CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This society shall be known as The Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this organization shall be, to unite all church women of the Diocese in work for Domestic and Foreign Missions, to increase missionary activity in the parish auxiliaries, and to encourage the formation of such branches where there are none. In furtherance of this there may be maintained :

- (a) A department in the periodical newspaper of the diocese to be devoted to the interests of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (b) A branch of the church periodical club for the distribution to missionaries of religious and secular literature.
- (c) Such other work as from time to time may be deemed expedient for the further development of the society.

ARTICLE III.

Any woman who is a member of a parish branch becomes thereby a member of the Diocesan branch.

The officers of each parish branch shall send to the treasurer all pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes. They shall make to the Corresponding Secretary, at the close of their year, a report of the number and value of their missionary boxes.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, a secretary for the junior department, a treasurer, and a treasurer for the United Offering. These officers shall be appointed by the Bishop. In addition there shall be one manager for each archdeaconry or division thereof, nominated by the Archdeacon and appointed by the Bishop. These officers together with the chairmen of standing committees, shall constitute the executive board.

1. The president, or in her absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall call and preside over all meetings.

2. The recording secretary shall send all notices, keep the minutes of all meetings and shall send a copy of the minutes of every executive meeting to each member of the executive committee not present at such meeting. She shall be responsible for the issuing and distributing of the annual report.

3. The corresponding secretary shall assist in preparing the annual report and conduct the correspondence of the society with parish branches, with missionaries, with the managers and with the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

4. The secretary of the Junior Auxiliary shall conduct all the business of her department and shall make a report at the annual and semi-annual meetings. She shall make an annual report of missionary boxes to the corresponding secretary and of all money to the treasurer.

5. The treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the Diocesan Branch, and shall collect by correspondence if necessary all sums payable to the same ; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements, with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report

of the same at each regular meeting. She shall pay out money only as directed by the Diocesan Branch or Executive Committee, except such sums as may be received for a definite purpose, and which may be disposed of without formal directions. All money received for purposes outside the diocese, shall be forwarded through the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

6. The treasurer of the United Offering shall be responsible for the collection and presentation of that fund

The Bishop shall appoint annually an auditor, who shall examine the accounts of the treasurer before they are presented at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

Managers shall endeavor to stimulate the formation of new parish branches, to infuse greater missionary spirit throughout their archdeaconries, and shall seek to increase intelligent interest in the missionary work of the Church.

At least one general meeting shall be held during the year in each archdeaconry.

Each manager shall make a statement of the work done in her archdeaconry to be published in the annual report.

ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting shall be held in October, in one of the central cities of the Diocese, the time and place of meeting to be decided by the executive committee.

A semi-annual meeting shall be held in May, the several archdeaconries, in rotation, being responsible for all arrangements in regard to the meetings, the executive committee acting as advisory board with them as to time and place.

Special meetings of the executive board may be called by the president at the request of five of the executive committee.

Notice of annual and semi-annual meetings shall be sent to each diocesan officer and to the secretary of each parish branch.

A quorum of the executive committee for the transaction of business, shall consist of not less than five members present at any meeting regularly called.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for this meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In consequence of the change from the old, and in accordance with the articles of the new constitution adopted last May, we have now come together for the Annual meeting of the Auxiliary for the winter of 1912-13. All the reports that are to be made to us, cover therefore, not quite six month's work, and not only that, but these six months are the least active in the Auxiliary year. Every effort has been made to have them as full as possible, but in many cases we regret that they are necessarily incomplete.

In order to keep our files correctly, the Annual Report for this year will be issued as soon after this meeting as is expedient, and it will, of course, cover the six months work only. On account of the unusual expense incurred by this, we might not feel justified in doing it, were it not that the thoughtful kindness and generosity of one of our best friends, makes it possible for us to do it without taxing our own resources.

The First Annual Meeting of the Junior Auxiliary, held early in October, at the Cathedral of All Saints, has been a matter of special congratulation. The Junior Secretary will of course make a report in detail, but I cannot refrain from speaking this word in regard to the success of the undertaking.

The matter of the extension of the Auxiliary throughout the Diocese, both by the establishment of new branches and by increased ardor, producing greater results in every line in the existing Branches, is something we have very closely at heart. We hope that before very long, active steps may again be taken for a yet further canvas of the Diocese, and it will be a great disappointment if this is not productive of encouraging results.

I want to urge on every Branch the formation of new, or the continuation of already organized study classes. Our Extension Committee is ready to aid in the formation of these classes, and eagerly awaits requests for any help it may give.

All of our women appreciate fully the rare opportunity for doing good, that comes to them through the United Offering.

I must read you nevertheless, a few words of Dr. Manning's, on the "*Spiritual Value of the United Offering.*" He says: "First, the work of the United Offering is helping to train the women of the Church to give, and there is nothing that so surely leads toward Spiritual growth, as that does."

"The woman whom you influence to give in this way, is not only helped in her own soul, she grows inevitably in the interest in the Church, and in the Church's work." "There will come to her,—we have all seen it come to many and many a one,—a new realization of what the Church is, of what the Church's mission is, and also of her own responsibility for the carrying out of the Church's mission."

"And one point still further: The woman who gains a truer view of the Church and of the Church's mission, and of what her own responsibility is for, that Mission gains also a new sense of her responsibility to the Church's head."

"I believe that the woman who takes her part in the United Offering, will find a truer happiness in her religion, a deeper joy in the Eucharist, a deeper reality in all the Sacramental life of the Church."

DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES

1. The Corresponding Secretary of the Diocesan Branch, has on hand letters, sent from the Church Missions House, stating needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools in the Mission field. Also letters, approved by our Bishops, which state the needs of the missionaries in our own Diocese. When your branch is ready to start work, write to the Corresponding Secretary for such letters.

2. When your branch has undertaken the work for which your selected letter calls notify the Secretary at once, sending her the name and address in such letter, and your own address and parish.

3. It is of the utmost importance that immediately after such decision, all rejected letters be returned to the Corresponding Secretary.

4. Write to the Missionary at once, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.

5. Write to the Missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, also to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, with statement concerning value of box.

6. Blanks will be sent for a report of the year's work. Read them carefully and fill them out fully. Return them to the Corresponding Secretary at once, correcting any errors which appear in the last report. At this time also write to the Manager of your division, giving any details of work and method in your branch.

All boxes of books, single books or magazines should be reported through the Church Periodical Club.

7. Always notify the Corresponding Secretary of any change of branch officers during the year. Keep in touch with the Manager of your division, and for any desired information write to the diocesan officers having such matter in charge.

8. Copies of the Special Auxiliary service, approved by the Bishop, will be sent on application to either Recording or Corresponding Secretary.

THE JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

Your Junior Secretary reports having visited the Auxiliary Branch at Delhi, last June. A large meeting was held at the home of the President, Mrs. Edgerton. There were 60 in attendance and a business meeting, followed by annual election of officers, took place.

Your Secretary spoke of the Extension work planned for the Diocese, and the hope that the Executive Board has for the *growth* of the Auxiliary, both in numbers and interest.

The formation of Study Classes during the year, was strongly urged and a delegate for the Summer Conference at Silver Bay, was asked for from the first and second Divisions of the Susquehanna Archdeaconry. This was considered and prompt action decided on, to try to secure some one to go.

From Delhi I went to Walton, speaking there to the Junior Branch. Several members of the Woman's Auxiliary were present, and again the subject of a delegate to Silver Bay was broached. There being no resident, rector in Walton, at that time, nothing definite could be determined.

During the summer I learned that no one was found to go to Silver Bay, but they hope another year to find a suitable delegate.

On October fifth, was held the first annual meeting of the Juniors of the Diocese. This has been a plan under consideration for several years, but this year it materialized into a fact. It was held in the Guild House of All Saints' Cathedral, Albany, at 4 o'clock. There were about one hundred Juniors present, and after a cordial welcome extended them by our President, short reports were read by the Junior secretaries themselves, of their work during the past year. Then the Rev. Mr. Burleson from the Missions House, spoke to the children, telling them much about Mission work, arousing their keen interest and desire to help the Board to which they are auxiliary, in the great work of speeding Missions throughout the world, by their earnest prayers, work and gifts.

His most informal, yet delightful manner won the children from the start, and their interest was quite apparent. Following his talk most of the Juniors went into the Cathedral for evensong, after which a supper was served to all, in the Guild House, when Dean Brookman welcomed them all to the Cathedral Church of the Diocese. The Rev. Dr. Sill of St. John's Church, Cohoes, who was present, invited the Juniors to hold their next annual meeting in Cohoes. The invitation was accepted, the date not finally settled, but October was thought to be the most suitable time for such meeting to be held.

Our President has offered to bear any expense that may be incurred in giving a stereopticon lecture at that meeting of our Mission fields. Such lectures are prepared and sent out from the Missions House and will certainly prove most entertaining, as well as instructive to the Juniors. Had it not been for her cordial co-operation and support, the first meeting could not have taken place so, as Junior Secretary, I wish to thank her for making our first annual meeting, not only possible, but, a success.
