REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

Last year's report marked an advance in the work of the Auxiliary. This year we are able to report not only an advance in gifts, but better still an enlargement of enthusiasm; the broadening of some special lines of work, and the evident desire throughout the Districts for more information concerning the Missionary work of the Church. From May 1st, 1904, to May 1st, 1905, this Branch sent to the Mission field, diocesan, domestic and foreign, the sum of \$4,957.12 and boxes valued at \$7,373.46 of which a detailed report will be found in the following tables.

An encouraging aspect of the work is that many more Auxiliary workers attend the Annual Meeting than formerly, while some of the District Meetings are marvels of businesslike despatch and enthusiasm for the work. Our band of Little Helpers especially shows healthy growth, the contributions having nearly doubled in the past year and the membership largely increased. The idea of educating little children in Churchly ways and making them eligible for the Junior Branch is certainly a practical plan for future church extension.

The Church Periodical Club has added a new department in furnishing games for children's hospitals. The Fifth District has made a long stride in appointing a District Librarian to aid in the work of this Club. A number of books and periodicals should go from each parish to fill the shelves of some book-loving Missionary on the frontier. If some woman could be found in each church willing to act as a corresponding librarian how rapidly the work would grow.

The Junior Branch has put forth increased effort the past year. Can not more attention be given each Parish Branch by the parent Auxiliary. The Junior Branches are forming the strong women who in a few years will take our places in this work.

The Bishop has appointed Mrs. Knickerbocker of Watertown, Mrs. Lockwood, of Syracuse, Mrs. Irish of Utica, and Miss Cornell of Ithaca, a committee to revise the Constitution and their report will be brought before the Annual Meeting of 1906.

Each District seems to have made an advance in some special line. The Fourth District has been disseminating instruction by circular letters explaining the pledges, addressed to each communicant. The Sixth District has perfected its financial organization by decreeing that all sums shall pass through the hands of the District Treasurer. The First District has made a long step forward in active work. The Second District has bettered its work in accuracy as well as scope. The Third District has enlarged the interest in District meetings.

But there is still a wide field of effort before the ideal of Auxiliary life is reached. Every church woman is a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. It is her birthright. Then let the officers of each Parish Branch

enroll them according to their qualifications. If necessarily detained in the home, then make them honorary members helping with the pledges. If possessed of literary qualities let them give "talks" on the different objects for which gifts are pledged, this year, and thus awaken interest. Others are fine readers, let them entertain the Branch with some of the many interesting publications now brought out by the Church Missions House. Let others disseminate a wider understanding of the United Offering—the voluntary thank offering of every Christian woman.

And above all, let a copy of the "Spirit of Missions" be upon the work table of each Branch, as the chart by which the course is shaped; and beside it a copy of this Annual Report as a compass, to show by its list of pledges, the special route this Diocesan Branch travels.

For this report is not printed simply to be filed away as a record of past achievements. It is meant to be put to a fine use, to be read by the church women of Central New York. It is a report of the work we women are doing, and not doing well enough. Because instead of the superhuman efforts of the few, there should be the willing hands of the many to lighten the toil.

Can not each Parish appoint a woman of gracious presence and earnest spirit who shall devote herself to the enlargement of the Branch.

Read the Diocesan Journal and compare the number of church women with the number of each Parish Auxiliary.

That is an unanswerable argument. There is lack of growth in our Parish Branches. Can we not remedy it?

Our work in this Diocese is well organized, we have the perfected machinery, but it takes the fire of enthusiasm to move it. And all the more, this year, because of the resignation of our beloved President, Mrs. Knickerbocker, for fifteen years the inspiration of the Auxiliary, in this Diocese. In no way can so just an appreciation of her work be shown as by advancing it this coming year.

Our Vice President, Miss Watson, has also resigned, and the District Officers are thus by stress of responsibility doubly pledged to their work.

Mrs. Thorn, our efficient Treasurer for ten years past has assigned her arduous post to Miss Mary Cornell of Ithaca. Let us encourage our new treasurer by prompt payments of pledges, and thus relieve her of one-half the burden of her position.

As we look over the work for the coming year let each Parish Branch and each member resolve to aid in growth, to aid in Missionary study, to aid in gifts and work.

The Church Periodical Club was founded by the late Mrs. Mortimer Fargo. She had been led first, by her residence in the west, to see its great need, and made to herself a solemn promise that if she ever came to live in the east she would gather and distribute literature, particularly among the clergy in the west, where they were starving for it. With a foresight which must have been given her by the Holy Spirit and with a mathematical precision she had formulated and crystalized her plans for a work which has been the greatest ever undertaken by one woman not only in the Church but in the world.

The object of the Club is to supply to clergymen and missionaries in remote parts of the country such periodicals and other literary matter as might be useful to them in their work and otherwise inaccessible. Papers and magazines which, once read by the original subscribers would be cast aside or buried in cupboards, may do missionary work if the owners will remail them to addresses furnished by the librarian of the parish, pre-paying postage. The expenses of the Club for stationery, postage, express charges and typewriter have been met by special gifts, but the Club would be glad to increase the number of members paying one dollar a year, as it would assist in extending the work. Those who have no periodicals or books to forward, but desire to take part in the work, may make special gifts of money to be expended by the Secretary for the purchase of new theological publications which are constantly being asked for by the Clergy.

The very grateful acknowledgements received for these gifts show how keenly they are appreciated. There is an increased demand for games and pictures to be used in hospitals, which our Diocese I trust will help supply. One Missionary writes "after reading the periodicals sent us by the good Church people, we give them to others even poorer than we, with the understanding that they in turn give them elsewhere. In this way they are forming a beautiful endless chain of mental progress, whose influence no one can estimate. Another writes, "For those who cannot spare a penny to gratify intellectual hunger, your Club is a true benefaction and surely the givers will not be without their reward, if even a cup of cold water given I. H. N. is to receive it.

THE BABIES' BRANCH

Prayer of the Babies' Branch

"God bless all the Missionaries all over the world, and all the Little Helpers, for Jesus' sake.

Text

"Little children love one another."

The Babies' Branch is intended to introduce the little ones into their missionary responsibilities at baptism. This is a Diocesan Society, not Parish, and the babies are expected to help with their gifts of a penny each Sunday, the missionary work of the church.

Four thoughts are emphasized by this Babies' Branch.

FIRST.—Every baby by baptism becomes a member of the missionary society and the church.

SECOND.—The first day of the week is the time to lay apart something for the Lord, thus forming the habit in the child's life.

THIRD.—This cannot be a parish society. It is something broader, teaching practically that the child belongs to the church at large.

FOURTH.—The gifts are to be divided equally between the Diocesan, Foreign and Domestic fields.

The fifth idea has already produced beautiful fruit. When the little ones are transplanted to paradise, their work does not cease, but each Sunday a penny is put in the box by the mother or other children, in memory of the little one, and a prayer offered for the children of the world.

Officers of the Auxiliary or, when there is no branch, the clergy, are asked to appoint in every parish a competent Directress who will constantly seek for members.

The Directress takes the full baptismal name and surname and the age of the applicant, and sends it a box. On every Sunday the child is to put one cent in the box and say or hear said the prayer and text.

Holy Innocents Day the *money is to be taken from the box* and sent to the Directress, the child keeping the box for the following year.

Four principles are thus enforced: That every child is by baptism a member of the missionary society—the church; that on the first day of the week it should lay apart for the Lord; that prayer for missions is its constant duty; and that the field is the world.

It is hoped that all who take boxes will realize how important it is to take the best care of them, and train the "Little Helpers" to systematic giving and prayer, so that in the future they may become earnest and faithful workers for Christ.
