President's Address

Meeting as we do to-day, for help, encouragement, and the inspiration which comes from personal intercourse with those who are engaged in the same work and are striving for the same object; we must look back over the year just passed, to see how we can profit by its failures, and its successes. By dividing our work into different heads we can get a true estimate of what has been accomplished. As an organization, our reports show an increase in membership, a few new branches organized, and an increased attendance at our District meetings. As a helper to the Board of Missions, our appeals for boxes have met with a generous response, our pledge for General Missions has been promptly paid, the number of publications sent out by the Church Periodical Club has been larger than ever before, and our Day of Intercession for Missions has been generally observed. Our gifts in money have been very large, but the most hopeful sign is the growing desire for a better knowledge of the work, evidenced by the formation of study classes and an increased interest in Missionary literature. It is not necessary for me to dwell upon the benefits to be derived from the study of Missions, as they are fully described in an article published in the "Spirit of Missions" for this month. I will only say that by this means we enlarge our vision, we get an idea of the imperative needs of the work, we learn what it has cost to lay the foundations upon which we are asked to build, and presents such a host of possibilities, that we gladly welcome every effort towards the attainment of such knowledge. Bearing these facts in mind, we may well be surprised at the slow progress made by Christian people in this direction. The reason being that we fail to see any duty involved in the matter; we feel no personal obligation to share this Christianity with those who have never had the opportunity of believing. We look upon this Missionary work as an adjunct to our lives; whereas, it is a most important part of it—requiring the best of our time, interest, influence and our prayers. Nor should we be content with doing our own part, but strive to help others to accomplish theirs, just as our Missionaries are happy in giving themselves for the good of their fellowmen. Another fact revealed to us by the study of Missions is the need for workers, which is becoming more urgent every year. And where shall we look for recruits—but among our Junior members? They are engaged in the same work as ourselves, and in a few years they will be taking our places. Surely, in their youth, strength, vigor, and hopefulness, they are the ones to be taught that it is to them the Church is looking to carry the glad news of love and redemption,—and that self-consecration is the highest act of self-sacrifice.

As older members of the Auxiliary, let us extend to them our interest, our sympathy, our encouragement; ever ready to lend a helping hand, and thus make them feel they are one with us.

We see then the many claims this Missionary work has upon each one of us as Christian women; let us resolve to place it uppermost in our lives, and with minds enlightened, gaining fresh courage from the example of others and kept true to our purpose by our daily intercessions, we shall go forth to conquer in His name.

**Report of the Church Periodical Club
For the Diocese of Central New York
From May 1, 1906, to May 1, 1907**

We are now sending from our Diocese through our twenty-four Librarians, 230 periodicals regularly. We have sent fifteen barrels of reading matter and sixty-five Christmas and Easter cards. I have received but one dollar which I sent to the Treasurer, but I trust other gifts have been sent directly to her. The best idea of the real Missionary work our Club is doing can be gained from the grateful letters of those to whom we have sent reading matter. One clergyman writes: "It seems to me there is no phase of our Church work more important than yours. In very many cases it must be true that you confer a very real gift of Light. To tell you adequately what your work has done for me would be to write a history of all the study and thought side of my ministry. Through you I have been able to keep in touch with the larger world of thought outside my own parish." Another says: "If more people who are blessed with an abundance of this world's goods could realize the need of those who have little, surely there would not be in this day and age, localities where there is such a lack of literature." Archdeacon Stuck says of reading matter sent to Alaska: "It has been carried up and down the river in steamboats and poling boats, and across country on pack horses and mules, and even on men's backs when there were no beasts of burden, and many a lonely life will have recreation and interest brought into it in the coming winter as a result of this distribution. These periodicals will be passed from hand to hand and read and re-read as long as they hold together."

The Babies' Branch

Prayer of the Babies' Branch

"God bless all the Missionaries all over the world, and all the Little Helpers, for Jesus' sake."

Text

"Little children love one another."

The Babies' Branch is intended to introduce the little ones into their missionary responsibilities at baptism. This is a Diocesan Society, not Parish, and the babies are expected to help with their gifts of a penny each Sunday, the missionary work of the church.

Four thoughts are emphasized by this Babies' Branch.

FIRST.—Every baby by baptism becomes a member of the missionary society and the church.

SECOND.—The first day of the week is the time to lay apart something for the Lord, thus forming the habit in the child's life.

THIRD.—This cannot be a parish society. It is something broader, teaching practically that the child belongs to the church at large.

FOURTH.—The gifts are to be divided equally between the Diocesan, Foreign and Domestic fields.

The fifth idea has already produced beautiful fruit. When the little ones are transplanted to paradise, their work does not cease, but each Sunday a penny is put in the box by the mother or other children, in memory of the little one, and a prayer offered for the children of the world.

Officers of the Auxiliary or, when there is no branch, the clergy, are asked to appoint in every parish a competent Directress who will constantly seek for members.

The Directress takes the full baptismal name and surname and the age of the applicant, and sends it a box. On every Sunday the child is to put one cent in the box and say or hear said the prayer and text.

Holy Innocents Day the *money is to be taken from the box* and sent to the Directress, the child keeping the box for the following year.

Four principles are thus enforced: That every child is by baptism a member of the missionary society—the church; that on the first day of the week it should lay apart for the Lord; that prayer for missions is its constant duty; and that the field is the world.

It is hoped that all who take boxes will realize how important it is to take the best care of them, and train the "Little Helpers" to systematic giving and prayer, so that in the future they may become earnest and faithful workers for Christ.
