbursement of that fund.

The Bishop shall appoint annually an auditor, who shall examine the accounts of the treasurer before they are presented at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

Managers shall endeavor to stimulate the formation of new parish branches, to infuse greater missionary spirit throughout their archdeaconries, and shall seek to increase intelligent interest in the missionary work of the church.

At the annual and semi-annual meetings an opportunity will be afforded the managers to meet the members of the branches of their respective archdeaconries.

At least one general meeting should be held during the year in each archdeaconry.

Each manager shall present a written report of her work for the year at the annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch.

ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting shall be held in November, at the time and place of the Diocesan Convention.

At this meeting the annual reports shall be presented and the officers appointed. A semi-annual meeting shall be held the second Wednesday in May, the place of meeting to be decided upon by the Executive Committee. The date of this meeting may be changed for sufficient cause.

Special meetings may be called by the president at the request of five of the executive committee.

Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each diocesan officer and the secretary of each parish branch.

A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of the members present at any meeting regularly called.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for this meeting.
