## PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

---

It is with much pleasure I welcome so large a number of delegates from all parts of the Diocese, to our annual Council, to tell of the work done and the progress made since we last met, and I trust to plan for increased effort the coming year. We have reason for great thankfulness that we have been able to accomplish what we have, that our pledges have all been met and a good amount of work in boxes sent out. But I am sure none of us feel that all has been done that ought and might have been in this Diocese, because so small a proportion of the women of the church have had any part with us. I feel that the mission of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese, the coming year, should be to interest a larger number of the women of the church, by extending a knowledge of the work being done, and the personal responsibility of every baptized woman for some part of it, thus enlisting new helpers. I have not been able to do as much parish visiting as usual the past year. I have been into every District but most of my visits have been for the purpose of attending District meetings, having been present at seven of them. There have been many changes among the District officers the past year.

The Vice-President of the 6th District has gone to the rest of Paradise. A loyal daughter of the church, active in Parish and District, she will be greatly missed.

The President of the 6th District refused a re-election last spring, and no one was found to succeed her, so that District has been without an official head. The Secretary and Treasurer deserve much credit for having carried on the work so successfully. The very efficient President of the 4th District, who has accomplished so much in bringing up the standard in her District, not only in work and giving but more essential still, the spiritual conception of the work of the Auxiliary, has left the Diocese.

Mrs. Capen, who for nearly twenty years has given such loyal service as head of the work in the 3rd District, has felt compelled by added personal cares, to resign. I trust women will be found to fill these vacancies who will carry forward the work to even greater success.

We mourn with the church at large the passing away of three of our Missionary Bishops. I include Bishop Dudley among them, because, although the Bishop of a Diocese, no one was more thoroughly identified with the mission work of the church. His stirring words at Council and Convention, will long be missed. Bishop Ingle, although so recently consecrated, had shown wonderful fitness for the position and had entered into the work with a zeal

and wisdom which would have accomplished great results if his life had been spared.

The Woman's Auxiliary of Central New York was much attached to Bishop Leonard. He has often been with us, and for several years we gave him a pledge for his work. It is very fitting that memorials should be erected on the mission field in honor of these brave men, sacrificed to the indifference, to use no stronger term, of the church which sent them out. I am anxious the Woman's Auxiliary of Central New York should have some little part in these memorials.

Our weakest point in the work of the Auxiliary in this Diocese is lack of knowledge of the mission work of the church. I think very few Dioceses of as much importance as Central New York give as little attention to mission study. I hear from District officers of lamentable instances of ignorance of even the general departments of mission work. This seems inexcusable, when information can be secured so easily. I am sure it is really the result of lack of leadership in the matter, and I would suggest that each District appoint some one to take charge of this part of the work, by correspondence and personal visits, trying to institute Parish study classes.

Only four months remain before the united offering must be collected to be presented at the general meeting in Boston. How much effort is being made to make our portion of it at all worthy? I need not dwell upon the beautiful purpose for which it is to be used. The training, sending out and care of our women missionaries. The offering of 1898, for the same object, put a number of women into the mission field, that could not otherwise have gone.

A year ago that fund was exhausted, and only by special gifts has the Board of Missions been able to keep them there. But the greatest blessing of this offering comes to the donors themselves. It gives us the means of giving some small expression to the gratitude that should fill all our hearts for the blessings that are ours through Christ and His Gospel. Will we not gladly make some little sacrifice to show our appreciation of these blessings. Let us not make an offering of that which costs us nothing.

I wish throughout this Diocese more attention could be given to securing books and periodicals for the Church Periodical Club. If we could in imagination put ourselves in the place of our isolated missionaries we could better appreciate the blessing the regular appearance of some interesting magazine or paper would be. And it requires so little sacrifice to provide this happiness for them. Just "to gather up the fragments that nothing be lost," sending that which has already served ourselves. If each Parish would appoint some one to look after this matter much more could be accomplished. I want to speak particularly of the work of the Third District Altar Guild. Nothing has been of greater help and comfort to me in my work. I have never yet appealed to it in vain. Sometimes orders have had to wait a little because they take them faster than they can possibly

fill them, but as rapidly as possible, they send out their beautiful work. This is the most sacred part of the work of the Auxiliary. Providing furnishings for God's altar and vestments for His ministers, and I should be very glad if similar societies could be organized in the other Districts that more of this work could be done. This Altar Society would be glad to secure orders for paid work, that they might have more money for material for their mission work. I wish you would bear this in mind whenever you know altar furnishings or vestments are to be provided.

And now, dear women of the Auxiliary, we are about to begin a new year of service for the Master. Let us not wait until the autumn to begin that work, but wherever we are in our own homes or seeking rest and refreshment elsewhere, let us use the talents God has given us in His service and to His honor and glory. Those talents are varied, with one it is time, with another money, another has business ability qualifying her to be a leader in the work, another has personal influence and the ability to tell of the needs of the Master's work and the obligation of personal responsibility for that work in a way to win others to engage in it. To each of us something has been committed and whether it is ten talents or only one, the Master will require an accounting. It was not the smallness of the amount committed to the unfaithful steward that condemned him, nor even the dishonest use of it, for he had carefully hidden it away. It was because he had not used it at all. If he had used it to the best of his ability however small the result, he too would have received the commendation, "Well done good and faithful servant," with God's blessing upon it. Our smallest gifts will bring abundant results.

All that is asked of us is, that as faithful soldiers of Christ we shall be ready to give prompt and unqualified obedience to His every order, and as His servants be watchful of the interests of our Master, giving Him loyal and devoted service.

### Correspondent's Report for the Diocese of C. N. Y., of the Work of the Church Periodical Club.

---

The Church Periodical Club is a society formed for the purpose of supplying periodicals and books to those of the clergy and laity who are unable to procure good literature in any other way. We are now sending from our Diocese through our 26 Librarians 261 periodicals regularly. We have sent out this year 806 odd numbers of magazines also six barrels of reading matter and nine books. The Librarians report having expended \$14.75 for freight and other expenses. We have had one gift of \$5.05 which was sent to New York for general expenses. If we are able to do so much through the few parishes interested, how much more generous our contributions to this grandly philanthropic work would be if every parish in the Diocese was represented by a Librarian who could induce persons subscribing to good magazines or church papers to send them away after they have read them, to addresses furnished by the C. P. C. By this means literature of every sort which would be of use to clergymen, missionaries and laymen might be sent by those who possessed it to those who could not afford it.

## CONSTITUTION

Of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central New York to  
the Board of Missions. Amended and Adopted at the Annual  
Meeting Held in St. Paul's Cathedral, Syracuse, May 24, 1894.

### ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be known as the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central New York to the Board of Missions.

### ARTICLE II.

The object of the Association shall be to extend a knowledge of the work of the Church among the Churchwomen of the Diocese, to awaken greater interest and sympathy for her missions and missionaries (such interest to be shown by earnest, practical work for them), and to endeavor to promote spiritual life and activity among its members.

### ARTICLE III.

This Association shall be composed of six Districts, corresponding to the six Convocation Districts, each District electing its own officers and managing its own work, subject to the approval of the Diocesan President.

### ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. An Annual Meeting shall be held at some convenient date in May for the presentation of reports from District Branches, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SECTION 2. A Semi-Annual Meeting may be held in the fall at the discretion of the President.

### ARTICLE V.

The Officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary and Treasurer (appointed by the Bishop), who with the several District Presidents shall constitute an Executive Committee.

### ARTICLE VI.

SECTION 1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and have general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop.

SECTION 2. The duty of the Vice-President shall be to preside in the absence of the President, and to co-operate with her in the general work of the Association.

SECTION 3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence of the Association under the direction of the President, and to make an annual report.

SECTION 4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to keep a record of the annual and semi-annual meetings, to call the roll at these meetings, and to read such papers as may be ordered to be read.

SECTION 5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive and hold all moneys sent to her by the District Treasurers, to disburse the same to the objects designated by the senders, viz: Diocesan or other Missions, Missionaries, Scholarships, etc., and to make an annual report.

#### ARTICLE VII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any Annual Meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

---

#### BY-LAWS.

SECTION 1. Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

SECTION 2. The regular order of business at the annual and semi-annual meetings shall be:

1. Offices of Devotion.
2. Roll Call.
3. Reading of Minutes of Last Meeting.
4. Reports of Officers and Committees.
5. Unfinished Business.
6. Miscellaneous Business and Addresses.

SECTION 3. The By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting, by a vote of a majority present.

## CONSTITUTION

Of the Central New York Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Adopted at Binghamton, May 12th, 1893. Amended at Utica, May 11th, 1904.

### ARTICLE I.

This organization shall be called the Central New York Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

### ARTICLE II.

The object of this organization shall be to interest and instruct the youth and children of the Church in the mission work and to impress upon them a sense of responsibility as baptised members of the same to assist in advancing the great object for which the Church was established.

### ARTICLE III.

The Diocesan Branch shall consist of the District Branches, corresponding to the six Convocation Districts.

### ARTICLE IV.

The officers shall be a Diocesan Superintendent, a Diocesan Treasurer and a diocesan Secretary of the Little Helpers, appointed by the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary and approved by the Bishop; and a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan officers and a District Superintendent and a District Secretary of the Little Helpers for each district who shall be elected annually by the Woman's Auxiliary of their Districts.

### ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Superintendent to have entire management of the Junior work in the Diocese, subject to the approval of the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Treasurer to receive and forward to the beneficiaries all gifts of money and render an annual report of the same.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to carry on the work as directed by the Diocesan Superintendent, organize new branches and visit the parishes of her district frequently to arouse interest, and present the report of her district at the annual Diocesan meeting.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Secretary of the Little Helpers to direct the work of the District Secretaries, and to receive the annual

offerings of the members and disburse the same with the approval of the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

SECTION 5. It shall be the duty of the District Secretaries of the Little Helpers to secure the appointment of Parish Secretaries in their Districts, and to collect and forward the offerings annually to the Diocesan Secretary.

#### ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch shall be held upon the day following the Diocesan meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

#### ARTICLE VII.

This Constitution may be changed or amended by the Board of Managers at their discretion.
