

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

The Twenty-eighth Annual Meeting of the Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, is being held in the well known and well beloved parish of St. Ann's, Amsterdam.

It is many years, dear friends, since it has gathered here, and it gives me the very greatest pleasure to feel that St. Ann's branch of the Auxiliary was so glad, and so eager to entertain us. I hope that every branch in the diocese has sent at least, one representative. Let us try through the coming year, to encourage a more equal representation in the future.

What has been the result of the past year? What have we done? I believe that we have paid our pledge to the Board, for General Missions, which pleases me very much.

I am wondering whether we have also remembered about our two Diocesan pledges, current expenses and the salary of the Diocesan Missionary.

Will not each branch send a stated amount, for these two objects, to the treasurer each year at the same time that they pay their pledge for General Missions? A small amount of two or three dollars a year, from small branches; and five or ten from the larger ones, would pay our running expenses, and would add greatly to our Treasurer's peace of mind. I feel sure that all those branches that already give liberally to Missions, could vote five or ten dollars a year, also, to these Diocesan needs. In like manner, also, the smaller branches could vote smaller sums for the same purposes, as they might feel able.

During the coming year let us try to make strong, the weak places at home; by our prayers, our work and our gifts, while we hearken, also to the cry for help of those in far off lands.

We have witnessed two very important and notable events, during the past year. The General Convention, in Cincinnati, and the Woman's National Foreign Missionary Jubilee.

"Missions" was the great theme at the Convention, and the bugle-note of advance was then sounded, which still rings in the ears of all that heard it. It practically called for a general reconstruction of everything. The Church itself, has determined upon a more aggressive Missionary Policy than ever before.

New fields have been opened out, and new Bishops have been Consecrated to shepherd them. The district of Hankow, China, and also that of Oklahoma in our own country, were each divided: a portion of California was made into the Missionary district of San Joaquin: from parts of the dioceses of Dallas and West Texas, the new Missionary district of North Texas was formed, thus making five new districts to be added to the Missions of the Church.

As the field grows larger, year by year, and as the demand for the support of the work and workers increases, does it not call us to more work; more prayer; more self-denial; more love and sympathy than ever before? I think so.

Our vision must be larger and broader than in the past; our prejudices must be made to lose *some* of their ugly creases, and in some way, we *must* adjust ourselves to the forward march of the age, if we would keep pace with it at all. In the Golden Jubilee of the Woman's National Foreign Missionary Societies, which swept over the Country from the Pacific Coast to the Atlantic, like a mighty tidal-wave, there was an attempt made to give a clear and vivid picture of Woman's organized work for Foreign Missions, since its beginning in America fifty years ago, and I am indebted to the Spirit of Missions for March, 1911, for much of my information regarding the Jubilee.

While the *chief* object of the meetings was to celebrate the Fiftieth Anniversary of Woman's Work in the Foreign Field, they also had the added object of seeking to stimulate the interest for Missions among the Christian Women of our own country.

Meetings were held in all the principal cities and towns, literature was distributed freely, and many addresses were made by Missionaries.

We gained much from the meetings in Albany and Troy. A wider and more true conception of the great opportunity confronting the Christian Church in the Orient; a deepening of the prayerful life in each individual, and a larger sense of obligation in the matter of giving to Missions.

Many who were already interested in Foreign Missions were stimulated to greater effort, and many I am sure, who have been careless and indifferent before, were given a better and wider knowledge of Foreign Missions.

In an age when we hear so much about Church Unity, it was gratifying to find the women of all Christian Communions coming together on the subject of Missions.

"Missions" are without doubt the one great object of the Church, and our Blessed Lord was, himself, the first and greatest Missionary, imparting to it an endless ever fresh supply of spiritual life and strength.

My wish for the Auxiliary in the Diocese of Albany, is that it shall rise to the opportunities which confront it. Never in our time have the doors of the Orient been thrown so wide open to western learning, thought and religion as they are to-day. What is to be our attitude? If we are unable to offer ourselves to the work, we can at least, give of our abundance for the support of the work and workers, and in all cases we can surely pray for them as well.

I wish every possible success to the Albany Diocesan Branch in the year just beginning, and I wish to thank my Secretaries and Treasurer, my Managers and Vice-Presidents, for their most gracious and untiring help.

DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES

1. The Corresponding Secretary of the Diocesan Branch, has on hand letters, sent from the Church Missions House, stating needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools in the Mission field. Also letters, approved by our Bishops, which state the needs of the missionaries in our own Diocese. When your branch is ready to start work, write to the Corresponding Secretary for such letters.
2. When your branch has undertaken the work for which your selected letter calls, notify the Secretary at once, sending her the name and address in such letter, and your own address and parish.
3. It is of the utmost importance that immediately after such decision, all rejected letters be returned to the Corresponding Secretary.
4. Write to the Missionary at once, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.
5. Write to the Missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, also the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, with statement concerning value of box.
6. Blanks will be sent out early in April, 1912, for a report of the year's work. Read them carefully and fill them out fully. Return them to the Corresponding Secretary at once, correcting any errors which appear in the report of 1911. At this time also write to the Manager of your division, giving any details of work and method in your branch.
- All boxes of books, single books or magazines should be reported through the Church Periodical Club.
7. Always notify the Corresponding Secretary of any change of branch officers during the year. Keep in touch with the Manager of your division, and for any desired information write to the diocesan officers having such matter in charge.
8. Copies of the Special Auxiliary service, approved by the Bishop, will be sent on application to either Recording or Corresponding Secretary.

REPORT OF ARCHDEACONY OF ALBANY

1st DIVISION.

ALBANY—ALL SAINTS :

The Cathedral branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, has held regular monthly meetings from October to May, inclusive, which have been well attended and at which addresses have been made by the clergy and by members of the Auxiliary. Two boxes have been sent and all pledges paid. Special meeting for Missionary sewing and reading have been held during Lent.

ALBANY—HOLY INNOCENTS :

This branch reports a year of continued effort. Meetings have been held each month during the autumn and winter and on the second Sunday in January a special Missionary service was held with a sermon by the Rector and a corporate Communion for all women workers in the parish. This branch has also been visited by the Diocesan president, Deaconess Pell-Clarke, who told of the work of the Auxiliary at the General Convention. Gifts to the United offering and pledges have been made, and a creditable box sent.

ALBANY—ST. PAUL'S :

This branch has held seven business meetings at which missionary addresses and stereopticon lectures were given. During Lent weekly meetings were held, when garments were made to be sent to Cafe Palmes Orphanage in Africa. All pledges have been paid and a contribution made to the United offering.

ALBANY—ST. PETER'S :

This branch reports nine boxes, which partly represents its year's work. The Lenten service was started a few weeks before Lent and the subject of study was our Missions in Africa. At one of the monthly meetings an address was made by Miss Schereschewsky, of Japan, and at another by Rev. C. E. Betticher, of Alaska.

ALBANY—ST. ANDREW'S :

This branch has been much encouraged this year. Deeper interest has been taken in the work, and the serving of light refreshments at the meetings greatly improved the social side of it. Boxes and barrels have been sent to different missionaries, also gifts of money.

ALBANY—TRINITY :

This branch is at present in a dormant state, but it is hoped that very soon it will be doing the very excellent work it once did.

COHOES—ST. JOHN'S :

This branch sent three barrels and one box to the South, also money to a clergymen's family and to St. Margarets, Tokio.

AMSTERDAM—ST. ANN'S :

This branch has held thirteen meetings at which there was an average attendance of thirteen members. Much sewing has been done and a regular course of reading has been followed. On Feb. 1st a missionary conference for neighboring auxiliaries was held, at which the Rev. C. E. Betticher, Jr., of Alaska, made a stirring address. On Maunday Thursday a corporate Communion was observed. Four ford sales and teas added to the treasury, and a miscellaneous barrel was sent to the Rev. A. B. Livermore, of Fletcher, N. C. At the annual meeting it was voted to double the apportionment to the Board of Missions and in addition money was sent to Mr. Betticher for his work in Alaska, and to St. Margaret's, Tokio. During the year two valued members were lost by death and two by removal from city. Fifteen new members have come into the branch making the present membership forty seven.

FONDA—ZION :

This branch reports a membership of fourteen members and eight meetings during the year. Also a contribution to the United offering, Branch fees, salary of diocesan missionary, and general work.

GLOVERSVILLE—CHRIST CHURCH :

During the illness of the president this Branch did not begin work until November. Notwithstanding fifteen meetings fairly well attended were held. During Lent they worked for a sale. All pledges were paid and one box sent.

RENSSELAERVILLE—TRINITY :

This branch, although small in number and strength, is nevertheless anxious to do what it can and struggles to keep in existence. All pledges are paid, also a contribution to United offering.

FAIRFIELD :

We hope for a branch at Fairfield the coming year.

HUDSON :

Has been doing its usual admirable work. A box valued at \$115 to the Diocesan Missionary for his distribution. A christmas box valued at \$70 to Rev. A. Livermore, at Fletcher, N. C. Lenten box \$80, to Rev. A. Clark for his Indians at Rosebud Agency, S. D. Books worth \$8 to Red Dragon Inn and St. Matthews Reading Room, Fairbanks, Alaska.

The Rector gave them talks on Japan, and for the October and April meetings the President prepared papers on recent happenings in the mission fields, domestic and foreign.

At their last meeting, always held the first Monday in May, they unite all the guilds of the parish, to listen to their annual report, and be served with ice cream and cake.

ILION :

Has not sent yet its usual admirable report.

KINDERHOOK :

Excellent work as usual. Box, value \$50, to Rev. M. W. Du Bose, Manganon, N. C. Small sums for general missions, Diocesan Missionary; Tokio and Shanghai. They also sent a box of canned fruit and a box of clothing to Cooperstown Orphanage.

LEBANON SPRINGS—Seven Members :

For united offering and current expenses \$2.50. For Bishop Nelson's work in Georgia among poor whites \$1. Night gowns to Stony Wold Sanitarium, Kushqua \$5. They have much to do for their own little church. They meet once a month for a little service of prayer, and reading of Spirit of Missions.

LITTLE FALLS :

Has been doing its usual good work.

PALENVILLE :

One of our smallest and certainly one of our most faithful parishes. They have never had more successful work and more interest. They sent a box, valued \$65, to Rev. W. M. Cleaveland, Stanardsville, Va. \$10 for W. A. work. \$2.25 for united offering.

They are doing a great deal for their own church property; and their Easter collection was nearly \$50. The Lenten boxes of their twenty-five Sunday Scholars amounted to more than \$10.

CATSKILL:

Has organized and is studying missions in this country. I have no report of work it is doing.

SCHEECTADY-ST. GEORGE'S:

The usual Christmas and Lenten boxes were sent. The former to Rev. M. Van Allen and to Mrs. Earhart, of Lincoln, Nebraska. \$5 in money was placed in each box. The Lenten box was sent the same as usual to the Mountain Missions. Regular meetings monthly.

Bishop Griswold gave us an interesting account of his work in his missionary district of Salina.

During Lent sewing meetings were held weekly for the box.

The Junior Auxiliary, under Mrs. Conover's care, is doing excellent work.

CHRIST CHURCH Sent \$10 for missions.

There is really very little for the manager of the 2nd Division of the Archdeaconry to report.

Walton Parish Branch reports for the year ending April 6th, 1911, eight regular monthly meetings and twenty-seven meetings for work. Average attendance at monthly meetings seven; at work meetings, five; number of members enrolled thirty-three. The Branch has paid all pledges, also giving to several appeals not included in the pledges.

The United Offering has been made and sent to the Diocesan Treasurer. A box valued at fifty dollars has been sent to the Virginia Mountain Missionary. At the Annual Meeting suggestions were made for a fresh attempt at readings and Missionary meetings during the coming year to which the members present assented gladly.

The United Offering for the past six months is \$10.22. All leaflets sent me in regard to it, have been sent to every Parish Branch. There is not as much interest in this Branch in Missions and Missionary work as I wish and hope to see and pray for. I am grieved to report the death of Mrs. Olive Webster, one of the most faithful, devoted, and interested Auxiliary Mission workers Walton Branch ever had, and our loss was Franklin's gain, as she had moved from Walton to Franklin some time before her death, and before her sickness was active in the work for the Auxiliary of St. Paul's.

STAMFORD—GRACE :

It is most encouraging to receive a report from Stamford this year. They are still working away on the old lines, having their monthly meetings except during the Summer. They have prayers, intercessions, and instructions, and do what giving they can.

St. Paul's, Franklin, says they have already sent their report to Mrs. Griswold. They hope to have the General Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary next year.

ST. JOHN'S—DELHI :

The women are greatly interested in the work, consequently they are prayerful. At each of their meetings they have prayers. They also have Corporate Communion at their first meeting, and each person is expected to come to that service and it is always well attended, and afterward they hold their business meeting when the letters are read and their work for the year decided upon. They have Missionary reading at their regular business meeting held the first of every month, and find the "Spirit of Missions" most helpful. Their regular study for this year and next is Japan.

Mrs. Norton, the United Offering Secretary is very faithful in her duties connected with the work, and holds a meeting annually at which she gives a talk on the work, sees the boxes distributed and reads a report of what the Branch does through the year; also a report of the whole United Offering.

I regret very much to report that the Branch at Sidney has been disbanded, with the hope of re-organizing again when they feel they can have both a Parish Aid and Woman's Auxiliary.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this society is "The Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of this society is, by means of mutual and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among the women of the diocese, and to encourage the formation of new branches. In furtherance of this there may be maintained :

- (a) A department in the periodical newspaper of the diocese to be devoted to the interests of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (b) A branch of the church periodical club for the distribution to missionaries of religious and secular literature.
- (c) Such other work as from time to time may be deemed expedient for the further development of the society.

ARTICLE III.

Any woman who is a member of a parish branch becomes thereby a member of the Diocesan branch.

The officers of each parish branch shall send to the treasurer all pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes. They shall make to the corresponding secretary, before May 1st of each year, a report of the number and value of their missionary boxes.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, a secretary for the junior department and a treasurer, and a treasurer for the United Offering.

These officers shall be appointed by the Bishop at each annual meeting and shall serve one year. In addition there shall be one or more managers for each archdeaconry, chosen by the Archdeacon and approved by the Bishop. These officers, together with the chairmen of standing committees, shall constitute the executive committee.

1. The president, or in her absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall call and preside over all meetings.

2. The recording secretary shall send all notices, keep the minutes of all meetings and shall send a copy of the minutes of every executive meeting to each manager not present at such meeting. She shall be responsible for the issuing and distributing of the annual report.

3. The corresponding secretary shall assist in preparing the annual report and conduct the correspondence of the society with parish branches, with missionaries, with the managers and with the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

4. The secretary of the Junior Auxiliary shall conduct all the business of her department and shall make a report at the annual and semi-annual meetings. She shall make an annual report of missionary boxes to the corresponding secretary and all money to the treasurer.

5. The treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the Diocesan Branch, and shall collect by correspondence if necessary, all sums payable to the same; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements, with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report of the same at each regular meeting. She shall pay out money only as directed by the Diocesan Branch or Executive Committee, except such sums

as may be received for a definite purpose, and which may be disposed of without formal directions. All money received for purposes outside the diocese shall be forwarded through the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

The treasurer of United Offering shall be responsible for the collection and disbursement of that fund.

The Bishop shall appoint annually an auditor, who shall examine the accounts of the treasurer before they are presented at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

Managers shall endeavor to stimulate the formation of new parish branches, to infuse greater missionary spirit throughout their archdeaconries, and shall seek to increase intelligent interest in the missionary work of the church.

At the annual and semi-annual meetings an opportunity will be afforded the managers to meet the members of the branches of their respective archdeaconries.

At least one general meeting should be held during the year in each archdeaconry.

Each manager shall present a written report of her work for the year at the annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch.

ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting shall be held in May, the time and place of meeting to be decided by the Executive Committee.

At this meeting the annual reports shall be presented and the officers appointed. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the fall of each year, the date and place of meeting to be decided upon by the Executive Committee.

Special meetings may be called by the president at the request of five of the executive committee.

Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each diocesan officer and the secretary of each parish branch.

A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of the members present at any meeting regularly called.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for this meeting.
