## **DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH OFFICERS**

### **Finances**

The annual Branch Fee (minimum \$2) is due in January of each year. The Parish Treasurer should send this to the Diocesan Treasurer as early in the year as possible, and other moneys as soon as they are in hand.

Gifts for the United Thank Offering should be sent to the Treasurer of that fund; those for the Church Periodical Club to the Diocesan Director of that organization; and special gifts to churches and charities not under the Department of Missions of the National Council should be sent direct to the recipients.

In remitting funds for the United Thank Offering, checks should be made out to, "United Thank Offering, Diocese of Albany."

### **Box Work**

Always mention the name of your parish, your city or town, and the date of writing, in every communication.

The Box Secretary of the Diocesan Branch receives, in August, the allotment of Box Work for the Diocese. When your branch is ready to start work write to the Diocesan Box Secretary for an assignment.

When your branch has voted to undertake the work assigned to it, notify at once, the Box Secretary, and the missionary for whom the box is to be prepared.

All rejected assignments must be returned to the Box Secretary without delay.

When boxes are shipped, write to the missionary to whom it is addressed, and also send a report to the Box Secretary, on the authorized blanks.

No requests for additional new articles should be accepted by branches unless approved by the National or the Diocesan Box Secretary. This is to avoid duplication.

No credit can be given for boxes unless the work has been assigned by the Box Secretary.

### **Education**

The Educational Secretary sends to all branches in the Diocese during December a questionnaire, replies to which are her sources of information for the report she must send to the Church Missions House as well as to the Annual and Semi-Annual Diocesan Meetings. Branches are urged most earnestly to fill out these questionnaires and return promptly to the Educational Secretary.

### **Periodicals, Furnishings**

All boxes of books, single books, and magazines, should be reported through the Church Periodical Club.

All requests and gifts for church furnishings should be sent to the Correspondent for Church Furnishings.

### **Reports, etc.**

Any change in Branch Officers occurring during the year should be reported at once to the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. A. Abbott Hastings, 42 Maple Ave., Troy. This is important.

Keep in touch with the Vice President of your division, and for any desired information write to the diocesan officer having the particular matter in charge.



## FOREWORD

Dear Fellow-members of the Woman's Auxiliary:—

As usual when a year has closed, we let ourselves look backward and then forward. It is a help to know that in all the practical details of our work, in study, in Supply work, in giving, we have registered an advance, though not a great one. Moreover, new Branches have been organized, to be, let us hope, a source of blessing to their parishes, though some have faltered and withdrawn, at least for a time. The Church in the Diocese as a whole, too, increased its offerings for Extension by 10%, and in that we have our honorable part. And one outcome of this endeavor will be that as we and others in our parishes practice a deeper and more loyal devotion to God, we shall come to see more clearly how necessary the Church of God is to all our brothers the world over, and shall all give more gladly and generously to the blessed and loving work known as "Missions."

Let us all set to work at once along these three lines.

## REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING

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The 54th Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Albany was held at St. George's Church, Schenectady, on Thursday, April 22, 1937. Holy Communion was celebrated at 9:30 by Bishop Oldham, the Rev. Mr. George Bambach assisting. Approximately 150 participated. The United Thank Offering was presented. Greetings from the Parish were extended by the Rev. Mr. Bambach. The Bishop extended his greetings and asked prayers for the Diocesan Convention and the Triennial. Business meeting was called to order at 10:30 by Mrs. Henry Rodgers, the president. Mrs. Conover extended greetings in behalf of St. George's Auxiliary. Miss Elsie Hutton, president of the Woman's Auxiliary for the Province, was presented to the delegates and extended greetings. She congratulated the Diocese on both their U. T. O. and their Box Work. Report of the Recording Secretary was read and accepted. Report of the Treasurer, report of the U. T. O. Custodian (\$8,119.34), report of the Supply Secretary showing an increase of over \$1,100.00 in the work were also accepted as read. Also, reports of the Educational Secretary, C. P. C. Director, and Chairman of the Church Furnishings Committee. It was moved and seconded that these reports be accepted. Carried.

Report of the nominating committee received and accepted, and ballots were distributed. The following officers were elected: President, Mrs. Henry D. Rodgers; First Vice-President, Miss Sarah B. Tibbits; Treasurer, Mrs. William Gillespie; V. P.'s for Admin. Divisions; Mrs. James McGuire, Mrs. Bayard Pruyn, Mrs. Leon Frank Haley.

The Bishop extended greetings and said a closer contact was to be established between the Auxiliary and the Diocesan Convention. The report of the Corresponding Secretary was read and accepted. An invitation for the Semi-Annual meeting from St. Paul's Church, at Kinderhook, was read and accepted. It was reported that the U. T. O. at Communion amounted to \$40.44. The roll call showed 297 present, with 44 parishes represented; 1 Bishop, 1 Dean, 1 Provincial Officer, 10 Clergy, 2 Deaconesses, 3 Laymen, and 271 members.

Noonday prayers were conducted by the Rev. Mr. Bambach.

The President in her address emphasized the fact that a flourishing church depends upon each individual's flourishing religion. The President introduced Deaconess Stewart, of Hankow, China, who gave a most comprehensive address concerning the work at that mission. The Rev. Nelson Burroughs gave information as to the Young People's Conference at Silver Bay.

Following luncheon, it was moved and seconded that we hold the Annual Meeting in 1938 at the same time as the Diocesan Convention. Carried.

Moved and carried that we extend a rising vote of thanks to the women of St. George's parish for their hospitality. An interesting and instructive U. T. O. play, "The Vision of Hester Brown," was presented by a group of young women from St. George's Parish. Meeting adjourned.

## REPORT OF SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING

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The 54th Semi-Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Albany was held at St. Paul's Church, Kinderhook, on Thursday, November 4, 1937. Holy Communion was celebrated at 9:45 by Bishop Oldham, assisted by the Rev. Charles Lewis, D. D. and Archdeacon Purdy. Over 200 partook of communion. The organist and choir of the church were present. The U. T. O. amounted to \$52.50. Rev. Mr. Lewis gave greetings from the parish. The minutes of the Annual Meeting were read and accepted. Reports, all of which are in the yearbook, were given by the Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, U. T. O. Custodian, Supply Secretary, Educational Secretary, Director of the C. P. C., and the Correspondent for Church Furnishings. Mrs. Rodgers read a letter from Louis B. Franklin, Treasurer of the National Council, thanking the Diocese for their contribution of \$500.00 to the "China Emergency Fund." 279 responded to roll call, including 1 Bishop, 1 Archdeacon, 24 Clergy, 3 laymen, and the delegates. With the addition of late arrivals, a total of 299 were in attendance.

The Bishop gave a summary of the Triennial, and spoke of the lack of partisanship and expressed the belief that each should so worship as he could best. He felt that the Triennial was the most missionary-minded one ever had. He told also of the Oxford and Edinburgh conferences at which 45 nations and nearly every communion were represented. Church Unity was the theme.

Noonday prayers were led by the Rev. Mr. Lewis.

Following luncheon Mrs. Rodgers gave a report of the Triennial, Mrs. Conover reported the U. T. O. at Triennial, and Miss Tibbits reported on some of the addresses. The Rt. Rev. Henry St. George Tucker, our new Presiding Bishop, addressed the last meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary. Mrs. Raymond told of "What we saw at the Convention" and described "The Drama of Light," in which 1,000 participated, over a period of three hours. Mrs. Scudder read Mrs. Haley's report, "Missionary Contacts at the Convention." The meeting closed with Mrs. Rodgers' address, the Theme of which was "Christianity is a World Fellowship." Thanks were extended to Kinderhook for their delightful hospitality. The meeting was adjourned.

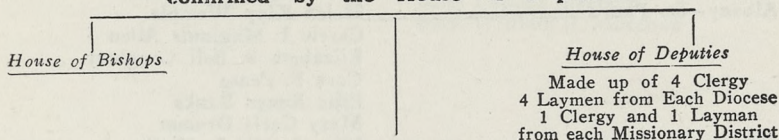

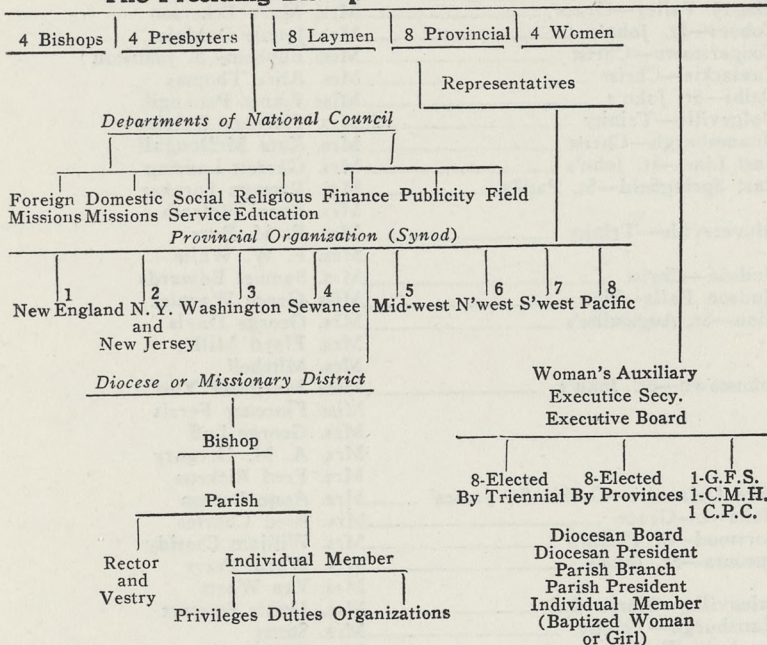
