REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SECRETARY OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The District Secretary is unable to report the formation of any new branches, but she is glad to be able to report that all the branches already formed are doing work. And she wishes to especially mention the work of the Auxiliary in Douglas, which has sent fifty dollars to aid Miss Thackara in her mission-hospital at Fort Defiance. The Auxiliary at Globe has been holding regular meetings throughout the year and great interest has been manifested. The branch at Prescott has been holding regular monthly meetings and has taken up the study of the work in Alaska as the serious work of the winter. They have, as always, contributed to Miss Thackara's work, and to the United Offering. The membership of this branch, though small, is intelligently interested in the work of missions, have made missions a systematic study for several years. The branch at Phoenix has held regular monthly meetings and has taken up Bishop Tuttle's Reminiscences as a basis for study. They have taken up the subscription list for the Bishop's Quarterly as an active part of their work, and they hope, from year to year, to materially advance this interest. They also hope to advance the subscription list and interest in the Spirit of Missions. The Guild-Auxiliary at Tucson has not held regular meetings, but they have responded most courteously to requests from the District Secretary, and it is hoped that next year more active auxiliary work can be done. Bisbee and Nogales have not been heard from, but they are undoubtedly doing their duty, as they have done in the past. Arizona has been asked to contribute \$40.00 for the Woman's Auxiliary share of the Apportionment, and all the branches have expressed their willingness to do their share, and most have already done so. Three branches—Prescott, Globe and Phoenix—have contributed this year for the United Offering of 1910, and three branches—Globe, Prescott and Douglas—to Miss Thackara's hospital at Fort Defiance.
