




Summary of Ten Year's Work, Given by Miss Cornell at the Annual Meeting in Oswego, May, 1916.

It may interest you to know that during the ten years I have been in office as Treasurer I have received:

For Pledges and Specials	\$62,761 35
For United Offering	29,283 58

Making a total of\$92,044 93

This seems a very large sum to be given in ten years by the women of a small Diocese, but it is by no means all they have given, for I have known of more than \$10,000 that the women of one District have given in large and small sums directly to the Missionaries who have visited their District and aroused their enthusiasm. No doubt much has been given in the same way in other Districts, which I have not heard of.

Even in the United Offering my figures have never corresponded with those published at the Mission House, showing there must still be some women in the Diocese who send their United Offering to Miss Emery, instead of to the District Treasurer. I wish you might all remember that *all* your gifts should go through the Diocesan Treasurer. These small gifts make a lot of unnecessary bookkeeping for the people at the Missions House.

Now that I am retiring from office, I want to make an appeal to all the women of the Diocese to send their United Offering and all other gifts for missions, if possible, through the Treasurer of the Diocese. In this way your Parish Branch gets credit for its gifts and your money is sent in the way requested by those in authority at the Missions House.

I would like to make one more appeal in behalf of your new Treasurer. Our Pledges have to be paid promptly in order to be of real benefit to the Missionaries for whom they are intended, and it is a great embarrassment to your Treasurer when she knows some poor Missionary is suffering for his money promised in September or

October, if part of it does not come until the next spring. There are throughout the Diocese quite a number of Branches which never under any circumstances send in their pledges until just before the May meetings, and you can readily see how much trouble that gives your Treasurer.

I feel sure that with a little forethought every Branch could pay its Pledges promptly. Some Branches have to earn their money for the Pledges, but it is always printed on the Assessment blanks what month a Pledge is due and, having made your promise, it is as necessary to pay when due as it would be to pay interest on a mortgage when due.

It is with real sorrow that I give up my work, and bid farewell to the many friends I have made among the women of the Diocese. I do not like to think that this is the last time I shall meet with you. You have all been very patient with me. I thank you.

Condensed Minutes of the Annual Meeting held in Oswego May 25, 1916

The annual meeting of the Central New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in Christ Church, Oswego, May 25th, 1916.

A meeting of the officers was held Wednesday evening, May 24th, at which time twenty-five were present.

The Holy Communion was celebrated at 7:30 by the Rector, the Rev. R. H. Gesner, and at 9:30 by Bishop Olmsted.

The business meeting was called to order by Mrs. Goodale, Diocesan President.

Roll call showed 142 present.

Reports were received and accepted from the Secretary, Treasurer, District Presidents, Junior Superintendent and Secretary of Little Helpers.

Reports were received from Miss Huntington, United Offering Secretary; the Educational Secretary, Miss Beauchamp, and the Church Periodical Secretary, Miss Fitch.

At 12 o'clock Monday prayers were read. At 12:15 luncheon was served in the Parish House.

Business was resumed at 2 o'clock.

The list of pledges, as printed, was adopted. The First District increased \$40.00; the Second, \$19.00; the Third, \$10.00; the Fourth, \$70.00; the Fifth, \$2.00; making a total increase of \$141.00, for general missions.

Bishop Olmsted announced the resignation of Miss Cornell, as Treasurer, and the appointment of Mrs. G. L. Clift to fill the vacancy. Miss Watson presented the following resolution, which was accepted by a rising vote:

It is entirely impossible to put into words the appreciation which the women of the Auxiliary feel for the faithful work of Miss Cornell, for many years our Diocesan Treasurer in Central New York, and our regret at the necessity which her removal from the Diocese imposed upon us of accepting her resignation.

For ten years Miss Cornell has illuminated the prosaic office of Treasurer with the devotion of one who counts nothing small when done for Our Blessed Lord and His Church, and often her personal interest in some mission work has inspired larger gifts than without it, might have been made.

Sometimes devotion alone is not practical, but not so in Miss Cornell's case, for her persistent advocacy of business methods has resulted in more system than formerly, especially reports, and in the matter of sending all

money given by the women of the Auxiliary through the Diocesan Treasurer. This involves much trouble for the individual giver, but is not only right from a business point of view, but it is an encouragement to the women all over the Diocese when the Diocesan report is large.

Continued improvement in system in our reports and increase in our gifts will be the truest reward we can offer Miss Cornell for her years of service.

We shall miss her, but we know that her heart will still be in Central New York, and the work of the Woman's Auxiliary. Our affection and good wishes will follow her. May her mantle fall on her successor.

Since the last report, three new Parishes have been added to the list and now have librarians: St. Peter's, Bainbridge; Zion, Greene, and St. Ambrose, Groton. Four active Parishes are temporarily without librarians: Grace Church, Utica; St. Mark's, Syracuse; Emmanuel, Norwich, and St. Thomas', Hamilton, whose interested and able librarian, Mrs. Henry C. Hardy, died in June, 1915. It is hoped that these vacancies can be filled at once. Although the figures in the report show only a small increase, except in the case of books, there has been a perceptible increase in interest and activity throughout the Diocese.

In the effort to meet the needs of our own Diocese, several copies of the Church papers and the Spirit of Missions are being sent to addresses furnished by the Rev. Mr. Springsted, the missionary of Chenango county, who is working among the country people, whose knowledge of the Church is just beginning.

Through the generosity of one member this Diocese has sent the four new theological books asked for as our share toward building up a lending theological library for the Japanese students under Bishop Tucker in the District of Kyoto, so that they may be helped to combat the great growth of rationalism in Japan.

During the year the Diocese has united in collecting a permanent library of two hundred volumes in memory of Mrs. Charles Tyler Olmsted. This included a set of Scott which had belonged to Mrs. Olmsted and was given by Bishop Olmsted; a set of Thackeray from Trinity Parish, Watertown; a number of religious books and books descriptive of the Church's missionary work; a new cook book given by the C. P. C. of Christ Church, Oswego, and several nature study books especially suited to children. It has been sent to the Parish House of St. Paul's Mission, Graniteville, S. C., where under the direction of Deaconess Sands it can be used by a community of mill workers, and where we are assured it will bring recreation, instruction and good cheer for years to come.

The Church Periodical Club is appreciating more and more each year its opportunity to serve. Missionaries at home and abroad are appealing to

us for simple tracts, telling about the Church, her teaching history and customs. They are asking us for magazines, pictures and games to carry the expression of friendly thought, through Parish House, or directly to individuals in lonely places. When a missionary in Texas or California loses his entire library through fire, the Church Periodical Club immediately sets to work to help him get another. Japan asks us to send the best books available on Christian doctrine, to answer the questionings of her students. Arch-deacon Stuck begs us to send good reading for the lonely men in Alaska and tells us that so we may stem the tide of insanity so liable to overwhelm them. May this Diocese of Central New York, with its many resources, respond generously, and do its part.

Educational Report of the Diocese of Central New York

MISSION STUDY DEPARTMENT.

The report of Mission Study work for 1915-1916, as far as received, shows that much has been done in that line by the branches of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The following is the report of the number of groups that have taken up some form of missionary study:

First District	10
Second District	15
Third District	Not reported
Fourth District	24
Fifth District	4

The Educational Secretary of the First District sent out suggestions for meetings and later followed these with letters to find out what was being done. Nine branches reported study and addresses and another is to study during the summer.

The Second District leads in Mission Study classes, six in all, that ideal form of mission study from which the greatest benefit is derived, because it calls for work from the members of the class.

In the Fourth District, two Parishes have used the slides from the Mission House with good results. There have also been two Home Study classes. In Syracuse and vicinity Mission Study speakers have given more than eighty addresses.

The work of the Fifth District is hampered by the difficulty of reaching places on account of Cayuga Lake, but those classes that have been held have studied the series in the Spirit of Missions, "How the Church Came to America," also "The Conquest of the Continent," "The How and Why of Foreign Missions" and "The Gospel of St. Matthew."

The Spirit of Missions has furnished much material for reading circles, and every branch would find it profitable to save a file of that magazine, for reference work, and for material for papers and reading.

Already plans are being made for next year so that the work may be even more profitable than it has been this year,
