The Bishop read his Annual Address. Appendix A.

The report of the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary was read by the Bishop:

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SECRETARY OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The district secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary is glad to be able to report the formation of a branch at Tucson. Mrs. A. M. Franklin is its president. This branch has contributed to the Board of Missions.

The branch at Prescott has always been the banner branch. They have had monthly meetings and a good attendance. They have been making a systematic study of the missionary work of the Church.

The branch at Phoenix has held monthly meetings since November. They have taken up the study of American Church history and the study of the missions of the Church. The attendance at the meetings has greatly improved the past year. This branch has contributed to the Board of Missions.

We have two guild-auxiliaries in the district; guilds which resolve themselves into an auxiliary at the call of the president of the guild. There is one of these at Nogales and another at Globe.

The branch at Globe has held four meetings during the present year and the secretary reports the meetings as being "very interesting." This branch has contributed to the Board of Missions.

The branch at Nogales has held one meeting and has also contributed to the Board of Missions.

SECOND DAY.

Thursday, May 4, 1905.

Convocation was called to order after prayer by the Bishop.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

The report of the Committee on the State of the Church was made by Mr. Morford:

REPORT ON THE STATE OF THE CHURCH.

The searching, analytical consideration of the state of the Church in this Missionary District by the Bishop, as given in his very able annual address, leaves little or nothing to be presented by your committee, as to the detail conditions.

In general, it should be said that the Church in this District has never been in a more healthy churchly condition than it is today.

The effect of the arduous work of harmonizing and of weeding out conditions, and rectifying situations foreign to Church polity, that has been quietly going on, is becoming apparent.

The Church in the Southwest, especially in this and contiguous missionary districts, is peculiarly subjected to diverting and diversifying influences. The great distances between Church communities, the paucity of numbers in each of these communities, incline us to provincialism, and are centrifugal in effect upon the Church as a whole; while the fact that each church organization is made up of an in-

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SECRETARY OF THE WOMAN'S
AUXILIARY

The district secretary sincerely regrets that her report will be meagre and unsatisfactory. But it has been impossible to obtain reports from Tucson and Nogales. The secretary has written twice to these places, urging the absolute necessity of these reports, but has received no reply.

The most encouraging feature of the work this year, and a feature that has greatly gratified the district secretary, is the interest shown by the Rev. Mr. Simonson, at Douglas. He has written that he hopes and expects to form a regular branch of the Auxiliary at Douglas. This is good news; the most encouraging news that the secretary has received during her term of office.

The secretary of the Guild of Globe wrote to the secretary for definite information concerning a course of study, and the secretary recommended the book that the Phoenix branch is studying—"The Kingdom Growing," by the Rev. Lester Bradner. The Guild-Auxiliary at Globe is to be greatly commended. They take an intelligent interest in the work and they respond promptly and cordially to all requests from the district secretary.

All the branches have promised to send their quota for the apportionment of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. Globe, Nogales, Douglas, Phoenix and Prescott have each contributed. Tucson has promised and has probably done so.

The Phoenix branch has held regular monthly meetings and has been studying the mission work of the Church, which has proved most interesting. This branch has contributed to the Board of Missions and to Miss Thackara's mission hospital at Fort Defiance, and has deposited from time to time small sums in the savings bank for the United Offering of 1907.

The district secretary feels that there is more interest in the objects and aims of the Woman's Auxiliary than in any previous year since she has been in office and she feels encouraged.
