MINUTES OF THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING OF
THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY OF THE
JURISDICTION OF ASHEVILLE.

The Eleventh Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was called to order by Bishop Horner in St. James' Church, Lenoir, N. C., on Tuesday, June 25th at 4 p. m. The Bishop in his address spoke of the work done by the Auxiliary in helping to build the Rectory at Wilkesboro and also the help given Micadale and Balsam. The fruit of the Micadale work appears in the training of a young woman in Philadelphia to become a Deaconess. The Bishop suggested two different objects for our Diocesan work the coming year, — Valle Crucis or the Rectory at Hickory, saying that both were worthy, but that we should not divide our help. Roll call was answered by fifteen members representing eight branches. Roll call for Juniors was answered by one,

The President and Treasurer read her report showing an increase in money given but a decrease in boxes.

Miss Martin's report of the United Offering shows the sum total in Bank June 1st, \$925.00 and hopes it will reach \$1,000 by Oct. 1st. Miss Martin also read the report of the Junior Auxiliary.

Mrs. Royster's report for Babies' Branch shows no increase in numbers. Contributions \$34.00.

The report on Mission Study by Mrs. Chester was read by the Secretary.

The report of the Church Periodical Club from Mrs. Chapman was read by the Secretary.

The Annual Letter from Miss Julia C. Emery was read by the Secretary. Also instructions regarding the delegates to the Triennial Convention in Richmond in 1907.

A letter from Miss Mann of the Diocese of Fond du Lac asking for our interest in support of the work among the Oneida Indians was read.

The President regretted that so few of the branches responded to the United work of the Auxiliary and hoped for more another year.

The President announced that at the Officers' meeting it was thought best to place General Missions at the 1st quarter and District Missions at the 3rd quarter.

The President also read an assessment list for General Missions and for the Central fund, to which no objections were raised.

The Bishop then introduced Rev. Mr. Savage, who made a strong plea in behalf of the Valle Crucis work.

Rev. John S. Moody spoke in behalf of the much needed funds for the Rectory at Hickory.

Rev. Walter J. Smith thanked the Auxiliary for past favors and begged their continued interest in the Thompson Orphanage.

The meeting was then adjourned until Wednesday morning at nine o'clock.

On Wednesday, June 26th at 9 A. M. the meeting was called to order by the President.

Miss Martin moved that the voting be done by Branches. Seconded by Miss Caisson. Vote taken and carried, six for branches, two for members.

President called for standing vote for Valle Crucis or Hickory. Valle Crucis received four votes and Hickory three votes.

The vote for Domestic Missions was unanimous for Thompson Orphanage.

Vote for Foreign work was then called for. Mrs. Horner made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Royster, that we continue our work for the Training School in Japan. Vote was unanimous.

The Secretary made a motion, seconded by Miss Martin, to thank Dr. Butler for his splendid and interesting sermon. Vote was carried unanimously.

A rising vote of thanks to the Lenoir Branch was given for their delightful hospitality. Meeting adjourned.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF MISSION STUDY.
1907.

Another year of mercies and blessings has passed, and we should come, with thankful hearts, remembering the injunction to "Rejoice in the Lord alway." Even when the report of Mission Study cannot be just what we should like to hear, there is always hope for something better, and we may find good reason for what the pessimist would call discouragement. Last year it was resolved to put into the hands of each Branch, "The Kingdom Growing," as a good text book for study, and highly recommended by the Rev. Everett P. Smith, the Educational Secretary.

It had been tried in one Branch last year and so much liked, it was

resolved to take the lessons another year. These books were distributed as generally as possible, but on account of incorrect addresses some of the Branches were not reached. There are still three copies left, and if any Branch needs one it will give me pleasure to send it, when I have a correct address. Twenty-five letters have been written. Nineteen answers have come to me. Of these, six have taken up Mission Study, four having used "The Kingdom Growing." The other two have read "The Spirit of Missions," which is full of interest and contains good accounts of mission work in all the fields, and should be considered study, to a certain extent.

One letter was so encouraging that I must make some short quotations. "The members of the Woman's Auxiliary have studied with much interest "The Kingdom Growing. In our study of Indian Missions an interesting paper was read upon "Indian Characteristics, and how Modified by Christian Influences;" by another member, A Sketch of John Eliot, the first Apostle to the Indians." The study is exercising a broadening influence upon us all, and emphasizing the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man."

To those Branches who say that there are so few to come the study is not taken up, may we not suggest that even two or three may make the study of Missions instructive and helpful, and the more we know the more we wish to know. The Rev. Everett P. Smith is recommending study classes, which take up the different fields of work, and he writes that papers are prepared for use.

Last year many Branches studied the Islands in the Pacific. Quotations are given by Mr. Smith from letters, in which the students express their delight, and even clergymen wish to join the classes.

Let us begin our new year with the thought that we must "work while it is day, for the night cometh wherein no man can work." And if we have faith in our Risen Lord, and pray that His kingdom may come, we must show our faith by our works, For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also."

REPORT OF THE "JUNIOR AUXILIARY."

The full Report of the "Junior's" shows the same number of members, about three hundred, notwithstanding the fact that six new Branches at Bat Cave, Edneyville, North Wilkesboro, Lenoir, Rutherfordton and Saluda have been formed during the year. Unfortunately, an equal number have, for various but compelling reasons, been disbanded; therefore there are still but nineteen Junior Auxiliaries in the District. Often we hear that boys are not interested in Junior work, yet we have sixty-two boys doing good work, and this does not include the boys in All Soul's Sunday School, Biltmore.

The Juniors have sent out eight boxes this year, against five for last, and while small both in size and value, they show the desire on the part of the children to "do for others." Also a lectern, prayer-desk, and hymn-board were made by the All Soul's Sunday School and sent to the new chapel at Christ School, the whole value of boxes and furniture being \$60.05.

They have given in money their full apportionment to general missions, to domestic and district missions, also to foreign through the united work of the Junior Department in New York, to the United Offering, and to the Thompson Orphanage, as well as some special work in many of the Branches. The total amount of money and boxes last year was \$168.93. This year the sum total was \$214.65.

I wish again as I did last year to beg the members of the Auxiliary to take an interest - an active personal one - in the children in the Junior Branches of the Auxiliary. The development of their work, both spiritual and practical is particularly important, as they are now the cornerstone of missionary work, and will in the future be called upon to take

the places of those who are at present working and praying in the Auxiliary. They should, therefore, be so well trained in their youth, by you their leaders, that they will be not only ready but well prepared to take up your mantle when it falls upon them.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY OF THE DISTRICT OF ASHEVILLE.

CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this Society is the Asheville Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

II.

The object of this Society is to diffuse knowledge of the Missionary work of the whole Church among the women of the District; to increase their interest and activity in the work; to encourage the formation of parish branches of this Society; and by means of united and systematic efforts to prosecute the work of Church Extension.

III.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, who shall perform the duties of Treasurer; a Vice-President; a Recording Secretary; a Secretary for the Junior Branch; a Treasurer for the United Offering; a Secretary for Mission Study; a Secretary for the Church Periodical Club; and a Secretary for the Babies' Branch.

These officers shall constitute the Advisory Board of the Auxiliary of the District.

Vacancies in the Advisory Board shall be filled by appointment of the Bishop from nominations to him by the Advisory Board of two names for each vacancy. The Bishop may call together the Advisory Board at any time to make nominations for vacancies.

IV.

The duties of the President are to call all meetings, preside at them, and to have the general oversight and direction of the work of the Society, and as Treasurer to receive all money sent her and disburse the same in accordance with the determination of the Society at its annual meeting, making a detailed report of same to the Society.

V.

The duties of the Vice-President are to act as member of the Advisory Board and in the absence of the President to preside at all meetings of the Society.

VI.

The duties of the Recording Secretary are to keep the minutes of all meetings of the Society, and with the President, to have charge of the printing of its reports and other documents, and to conduct such correspondence with the parent society and other branches as the President may direct and approve.

VII.

The duties of the Secretary for the Junior Branch are to call all meetings of the Juniors, to preside at them, and to have the general oversight and direction of the work of the Juniors, and as Treasurer to receive all money contributed by Juniors and disburse the same in accordance with the determination of the Junior Society at its annual meeting.

VIII.

The duties of the Secretary for the Babies' Branch are to have the general oversight and direction of the work of the Babies, and to receive and disburse the money contributed by the same.

IX.

The duties of the Treasurer of the United Offering are to correspond with Parish Branches and with individuals in regard to this offering, to receive all money contributed therefor, and to present the same at the Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

X.

The duties of the Secretary for Mission Study are to keep on hand a supply of literature on the Foreign, Domestic and District Missions of the Church, and to advise with parish branches in regard to the study of the Missions of the Church.

XI.

The duties of the Secretary for the Church Periodical Club are to correspond with the parish branches of this Club and to have the general oversight of the work of the Club in this District.

XII.

The duties of the Advisory Board are to meet at the call of the President, to advise with her in regard to the general work of the Auxiliary in the District and to nominate to the Bishop names to fill vacancies in the Board. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

XIII.

Each Parish Branch shall send to the President, acting as Treasurer all money contributed for Missionary work, except such special contributions as the Branch may prefer to send direct to the beneficiary, and shall make to the President an annual report of all work done by the Branch.

XIV.

There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Society at such time and place as may be determined upon by the Society itself, and in the absence of such determination by the Society, the President, upon consultation with the Bishop, shall appoint the time and place of the Annual Meeting.

XV.

At the Annual Meeting, each Parish Branch shall be entitled to one delegate and an additional delegate for each additional ten members of the Branch after the first ten.

XVI.

All officers of the Society shall make a report of all work done under their direction, to the Annual Meeting of the Society, and the same shall be printed in the Annual Report of the Auxiliary.

XVII.

At the Annual Meetings of the Society, any member of a Parish Branch shall be entitled to vote on all questions, unless there is a call by at least two delegates for a vote by Parish Branches, in which case only delegates shall be entitled to vote.

XVIII

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the Society, voting by Parish Branches at any Annual Meeting, provided the Bishop approves of such amendment.
