Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Secretary are printed in Church Bulletins or read by your Rector at the Church Services.

Send all checks and money for ALL purposes payable to your District Treasurer. Designate to whom and for what purposes the money is sent. Remember your money will be sent to whatever cause or person you may designate. Pay pledges promptly.

As the fiscal year of the Protestant Episcopal Church ends December 31st of each year, the Women's Auxiliary closes its books at the same time.

All yearly reports MUST be sent to the District Secretary NO LATER than January 1st of each year.

Please write at once to the Missionary, for whom you have been asked to supply clothing, stating when he may expect a box and from whom. As soon as a box has been shipped, please notify at once your District Supply Secretary by filling out the necessary card, giving its estimated value, plus parcel post, express or freight.

No credit can be given for boxes unless the work has been assigned by the Diocesan Supply Secretary.

Any assistance given Missions in the Diocese should be reported in the same manner as assistance given outside of the Diocese.

The fulfillment of these requests will greatly aid the Diocesan and District Officers in their work.

Mrs. Weidman urged us to get more women to use the Blue Boxes, and thus share our offering.

The Educational report was read by Mrs. Hixson.

Mrs. Taylor reported a total of 175 boxes valued at \$3,277.25 sent from January 1 to May 1, 1936.

Mrs. Ellis explained the Prayer Partnership Plan and urged all Branches to choose a missionary and pray for her, and act as her special friend.

Mrs. Goodale thanked the Auxiliary for all the kind thought of her during her illness last winter.

Noon-day prayers were then said.

Mrs. Henry Hill Pierce, our Provincial Representative on the National Executive Board addressed us on the subject, "Why the Chronic Crisis." Mrs. Pierce called our attention to the fact that one-third of our Church members never gave, one-third give occasionally and one-third are faithful givers. She then discussed the various motives which prompted giving and the reasons why some never realized their responsibility to their fellow men. Mrs. Pierce then reminded us that we are all God's children and all are dear in His eyes, and without prejudice, we must put our faith to work that we may be part of an advancing kingdom, with the Gospel taken to all nations. A rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Pierce for her very helpful address.

The president then presented Miss Judson, of the Church Mission of Help, Miss Judson thanked us for the help we had given, and stated that 163 girls had been helped during the year.

Roll Call showed that 199 were present, nine from the First District, ten from the Second, sixty-two from the Third, thirty-five from the Fourth and eighty-three from the Fifth District. The total offerings were \$66.66.

Mrs. Hixson urged us to observe Nov. 11th as a Quiet Day of Prayer. The next order of business was the election of officers. Mrs. Beers, Chairman of the nominating committee, made the following report:

The speaker of the afternoon, Miss McGrath, now living in New York was introduced by Mrs. Hixson.

Miss McGrath returned from Japan in 1932, living there 15 years. She went out in the beginning as secretary to Bishop McKim. She gave us a most interesting and instructive talk. She began with the first Christian mission in Japan in 1549, making thus a background for the present work in Japan. She spoke at length of the "House of Light" and Miss Skiles' work there, mentioning the lovely, natural setting, which made the name, "House of Light" most appropriate. She paid a fine tribute to Miss Skiles.

Mrs. Hixson spoke of the next Annual Meeting to be held probably in Watertown in May 1937.

As there was no further business, on motion, the meeting adjourned.

The Prayer Partnership plan in this Diocese has been taking definite form and the work is well under way. A chairman has been appointed in each district. This chairman, in turn, contacts each branch of the Auxiliary in her district, and arranges for the appointment of a prayer partner in each branch, who is the actual correspondent with the partner in the field. Thus far sixty-one branches have become a part of the plan and are entering into this work of prayer and faith.

In our enthusiasm we must remember that while we write frequently we must not expect a personal reply to each letter—it would add too greatly to the already heavy burden which each missionary is carrying.

In so far as possible where there are many partners for the same missionary a month has been assigned to the branch in which to write so that all letters will not arrive at the same time.

Branches have found that in carrying out this plan that there has been increased interest in the United Thank Offering and in the use of the Spirit of Missions magazine. In other words—missions are becoming more than a name—they are assuming reality because of some one in the field whom they feel they are coming to know.

We are hoping that during this coming year more and more branches will join this plan and pray in faith, believing, our missionary prayer using the name of the prayer partner:

O God, our Heavenly Father, we thank thee for the gift of thy dear Son. Grant that we who have received him in our hearts may joyfully go forth with him on many errands. Bless those who toil for thee in far off places; especially thy servants.....
..... Comfort them in their loneliness; and unite our work with theirs. Accept our gifts; receive our prayers; and use us for the sake of Thy Son Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
