



## PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

---

It seems scarcely possible that this is the fourth time I have had the honor of presiding at our Annual Meeting, so quickly have the years gone by. In reviewing the work during this period, the first thought presented is one of thankfulness that we have not been called upon to mourn the loss of either a Diocesan or District Officer. Of course there have been changes in the Districts; the most important one was caused by the action of the Diocesan Convention last June, by which the 6th Missionary District was eliminated and merged into the 3rd and 5th, thereby making them much larger than before. This necessitated the election of new officers; Mrs. Stephenson, President of the 3rd District, graciously yielded her position to Mrs. Rankine of the 6th, who was well fitted by long experience for the larger work. In the 5th Mrs. Wm. B. Clark who served successfully as President of her District several years since, was again called to fill the position. It will doubtless take time before these Districts are amalgamated, but the kind feeling displayed and the willingness to make concessions for the good of the work, on the part of those concerned, is highly commendable, and augers well for the future of these enlarged districts with their increased membership and responsibilities. It is scarcely necessary for me to mention that the 4th District has been called upon to give up their President, which is a source of deep regret, yet they must feel honored in having her called to a higher and more influential position. These changes, however, have not affected the progress of the work, which has gradually increased, as our reports show. During the time that the work has been under my charge, the objects that I have tried to keep before the minds of the women have been our apportionment, the United Offering, and the great need of study classes.

With regard to the first subject, it gives me great pleasure to say that for the first time since the adoption of the apportionment plan we have reached the amount asked for General Missions, showing that we have not only recognized our obligation to the Board of Missions but have fulfilled it. It is a well known fact that of the \$100,000 asked each year from the Auxiliary at large, Central New York's portion was \$1,000. It would perhaps be interesting to know that our first pledge for General Missions made in 1902 (in response to an appeal for this object by Mrs. Knickerbocker our faithful president for so many years) was \$100. Our United Offering which in 1904 amounted to \$3,239 in 1907 reached the sum of \$5,339, proving that this Thank Offering given to those whom we wish to bless, is becoming each year dearer to the hearts of the women of the Auxiliary; that we are learning the blessing of giving, and the joy of service. Lastly, our Mission Study Classes number more each year, giving evidence of a growing desire for a deeper insight into the needs of the work, and of the host of possibilities constantly being revealed to us. But all these good results could not have been reached without the united and self sacrificing efforts of the officers and members of the Auxiliary; for a President cannot carry on the work. She can only suggest, advise, and influence, and I wish to avail myself of this opportunity to thank you individually and as a body, for your constant, cordial and helpful co-operation, for your warm greetings to a comparative stranger, and especially for your forbearance with one who took the position poorly equipped for the work, and doing so, only for the exigency which then existed; you will, I am sure, agree with me also in the deep sense of gratitude toward our most efficient Diocesan Secretary, whose ever ready help has been so greatly appreciated, and whose businesslike reports have received from Miss Emery the highest commendation. It is very gratifying to leave the work in this progressive condition, but there is so much to be accomplished, requiring the best of self and means, that it gives me complete satisfaction to resign the position to one who through her long experience as a District President, by her wide acquaintance throughout the Diocese, and by her deep interest in the work, is better fitted to lead you on to greater effort and to larger achievements.

You all know my heart is in the work, and it will always give me pleasure to hear of your advancement. My term of office has not been a long one, but I shall retain the happiest recollections of my experience as your President.

Your report this year is in every way most satisfactory. While some parishes fell short in their gifts, it was made up by others, the result being an increase of \$15.55 over last year.

You have given \$110.00 for General Missions. Twenty-five dollars of this goes to the support of the Gaylord Hart Mitchell Memorial Kindergarten, which was until this year the special work of the Little Helpers, but has recently been assumed by the Board of Missions, as has also the Angelica Church Hart Day School, to which you gave \$10.00. Forty dollars of the remaining \$75.00 went for Foreign Missions and \$35.00 for Domestic Missions.

I wonder if you understand the meaning of all these long words. Foreign Missions teach the story of Our Lord Jesus Christ to the little ones in far off India, China, Japan, and Africa. Domestic Missions teach the great story to those nearer home—the Indians in the west, the colored babies down south, the Esquimaux in the cold frozen north, and the Filipinos on their island in the Pacific Ocean.

The gift of a font always seems a most appropriate one, as through Holy Baptism more babies are annually made eligible to membership in the Babies' Branch. This year two such gifts were made, one in our own diocese, and the other in True Sunshine Mission, San Francisco.

You see your pennies have done much good this year. Please do not forget them every Sunday next year, and above all do not forget the little prayer which gives them an additional value by consecrating them to God's service.

REPORT OF THE CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB  
FOR THE DIOCESE OF CENTRAL N.Y.

We are now sending regularly 225 periodicals. Have sent 160 odd magazines, 70 pictures and 7 boxes and barrels of reading matter and 130 Christmas and Easter Cards and Calendars. The Librarians as far as reported, and the Correspondents have contributed Sixteen dollars for postage and freight.

The grateful letters that we receive from those to whom periodicals are sent express more vividly than statistics the good missionary work this reading matter is doing and the great enjoyment it affords.

Extract, from the Report of the Recording Secretary of the Church Periodical Club, read by Miss Wood, at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, in Utica:

Is it too much to hope that every parish in the land will take an interest in the Church Periodical Club? May it not go hand in hand with the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, supplying the needs of the mind, as the Auxiliary supplies the needs of the body? To accomplish this we need the co-operation of the librarians. We need one in every parish who will arouse interest among the people, and direct the interest when aroused; one who will not weary in making known the needs of the work and the best way to ensure good results. Such a librarian will impress upon the individual donor the importance of sending a magazine regularly, with postage prepaid, and explain how current magazines, if sent to the office, involve more work for the hard-pressed clerks and extra money for postage. She will tell the people of the necessity of funds to carry on the work; for salaries of clerks, for postage and freight, and remind them that the packages sent to the office cannot be forwarded without expense, and therefore beg them to supplement their reading matter with some money to send it on. She will encourage the donors to write to their recipients as mutual friends, not merely machines to give and take reading matter, and she will do all in her power to keep before herself and others the motive of the Church Periodical Club: to give of one's abundance to those who are in need of good literature. Surely there are many women who can and will do this, and who will desire no reward but that of the good servant who has been faithful over a few things.

The Babies' Branch is intended to introduce the little ones into their missionary responsibilities at baptism. This is a Diocesan Society, not Parish, and the babies are expected to help with their gifts of a penny each Sunday, the missionary work of the church.

Four thoughts are emphasized by this Babies' Branch.

**FIRST.**—Every baby by baptism becomes a member of the missionary society and the church.

**SECOND.**—The first day of the week is the time to lay apart something for the Lord, thus forming the habit in the child's life.

**THIRD.**—This cannot be a parish society. It is something broader, teaching practically that the child belongs to the church at large.

**FOURTH.**—The gifts are to be divided equally between the Diocesan, Foreign and Domestic fields.

The fifth idea has already produced beautiful fruit. When the little ones are transplanted to paradise, their work does not cease, but each Sunday a penny is put in the box by the mother or other children, in memory of the little one, and a prayer offered for the children of the world.

Officers of the Auxiliary or, when there is no branch, the clergy are asked to appoint in every parish a competent Directress who will constantly seek for members.

The Directress takes the full baptismal name and surname and the age of the applicant, and sends it a box. On every Sunday the child is to put one cent in the box and say or hear said the prayer and text.

Holy Innocents Day *the money is to be taken from the box* and sent to the Directress, the child keeping the box for the following year.

Four principals are thus enforced: That every child is by baptism a member of the missionary society—the church; that on the first day of the week it should lay apart for the Lord; that prayer for missions is its constant duty; and that the field is the world.

It is hoped that all who take boxes will realize how important it is to take the best care of them, and train the "Little Helpers" to systematic giving and prayer, so that in the future they may become earnest and faithful workers for Christ.
