Nineteenth Annual Meeting.

MAY 22ND, 1899, S. STEPHEN'S CHURCH, SAN FRANCISCO.

As the day was Monday in Whitsun week, the officers attended the celebration before proceeding to their conference. Eleven branches responded to the roll call.

Pledges were made to the general fund, and the year's unfinished business concluded.

The Junior Auxiliary Publication Company, through our Secretary, asked for a diocesan representative and a grant. Mrs. M. D. Wilson had already been appointed. Her appointment was confirmed, and by vote it was decided to hold a meeting in the autumn in the interest of the Junior Auxiliary and the Junior Auxiliary Publication Company, and give the collection as our grant for this year.

Considering the waste of time incident upon the separation of secretary's and treasurer's offices in the Junior Auxiliary, it was voted to request the Bishop to appoint Miss Bishop treasurer as well as secretary, and in the afternoon meeting he did so.

Mrs. Lawver called attention to our need of an Auxiliary store-room. The President appointed Mrs. Bird and Miss Hyman a committee to see if a room could be obtained.

A subject of conference was the effort to have everyone understand the distinction between the object and methods of the Daughters of the King and those of the Auxiliary—the former organization being specialized, parochial and pledged not to raise money; the latter, general, extra-parochial and under the necessity of raising money for its work. Mrs. Lawver, speaking for the Auxiliary, and Dr. Fletcher for the Daughters of the King, were desirous of having a clear understanding of this distinction spread abroad among the parishes.

The afternoon meeting was opened at 3 o'clock, with a hymn, and prayers by the Rev. E. J. Lion, the Bishop being present also, and the President, Mrs. Newlands, in the chair.

Fourteen branches answered the roll call, and each branch gave a report of its total work for the year, with such details as would be of general interest.

The Bishop's address was, as ever, full of encouragement and counsel, and he announced a step in advance in the prospective conference of the clergy as a body with the Auxiliary.

Mrs. Newlands made the report of Auxiliary work for the year, as Mrs. Lawver was absent much of the time.

The reports of the Juniors, the Babies' Branch, and the Periodical Club were read by their respective leaders, and all showed progress.

The collection was for printing expense. Miss Wade then gave a most instructive talk about the informal meetings of the women during the Triennial, and the many useful suggestions gained there.

The Secretary followed with an address, giving the lessons she had learned of the Auxiliary's life and work, looking forward to the Triennial in 1901.

President's Report.

It becomes my pleasant duty to present to you this year the general report of the work done by the California Branch of the Auxiliary.

Early in the Auxiliary year just closing, it was deemed advisable that an extended vacation should be given to the Diocesan Secretary, to include also attendance at the Triennial Meeting of the Auxiliary. For the time, her general duties as Corresponding Secretary were assumed by the President, but many things usually fostered or carried out by the Secretary, that have added much to the usefulness of the Auxiliary, had to be laid aside. We most heartily welcome her home, knowing that with her inspiration and enthusiasm the work will go forward successfully.

The Secretary presented, at the Triennial, California's gift for the United Offering, amounting to \$624.75, more than the undivided Diocese of California gave in 1895. Many mite boxes have been distributed for the gathering of the offering for 1901, and it is hoped that every woman will have a share in this "Thank Offering," to be presented when the Triennial Convention then meets in this City.

There have been ten regular and general meetings, and one called meeting, in San Francisco, with three quarterlies for Alameda County Branches. We have had as speakers, Bishops Rowe and Moreland, Rev. Messrs. Stoy, Mynard and Jenks of our own Diocese, the Ven. Mr. Thomson, Archdeacon of Shanghai, Miss Taylor of Pyramid Lake, and Miss Verbeck, of Japan.

The Semi-annual was held on Friday in Convention week. At the Eucharistic service, Bishop Nichols being celebrant, the Rt. Rev., the Bishop of Columbia, was the preacher. His address was one never to be forgotten by those who heard it, and much regret was expressed that it could not be published.

The afternoon meeting, at which nineteen branches were represented, was characterized by interesting addresses from Bishops Leonard and Barker and our own Diocesan.

So many members of the Auxiliary devoted themselves during the summer to helping the Red Cross Society in caring for our soldiers, a most worthy object, that it seemed, at first, doubtful if our usual Christmas missionary boxes could be filled; but as the time drew near for such boxes to be sent, our women, who are always ready to make sacrifices, came again nobly forward and seven boxes were sent, one for a Domestic Missionary.

The Lenten work has consisted, with the exception of a few diocesan boxes in work for Alaska, the California Branch having agreed to supply the missions at Anvik and Circle City.

The work has not reached that of previous years, but in partially accounting for this, not only should the diversion of gifts and money by our members for the Red Cross be taken into consideration, but the great drought in our State that has affected every branch of industry, thus crippling the general outlay.

With the close of our year's work the Annual Quiet Day has lately been held, carrying us beyond the practical Auxiliary life to the spiritual part.

Two new branches have been organized this past year, S. Paul's, Visalia, and S. Andrew's, Oakland. Last year one of our earnest Auxiliary women at Fowler moved to Visalia, and finding no Auxiliary there, consulted with the rector, and an active and helpful branch has been started. The President writes: "If anyone

had said, last winter, that in so short a time we could have raised so much money and accomplished so much work, I would not have thought it possible." This shows what one energetic and interested woman can do.

A new correspondent for the C. P. C. has been appointed, and entered on her duties with enthusiasm and a thorough understanding of the work. Her report will be heard later.

In looking forward to the coming year, we must bear in mind that as new objects may perhaps present themselves for our interest and labor, we may not forget that the old must still be sustained, and I would urge you to bear in mind the fund the Auxiliary places at the disposal of our bishop, remembering that our first duty is to him.

May we strive for larger and broader effort in every branch, and as year after year we bear fruit, let it be richer and fuller in all respects.

Fifth Annual Report of the Junior Department.

Slowly and surely the Sunday Schools are falling into line by helping in the missionary work. Several have reported regular missionary instruction, and more schools have helped in the work this year.

A new folder of suggestions as to what to do and how to do it has been published which we will gladly send to anyone on application.

1901 "Convention Year" is coming quickly. Let us be up and doing that our record may be a good one for the next year and a half. First and most important are the Lenten Pyramids. Just as soon as we can persuade the officers of a Sunday School that the Lenten Pyramids do not need pledges, that they are to be distributed, and whatever is collected in them sent, just so soon they use them in their Sunday Schools. The scholars enjoy hearing about them, enjoy telling how much was raised in their school, and the total raised by a few Sunday Schools in the United States. It makes no difference how poor a school is; the poorer, the greater the blessing earned. If every school could be persuaded to try them once, they would be astonished at the immediate blessing received.

There is not the excuse of many calls, for this is the only call from the Board of Missions to our Sunday Schools.

Second, our Advent Tents for our own Diocesan Missions. These are used in the same manner, distributed for Advent, with no pledge, to collect whatever the scholars see fit to put in them. Our Bishop has set us a goal for the encouragement of the schools, and we hope soon to enlist enough enthusiasm in scholars to reach the goal. Last Advent \$310.10 were raised by thirty-nine Sunday Schools. There are about sixty Sunday Schools capable of contributing.

Third, the Font Fund. Every Whitsuntide we hope to receive fifty cents from each Sunday School, that we may help a mission to buy a font. The first step in a mission is baptizing the little ones. If the scholars furnish a font, there is the object lesson before them beckoning on. Last year was our first trial; eighteen dollars and seventy-five cents were contributed. A font costs at least twenty-five dollars. Whitsuntide has passed, and we have heard from seven Sunday Schools. When all have responded, we will let the schools that have helped know about our first font, which, you remember, is to go to Visalia.

Our Week-day Branches are sewing for hospitals, schools and orphanages, from Alaska to Texas, and some work has been done for Japan.

All branches, both Sunday Schools and week-day, are asked to contribute each year to expenses, that the Junior Department may be self-supporting. Please attend to this at once, if your Sunday School or society has not paid to the expense account since January, 1899.

Our greatest need is women to superintend the Juniors. Most of the children are too young to work without teachers, but are willing, and when properly directed accomplish much. I commend the work to you all, and sincerely hope some one will be found in every parish and mission willing to help on the good work.

Fifth Annual Report of the Babies' Branch.

The last two years I have sent at Easter a letter to each of the "Little Helpers," as a reminder that the time for opening the boxes had come, and telling them how much was received the year before, where it was sent and what the Bishops wrote me. I think it may interest you to know what the bishops said, as well as the children. We sent \$17.50 to each of the four bishops.

Bishop Rowe wrote: "I wish to thank the little ones of the Babies' Branch for their splendid offering and to say that it will be used towards helping to nurse and care for poor, distressed and sick men on the Yukon, who need the aid of our hospital at Circle City." And the bishop said he wished he could meet you all and tell you how much he appreciated your offering, and how thankful he was for it.

Bishop McKim thanks you heartily for your gift, and says it will be given to S. John's Orphanage, in Osaka.

Then Bishop Kendrick writes: "The contribution of \$17.50 shall go to Miss Thackara, at the Hospital for the Navajo Indians, at Fort Defiance, Arizona, and it shall be used for the children, the babies are to have the preference, and this money is not to be used for general expenses, but it is to be a special fund to enable Miss Thackara to do something for the children she could not otherwise do. We are very grateful for the contribution, and thank every one who had any thing to do with it."

Bishop Nichols says: "It did a good deal to help me start new Sunday School work in some of the mining country of the Diocese. Miss Dorsey, who is working with Rev. Mr. Linsley, at Sonora and points near it, will perhaps some day write you a letter to tell you about the work. The Junior Auxiliary has undertaken to provide for keeping it going. Your contributions came in well to encourage me to start it, and I thank you all, and hope to meet many of you as I go about."

In response to this letter I heard from 103 members, and received \$85.58, so I feel that our Fifth Annual Report is more encouraging, and am very happy that this year we can send \$20 to the same four bishops for their work.

Report of the Church Periodical Club.

Having become Correspondent for the Church Periodical Club on January 1st, 1899, the report I now offer is from that date.

We have now nine working Librarians. 116 regular current magazines and papers are sent out, and since January 1st, 1899, 1075 miscellaneous numbers have been contributed, besides several large packages of same—numbers not given.

There are 80 regular names on our books. Several of these receive more than one magazine, as they are distributors for their neighborhood.

Letters received by Correspondent, 58. Letters written, 102. The Librarians have not sent in reports of their letters. The report from one, however, shows that she has written 59 letters and received 64.

A note was received this week from the Central Office, saying that each Diocese was requested to forward \$10 per year for Central expenses.

Mr. Valentine, of Wells, Fargo & Co., has kindly furnished the Correspondent with a "frank," so that the work now may be much extended.

On April 14th a meeting of Librarians was held at the residence of Mrs. T. E. Smith. Seven members were present. It is hoped to have another meeting early in the fall, and after that to hold them regularly every three months.

An appeal was published in the Easter number of the Pacific Churchman, and the response to it has been most gratifying. In a short report one cannot speak of the amount of good done by this branch of church work. The many letters received tell of lonely lives made less lonely, and sad days brightened by the work of the Librarians.

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Counsels to Parochial Officers.

Impress upon the women of your parish that they are, by virtue of their baptism, members of the Auxiliary. Urge them to recognize this claim by working along the appointed lines, and by giving such dues as your Parish Branch may settle upon.

When there is no Parish Branch, you may become a member of the Diocesan Branch by paying one dollar annually or by giving regularly to the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund.

Every branch is expected to give to the United Offering, to the Bishop's Auxiliary Fund and to Diocesan expenses, and report to Diocesan Treasurer.

After this develop any general or diocesan work that has the approval of your rector.

The "United Offering" is the Thankoffering presented at every Triennial Session of the Woman's Auxiliary. The Offering of 1901 will be laid on the Altar at the Triennial Celebration of the Woman's Auxiliary, October, 1901, in San Francisco. It will be divided equally among all the Missionary Bishops and the Commission for Colored Work.

Every woman is given an opportunity to share in the great Thankoffering. Mite boxes will be sent on application, and gifts or pledges received at any time.

The Bishop's Auxiliary Fund is placed by the Woman's Auxiliary at the Bishop's disposal, for such missionary work in the diocese as is not provided for elsewhere. It supports at present a sister assisting the City Missionary in San Francisco, and, through the Junior Department a candidate for deaconess orders, working now most acceptably in a mining district.

The Auxiliary asks every Churchwoman in the Diocese to contribute to the fund, through envelopes which will be furnished.

Every congregation is asked to give one dollar annually to the Altar Fund, and thus to share in erecting an Altar in a new mission every year. See that your church responds. Payments are due on the Feast of the Transfiguration, August 6th.

Begin every meeting with prayer.

Take the *Pacific Churchman* and read to your branch the Woman's Auxiliary page. Keep ready for reference a Church Almanac with clergy list, the last report of your Diocesan Branch, Miss Emery's last report and the Spirit of Missions; and keep in supply copies of the Auxiliary prayers, leaflets from the Church Mission House, mite chests for the United Offering, Auxiliary Fund envelopes and blanks for box lists, and leaflets for the Junior Auxiliary work.

When a project is laid before your Branch, do not fail to report its action, after due deliberation.

When you begin a box, advise the recipient and the Diocesan Secretary. When you ship it, advise again, giving date and mode of shipment. If you cannot secure free shipment, prepay charges on all packages to clergy, institutions and diocesan officers.

Remit money by express, P. O. Order, bank drafts or checks on San Francisco banks; never by bank notes.

Report at once changes of address or temporary absence, and apply to the Secretaries of the various departments for further information.

Fear not; trust and pray.
