## DIRECTIONS FOR PARISH OFFICERS

### Finances

The annual Branch Fee (minimum \$2) is due in January of each year. The Parish Treasurer should send this to the Diocesan Treasurer as early in the year as possible, and other moneys as soon as they are in hand.

Gifts for the United Thank Offering should be sent to the Treasurer of that fund; those for the Church Periodical Club to the Diocesan Director of that organization; and special gifts to churches and charities not under the Department of Missions of the National Council should be sent direct to the recipients.

In remitting funds for the United Thank Offering, checks should be made out to, "United Thank Offering, Diocese of Albany."

### Supply Work

Always mention the name of your parish, your city or town, and the date of writing, in every communication.

The Supply Secretary of the Diocesan Branch receives, in August, the allotment of Supply Work for the Diocese. When your branch is ready to start work write to the Diocesan Supply Secretary for an assignment.

When your branch has voted to undertake the work assigned to it, notify at once, the Supply Secretary, and the missionary for whom the box is to be prepared.

All rejected assignments must be returned to the Supply Secretary without delay.

When boxes are shipped, write to the missionary to whom it is addressed, and also send a report to the Supply Secretary, on the authorized blanks.

No requests for additional new articles should be accepted by branches unless approved by the National or the Diocesan Supply Secretary. This is to avoid duplication.

No credit can be given for boxes unless the work has been assigned by the Supply Secretary.

### Education

The Educational Secretary sends to all branches in the Diocese during December a questionnaire, replies to which are her sources of information for the report she must send to the Church Missions House as well as to the Annual and Semi-Annual Diocesan Meetings. Branches are urged most earnestly to fill out these questionnaires and return promptly to the Educational Secretary.

### Periodicals, Furnishings

All boxes of books, single books, and magazines, should be reported through the Church Periodical Club.

All requests and gifts for church furnishings should be sent to the Correspondent for Church Furnishings.

### Reports, etc.

Any change in Branch Officers occurring during the year should be reported at once to the Corresponding Secretary. This is important.

Keep in touch with the Vice-President of your division, and for any desired information write to the diocesan officer having the particular matter in charge.

## FOREWORD

Dear Fellow-members of the Woman's Auxiliary:

The year just past is a milestone of thankfulness for us in that for the first time in several years we in this Diocesan Auxiliary measured up to our expectations, in completing, and a little more, the sum of \$3,000 for General Missions. It is known that many sacrifices entered into this giving, and undoubtedly they were joyous sacrifices, made in humility and gratitude.

The coming year is one of unusual opportunity. As the second year of the Triennium in which we are emphasizing Fellowship, Peace and Evangelism, we are not going to lose our momentum in the pursuit of Christian Unity, while going on to think, pray and work more definitely for World Peace. Christian fellowship is marching on. The great meeting at Madras last December issued in a real unity of spirit within the diversity of views and races represented. That the Church of Christ is one, and is "the corporate universal bond of all mankind", will be increasingly shown among us in our local meetings, as we allow the love of God to have its way among us in our relations with Christians of other branches of the Church. And in like manner let us bring all our intelligence and trust in God to bear on the urgent subject of Peace. Our Educational Secretary will tell us where to find material for study on this great matter, so that we can learn what we can do to further it. Someone has suggested that as we women give up our "spare time" activities to devote ourselves to nursing when some member of the family is sick, so now that the world is grievously ill in social and international ways, we can give up some of our "spare time" in an attempt to bring the sick world healing, through prayer, through intelligent love for mankind, through speech and action.

These are high matters, yet all of us can help to further them, by taking up our responsibilities as Christians just where we are. In every parish we of the Woman's Auxiliary have a duty to all women and girls, to help relate them to the task of the Church, which is no less than "proclaiming individually and corporately the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ." To this end it may seem advisable to a Branch to undertake a survey of the women and girls of the parish, their individual needs and capacities, so that we may better present the claims of the mission of the Church. It is our duty to take part in the timely work of "raising the giving power of the Church permanently" in order that the Gospel may be more adequately proclaimed.

Let us remember the verse of the Psalm, "The Lord gave the word; great was the company of women that bare the tidings."

## REPORT OF ANNUAL MEETING

---

The 55th Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Albany was held in conjunction with the Diocesan Convention on Tuesday, May 3, 1938, at the Cathedral of All Saints, Albany. The Holy Communion was celebrated with Dean Welles as the celebrant. The United Thank Offering was presented at this time and amounted to \$79.40. Bishop Oldham then gave his annual address to the Convention in place of the sermon.

At the close of the service, luncheon was served in St. Paul's Parish House, and the business meeting followed in the Church. Mrs. Henry D. Rodgers, the president of the Auxiliary, called the meeting to order with prayer. Mrs. James McGuire extended the greetings for St. Paul's Branch, and spoke of being proud to be the first parish to entertain the Auxiliary under the new plan. The roll call followed and 324 were present, representing 60 parishes.

The reports of the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer were read and accepted, and the United Thank Offering Custodian informed us that \$1,700 was in the Treasury. The Supply Secretary was greatly encouraged by the cooperation of all of the parishes. The Educational Secretary's report and those of the Church Periodical Club and the Church Furnishings Committee were read, and they were accepted. There was evidence of real enthusiasm in all of the reports.

The report of the Nominating Committee was presented by Mrs. Conover. The following officers were elected: Second Vice-President, Mrs. Fritz Beiermeister; Recording Secretary, Mrs. Henry F. Mace; Educational Secretary, Mrs. W. A. Partee; Vice-President for First Division, Rural Deanery of Troy, Mrs. G. Brooks Kafka; Vice-President for Second Division, Rural Deanery of Troy, Mrs. W. G. Baxter.

Mrs. Leon F. Haley of Madrid told us of the Prayer Partners in the diocese; and the Silver Bay Conference for Young People on July 3 was announced. Mrs. Rodgers spoke of the meeting for leaders of the Woman's Auxiliary at Watkins Glen.

The Interdenominational luncheon for women to be held on May 17 at Trinity Methodist Church was announced. Our representative is Mrs. George Taylor.

An invitation to hold the Semi-annual Meeting at Johnstown on October 20 was accepted.

At this time our president introduced Miss Grace Lindley, Executive Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, as the speaker of the afternoon. She emphasized the marked influence which the members of the Woman's Auxiliary exerts in furthering the principles of Christianity in the mission field, in our home country, and in our parishes. Miss Lindley said that we are beginning to understand what Christianity is and that our opportunity in the world is tremendous.

Mrs. Rodgers thanked the women of St. Paul's Church for their hospitality, and with a closing prayer the meeting was adjourned.

## REPORT OF SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING

---

The 55th Semi-Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Albany was held at St. John's Church, Johnstown, N. Y., on the 20th day of October, 1938. The Rector of the parish, the Reverend Roscoe C. Hatch, celebrated Holy Communion at eleven o'clock. The business meeting was called to order by Mrs. Henry D. Rodgers, after which Mr. Hatch greeted the Delegates. The Minutes of the Annual Meeting were read and accepted. The reports found in the Year Book were read by the Supply and the Educational Secretaries. Mrs. William A. Partee announced the all-day meeting at St. John's Church, Troy, for November 3rd, at which time study classes will be held in the morning and afternoon. It was further announced that Mrs. Henry D. Rodgers will lead the morning class and her subject will be "India." The afternoon class will be led by Mrs. Partee, her subject being "The City Church." Mrs. J. S. Conover of Schenectady announced a 6% increase for the United Thank Offering over and above that of the last Triennial. The amount was \$3,709.11, \$27 of this having been given at the Service of the Holy Communion on that day.

A new office has been created of Assistant to the President and Chairman of the Committee on the Devotional Life. Mrs. Robert W. Woodrooffe serves in this office and she has asked each Parish Branch to appoint a representative.

As all reports were most gratifying they were, moved, seconded and carried for acceptance. Two hundred and twenty-five were present at the Roll Call. Noon-day Prayers were led by the Reverend Mr. Hatch.

Following Noon-day Prayers Miss Margaret Jefferson, field Sec'y. of the G. F. S., spoke on the three phases of Girls Friendly program—prayer, self-government and leadership. She made it plain that there was a close affiliation with the Woman's Auxiliary.

The next speaker was Miss Sarah Reid of Shanghai, China. She told the sad story of recent war events in Shanghai, especially emphasizing the anti-religious and anti-Chinese program of the Japanese. Her address was followed by luncheon at one o'clock. Following luncheon, literature was distributed by the G. F. S. and the Educational Secretary.

Mrs. Henry D. Rodgers gave the President's address and informed us what the Church was doing for Missions with reference to study, prayer (Quiet Day), supply boxes, Church Periodical Clubs, Church furnishings, gifts and United Thank Offering.

The Interdenominational Meeting of the Church women at the Emmanuel Church, Albany, was announced. Mrs. Haley reported on the meeting of the 2nd province and especially emphasized the provincial scholarship which goes to Bishop Carson's Children's Home, in Haiti.

The meeting closed with a resolution thanking the women of Johnstown for their hospitality. Upon motion the meeting adjourned.




