PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

"What shall we render unto the Lord for all His benefits?"

As we come together, to review the work we, as an organization, have been permitted to do for the Master the past year, we find much cause for devout thanksgiving and grateful acknowledgment of all the blessings that have attended our efforts.

First of all, that we have been privileged not only to work for the advancement of the Kingdom of our Blessed Lord, but to work with Him, so that our efforts, which at the best could avail little, supplemented by the Divine blessing, have accomplished some acceptable results.

Our reports show that in most of the Districts there has been an increase in work and giving. We must not, however, be misled by this, for although we endeavor to gather the United Offering at least once a year, there is always an extra effort the last year, so that each triennial year our reports are larger than for the two intervening ones. This should be kept in mind, so that if the report should show smaller amounts next year we should not be discouraged by it. It is not safe to make the amount reported the criterion by which to measure the interest and development of the work. I trust, however, that the spiritual and educational part of the work has been as carefully looked after as the material. We must guard against an undue desire to swell our reports, without at least a corresponding effort to increase our spiritual and intellectual growth.

This brings us to speak of Mission Classes. The necessity for the study of missions was brought prominently before us at the general meeting in Washington, and a movement is on foot to provide a regular course for this department of the

work. The committee on Missionary Literature, was changed to one on Mission Classes, and no doubt before the autumn leaflets will be issued to aid in the study. I sincerely hope there will be an earnest, systematic effort all through the Diocese to increase our interest in this department of the work, and that Mission Classes will be organized in every Parish Branch. We are commanded to serve God with our mind as well as with heart and soul, and should consecrate our intellect as well as our spirits and affections.

Another cause for thanksgiving is that we have had the inspiration of the largest triennial meeting the Auxiliary has ever held. The large number of delegates, (almost every Diocese and Missionary jurisdiction being represented), the report of increased work and giving, and the United Offering more than \$25,000 more than was given at Minneapolis, shows how fast and far the influence of the Auxiliary is extending. Every Diocese and Missionary jurisdiction has its branch, and from each of them comes every three years something to mark the grateful appreciation of the women of the Church, of the blessings that Church has wrought to them. But although an offering of \$82,000 is a cause for thanksgiving and congratulation, yet it is not what should be the result of a three years effort of 400,000 or 500,000 Church women, to give expression to their gratitude for the gift of a Saviour, and all that gift has meant to them.

Too few women are yet reached with a knowledge of what the United Offering really means. The plan used by Pennsylvania and which resulted in raising \$14,000, is to appoint a treasurer for the United Offering for each Parish, and with the co-operation of the clergy endeavor to put a mite box into the hands of every woman communicant, telling her of its true meaning. Let us try to make this beautiful object more generally known the coming year, and to increase the individual interest in it.

I have attended seven District Meetings and have visited 34 parishes. These parish visits have been a source of great pleasure, and I feel I have come nearer to the body of workers in the Diocese than in all the nine years of service as Diocesan President. Most of the visits were made in small parishes and mission stations, where the women come so seldom in personal touch with the great Church outside, that, as I was told more than once, they have a very vague idea of what the Woman's

Auxiliary really is, and still less knowledge of its methods or work. I try in my work to take little thought for its results. to as far as possible efface myself from it, just feeling I am simply my Master's messenger, an instrument in His hands to do a certain work, and that He will take care of the results. But it is pleasant sometimes to know that our efforts do bear some fruit, and I was deeply touched when in several instances women came to me and said they had never before realized their personal obligation for Christ's work. I hope to be able to make a still larger number of visits the coming year, feeling more than ever convinced that this personal work is greatly needed. I shall be very glad to plan for this kind of work with the District Officers.

I have written a larger number of letters than ever before, 750. Of these quite a number were made necessary in raising money for the repairs and improvements at the Reservations, and nearly 100 in the interest of the Committee on Systematic Giving, of which I was made a member at the general meeting. I want your co-operation in the work of this committee, and shall be very glad of any information or suggestions with regard to methods of making our work and our offerings more systematic, and therefore more effective.

The Board of Missions to which we are auxiliary is constantly extending its work. Realizing that the expansion of our country through its new possessions, brings not only increased civic responsibility, but greatly increased responsibility to the Church, it has been quick to send the services and sacraments of the Church wherever our brave soldiers have carried the flag. At General Convention it took under its fostering care the most interesting work in Brazil, and gave to it a Bishop. Still more recently it has taken the first step in this most gracious work of lending aid to the almost miraculously preserved little band of Syrian Christians, who seem almost a connecting link between our Saviour's time and our own, having retained in so great a degree the primitive practices and customs of that time, and although secluded from the rest of the Christian world, and surrounded by Mohammedans, have preserved the vital part of their faith intact. We, as Auxiliary to the Board, must keep pace with it, and endeavor to follow with our prayers, our interest and as far as possible with practical aid, these new movements of the Board. What we need, dear sisters, is a Pentecostal outpouring of God's Holy Spirit, such

as came upon the Apostles at the first Whitsunday, to fit us, as it fitted them, for the great work put into our hands to do; to give us grace not only to do this work for Christ and with Christ, but like Christ, with a humility which recognizes the little worth of our best efforts without the Divine blessing; with a charity which will throw its mantle of love over all the shortcomings and imperfections of others, so that we may work harmoniously and lovingly together and with a faith that reaches confidently out toward large things, feeling that "we can do all things through Christ who strengtheneth us." And that we may receive this Divine baptism, we must keep constantly near the Christian's only source of strength, the Throne of Grace, seeking to bring ourselves into such close union with our Divine Head, that we shall be ready, not to do our own work, in our own way, but His work, how, and when and where it shall please Him.

ANNUAL REPORT

--OF THE--

Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of Central
New York.

MADAM PRESIDENT AND THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY:

Six years ago in the "Mother Church" of this city the Juniors of Central New York came together for the first time and organized as a Diocesan Branch.

As each year has gone by has our work been the very best we could do? The number of branches and the amount of pledges have increased steadily, but our reports are not what they were at first. This is partly accounted for by the fact that we have ceased to report what is not strictly Junior Auxiliary work.

But is there not a graver reason also? Do we remember the duty we owe, as members of the Diocesan Branch, to make its pledges for gifts and money our first and most important work? Or, do we prefer to work for some object of which we are very fond, and where we can see the good we are doing? In this way much is accomplished by Junior Branches, for those who are not of the Household of Faith. There is also a selfish motive in this working for our own gratification. We receive the reward here, but forget we are not laying up treasure in Heaven. Again, are we remembering our motto: "Be Strong in the Lord and in the Power of His Might"? Are we self-confident and satisfied with our own efforts? Let us never

take up the smallest detail of our work without asking His Divine guidance, and that He will give us a hearty desire to do what will be most acceptable in His sight. Then, remembering that we are but the instruments in His hands, be content to leave the results with Him.

No gift should be sent upon its mission without the prayer that it may be worthy for His purposes; for the small gift representing self-denial and love upon which God bestows His blessing is infinitely greater than the more valuable, unconsecrated one. We have not received the blessed Whitsuntide Gift of Tongues, but there is at our command the universal language of Christian love, most plainly spoken by deeds, not words, and understood by all nations. Thus may we "Preach the Gospel to every creature," rather thus *must* we do.

In our constitution we declare it our duty to impress upon the youth of the Church their responsibility as baptized members, to assist in the great object for which it was established. When we are baptized the badge of the Great Missionary Society is placed upon our foreheads, and we are pledged "to fight manfully under His banner." Therein is the evidence of our duty, and it is fulfilled or left undone, according as we do, or do not, work for Missions. Let us endeavor to make the "Study of Missions" a part of our Sunday school work. A few minutes given, once a month, to questions on some topic previously designated, would arouse interest and cause increasing zeal.

It is our earnest desire that this Diocese may hereafter observe the Second Sunday after Epiphany as a "Missionary Sunday," after the plan adopted by the Diocese of New York. The general idea is to have several Sunday schools unite wherever feasible, and have speakers from away if possible, addresses by the rectors or papers prepared by others, as seems best in different parishes. A common service of missionary collects and hymns is provided, and if practicable the same hour appointed for the service. It is preferred that no offering be made, the important desire being "To interest and instruct the youth and children of the Church in mission work."

In closing, let us give a few thoughts to the United Thanksgiving offering of 1901, to be divided among all Missionary Jurisdictions at that time, and a portion for Colored Missions. Can we not all take part in this and so make it a real united offer-

ing from the Juniors of the Diocese? Each of us is able to give something when thankful, and we can always give of our prayers and labor. One of our Bishops said of the Thank-offering last year: "Eighty Thousand Dollars offered to support women workers in the mission field, and not one woman!" The means are not all that the work needs, there should be more "labourers in the harvest." We must ask earnestly and constantly, that when we give of our substance at the next United Thank-offering, some Central New York Junior may be ready and be deemed worthy to forsake all and follow Him, always remembering to say, "Even if it be I, Thy will be done."

CONSTITUTION

—OF THE—

Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central New York to the Board of Missions.

**Amended and Adopted at Annual Meeting held in St.
Paul's Cathedral, Syracuse, May 24th, 1894.**

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be known as the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central New York to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The object of the Association shall be to extend a knowledge of the work of the Church among the Churchwomen of the Diocese, to awaken greater interest and sympathy for her missions and missionaries (such interest to be shown by earnest, practical work for them), and to endeavor to promote spiritual life and activity among its members.

ARTICLE III.

This Association shall be composed of six Districts, corresponding to the six Convocation Districts, each District electing its own officers and managing its own work, subject to the approval of the Diocesan President.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. An Annual Meeting shall be held at some convenient date in May for the presenting of reports from District Branches, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SECTION 2. A Semi-Annual Meeting may be held in the Fall at the discretion of the President.

ARTICLE V.

The Officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary and Treasurer (appointed by the Bishop), who with the several District Presidents shall constitute an Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.

SECTION 1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and have general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

SECTION 2. The duty of the Vice-President shall be to preside in the absence of the President, and to co-operate with her in the general work of the Association.

SECTION 3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence of the Association under the direction of the President and to make an annual report.

SECTION 4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to keep a record of the annual and semi-annual meetings, to call the roll at these meetings and to read such papers as may be ordered to be read.

SECTION 5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive and hold all moneys sent to her by the District Treasurers, to disburse the same to the objects designated by the senders, viz: Diocesan or other Missions, Missionaries, Scholarships, etc., and to make an annual report.

ARTICLE VII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any Annual Meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS.

SECTION 1. Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

SECTION 2. The regular order of business at the annual and semi-annual meetings shall be:

1. Offices of Devotion.
2. Roll Call.
3. Reading of Minutes of Last Meeting.
4. Reports of Officers and Committees.
5. Unfinished Business.
6. Miscellaneous Business and Addresses.

SECTION 3. The By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a vote of a majority present.

CONSTITUTION

—OF THE—

Central New York Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Adopted at Binghamton, May 12th, 1893.

Amended at Binghamton, May 26th, 1899.

ARTICLE I.

This Organization shall be called the Central New York Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Organization shall be to interest and instruct the youth and children of the Church in the mission work, and to impress upon them a sense of responsibility as baptized members of the same to assist in advancing the great object for which the Church was established.

ARTICLE III.

The Diocesan Branch shall consist of the District Branches corresponding to six Convocation Districts.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers shall be a Diocesan Superintendent and a Diocesan Treasurer, appointed by the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary, and a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan Superintendent and Treasurer and a District Superintendent from each district, who shall be elected by the Woman's Auxiliary from her district, whenever a vacancy shall occur.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Superintendent to have entire management of the Jnnior work in the Diocese, subject to the approval of the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to take charge of the work in her district, under the supervision of the Diocesan Superintendent.

ARTICLE VII.

General meetings of the Diocesan Branch shall be held at the discretion of the Diocesan Superintendent, with the approval of the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VIII.

This Constitution may be changed or amended by the Board of Managers at their discretion.
