1908

Owing to changes in the Executive Board, and illness among its members, the Annual Report for the year ending May 1, 1908, has been greatly delayed.

This can be made a possibility only through the co-operation of the Branches throughout the Diocese, and by their interest and immediate action when, (in April), the blanks are received from the Corresponding Secretary. Fill out these blanks *fully*, correct any errors that may appear in the 1908 Report, and return the reports to the Corresponding Secretary at once.

## DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES

---

1. The Corresponding Secretary of the Diocesan Branch, has on hand, letters which state the needs of missionaries in our own Diocese. Also from missionaries, hospitals and schools, in the Mission fields. When your branch is ready to begin work, write to the Secretary for such letters.
2. When your branch has "accepted" a letter--that is--has undertaken the work for which that letter calls--let the Corresponding Secretary know at once, the name and address enclosed in such letter, and the name and location of your parish.
3. It is of the utmost importance that immediately after a decision, you should return the rejected letters to the Corresponding Secretary, so that she can without delay, send them to other parishes.
4. Parish Secretaries must also write at once, to the missionary whose letter has been accepted, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.
5. Secretaries will please send a letter to the missionary, as soon as the box has been dispatched, stating date of shipment; also a letter to the Corresponding Secretary, with a statement of the value of the box. The address of the sender inside the box, is always advisable.
6. Upon application the Recording Secretary will send copies of the special Auxiliary service, approved by the Bishop.
7. A list of the officers of each parish branch, should be sent to the Recording Secretary of the Diocesan branch, not later than April 15th, for publication in the Annual Report. (A type-written list would be considered by the Secretary, a special favor.)

In this division there are eleven branches, and it is with delight that I am able to present a report from all of them.

#### ALBANY—ALL SAINTS':

Regular monthly meetings have been held with an average attendance of thirty, at which addresses have been made, or papers read. With the aid of St. Martha's Guild three boxes have been sent.

## ALBANY—HOLY INNOCENTS:

This branch reports regular monthly meetings with good attendance and an increase of five new members. Two boxes were sent. Deaconess Pell-Clarke addressed one meeting, subject being "Woman's Auxiliary and its Work."

## ALBANY—S. PETER'S:

This branch reports a very successful year's work. At each monthly meeting the missionary intelligence committee provided a speaker, usually a missionary, while at the weekly sewing meetings held in Lent, papers were prepared and read on China by members of the society. Eight boxes were sent out. Also an increased amount of money given.

## ALBANY—S. PAUL'S:

This branch has held monthly meetings and during Lent, instead of usual weekly sewing meetings, Deaconess Pell-Clarke gave talks on "Missions." Six boxes were sent out.

## AMSTERDAM—S. ANN'S:

This branch is flourishing and doing good earnest work. The meetings are held at the home of the president, and a large amount of work is accomplished each afternoon, followed by light refreshments. In March a Missionary Tea was given, admittance to which being anything that could be used in their work—calico, gingham, muslin, thread, etc.

## COHOES—S. JOHN'S:

This branch is composed of about fifty women. Meetings for sewing were held at the homes of the members, when tea and wafers were served. During the year, addresses were delivered by Rev. M. McLouglin and Deaconess Drant. The annual missionary meeting, when the United Offering boxes are opened, is a feature of this branch, the attendance being over one hundred.

## FONDA—ZION:

This branch is composed of twelve members and notwithstanding serious illness in the families of several of the members, there has been an increase of interest and three new members have gone in to take the places of those incapacitated by ill health and failing strength.

## GLOVERSVILLE—CHRIST CHURCH:

This branch is in great sorrow, their president Mrs. Eugene Littell, having died on Easter Sunday. Their meetings have been well attended and more interest shown. During Lent, weekly meetings were held, at which the Rector conducted Lenten services. In December, Deaconess Pell-Clarke gave an interesting talk on "Missions."

## JOHNSTOWN—S. JOHN'S:

This branch reports twenty-five members and about the usual amount of work done.

## RENSSELAERVILLE—TRINITY:

This branch reports ten members, and no particular work done for some time past, as some of the members are very old, and some invalids. Monthly meetings are held at the homes of the members, at which the time is spent in missionary reading.

## WATERVLIET—TRINITY:

This branch reports twenty members and work only during Lent. One box was sent.

The second division of the Archdeaconry of Albany reports fifteen active branches. Two of the oldest Parishes in the state have been obliged to give up their branches owing to deaths and removals of leading workers, and losses and changes of Rectors. These, with cases of serious illness, have also interfered with the activity of some other Parish branches. But upon the whole, quite the usual amount of work seems to have been done.

Christ Church, Hudson, still holds its first place, in numbers, work and study.

S. Paul's, Kinderhook, is rather a small and scattered Parish, but keeps up its attendance and work bravely.

Catskill, S. Luke's Church, though with some discouragements, has done its usual work, and testifies to its Missionary readings, as incentives to effort and interest.

The Parish at Lebanon Springs has been successfully led through troublous times, by the care and skill of Rev. Mr. Marvin, and settled under a new Rector. The ladies have done some outside work, besides making Church repairs.

St. Augustine's, Ilion, has been sorely tried in giving up its faithful and beloved Rector of many years; who after repeated trials has been obliged, on account of his health, to give up his work. They are prepared however, to welcome their new Rector in a cordial and confident spirit.

Gloria Dei, Palenville, small, but faithful and energetic, though missing their long time leader, has sent a box to Mrs. Buford's colored people, and to a leper colony.

Athens, reports subscriptions to "Spirit of Missions."

S. George's, Schenectady, has sent several boxes, and has organized a branch of the Junior Auxiliary, which has been preparing Christmas gifts for Alaska.

## DELHI—S. JOHN'S:

The splendid interest here in the work of the Woman's Auxiliary is steadily increasing. We have had 21 meetings—eight of which were missionary teas, which this year have been held regularly on the first Thursday of each month and devoted particularly to systematic study of mission work in China. The members have written excellent papers, which have proved very helpful to all, and with many more interested in the work the offerings have been proportionately larger. Two boxes have been sent to missionaries. In Easter week a missionary tea was given, and the money raised was devoted to a memorial gift from S. John's, Delhi, the old home of Bishop Griswold, to the Cathedral at Salina, Kan.

## FRANKLIN—S. PAUL'S:

As soon as the year's work is finished in this Parish, the women at once begin on another box, to be sent when most needed. Interest in the work is increasing, and we hope it will in no way flag in the future.

## HOBART—S. PETER'S:

Although the work in the Parish has been at a standstill during the winter, we hope that under the new Rector the work may be renewed and the interest increased.

## SIDNEY—S. PAUL'S :

I am most happy to say that since the women of this Branch attended the semi-annual meeting at Walton, they have been inspired to more active work for Missions, and have more thoroughly understood what the "Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions" means. Although the membership is small, the women are enthusiastic and earnest. Thirteen meetings have been held during the year, and two boxes of clothing prepared.

## WALTON—CHRIST CHURCH:

This branch has held twenty-three meetings during the year. The Rector suggested a smaller number of meetings. The monthly meetings have been entirely of a missionary character. Papers have been prepared and read upon the women workers in the Field who are supported by the United Offering. The whole spirit of the work, and the gradual increase of interest are most encouraging. Boxes have been prepared and money sent. The semi-annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch was held in Walton, in November last, with Bishop McKim, of Japan, as speaker.

**MINUTES OF THE TWENTY-FOURTH SEMI-ANNUAL  
MEETING.**

Semi-Annual meeting of the Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, held at Christ Church, Walton, on Tuesday and Wednesday, Nov. 5 and 6. **1904.**

On Tuesday evening at 6 o'clock supper was served in the Parish House to about 50 persons. At 8 o'clock the Missionary Service was held in Christ Church, Rev. Mr. Pember, of Walton, and Rev. Mr. Grout, of Delhi, reading the service. The address was delivered by the Rt. Rev. John McKim, D. D., Bishop of Tokyo.

After the service an informal reception was held in the Parish House. Mrs. Rochester spoke upon the United Offering. The resolution of the last Triennial Council upon the United Offering was read, and many boxes were distributed.

On Wednesday morning, Nov. 6th, there was a celebration of the Holy Communion at 9 o'clock, with the Rector as celebrant. At 10 o'clock the business meeting was called to order by Mrs. Lockwood, Manager of the Second Division of the Archdeaconry of the Susquehanna, who, in the absence of the President and Vice Presidents, took the chair. After prayers by Rev. Mr. Grout, Mrs. Lockwood announced the resignation of Mrs. S. B. Ward, who has been President of the Auxiliary for six years; and also stated that the Bishop of the Diocese had appointed Deaconess Pell-Clarke to succeed her.

In the absence of the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary read the minutes of the 24th annual meeting, held at Cohoes, May 15th. After an amendment, the minutes were adopted.

The Corresponding Secretary reported 29 boxes being prepared by as many Branches. The Secretary read a paper from the Missions House, giving an explanation of the way in which boxes are offered to the Missionaries.

The Treasurer reported bills paid, and read the deficiency in each pledge. Report adopted.

No report from the Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary.

The United Offering Treasurer, Mrs. Rochester, reported the Diocesan United Offering for the last three years as \$3,314.14; of which the Juniors gave \$238.38. The Treasurer further reported that she already had upon deposit \$36.53, towards the United Offering of 1910. Report accepted.

Although no reports were asked from the Managers, Miss Hughes was asked to give a report of the Auxiliary in her department—the First Division of the Archdeaconry of the Susquehanna. Miss Hughes reported added interest in the work, and several successful Mission Study classes.

Miss Sarah North, of Walton, for many years the faithful Manager of the Second Division of the Archdeaconry of the Susquehanna, was invited to speak, and assured the Auxiliary of her continued interest in all its work.

The Secretary of the Sidney Branch reported interest and progress.

Mrs. North, President of the Walton Branch, reported that the women were already holding meetings, and filling a box.

Mrs. Grout, of Delhi, reported study classes successfully carried on for three years.

Mrs. Rulison, of Ilion, brought greeting from her Branch, and reported the prosperity of the Branch, and the success of its study classes.

Mrs. Rochester was asked to give a history of the Babies' Branch.

Miss Knapp, upon request, told how the United Offering is collected in S. John's, Cohoes.

In answer to an inquiry by Miss Hughes, Mrs. Rochester said she would like the United Offering collected twice a year, so that the money might be drawing interest; and she requested the Parish treasurers to have the money in her hands by April 25th and September 15th.

Rev. Mr. Pember presented a message of regret from the Bishop-Co-adjutor.

Rev. Mr. Grout, responding to a request from the acting president, gave an account of his visit to the General Convention in Richmond.

Rev. Mr. Pember spoke upon the importance of prayer, and explained the religious or spiritual side of our work, and the three-fold aim of the Auxiliary—"Prayer, Study and Work."

After a discussion upon objects for pledges, and the statement being made that the Secretary had been authorized to write the Branches, asking for an expression of opinion in regard to the choice of pledges, the following resolution was adopted:

Moved and seconded, that, after the choice of the Parish Branches in regard to future pledges is received by the Executive Board, a list of pledges be prepared and submitted to the Bishop for his approval, and these be presented to the Parish Branches, and be voted upon by the Parish delegates at the annual meeting in May.

Mrs. Rochester made a motion, seconded by Miss Knapp, that a vote of thanks be tendered the Rector and people of Christ Church, Walton, for their gracious and bountiful hospitality. Carried by a rising vote.

After noonday prayers for missions by Rev. Mr. Pember, the Rev. Ralph Birdsall, of Cooperstown, was asked to speak upon the Cooperstown Orphanage.

Rev. Mr. Birdsall extended to the Auxiliary a cordial invitation to hold the annual meeting at Cooperstown in May.

Mrs. Rochester explained the idea of S. Christopher's League, and asked that all contributions for the Orphan House of the Holy Savior, Cooperstown, the Child's Hospital, and S. Margaret's Home, Albany, be sent through the treasurer of S. Christopher's League, which was organized to assist Diocesan institutions.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY DEPARTMENT IN THE CHURCH RECORD.

In writing the articles for the Record, the same plan has been pursued in this past year as in the year before. When there has been any news from headquarters of interest to the Auxiliary branches as a whole, such as accounts of proceedings at an annual or semi-annual meeting, the formation of the Comfort Club, or any communications from Diocesan officers relative to the work in hand, all the space needed has been given first to these matters, in the hope that the department in the Record, might be of some practical assistance both to the branches and the hard-worked officers. It would be a great help in trying to realize this aim if the different branches would write freely to the department about any questions that might need clearing up, even if it should be only a question of red tape, for what troubles our branch might very probably trouble others, and an explanation might thus help more than the original inquirer.

When the space has not been needed for notices of this kind it has been devoted to a consideration of the special Mission posts for which the help of our branches has been asked, either in pledges or boxes, including S. Mary's Hall, Shanghai, Miss Thackara's work at the Fort Defiance Hospital, Miss Carter's work in Alaska, the Pine Ridge Indian Mission, and several different Missions among the poor whites in the South.

There is but one ideal for both these classes of articles, simply to make the Auxiliary work more intelligent and more interesting to the members, and in striving after this, any expression of opinion or suggestions about the department are at all times not only welcome, but most valuable, and if the department is to be really in touch with the branches, indispensable.

## CONSTITUTION.

---

### ARTICLE I.

The name of this society is "The Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

### ARTICLE II.

The object of this society is, by means of mutual and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the diocese, and to encourage the formation of new branches. In furtherance of this there may be maintained:

- (a) A department in the periodical newspaper of the diocese to be devoted to the interests of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (b) A branch of the church periodical club for the distribution to missionaries of religious and secular literature.
- (c) Such other work as from time to time may be deemed expedient for the further development of the society.

### ARTICLE III.

Any woman who is a member of a parish branch becomes thereby a member of the Diocesan branch.

The officers of each parish branch shall send to the treasurer all pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes. They shall make to the corresponding secretary, before May 1st of each year, a report of the number and value of their missionary boxes.

### ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, a secretary for the junior department and a treasurer, and a treasurer for the United Offering.

These officers shall be appointed by the Bishop at each annual meeting and shall serve one year. In addition there shall be one or more managers for each archdeaconry, chosen by the Archdeacon and approved by the Bishop. These officers, together with the chairmen of standing committees, shall constitute the executive committee.

1. The president, or in her absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall call and preside over all meetings.
2. The recording secretary shall send all notices, keep the minutes of all meetings and shall send a copy of the minutes of every executive meeting to each manager not present at such meeting. She shall be responsible for the issuing and distributing of the annual report.
3. The corresponding secretary shall assist in preparing the annual report and conduct the correspondence of the society with parish branches, with missionaries, with the managers and with the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.
4. The secretary of the Junior Auxiliary shall conduct all the business of her department and shall make a report at the annual and semi-annual meetings. She shall make an annual report of missionary boxes to the corresponding secretary and of all money to the treasurer.

5. The treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the Diocesan Branch, and shall collect, by correspondence if necessary, all sums payable to the same; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements, with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report of the same at each regular meeting. She shall pay out money only as directed by the Diocesan Branch or Executive Committee, except such sums as may be received for a definite purpose and which may be disposed of without formal directions. All money received for purposes outside the diocese shall be forwarded through the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

The Treasurer of United Offering shall be responsible for the collection and disbursement of that fund.

The Bishop shall appoint annually an auditor, who shall examine the accounts of the treasurer before they are presented at the annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE V.

Managers shall endeavor to stimulate the formation of new parish branches, to infuse greater missionary spirit throughout their archdeaconries, and shall seek to increase intelligent interest in the missionary work of the church.

At the annual and semi-annual meetings an opportunity will be afforded the managers to meet the members of the branches of their respective archdeaconries.

At least one general meeting should be held during the year in each archdeaconry.

Each manager shall present a written report of her work for the year at the annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch.

#### ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting shall be held in May, the time and place of meeting to be decided by the Executive Committee.

At this meeting the annual reports shall be presented and the officers appointed. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the fall of each year, the date and place of meeting to be decided upon by the Executive Committee.

Special meetings may be called by the president at the request of five of the executive committee.

Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each diocesan officer and the secretary of each parish branch.

A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of the members present at any meeting regularly called.

#### ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for this meeting.
