



PRESIDENT'S LETTER

MY DEAR FRIENDS:

It was certainly interesting at our annual meeting to listen to the reports and realize that some advance had been made in our work during the past year.

Yet it is not what we have done so much as what we ought to do in the future, which should engage our attention.

If we read the reports of the Board of Missions, we shall see that the needs of the Mission Field are greater than the Board can supply.

We learn that in their meeting on May 14, they felt obliged to take a step backward and to reduce the total appropriation some thousands of dollars.

We see also that other Missionary Boards complain of deficits in their apportionments.

In other words, the church, "God's Great Missionary Society," as someone has defined it, fails to come up to its full duty—does not supply what is absolutely necessary for work already planned, to say nothing of fields not yet entered.

Some of the fault *is ours*. No doubt we are all interested in missions, more or less—but also most of us are at the same time interested in very many other things, some of them wholly material.

A recent writer has said that the solution of the great missionary problem is two-fold, "The Sufficiency of God and the Soul's Vision of God."

Both are necessary. We all believe in the infinite power of God, but also we know that God works by means and that He has called upon *us to do our part*.

We fail, because we lack the needed vision, the spiritual uplift necessary.

A great united effort to carry the Gospel into all parts of the world was never more sorely needed than just at the present time.

We are now entrusted once more with a new opportunity. Let us begin again, determined to do better work than ever before.

May God grant us the needed vision that so we may work and give and pray as we ought for the coming of God's kingdom on earth.

* * * * *

It has been my observation that many parish and district branches of the Woman's Auxiliary delay beginning their work in triennial years until after those meetings. This may have resulted in some loss during last year.

It seems doubly important, therefore, that this year all parish branches should begin their meetings at an early date.

Surely, a thoughtful survey of the past should convince us all that more vigor is needed for the proper development of our work.

I would call especial attention to the resolutions passed at the triennial meetings in the matter of drawing more closely together the Junior and Senior branches.

In every parish there should be two, and when possible three, branches of Juniors—these of course to include the Little Helpers' branch. Surely in every parish, where it is possible, there should be a Section B of Seniors.

Only in this way can we enlist the interest of the younger women and so ensure the life of our Woman's Auxiliary.

Of almost paramount importance is the matter of Mission Study Classes.

Certainly as yet our branch has not done what we might in this direction. If all district and parish officers will aid our educational secretaries in their work, much may be accomplished in the coming year.

Condensed Minutes of the Annual Meeting held in Watertown May 26, 1914

The annual meeting of the Central New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary convened in Trinity Church, Watertown, May 26th, 1914.

Holy Communion was celebrated at 7:30 a. m. by the Rev. R. H. Gesner, rector of Christ Church, Oswego, and at 10:30 the Holy Communion was administered to a large congregation by the Bishop of the Diocese, assisted by the Rev. Almon A. Jaynes, rector of Trinity Church, Syracuse, and the Rev. Wilson E. Tanner, rector of St. Andrew's Church, New Berlin.

Immediately after service a meeting of officers was held, which was open to all members of the Auxiliary. Miss Jackson spoke particularly of summer conferences and wished that some women of this Diocese might attend. At 12 o'clock noonday prayers were said and at 12:15 luncheon was served in Trinity House.

At 2:30 the business meeting convened, the president, Miss Jackson, in the chair. The Rev. F. W. Eason, rector of the Parish, opened the meeting with prayer. Roll call showed 186 present. The minutes of the officers' meeting, held the evening before, were read and approved.

The treasurer, Miss Cornell, read her report, which showed all pledges paid and a balance on hand of \$165.66, with \$554.14 toward the United Offering of 1916. The report was accepted; also reports from the secretaries of the Church Periodical Club, the United Offering and Educational Work.

Reports were also made by the Diocesan superintendent of the Junior Work and the Diocesan secretary of the Little Helpers. Each district report showed a growing interest and knowledge of the missionary work of the church, which means increase in work and gifts.

Mrs. Metcalf, president of the Second District, presented a memorial in loving memory of Mrs. Charles Tyler Olmsted, wife of the Bishop of the Diocese.

The secretary was instructed to send a note of sympathy to the family of Mrs. W. H. Stephenson, of Binghamton. Mrs. Stephenson entered into rest a few weeks ago. She was, for many years, president of the Third District and since resigning that office has served as vice-president.

A resolution was passed, "That the semi-annual meeting of officers, which has been held the past few years, should become a regular custom, always to include the officers of the Juniors and Little Helpers."

Last year, in accordance with a resolution of the year before, all pledges that counted upon the apportionment were included in the one pledge under the head of "General Missions."

The general feeling seemed to be that the name of the object meant

much to many who gave and who might not know to what they were giving if sent to "General Missions." Therefore the following resolution was carried: "That the names be given and the parish treasurers trained to send their money promptly."

The list of pledges as printed was adopted. The First District increased \$10.00, the Second District \$21.55, the Third District \$5.00, the Fourth District \$30.00; a total increase of \$66.55, all for General Missions.

The Rev. Guy P. Burleson, rector of St. John's Church, Auburn, made an earnest plea in behalf of the raising of a fund of \$20,000, the income to be used for the support of an associated mission, to be a memorial to the memory of Miss Halsey.

The Bishop, being detained in the Diocesan convention, did not appoint officers for the coming year as has been his custom.

Mrs. Thayer, in behalf of the Third District, invited the next annual meeting to come to Elmira.

A rising vote of thanks was given the women of the Watertown churches for the entertainment given their guests.

The meeting adjourned informally.

At 7:30 the women met with the Diocesan convention in Trinity House and listened to a most inspiring missionary address by Mr. John W. Wood, of New York, after which all attended a reception given by Mrs. Emma Flower Taylor, at her home, thus closing the annual meeting of 1914.

MEMORIAL

Memorial to Mrs. Charles Tyler Olmsted, presented at the Diocesan meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, by Mrs. F. M. Metcalf, President of the Second District:

On the 21st day of January, as the sun was setting, a beautiful Christian life passed out of this world forever.

As word was passed from friend to friend, that Catharine Lawrence Olmsted had breathed her last, there was a universal expression of bereavement and sorrow throughout the community. Although the most loyal and devoted of church women, very noticeable were the love and respect which she had inspired among all bodies of Christians, and also in what high esteem she was held by the many charitable organizations to which she belonged.

No mere words can give an adequate idea of the cordial sympathy that was extended to the Bishop in his great loss, through the press and through personal expressions of sorrow and regard. Mrs. Olmsted was mourned by thousands.

From girlhood Mrs. Olmsted had been prominent in missionary work. She hardly remembered when she was not interested in foreign missions. Latterly she was particularly interested in China. She was always active in the Woman's Auxiliary, and for some years was president of the second district.

Thus it was that the shock of her death, and the sense of loss fell heaviest (outside of her immediate friends) on the Woman's Auxiliary. How can we do without her, was the feeling of every member. She was our inspiration, our sympathetic friend, and the promoter of effective missionary work. And so out of our great mourning was born the wish to carry on her work and continue her influence. At the first meeting (after Mrs. Olmsted's death) of the Woman's Auxiliary, a resolution embodying our wish, and a plan for a memorial was offered. It was as follows:

"St. Andrew's Church, Feb. 6, 1914.

There is but one thought in our minds this afternoon. It is of a woman whom we love; who was to many of us a personal friend, but who has left us. Our Father's wisdom must not be questioned;

but how strange it seems that a life so useful, a friend so dear, a sympathy so necessary, should be taken away. We are bereaved.

Mrs. Olmsted's strongest characteristic was sympathy; the power of personal fellowship with all she met, and with those of whose troubles she was told. It was this love for others that made her so eager to help the Cause of Missions.

That we who have shared this sympathy may show our appreciation of Mrs. Olmsted, I move, Madam President, that a fund to be known as the Catharine Lawrence Olmsted Fund, be raised and given, through the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese, as a memorial to Mrs. Olmsted.

And so was started the Catharine Lawrence Olmsted Memorial Fund. In the second district, it is already over seven hundred dollars, and in the whole Diocese we hope it will be many hundreds more. Every parish in the second district, however small, has contributed. It was most touching to receive from a group of two or three women in a struggling parish their little mite, offered with such sympathetic cordiality, and the wish that it were more.

Two points were determined on at that first meeting: First, that the fund should not be a yearly contribution, but should be raised as a complete memorial. Second, that it should go to St. Mary's School, Shanghai.

At our annual meeting it was further decided that as matters regarding St. Mary's School were at present indefinite (the land first hoped for not being obtained), that the fund should be placed in the hands of our Diocesan Treasurer, and by her placed at interest, until such time as definite plans could be carried out, for making the Catharine Lawrence Olmsted fund a special memorial.

It was also decided by the second district that it was the wish of the Woman's Auxiliary that the memorial should be used for a specific object and not go into any general fund.

Finally, although a fund commensurate with the high character and noble life of the dear friend and co-worker, whose memory we wish to perpetuate, and whose influence we hope to continue, is not possible to us, yet we may feel that in giving and helping the unfortunate young women in China, we are doing what she would approve, and that her blessing is with us.

The number of parishes helping in this work remains the same as last year (thirty), although there have been a number of changes, some dropping out and new ones joining us. While the figures in the list given do not all show an increase, it should be noted that the number of periodicals sent regularly has increased fifty per cent. over last year, and the odd magazines and papers one hundred per cent., a very encouraging growth. The number of Christmas and Easter cards distributed has also increased largely, and we have done more than ever before in passing on Church music. Seven magazines are being sent regularly to the reading room at the Onondaga Indian Reservation, and one hundred children in the Sunday School there were supplied with cards at Christmas and Easter.

During the past year, the Church Periodical Club in this Diocese has suffered a great loss in the death of Mrs. Charles Tyler Olmsted. Mrs. Olmsted had been for years actively and most generously interested in this work, and since 1912, as secretary of the Second District, she had devoted much time to enlisting the aid of the parishes in her section. Her help will be greatly missed, and her example will be an inspiration to all who have had the privilege of working with her.
