As the fiscal year of the Protestant Episcopal Church ends December 31st of each year, the Woman's Auxiliary closes its books at the same time.

All yearly reports MUST be sent to the District Secretary NO LATER than January 5th of each year.

Each Parish Branch should have their annual election of officers no later than December 15th of each year.

Answer all letters and inquiries promptly.

Please write at once to the Missionary, for whom you have been asked to supply clothing, stating when they may expect a box and from whom. As soon as a box has been shipped, please notify at once your District Supply Secretary by filling out the necessary card, giving its estimated value, plus parcel post, express or freight.

No credit can be given for boxes unless the work has been assigned by the Diocesan Supply Secretary.

Any assistance given Missions in the Diocese should be reported in the same manner as assistance given outside of the Diocese.

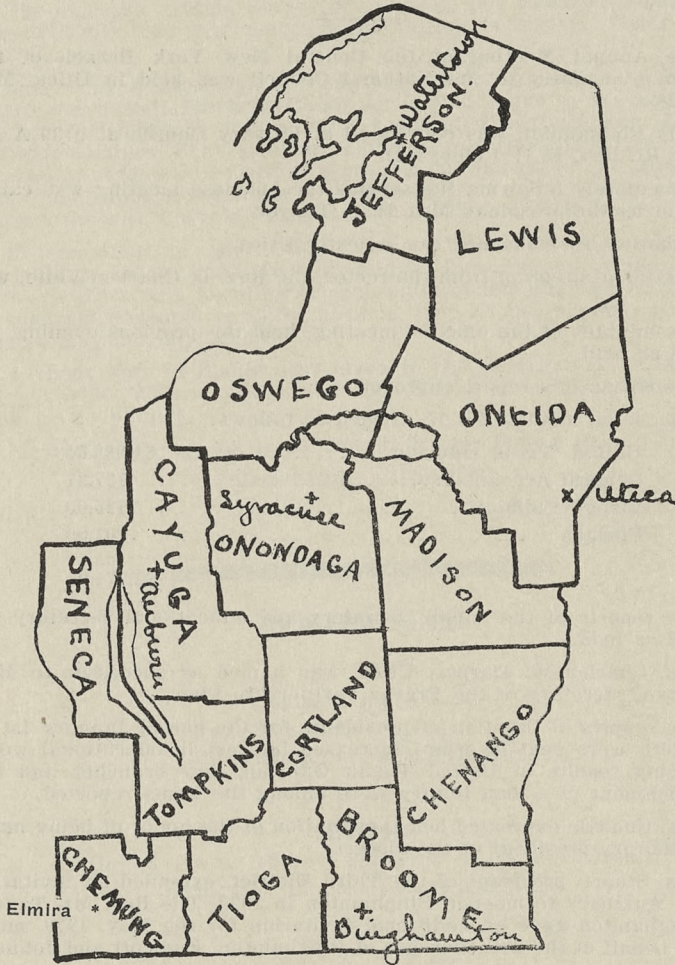

CONDENSED MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

HELD IN UTICA, MAY 22, 1928

The Annual Meeting of the Central New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council was held in Utica, May 22, 1928.

Holy Communion was celebrated at Calvary Church at 9:30 A. M. by the Rt. Rev. E. H. Coley, D.D.

Immediately following the service the business meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. H. S. Thayer.

Bishop Coley welcomed the ladies to Utica.

A letter of greeting from the rector, the Rev. D. Charles White, was read.

The minutes of the officers' meeting, held the previous evening, accepted as read.

The treasurer's report approved.

The reports of the supply secretary and educational secretary approved as read.

Mrs. Charles W. Harper, Utica, was named as successor to Mrs. Kingman, secretary of the Prayer Partnership Plan.

The reports of the district presidents for the period January 1st to May 20th were next in order. Increased interest in educational work, gratifying results in United Thank Offering, new branches and the establishment of a loan library were among the items reported.

Mrs. Goodale expressed her appreciation of the honor of being made the honorary president of the diocese.

Mrs. Stuart, president of the Third District, extended an invitation to the Auxiliary to meet in Binghamton in 1929. The Rev. Mr. Tanner of Binghamton gave an additional invitation for the May, 1929, meeting in behalf of the five churches of Binghamton, Endicott and Johnson City.

Mrs. Thayer called attention to the conference on Religious Education undertaken by our diocese. In the name of Miss Tompkins, she extended a hearty invitation to attend on Thursday, known as visitors' day.

Noon-day prayers by Bishop Coley.

Meeting adjourned for luncheon.

A delightful luncheon was served by Calvary Parish, assisted by the ladies from the other city parishes.

The afternoon session was opened by singing hymn 474, followed by prayers by Mrs. Thayer.

One hundred and ninety-two answered to roll call.

The diocesan lending library of not quite one thousand volumes is now available. The only charge is the postage both ways. Sister Lydia is in charge.

Mrs. Thayer introduced the speaker of the afternoon, the Rev. S. Harrington Littell, Hankow, China. Mr. Littell spoke to the women on the foundation truths and untruths concerning five religions, Taoism, Mohammedanism, Confucianism, Buddhism and Christianity. At a conference of students in Detroit, a suggestion was made and given serious consideration regarding a combination of China's four predominant faiths with Christianity, to be called "The China Religion."

In summing up, Mr. Littell said: "The glorious message of Christianity, which dealt with life and its living, is one which has no part and place in a blending of such philosophies and ancient beliefs. It must be presented to China as it is, that its full import and possibilities may be fully realized."

A rising vote of thanks was given to the churches of Utica, Miss Lucy Carlile Watson, the rector and ladies of Calvary Church for gracious hospitality.

Meeting adjourned to Grace Church to hear Bishop Fiske's address.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL WORK

FOR THE YEAR 1928

DIOCESE OF CENTRAL NEW YORK

Figures are, at best, cold and uninteresting, and it is only as they are interpreted, by comparison with past records, and hopes for future achievements, that they tell the story of the year's work. The 1928 reports show a decided gain in the number of Corporate Communion—214 as against 147 last year. This increase is very largely in the Fourth District. There is a falling off in both the First and Second Districts, due, possibly, to carelessness in reporting.

There have been two Quiet Days, one each in the First and Third Districts, as against twice that number last year. We can, however, claim credit for two follow-up days and one institute. The latter, held in the Second District, was attended by thirty-two persons.

The total number of branches engaged in educational work has been increased by ten, despite the fact that the Second District reported only eleven this year and fifteen last year, and the Fifth District report shows no gain. The First District, the black sheep of the 1927 report, has added eight new study classes, the Third District two, and the Fourth District four.

The other figures are too irregular to admit of comparison, especially as the time available has been greatly curtailed, owing to the fact that, with one exception, the reports were so late. This, I know, is due to the difficulty in securing the parish reports. The exception is the Third District—a complete and clear report received on time. Mrs. Dickinson deserves great credit for carrying through her plan for the appointment of an Educational Secretary in each branch in her district. She has also instructed the new appointees, and she is now profiting by a system which, I am convinced, would solve the really grievous problem of getting the necessary information from the parish branches. Last year I made a plea for the appointment of an Educa-

tional Secretary in every branch throughout the Diocese, and I earnestly hope that the other districts will follow in the way laid out by the Third, and that my successor in office may be spared the truly harrowing experience of watching every mail for a week for reports that do not materialize, and which, when they finally arrive, are incomplete and show evidence of hurried compilation.

In the separate districts, the outstanding achievements are as follows:

FIRST DISTRICT

Eight new branches engaged in educational work.
A review of "A Church Awake," by Mrs. Thayer.

SECOND DISTRICT

Follow-up day and institute.

THIRD DISTRICT

Marked gain in interest and co-operation in the work—facts not readily expressed by figures.

FOURTH DISTRICT

Decided increase in number of Corporate Communions.

FIFTH DISTRICT

Appointment of a religious educational worker in the town of Caroline.
