CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This society shall be known as The Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this organization shall be, to unite all church women of the Diocese in work for Domestic and Foreign Missions, to increase missionary activity in the parish auxiliaries, and to encourage the formation of such branches where there are none. In furtherance of this there may be maintained:

- (a) A department in the periodical newspaper of the diocese to be devoted to the interests of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (b) A branch of the church periodical club for the distribution to missionaries of religious and secular literature.
- (c) Such other work as from time to time may be deemed expedient for the further development of the society.

ARTICLE III.

Any woman who is a member of a parish branch becomes thereby a member of the Diocesan branch.

The officers of each parish branch shall send to the treasurer all pledges and money given for other than parish or local purposes. They shall make to the Corresponding Secretary, at the close of their year, a report of the number and value of their missionary boxes.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, a secretary for the junior department, a treasurer, and a treasurer for the United Offering. These officers shall be appointed by the Bishop. In addition there shall be one manager for each archdeaconry or division thereof, nominated by the Archdeacon and appointed by the Bishop. These officers, together with the chairmen of standing committees, shall constitute the executive board.

1. The president, or in her absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall call and preside over all meetings.

2. The recording secretary shall send all notices, keep the minutes of all meetings and shall send a copy of the minutes of every executive meeting to each member of the executive committee not present at such meeting. She shall be responsible for the issuing and distributing of the annual report.

3. The corresponding secretary shall assist in preparing the annual report and conduct the correspondence of the society with parish branches, with missionaries, with the managers and with the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

4. The secretary of the Junior Auxiliary shall conduct all the business of her department and shall make a report at the annual and semi-annual meetings. She shall make an annual report of missionary boxes to the corresponding secretary and of all money to the treasurer.

5. The treasurer shall have the custody of all money received by the Diocesan Branch, and shall collect by correspondence if necessary all sums payable to the same; shall keep a full and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements, with date, purpose and amount, and shall make a full report of the same at each regular meeting. She shall pay out money only as directed by the Diocesan Branch or Executive Committee, except such sums as may be received for a definite purpose, and which may be disposed of without formal directions. All money received for purposes outside the diocese shall be forwarded through the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

6. The treasurer of the United Offering shall be responsible for the collection and presentation of that fund.

The Bishop shall appoint annually an auditor, who shall examine the accounts of the treasurer before they are presented at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

Managers shall endeavor to stimulate the formation of new parish branches, to infuse greater missionary spirit throughout their archdeaconries, and shall seek to increase intelligent interest in the missionary work of the Church.

At least one general meeting shall be held during the year in each archdeaconry.

Each manager shall make a statement of the work done in her archdeaconry to be published in the annual report.

ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting shall be held in October, in one of the central cities of the Diocese, the time and place of meeting to be decided by the executive committee.

A semi-annual meeting shall be held in May, the several archdeaconries, in rotation, being responsible for all arrangements in regard to the meetings, the executive committee acting as advisory board with them as to time and place.

Special meetings of the executive board may be called by the president at the request of five of the executive committee.

Notice of annual and semi-annual meetings shall be sent to each diocesan officer and to the secretary of each parish branch.

A quorum of the executive committee for the transaction of business, shall consist of not less than five members present at any meeting regularly called.

ARTICLE VII.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given with the call for this meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As this, our Annual Meeting, has fallen immediately after the close of the Triennial Conference, it seems a fitting time to emphasize the lessons drawn from that great gathering, and to make from them what application we can to help us in our Diocesan work. First and foremost comes the story, not of actual achievement (for of that we shall hear later) but of the splendid inspiration and stimulus that has come to all of us who were there, filling our hearts with an earnest desire to increase our activities, to broaden our interests, and to bring us into closer touch with the vital questions of the Church of today. Who was there at those missionary gatherings, listening to story after story of men and women carrying Christ's word into heathen lands, men and women consecrated to the work, willingly suffering many hardships, and almost always hampered by lack of adequate financial support, who has not come away feeling that on her rests an *obligation* to further by every means in her power, this work so nobly conceived, so boldly carried on, and which should now advance with fresh impetus? Truly who is there of us who of her influence, of her means, or of her personal self-sacrifice, cannot do more than she has yet accomplished to further the Church's needs?

How to lay the surest foundations for the broadest and best missionary work has been a matter of absorbing interest to us here in our Diocese and it is truly gratifying to feel that in this we are working on the right lines. Through our various study-classes many of us are gaining that accurate knowledge of work in the missionary field and of the conditions of the lives of those whom we are trying to help which is necessary to an intelligent understanding of the situation. Perhaps most important of all is the great emphasis which rightly enough has been laid during the Conference on furthering the work of the Junior departments. It really seems as if the time could not be far distant when missionary work, missionary study and missionary enthusiasm would become as never before an integral part of the education of every Christian child.

That the work in our Diocese has at times lagged or has even seemed to have been at a standstill is doubtless true, but that it is now in a state to grow vigorously is beyond question, and I feel sure that the coming year will be productive of most gratifying results.

DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH SECRETARIES

1. The Corresponding Secretary of the Diocesan Branch has on hand letters, sent from the Church Missions House, stating needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools in the Mission field. Also letters, approved by our Bishop, which state the needs of the missionaries in our own Diocese. When your branch is ready to start work, write to the Corresponding Secretary for such letters.

2. When your branch has undertaken the work for which your selected letter calls notify the Secretary at once, sending her the name and address in such letter, and your own address and parish.

3. It is of the utmost importance that immediately after such decision, all rejected letters be returned to the Corresponding Secretary.

4. Write to the Missionary at once, stating when and from whom he may expect a box.

5. Write to the Missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, also to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, with statement concerning value of box.

6. Blanks will be sent for a report of the year's work. Read them carefully and fill them out fully. Return them to the Corresponding Secretary at once, correcting any errors which appear in the last report. At this time also write to the Manager of your division, giving any details of work and method in your branch.

All boxes of books, single books or magazines should be reported through the Church Periodical Club.

7. Always notify the Corresponding Secretary of any change of branch officers during the year. Keep in touch with the Manager of your division, and for any desired information write to the diocesan officers having such matter in charge.

8. Copies of the Special Auxiliary service, approved by the Bishop, will be sent on application to either Recording or Corresponding Secretary.

Meetings comparatively well attended and a more genuine interest taken in the work than ever before. A barrel of clothing, toys, books, etc., was sent to Miss Horner, Valle Crucis, N. C., in time for the holidays, value \$30. With St. James' Church, Lake George, a box was sent to Rev. Wm. Walking Shield, Catechist at Napala, N. D., their part of which was valued at \$42.65. A large number of beautiful articles were sent to Fairbanks, Alaska, for St. Matthew's Hospital Fair, valued at \$100. Five dollars was contributed toward the Nenana scholarship; \$9.54 to the United Offering; \$35 for Diocesan pledge; \$10 for Church Periodical Club work. Regular monthly meetings were held, and during Lent were held weekly. No Mission Study Class, but hope to have one next year.

ELIZABETHTOWN—CHURCH OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD:

This Branch has only twelve members, but has done excellent work. Meetings held weekly during Lent and boxes prepared. One box to the South of old and new clothing and one to a local tubercular hospital, "Stonywold." The boxes would average \$25.

LAKE GEORGE—ST. JAMES':

Meetings were held regularly and during Lent read "Japan Advancing." Joined with Church of the Messiah, Glens Falls, in sending box to Rev. Wm. Walking Shield, Catechist at Napala, N. D., their part of which was valued at \$42.65. Number of members remain the same as last year. Package valued at \$6 sent to Alaska. Money was also raised for local work. The members of the Auxiliary raised the entire amount necessary for the parish apportionment and placed it on the Altar in gold on Easter Day.

MINUTES OF THE THIRTIETH ANNUAL MEETING

The Thirtieth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions in the Diocese of Albany was held Tuesday and Wednesday, October 29 and 30, 1912, at St. Paul's Church, Albany. There were present at the roll call one hundred and eighty-four delegates and ten clergymen.

October 29, 8 P. M. Missionary Service in the church conducted by the Rector, the Rev. Roelif Brooks. The Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese introduced the speaker, Bishop Aves, of Mexico, who gave a most interesting and enlightening address on the condition of the Mexican people, the causes of such condition and the possible means of relieving it. Offering for Bishop Aves's work, \$23.20.

October 30, 9 A. M. Celebration of the Holy Communion in the church by the Rector. Offering for the United Offering, \$4.58.

10 A. M. Business meeting in the parish house. The President called the meeting to order and opened it with a short but stimulating address touching especially upon the spiritual benefit to be derived from the work of the Auxiliary.

Minutes of the May annual meeting read and approved.

Report of the Treasurer read and approved with hearty appreciation.

Report of the Corresponding Secretary read and approved. The President voiced for the Auxiliary its appreciation of the enormous amount of work covered by the Corresponding Secretary and her assistant.

The Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary reported visits to Delhi and Walton where she addressed enthusiastic meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary. On October 5th there was held in the Guild House of All Saints' Cathedral for the first time an annual meeting of the Juniors with about one hundred members present. Reports were read by the young Secretaries themselves. A helpful address was given by the Rev. Hugh Burleson, after which there followed evensong in the Cathedral and supper in the Guild House. The Secretary expressed grateful acknowledgment to the President, Mrs. Van Rensselaer, without whose cordial co-operation and support the meeting could not have taken place. The next annual meeting of the Juniors will be held at Cohoes. Report accepted.

Report of the Church Periodical Club read and approved.

Report of the Church Record read and approved.

Mrs. H. W. Thompson, for the Educational Extension Committee, reported having sent fifty-four letters to various branches asking that Mission Study Classes be formed. Nine replies stated that such classes had been started last year and would continue this year. Eight replied that new classes had been formed. Seven stated that they could do nothing.

The meeting then adjourned to the church where Miss Wood, of Wuchang, China, talked of the work of Boone College, making a special appeal for a library of standard works translated into Chinese, and following this with an interesting account of the Revolution, showing the influence and responsibility of America.

12:15 P. M. Address by Dr. Anstice on the organization and work of the Board of Missions at the Church Missions House.

1 P. M. Luncheon in the parish house.

2 P. M. Business meeting resumed. The President introduced Mrs. Rochester, who addressed the meeting regarding a gift to Miss Emery in loving recognition of her many years of service, to be presented at the triennial meeting in October, 1913.

Miss Knapp reported briefly concerning the Buffalo Missionary Council to which she had been appointed delegate by the Executive Board.

A resolution to send to Bishop Doane expressions of love and regard with regret for his absence was adopted.

A resolution of hearty thanks to the Rector and ladies of St. Paul's Church for their cordial welcome and generous hospitality was adopted.

Bishop Aves then spoke further of the Mission field in Mexico, detailing the educational and institutional work he is doing there and making a special appeal for his Medical Mission. At the close of his address special pledges were made to the amount of \$133.

There being no further business, on motion, the meeting adjourned.

12:15 P. M. Roll call. There were present fifty-nine delegates and three clergy.

12:30 P. M. Address by Miss Hicks, of Manilla, on the work in the Philippines and especially the hospital work in Manilla. The Filipino girls make excellent nurses; cost of educating and training a nurse, \$150.

Pledges for the training of a nurse were made to the amount of \$103.

The President read a letter from Bishop Nelson appointing Mrs. Rochester Treasurer for the remainder of the year.

2 P. M. Luncheon in the Presbyterian Parish House.

3 P. M. Business meeting resumed, the President in the chair. Letters were read from Miss Emery, Mr. George Gordon King and one on the apportionment.

The following resolutions were passed:

I. The Albany Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions assembled at Delhi for its semi-annual meeting desires to place on record the deep sense of loss and heart-felt sorrow in the death of its honored and beloved Bishop, the Rt. Rev. William Croswell Doane, D.D., LL.D., and to extend to his successor, the Rt. Rev. Richard H. Nelson, assurance of sympathy which shall, by God's help, find expression in greater service and increased usefulness.
