PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

It gives me much pleasure to welcome so many of the women of the Diocese to our annual meeting, and we cannot fail to be encouraged by the reports just given, showing that in every District the work has progressed, while in several the results have been most gratifying. This success is to be credited very largely to the officers of the several Districts through whose personal efforts and untiring zeal the work has gone steadily forward; and I wish to avail myself of this opportunity to thank you all for your cordial support and co-operation. While rejoicing in our success, however, let us always remember that no matter how much the Auxiliary may grow in the future, how many new branches may be formed, nor to what extent our gifts of money may increase, it was Mrs. Knickerbocker who took this work in its infancy, when the branches were few and struggling for existence, and has brought it up to its present standard. During fifteen years she devoted to it her best time, thought, energy and zeal. She it was who inspired enthusiasm, endeavoring by every means in her power to show to the women of the Diocese her interpretation of the Missionary spirit, and to her honor be it said, she left the work well organized and progressing in its various departments.

Such conditions are a matter of congratulation, but they do not insure the future life of the Auxiliary, and to us, upon whom has fallen the responsibility of carrying on the work, these questions naturally present themselves: How are we to increase the interest already existing? by what means are we to arouse fresh zeal and enthusiasm? and above all else how are we to deepen our spiritual life, without which we cannot retain strength or vigor? It is true that in the study of missions, which opens up such great possibilities, we may acquire both interest and enthusiasm, but it is by examining the characters of the missionaries themselves that we shall learn the best means of developing our higher capacities. Nor need we confine ourselves to any special age or particular field of labor. Each life will disclose an unmistakable feature which may be described by one word "self giving." It is easy to see why this self-giving is both effective and far reaching in its results and never fails of its purpose, for by this means we shall cultivate in ourselves the spirit of self-sacrifice, which is the foundation of all missionary life. In proof of this, we have but to look over the mission field to-day, where we shall find noble Bishops, faithful Priests and deacons, loyal men and devoted women, whose whole lives are made up of daily acts of self-sacrifice, and who, like brave soldiers, have gone forth at the Church's call to bear the brunt of the battle. When we read of the noble examples of those who are giving their lives for others possessing fewer privileges, are we not filled with a fervent desire to make our work at home more effective by deeds of loving service, purer and sweeter by

daily intercession, noble and more inspiring by constant acts of self-sacrifice? Thus through our example, others will be aroused from their indifference to a sense of the responsibility laid upon them to do their part of this work; will learn to appreciate the blessing of extending to others what we so richly enjoy, and will look upon every appeal for Missions as a fresh opportunity of proving their love and gratitude for the priceless gift of Christianity. Let us then give *ourselves* for as some one has well said, "The only real life is that which makes a sacrifice of self, and where through spiritual life we attain righteousness."

THE BABIES' BRANCH

Prayer of the Babies' Branch

"God bless all the Missionaries all over the world, and all the Little Helpers, for Jesus' sake."

Text

"Little children love one another."

The Babies' Branch is intended to introduce the little ones into their missionary responsibilities at baptism. This is a Diocesan Society, not Parish, and the babies are expected to help with their gifts of a penny each Sunday, the missionary work of the church.

Four thoughts are emphasized by this Babies' Branch.

First.—Every baby by baptism becomes a member of the missionary society and the church.

Second.—The first day of the week is the time to lay apart something for the Lord, thus forming the habit in the child's life.

Third.—This cannot be a parish society. It is something broader, teaching practically that the child belongs to the church at large.

Fourth.—The gifts are to be divided equally between the Diocesan, Foreign and Domestic fields.

The fifth idea has already produced beautiful fruit. When the little ones are transplanted to paradise, their work does not cease, but each Sunday a penny is put in the box by the mother or other children, in memory of the little one, and a prayer offered for the children of the world.

Officers of the Auxiliary or, when there is no branch, the clergy, are asked to appoint in every parish a competent Directress who will constantly seek for members.

The Directress takes the full baptismal name and surname and the age of the applicant, and sends it a box. On every Sunday the child is to put one cent in the box and say or hear said the prayer and text.

Holy Innocents Day the *money is to be taken from the box* and sent to the Directress, the child keeping the box for the following year.

Four principles are thus enforced: That every child is by baptism a member of the missionary society—the church; that on the first day of the week it should lay apart for the Lord; that prayer for missions is its constant duty; and that the field is the world.

It is hoped that all who take boxes will realize how important it is to take the best care of them, and train the "Little Helpers" to systematic giving and prayer, so that in the future they may become earnest and faithful workers for Christ.

CONSTITUTION

Of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central New York to
the Board of Missions. Amended, as proposed by the Bishop,
and adopted at the Annual Meeting held in St. Peter's
Church, Auburn, May 16th, 1906.

ARTICLE I. NAME.

This Association shall be known as the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central New York to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II. OBJECT.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out, within the Diocese of Central New York, the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions, to extend among the women of the Diocese a knowledge of the Missions of the General Church, and to awaken greater interest in, and sympathy with the Missionaries.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP.

This Association shall be composed of the women of the Diocese representing the various Parish Branches, and organized in the Six Convocation Districts of the Diocese, each District electing its own officers, and managing its own work.

ARTICLE IV. ANNUAL MEETING.

An annual meeting shall be held at some convenient date in May at such church in each of the Districts consecutively from year to year as shall be most convenient to the people of the Districts. Reports shall be presented by the several District Branches, and such other business shall be transacted as may properly come before such meeting.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS.

The officers shall be a President, a Vice President, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, and a Treasurer, all of whom shall be appointed by the Bishop. These officers with the Presidents of the Districts shall constitute an Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI. DUTY OF OFFICERS.

Sec. 1. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all the meetings of the Association, and have general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

Sec. 2. The duty of the First Vice President shall be to preside in the absence of the President, and to co-operate with her in the general work of the Association. In the absence of both the President and First Vice President, the meeting shall elect one of the District Presidents to take the chair.

Sec. 3. The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence of the Association under the direction of the President, and to make an annual report.

Sec. 4. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to keep a record of the annual and semi-annual meetings, call the roll at these meetings, and to read such papers as may be ordered to be read.

Sec. 5. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive and hold all moneys sent to her by the District Treasurers, to disburse the same to the objects designated by the orders, viz: Diocesan and other Missions, Missionaries, Scholarships, etc., and to make an annual report.

ARTICLE VII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any Annual Meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS

Sec. 1. Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

Sec. 2. The regular order of business at the annual and semi-annual meetings shall be:

1. Offices of Devotion.
2. Roll Call.
3. Reading of Minutes of Last Meeting.
4. Reports of Officers and Committees.
5. Unfinished Business.
6. Miscellaneous Business and Addresses.

Sec. 3. The By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting, by a vote of a majority present.

CONSTITUTION

Of the Central New York Branch of the Junior Woman's Auxiliary.
Adopted at Binghamton, May 12th, 1893. Amended at
Utica, May 11th, 1904.

ARTICLE I.

This organization shall be called the Central New York Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this organization shall be to interest and instruct the youth and children of the Church in the Mission work and to impress upon them a sense of responsibility as baptised members of the same to assist in advancing the great object for which the Church was established.

ARTICLE III.

The Diocesan Branch shall consist of the District Branches, corresponding to the six Convocation Districts.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers shall be a Diocesan Superintendent, a Diocesan Treasurer and a Diocesan Secretary of the Little Helpers, appointed by the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary and approved by the Bishop; and a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan officers and a District Superintendent and a District Secretary of the Little Helpers for each district who shall be elected annually by the Women's Auxiliary of their Districts.

ARTICLE V.

Sec. 1. It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Superintendent to have entire management of the Junior work in the Diocese, subject to the approval of the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Treasurer to receive and forward to the beneficiaries all gifts of money and render an annual report of the same.

Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to carry on the work as directed by the Diocesan Superintendent, organize new branches and visit the parishes of her district frequently to arouse interest, and present the report of her district at the annual Diocesan meeting.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the Diocesan Secretary of the Little Helpers to direct the work of the District Secretaries, and to receive the annual offerings of the members and disburse the same with the approval of the Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the District Secretaries of the Little Helpers to secure the appointment of Parish Secretaries in their Districts, and to collect and forward the offerings annually to the Diocesan Secretary.

ARTICLE VI.

The annual meeting of the Diocesan Branch shall be held upon the day following the Diocesan meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VII.

This Constitution may be changed or amended by the Board of Managers at their discretion.
