All yearly reports MUST be sent to the District Secretary NO LATER than January 5th of each year.

Each Parish Branch should have its annual election of officers no later than December 15th of each year.

Answer all letters and inquiries promptly.

Please write at once to the Missionary, for whom you have been asked to supply clothing, stating when he may expect a box and from whom. As soon as a box has been shipped, please notify at once your District Supply Secretary by filling out the necessary card, giving its estimated value, plus parcel post, express or freight.

No credit can be given for boxes unless the work has been assigned by the Diocesan Supply Secretary.

Any assistance given Missions in the Diocese should be reported in the same manner as assistance given outside of the Diocese.

The fulfillment of these requests will greatly aid the Diocesan and District Officers in their work.

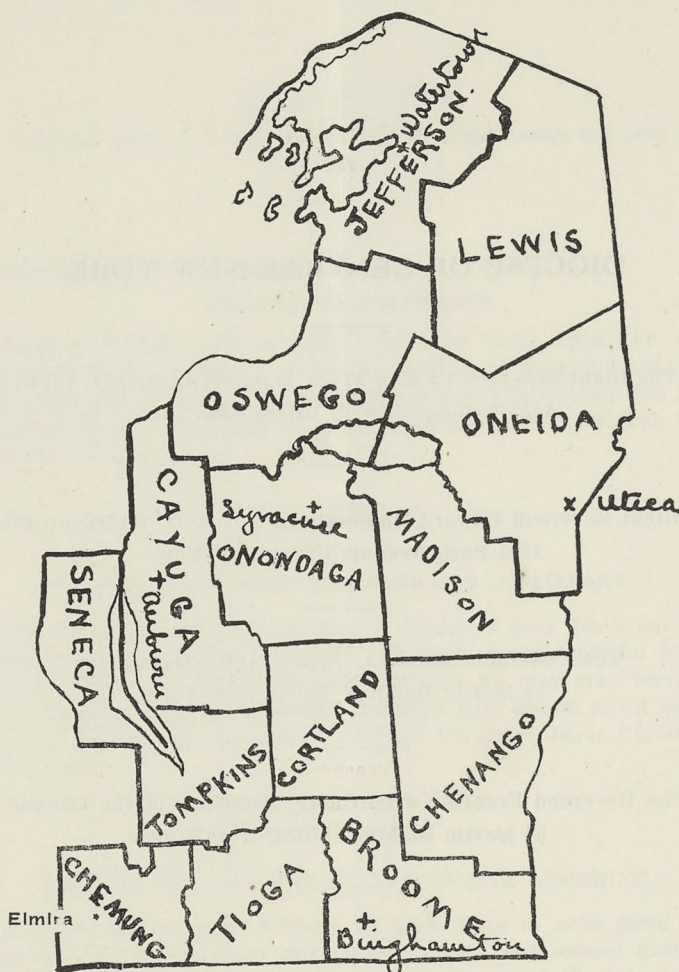

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

HELD IN BINGHAMTON, MAY 23, 1929

The Annual Meeting of the Central New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council was held in Trinity Church, Binghamton, New York, May 23rd, 1929. The Holy Communion was celebrated by Bishop Coley at 10:00 A. M. The Service was followed immediately by the business meeting which was called to order by the president, Mrs. Hixson.

The Rector of Trinity Church, the Rev. Dr. Wilson E. Tanner, welcomed the members of the Woman's Auxiliary to Binghamton in behalf of the churches of the city as well as those of Johnson City and Endicott.

Bishop Coley brought messages of regret from Bishop and Mrs. Fiske that they were unable to be present at the meeting. He then presented and declared installed in office the new president and secretary.

Mrs. Hixson, in reply to the Bishop's remarks, spoke of her appreciation of the honor of being president and again paid tribute to the cooperation which Miss Shippy had rendered in carrying over until the appointment of the new secretary.

The report of the officers' meeting was approved as read.

Upon motion, the secretary was instructed to send a telegram to Bishop and Mrs. Fiske expressing the great regret of the meeting at their absence.

The treasurer reported receipts and disbursements from January 1 to May 22, 1929, as follows:

The report of the supply secretary was read.

Mrs. Hixson explained the Prayer Partnership and urged that the branches undertake this effort, eleven missionaries having been assigned to this Diocese.

The next order of business was the reports for the districts, which were made from the first of January to date.

In the absence of Mrs. Scofield, Mrs. Babcock reported for the First District where greater interest is evidenced by larger offerings, increased attendance at meetings and more study classes.

Mrs. W. A. Somers reported that the Second District had taken an active interest in religious education, starting with the Institute last fall, study classes and program meetings during the winter, and ending with the Follow-up Day in April.

Mrs. M. D. Stuart, reporting for the Third District, announced a slight increase in the pledge to the Diocese and a slight increase in the United Thank Offering over a similar period a year ago. Increased interest is being manifested in the work.

Noon-day prayers were read by Archdeacon Jaynes who also expressed his appreciation of the cooperation which the Woman's Auxiliary has given him in his work. He invited the members of the Woman's Auxiliary to take part in the pilgrimage to Constantia on June 27, 1929. The Archdeacon brought a message from Bishop Fiske, suggesting that as a part of our work next year we study conditions in our Diocese.

Mrs. H. W. Clarke reported an active season in the Fourth District, and stressed the educational work.

Miss Frances White reported one meeting in connection with the Convocation of the Fifth District at which Miss Lindley was present and spoke. Bishop Coley added a few words to Miss White's report, commending the work which is being done at Willowdale.

Mrs. Goodale, on being called upon, spoke of the progress manifested in the Diocese since the time when she was first interested in the work.

Mrs. Mabel Benson spoke interestingly about her work in connection with underprivileged, problem and delinquent girls and unmarried mothers through the agency of the Church Mission of Help. She thanked the Auxiliary for its contribution toward her work, which is so largely preventive. She spoke of the special needs of the Church Mission of Help in this Diocese—more members, Christian homes in which to place girls who are working, boarding homes for girls who need motherly interest, and homes in which to place babies.

Miss Charlotte Tompkins, the diocesan secretary of Religious Education, told of the plans for the Conference at Skaneateles, and spoke of the attractive program which holds special interest for members of the Auxiliary.

The roll call showed two hundred and twenty people present.

Mrs. Thayer outlined the study work for next year, and spoke of the different methods which had been used in the various branches this year.

The meeting adjourned for luncheon. Bishop Coley opened the afternoon session with prayer at 2:15 P. M.

The Rev. T. J. Dewees spoke about the House of the Good Shepherd, which is a home for aged women and which is located in Binghamton. The members of the Auxiliary were invited to visit this home, which is a diocesan project.

It was announced that the diocesan meeting in 1930 would be held in Christ Church, Oswego.

Mrs. Hixson briefly described the efforts of the women of the Church to raise one million dollars toward St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo. She urged that every branch in this Diocese have a share in this undertaking, however small this share might be.

Miss Grace Lindley, Executive Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, was then introduced as the speaker of the afternoon. After a brief description of the need for the new St. Luke's Hospital in Tokyo, not only for better care of the sick, but also as a great testimony of international friendship, she passed to a description of her trip in the winter to the Missionary Districts of the Panama Canal Zone, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, Porto Rico and the Virgin Islands. Miss Lindley then spoke of the objects of the Corporate Gift—the church at Silver City, Panama Canal Zone, the church in Santo Domingo City, the water supply for the Indian school at Ethete, Wyoming, and the dormitory at Christ School, Arden, North Carolina.

The offering was designated for the Corporate Gift.

Upon motion, a rising vote of thanks was given the women of Binghamton, Johnson City and Endicott for their splendid hospitality.

The Benediction was pronounced by the Rev. D. Charles White, and the meeting adjourned.

Forms of educational work in each District—Study Classes, Program Meetings, and Discussion Groups.

The terms are interpreted by Miss Margaret Marston, Educational Secretary, as follows:

"I think of a Program Meeting as a more formal gathering than a Study Class, where the preparation and contributions are made by the leader or leaders.

"The Study Class implies real work on the part of the group and is usually one of a series of meetings dealing with the same subject.

"A Discussion Group is often more formal than a Study Class and denotes active participation by members of the group. A clear-cut distinction between these two latter methods is not always made."

Subjects studied:

Africa. The following books were used: "Green Wall of Mystery," "Sketches in Ivory and Ebony," "The New Africa," "South Africa," "Mission Stations," "Africa and Her Peoples."

The World Mission of Christianity, using the following books: "Roads to the City of God," "The World Mission of Christianity," "From Jerusalem to Jerusalem," "A Faith for the World."

Other books and magazines used in the study work: The Bible, "The Christ We Know," "History of the Church," "Old Testament History," "The Church," "The Church Awake," "Objects of the Corporate Gift," "Splendor of God," "The Episcopal Church," "Our Diocese," "The Spirit of Missions."

There were seventy new subscriptions to the Spirit of Missions reported.

It would be a real help to the educational work to have the appointment of an educational secretary in each parish which has not already secured one.

I would plead with the women of the Church generally for a greater interest in our educational work.
