## Report of Fourteenth Annual Meeting.

APRIL 30TH, 1894.

The Fourteenth Annual Meeting was held in the beautiful new Trinity Church, San Francisco, on Monday, April 30th, 1894. At the opening service the Bishop celebrated the Holy Communion, assisted by the Rev. F. J. Mynard, dean of the Northern Convocation, the Rev. Hobart Chetwood and the Rev. Geo. E. Walk, Rector. The Rev. W. H. Moreland preaching from the text, Romans 1:7, "Called to be saints," drew every heart to a holier height, and gave every heart a brighter hope of that personal consecration which shall make the Church a witness for her Lord, closing with a most tender and fitting remembrance of Sister Helen's life and example.

By a slight innovation on the custom of other years, an officers' meeting was held at 11:30, at which some routine business was quickly disposed of. The reports of Secretary and Treasurer being deferred until the larger meeting in the afternoon, the Vice-Presidents from the city parishes were nominated and pledges for central expenses were made. Mrs. Newlands reported a meeting held Sunday at St. Paul's in the interest of the Junior Auxiliary. This department has grown to such proportions that a general secretary for its work was suggested. By vote of the meeting the office was created, and Miss F. Elizabeth Bishop, of Oakland, was nominated to fill it.

The Secretary reported that the unanimous voice of all the Branches from which she could hear was in favor of using the United Offering as a fund to keep perpetually a new missionary bishop in the field. The meeting endorsed this opinion by a unanimous vote.

The President called attention to the Round Robins, especially to the one written by Bishop Nichols about the history of the Church in California.

The Secretary explained the advantages of the envelope system for raising the \*Diocesan Fund each year—the fund which the Auxiliary puts at the Bishop's disposal.

At one o'clock the Auxiliary enjoyed the hospitality of the ladies of Trinity parish, bountiful as ever.

At half past two the missionary meeting in the Church was called to order by the President, and opened with prayer. The roll-call showed twenty-four Branches represented. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the morning business meeting. The retiring officers were nominated to serve another year, and re-elected by a rising vote, with the addition of Miss Bishop for the new office of Secretary of the Junior Department. The Vice-Presidents from the City parishes were announced.

The Treasurer read a very clear report of the general receipts and expenditures, deferring her statement of the year's work until reports received at the last moment and hurriedly incorporated by the Secretary might be verified.

The Secretary's report followed.

The Bishop's address was encouraging and helpful as his addresses to us always are. He expressed his wish to use the Diocesan Fund this year again in the City Mission. Three Missionaries, Mr. Freer, Mr. Waterman and Mr. Robinson

made interesting addresses, Mr. Waterman mentioning especially the encouragement given his people at Tulare by receiving the altar recently sent by the Auxiliary, the first fruits of the altar fund.

We were very happy in having with us Miss Berry, President of the recent Congress of Missions. She thanked the Auxiliary for the very efficient aid rendered by its representatives to the Committee of Arrangements which prepared for the Congress, and spoke of the great bond which unites Christians of all names—the love and service of our Master.

Just before the close of the meeting Mrs. D. O. Kelley, who saw Sister Helen daily during her service as a deaconess, spoke touchingly of her character and work, told us of some of the people in whom she had been most interested, and suggested some directions in which the Auxiliary might, in memory of her, continue her work. The remainder of the Diocesan Fund for April was put by vote of the meeting at Mrs. Kelley's disposal for that purpose.

The meeting closed with the Bishop's benediction.

## Fourteenth Annual Report.

The silent passing of the years has been likened to the dropping of pearl by pearl from a broken necklace as its wearer floats down stream with eye on the distance, and no thought of loss until its last white drop has left its string. Rather, I would ask you to think of our Auxiliary years that have gone, and of this fourteenth year now closing, as bright jewels added one by one to the crown of church womanhood. Each has its own peculiar color, but all are precious for they have taken of the light but to give it back again, and all are safe because they are no longer yours or mine.

In the intricate lines of plans and counsels, considerations and reconsiderations, adjustment of means, and re-adjustment of material that cross and re-cross this year's record of boxes and money, of services and meetings, I see a work far beyond the power of any Secretary to report adequately, but a work that calls on me to assert that however boxes and cash may sum up, the richest giving of the year has been in time and trouble and patience, and that the fourteenth year of our Auxiliary shall have a luster all its own, which the future only may reveal.

In vacation your officers were busied with arrangements for the Missionary Council expected in San Francisco, and with rearrangements on account of the Council that did not come.

The Semi-Annual Meeting at the Church of the Advent, September 11th, was especially favored by the presence of the Bishop of Tokyo going to Japan and of the Honorary Secretary coming home; and beautifully did their addresses focus on Auxiliary work. Bishop Nichols, returning from the interment of Mrs. Kip, addressed the meeting in loving words of memory of her, and of encouragement to us who labor while she has rest. On motion, carried by a rising vote, the following minute was put on record:

"As, at the Annual Meeting in June, our hearts were saddened by the recent death of our first Bishop; so, on the next occasion of general gathering we mourn the loss of his wife, our chief auxiliary, Mrs. Maria Laurence Kip. All that was said then of love and honor we felt for both, and all that we can now say is that we thank God for the beauty and the grace that have survived the years, and beyond the grave are guerdons of reunion—the sweet reward of these true souls."

On Wednesday, October 4th, in St. Stephen's Church, the Bishop set apart Sister Helen E. Reed for the work of a Deaconess in the Church of God. The record of her short service is in the hearts of the sufferers she blessed, in the lives of the sinful she brought near to God. You all know the rest—how in just five months afterward she entered Paradise. You do not expect of me to-day a panegyric of that dear life, for so many years an open book to me. She would not wish it. I could not utter it. She was my own. But I must speak to the Auxiliary of the Deaconess. Above all else, even above her own career, Sister Helen had at heart the Deaconess movement as it had been fostered by the women of the Church under the guidance of Mrs. Twing, and finally had sanction in the canons of the National Church. She conceived clearly the functions of a Deaconess to be largely missionary in the seeking for souls and the teaching of divine truth under priestly direction, and all her hopes and ambitions ran parallel with the movement as it developed. You remember her intelligence in all lines of church teaching; her unbiased interest in every department of the church work; how, when she filled my place that I might go East, she need not be told who was missionary here or there, or what were the present needs. And if I could ask her



"What, Helen, shall I say to the California Auxiliary to-day for you?" do you not know that back would come the answer, "Ask them to be Auxiliaries in the best sense, themselves helpers and the senders of helpers to the dear Church. *Ask them not to let the Deaconess movement in California die with me.*" Singularly have we been blessed that in our first Deaconess character and vocation combined to form the Deaconess type as differentiated from other types of service. It is for us to cherish this ideal, and so to take up her work

At a Conference of general officers with our city Vice-Presidents it has been decided to give up the awkward title, Associated Parishes, and hereafter to hold a general meeting on the first Monday of every month at the churches in San Francisco in rotation; when, after a business meeting, at which the President will call for reports from the Branches represented, a more public Missionary Meeting will follow. The annual dues of one dollar from members, with all money gifts from parishes not having Auxiliary Branches, and all other monies paid by individuals to the Diocesan Treasurer will form a contingent fund; to be paid as has been hitherto, this income of the Associated Parishes to work not provided by Branches, and accredited to the several parishes whence it comes. St. Paul's, San Francisco, took a step in aid of this change, when, early in last December, it set off its workers as a chapter of the Parish Guild, the Vice-President being made Chairman. It has done a good work, aggregating \$76.90 — boxes \$48.40, cash \$28.50. The Rector has declared the Sunday School a Junior Auxiliary, and gives it missionary instruction when a fifth Sunday falls in the month. These children sent a nice Christmas box to a Sunday School gathered by a church woman in a new field, and reports its Lenten Offering \$17.70, total \$35.15. Total by S. Paul's \$62.60.

In Grace Church the Ministering Women and Children report a work valued at \$176.70, S. Agatha's Guild, \$83.80; total in Grace Parish \$260.50.

The Mizpah Club contributed to an Easter box in value \$9.65.

S. Luke's Parochial Missionary Society has done a work reported at \$466.40, boxes \$134.15, cash \$332.25. Besides this, the Sunday School gave a Christmas box to a mission, value \$20, and the Junior Auxiliary, a box to an Orphanage, \$5; total by S. Luke's \$491.40.

S. Peter's Missionary Chapter has given material for a vestment \$6, cash \$4.75, total \$10.75.

The Parochial Missionary Chapter of Trinity Church has reorganized, its officers helping in the readjustment of our city work by combining all the woman's missionary work within the parish that is not included in S. Mary's Guild, another efficient branch. The Missionary Chapter reports boxes, \$256.03, cash \$270.00, total \$526.03; S. Mary's Guild, vestments \$55, cash \$22, total \$77: total by Trinity \$603.03.

Included in the work of the Associated Parishes are the gifts of S. John's Parish Aid, boxes \$29, cash \$33; and of S. Katherine Chapter, boxes \$26, cash \$1; total by S. John's \$89.

The Golden Circle of the King's Daughters has given a silver-plated gold-lined communion set to four several missions, aggregating in price \$38.70; the Willing Circle, altar linen, \$7.35. These are also included in the report of the Associated Parishes.

From the Juniors in S. James' Mission, Point Lobos, has gone a set of altar linen to the Divinity School, San Mateo, and presents to Mission Sunday Schools valued at \$13.00; the Ministering Children's League, Juniors, dressed dolls for a Mission Sunday School, value \$3.00; total by S. James', \$16.00.



By Branches in San Francisco: Boxes in value \$828.18, cash \$675.20; total \$1,503.38.

By Associated Parishes: Boxes in value \$352.65, cash \$357.23; total \$709.88.

Total boxes in San Francisco \$1,180.83, total cash \$1,032.42; grand total in San Francisco \$2,213.26.

Early in Lent the Pastor of Christ Church, Alameda, called together his three woman's societies to consider with the Diocesan Secretary how to share in the work. They decided to form no new organization, but to work as a whole. Mite chests for the United Offering were taken, and envelopes for the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund; and two boxes in value \$68.70 were sent at Easter, and \$1 given to the Altar Fund.

The Juniors in S. Paul's, Bakersfield, have begun a new and vigorous career under the direction of the missionary's wife. The Seniors sent \$2.50 to the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund.

In S. Mark's, Berkeley, the women have done a good work for the Church's institutions. What has been done by the Auxiliary is reported as boxes \$60.00, cash \$24.00, total \$84.00.

Again S. James' Guild, Fresno, worked as an Auxiliary during Lent, providing vestments for a clergyman \$23.50, gifts to the Orphanage by the Parish through the Auxiliary \$29. The S. Agnes Guild has given boxes valued at \$12.00. The Sunday School, Juniors, report their Lenten offering \$41.25. Total by S. James', Fresno, \$105.75.

S. Michael's, Fowler, holds a brave band of women whose energies have been given for others as well as for the local work, in time of great financial embarrassment. They have given boxes in value \$48.40 and cash \$1.00, total \$49.40.

The work of the Branches in Fresno Flats has not been given wholly to their own Church. The Seniors sent a box to an Orphanage valued at \$20, and cash \$2.00; the Juniors boxes \$2.50: total \$24.50. What was done for the local work is reported by Seniors \$18.45, Juniors \$15, total \$55.95.

The Ladies Aid Society of Trinity, Hayward, has sent a box valued at \$6.00, cash \$1.00.

From the small society in Hueneme comes this message: We have some little money, but with no prospect of building very soon, so should like it to bear interest. How can we help the Auxiliary? The Guild declared itself an Auxiliary Branch, a nice Christmas box was provided valued at \$27. Carefully considering the claims of the several Auxiliary Funds the five members paid \$1 to the Altar Fund and pledged \$2.50 monthly to Maria Kip Orphanage and 60 cents to the Diocesan Auxiliary Fund, putting what cash remained in the mite chest for the United Offering. This is a sermon in giving, all text. By Trinity Guild, Hueneme, a total of \$31.10.

S. Mary's, Lompoc, has furnished altar linen for a mission. Besides, it has made up a box for an Orphanage \$21.95, the Junior Auxiliary adding to it in value \$4.50; total \$44.45.

S. Paul's Woman's Auxiliary, Los Angeles, has given in boxes \$166.75, in cash \$90; total \$256.75. The Sunday School Juniors, boxes \$24.45, cash \$1.14; total \$25.59. The Little Missionaries of the Ellis Avenue Sunday School, boxes \$41.20, cash \$10.20. Total by S. Paul's, Los Angeles, \$333.74.

Again a *memento mori*! For now our first band of Juniors gathered by our Vice-President early in her work in Los Angeles, counts one member in Paradise, Katharine McFarland, our first Junior Auxiliary, its first Secretary. The fourteenth year of the California Branch is rich in first fruits of consecrated womanhood: Mrs. Kip's first woman's auxiliary in every interpretation of the term; Sister Helen, our one Deaconess; Katharine McFarland, gentle pioneer of the



ever increasing band of Junior Auxiliaries, vanguard, we trust, of a mighty host. Grant them, O Lord, eternal rest; and let perpetual light shine on them!

No report has been received from the Branch in Christ Church, Los Angeles, beyond the enthusiastic giving of \$3.00 to the Altar Fund.

From S. John's the Rector writes: "Our Woman's Guild will work as an Auxiliary from the first Sunday in Advent until Easter Day, thus giving the greater part of its time to Missions. We have a strong Woman's Guild; to cut it up would weaken it, and rob it of its present efficiency." This is exactly as we would have it, and with the examples of the Rev'd Mr. Taylor and the Rev'd Mr. Perkins before us I will ask you to see how this arrangement simplifies two great complexities of Auxiliary work, expressed by the questions, "Who are the Auxiliaries in a Parish?" and, "What is Auxiliary work?" A separate organization will ever be open to the asking of these questions, unless officers are alert in adjusting differences of opinion as they arise, and constant in defining and explaining what may be Auxiliary work.

But let the Pastor say to various officers, "The woman's mission work of my Parish is hereafter to be done with the Auxiliary, and I appoint So and So your Auxiliary Secretary." For us the association is clearly defined. Our correspondent, always in consultation with her Rector, lays before the organization in her Parish the plans of work as arranged by diocesan officers in consultation with the Bishop, or writes to the diocesan officers of plans suggested by the interest of her own Branch, and asks their co-operation. If an Auxiliary Chapter or an Auxiliary committee of the Parish Guild or a separate Woman's Missionary Society is her means of special missionary work, through them she reaches all departments of woman's and children's work in the parish, gleaning from all, stimulating all. Or, as is generally a better plan, if existing woman's societies, as in the cases cited above, form the Parochial Branch, giving time and money, as may in every case be defined by the parish itself, missionary giving will be larger, less burdensome to those who have it most at heart, parish claims and missionary claims will not conflict, and O! special unction to the mind of a distracted Diocesan Secretary, there will be some likeness among the annual reports of the various Branches.

S. John's new Branch, besides providing opportunity for this argument, has given a missionary box valued at \$30.00 and has contributed \$3.00 to the Altar Fund by the Chapters of its Guild.

The first Oakland Society to be reported here, the Auxiliary in S. John's, is a perfect illustration of the good working of this principle.

From the Secretary I received an absolutely correct report of the several Chapters; and to her I would refer you for details. I have but to turn over the clearly written pages and, jotting down the several footings, give you the sum total: The Sunday School, a Junior Auxiliary, cash \$115.00; the S. Agnes Chapter, a working Junior Branch, boxes \$33.85, cash \$23.50, the Altar Chapter, vestments to an Orphanage \$13.25, cash \$1, the Auxiliary Chapter boxes \$82.70, cash \$32. Total by S. John's, boxes \$129.80, cash \$172.50, grand total \$302.30.

In the Church of the Advent, East Oakland, no regular Branch exists, but the Guild is always helpful with the missionary boxes, giving at Easter a package valued at \$6.00.

In S. Andrew's, Oakland, missionary work has not been neglected, although its members have shared in new parochial enterprises. The Branch has given to missionary boxes in value \$8.25, money \$9.50, total \$17.75.

In S. Paul's, now a venerable example of the Guild—the Auxiliary, S. Paul's Guild reports, to missionary boxes \$63.75, cash \$199.05, total \$262.80. The Sunday School reports through the Auxiliary \$20.



Trinity Mission has given by the Sisters of Bethany a package valued at \$5.00, cash \$5.00; Trinity Guild, Juniors, boxes \$23.50; S. Agnes' Guild, Juniors, boxes \$4.00. Total by Trinity \$37.50.

Grace Mission, Oceanside, has given in boxes \$19.00. A beautiful custom of the Sunday School is kept up despite hard times. At the Bishop's visitation one of the Juniors carries to him at the offertory a five dollar gold piece for the work he asks of the Auxiliary. Total by Grace Mission \$24.00. San Luis Rey, a sister mission, sends a contribution to the Alaska box valued at \$1.00.

The largely increased Sunday School in S. Mary's-by-the-Sea, Pacific Grove, reports \$52.50 cash; the Guild, boxes \$25.15, cash \$22.75. Total by S. Mary's \$100.40.

The Woman's Auxiliary in S. Paul's, Pomona, has provided boxes valued at \$28.68 and cash \$6.30; the Sunbeams, Juniors, boxes \$5.75, cash \$6.00. Total by S. Paul's, Pomona, \$46.73.

The Woman's Auxiliary in All Saints, Pasadena, has made up two good missionary boxes, aggregating in value \$88.75, and has given \$21 in cash. The Sunday School Juniors divided the Easter offering among the foreign, domestic and diocesan fields, \$54.00. Total by All Saints, Pasadena, \$163.75.

Just as this is writing news comes of the formation of a Branch in Trinity Mission, Redlands.

The Guild of San Anselmo, Ross Valley, has contributed \$14.00 to missionary boxes, and \$1.00 to the Altar Fund. The Ross Valley Branch of the Needlework Guild of North America sent to Diocesan officers a most timely box containing eighty new and excellent garments, which were distributed at Christmas among the various boxes, in value \$45.

S. Paul's, San Diego, is represented by its Secretary to-day, for the first time in our history, and I wish she might make her own report, and tell you of the labors and discouragement that, as the months went by, met first renewed interest and then glad, unexpected fruition. But I am only a little braver than she, the joy touches my heart as well and fills my throat only less chokingly when I say that the Mission Chapter reports boxes \$316.39, cash \$733.45, the Junior Auxiliary boxes \$38.55, cash \$54.00, total boxes \$354.94, total cash \$787.45; and then something that is in neither of these items, for when it reached its destination it was not money, and never could have been boxes—the stone for the new S. Peter's Coronado by a member of S. Paul's Auxiliary, in value \$2,485. Total by S. Paul's, San Diego, \$3,627.39.

But rejoicing as we do, every heart of us, in this good news of the first large gift—the first to reach the thousands—I know too how every true Auxiliary in this room has learned God's way of counting values, and that no other Branch suffers by comparison, rather they all take on a little splendor, and feel a little of that virtue, which, stimulated by another's doing in our cause, may well be called a proper pride.

In South San Diego S. Mark's Mission reports, boxes \$12.50, cash \$1.00, total \$13.50.

In National City, S. Matthew's, boxes \$21.50, cash \$5.00. In Coronado S. Peter's—blessed S. Peter's—cash \$1.00. Total by this group of Branches in San Diego County, \$3,668.39.

The work of the Auxiliary members in S. Paul's, San Rafael, has been given largely to parish needs, but they send in a good record, boxes \$114.50, cash \$73.50, total \$188.00. The Junior's Auxiliary is growing up all right, reporting boxes \$13.00, cash \$6.50, total \$19.50. Total by S. Paul's \$207.50.

The Auxiliary in Our Saviour, San Gabriel, has provided a most acceptable box valued at \$48.65, cash \$12, total \$60.65.

The Woman's Auxiliary of Santa Barbara has sent all its gifts through the



Diocesan Treasurer in cash, \$111.30. The Sunday School, a Junior Branch, reports boxes \$21.40, cash \$20.02, total \$41.42. Total by Trinity, Santa Barbara, \$152.72.

The Guilds of Our Saviour, Santa Cruz, have wisely combined in missionary work, giving up a separate organization, and report boxes to the Orphanages \$13.25.

The Clara Nichols Branch, Junior Auxiliary, in the Church of the Holy Saviour, Santa Clara, has given a box valued at \$10 and \$5 in cash, besides paying for furnishing the vestibule of its own church. Total \$22.00.

The Juniors, S. Catherine's Chapter, in St. Augustine's, Santa Monica have made comforters for the Bishop Armitage Orphanage valued at \$5.00, beside doing much other work not reported here, and have paid for memberships 95 cents, total \$5.95.

In S. James', Sonoma, the Auxiliary, owing to the great expense of shipping, has confined its gifts to cash, and has instituted an admirable plan of systematic giving. The register was consulted and every women whose name was on it asked to attend a called meeting. Result: Twenty-one women subscribers to the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund at five cents each, monthly. Total by S. James' Mission \$18.60.

The Auxiliary of S. John's, Stockton, has sent a box valued at \$20 The Juniors, organized early in February, have since been working for the orphanages, but the best reason for being a Junior Branch lies in the teaching they receive from their directress, the wife of the Rector. Their report is incomplete, cash 95 cents.

Diocesan receipts have been by collection and other general receipts: \$386.94. Eleven Missions, not Auxiliary, have paid to the Altar Fund \$11.00. Boxes aggregate a total value of \$5,409.15, cash, \$3,238.23; grand total \$8,647.38. In this is included the work of twenty-six Junior Branches as follows: Boxes in value \$315.15, cash \$420.44, a total of \$735.59.

Again two Quiet Days, one in S. Paul's, Los Angeles, hurriedly arranged for by the Bishop during his recent visitation, but most successful, and one in S. Stephen's, San Francisco, on April 19th, by the Rev'd Mr. Lion.

The suggestion to hold more general meetings at central points has been very happily carried out. Eight of the sixteen meetings held during the year by the Associated Parishes of San Francisco have drawn a large attendance to hear some speaker or the reading of a paper. Mrs. Twing's visit was occasion for three of these in San Francisco, and in San Rafael, Oakland, Pacific Grove and Los Angeles she was met by enthusiastic numbers. Two Oakland meetings, three Los Angeles meetings and two San Diego meetings may be classed as diocesan as far as they could go.

The Secretaries appointed to act as District Secretaries, and thus distribute the detail work of the Diocesan Secretary, have given much help. San Diego and Los Angeles, especially, show more and more the excellence of this system in developing centers of growth.

The Altar Fund suggested at the last annual meeting has found hearty helpers in many of the clergy. The first dollar was paid in by a member of Grace Church, who had formed the first Altar Society in California under the direction of Bishop Kip. Next came a dollar from S. Michael's Fowler, where, if anywhere on earth, dollars are needed at home. In the Treasurer's published statement you may read the old Auxiliary story of the giving of the poorer places as they fall in line among the stronger Churches. Thirty-eight altars are represented in the \$49 thus far raised. At Easter a beautiful redwood altar and cross adorned in fire etching by women artists was put up in S. John's, Tulare. For this the Auxiliary paid \$47, much of the work being given. But there are over one hundred altars in this Diocese. When, again, the Feast of the Transfiguration



makes bright the page of our calendar may we not expect that all will unite in this work and that next year two altars may be promised to two new Churches as the Bishop may select.

As far as can be ascertained one hundred and forty-five mite chests are gleaned in as many families or guilds for the United offering, 1895.

It has been our custom since Bishop Nichols' coming to promise our Bishop at the annual meeting the support of some special work. The fund has been raised by parochial pledges, collections, individual gifts and in some instances by the envelope system, and has been designated by the name of the object for which it was intended. In this year's printed tables the money given for the support of our Deaconess in the City Missionary Field will be entered as for the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund, and hereafter this term will be employed to designate the money raised by us every year for our Bishop's use in his own field. We have one General United Fund, the money we are raising through the mite chests for the United Offering, and one Diocesan United Fund. We ask that all our parishes join in these two general interests, and strongly recommend the envelope system for raising the Diocesan United Fund, the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund. If Auxiliaries will persistently seek for takers of these envelopes, urging a greater number to give, if they may pledge only five cents a month, we shall have at the next annual meeting something to promise the Bishop before he asks us.

Early in October, the Occidental Board of Missions, Presbyterian, invited the Auxiliary, with other Woman's Mission Boards of California, to consider the holding a Woman's Congress of Missions during the Midwinter Fair. The purport of the Congress was clearly defined and its limitations fixed. In papers and addresses the Missionary idea was to be strictly adhered to, no reform movements, however valuable, were to be introduced, no discussion of papers allowed, and no resolutions presented that had not been unanimously approved by the Committee prior to the Congress. By the Bishop's advice your Diocesan Officers have represented the Auxiliary in this Congress, and in the many committee meetings held prior to its opening they have always been present.

The Congress has closed its sessions in which many of you have shared, and whatever the issue, we must here record how wonderfully the high purpose set before us has been adhered to by every active member of the Committee. Strangers to each other, most of us, recognizing fully all that divides us, not for a moment asking anyone to give up anything that a level might be reached; in a word, not thinking so much of ourselves as of the Christ above all, drawing us all to Him, and of the unbroken front to be presented as Woman's new gift to this new world, no jar has come to mar our peace, no fracture of the beautiful gift we have prepared; and however great or however little shall be the value of the gift, it will be a *whole* offering and as such, we doubt not, for we believe Him, acceptable to God. And for each of us in all the wonderful work that God has given us, women, at the close of the millenium, what is the secret of our power? How shall we, new-fledged, rise to the height of our destiny, we whom the confusion of awakening has often so blinded that we see not clearly the way amid old blunders and new delusions.

Ah, Women, Churchwomen, it is the old story—the old key unlocks all new mysteries. In the giving there is having, and no issue shall come to womankind, no crisis risk her fate, that may not be safely met by her who has emptied herself of herself, who can hold out her hands to humanity and say

Would that my soul might be a world  
Of golden ether bright,  
A Heaven where other souls might float,  
Like all Thy worlds, in light!

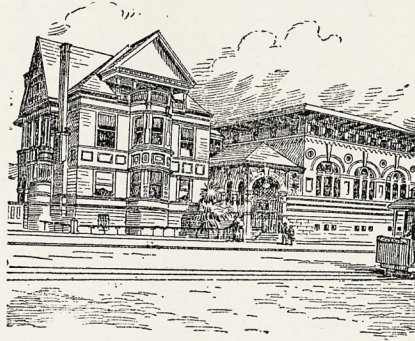
