The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved, and the Treasurer's report read by Mrs. Israel in the absence of the Treasurer, was declared correct by the Auditors, Mrs. Sterling and Miss Coppee.

Attention was called to the discrepancies between the amounts of money reported by the Treasurer and the Organizing Secretaries and explanation for them was found in the mistake, made by many parishes, of not sending all money to the Organizing Secretaries as required by the Constitution. The Organizing Secretaries then read their reports and, at the request of the President, Mrs. Eckel of Williamsport, gave a description of the Bishop Talbot Club of boys in Williamsport.

Mrs. Ramsay read the general report of the Junior Auxiliary, following it with an invitation for the Auxiliary to meet the following year at St. Stephen's Church, Harrisburg. Mrs. Horace Brock immediately extended another urgent invitation of the same kind from St. Luke's Church, Lebanon. The President after expressing appreciation of the hospitality of both parishes announced that the matter should be referred to the Bishop for decision.

Miss Troxell, of West Pittston, spoke upon the subject of the Babies' Branch, urging the formation of new branches throughout the Diocese.

Miss Elizabeth Miner, of Wilkes-Barre, *Diocesan Correspondent for the Church Periodical Club*, read the report of the year and drew attention to the fact that many persons could contribute reading matter if postage could be furnished for its transmission. It was suggested and approved that parish branches should be encouraged to contribute small sums of money for this purpose.

Miss Lucy Jarvis, of Connecticut, made an interesting address upon the Junior Auxiliary and Babies' Branch, after which the business of the meeting was resumed.

The list of appropriations for the previous year was read and it was moved, seconded and carried that they should be continued.

Election of officers being in order, it was moved, seconded and carried that the present officers should be re-elected.

Nominations for a delegate from the Auxiliary to the Triennial Meeting in San Francisco, in 1901 were called for. Miss Mercur as delegate and Mrs. Israel as alternate were nominated and unanimously elected. It was moved, seconded and carried that the President should be authorized to appoint a delegate in case neither of those elected should be able to go.

The President then introduced the subject of the United Offering and urged the necessity of greater effort during the last year of the Triennium to keep up the record of the offering of 1898.

The President announced the organization of a committee to assist the Bishop in raising money for Diocesan Missions and appointed as chairman Mrs. Horace Brock, of Lebanon. After a vote of thanks to the ladies of St. Stephen's Church for their generous entertainment of delegates, the meeting adjourned.

Secretary's Report.

Quiet confidence and determination even more than ardent enthusiasm characterized the recent gathering of Churchwomen on the Pacific Coast and the same note is sounded in the reports from the four quarters of the Diocese presented by our Organizing Secretaries. The Auxiliary in Central Pennsylvania even as in the American Church is no longer a venture or an experiment but an institution whose importance cannot be estimated. Our standing among the Dioceses is indicated by the United Offering which still keeps for us the sixth place in the ranks and, though falling short of the thirty-five hundred dollars that had been hoped for, yet shows by its increase of five hundred dollars over the offering of 1898 that these three years have been years of advancement. The "putting forth of new branches" is another indication of growth, and the Babies' Branch, raised to the dignity of a diocesan organization within the last year by the appointment of a special Secretary, suggests by its very name, the work of the future. Its work just accomplished is the special offering of \$24.35 which accompanied the United Offering of the Diocese and with it was laid upon the altar at the great Triennial Service. The Bishop's Committee for aid in Diocesan Missions, also organized within the last year, has not yet presented a formal report to the Auxiliary but its power has been felt and the first fruits of its labors already gathered in are a foretaste of coming success. As our powers and activities increase so also must our benefactions and we must not neglect the opportunity of aiding in the gift of fifteen thousand dollars promised by the Woman's Auxiliary to Bishop Graves before the coming Epiphany for St. Mary's School in China. There will be no withholding of interest or of contributions when it is announced that this is to be offered as a memorial to Mary A. Twing whose sudden passing away in San Francisco seemed less like death than like translation, or as if the Father had graciously chosen there "in the sight of the congregation" to accept and crown the sacrifice of her faith and her devotion.

The strengthening and elevating effect of a great council of the church like the one just held in San Francisco must be felt by those who witness as well as by those who take part in it, and to the women of the Auxiliary who conferred upon me not only the privi-

lege of being present, but also the honor of representing them at such a time, I wish to express my earnest gratitude, with the hope that whatever work I may be permitted to do in the future may be less unworthy because of the help of this great experience.

Reading Archdeaconry.

It is gratifying to find in reporting the work of the Archdeaconry of Reading for the year 1900-1901, that while the amount of money given is greater than that of last year, the most encouraging sign, as a result of the year's work, is the more even distribution of interest in the work of the Woman's Auxiliary among the Parishes

and Missions comprising the Archdeaconry. This is largely due to the more frequent meetings, and the increasing use of books and papers on our Missionaries and their work. With knowledge comes the desire to help.

Four meetings were held. One in Trinity Church, Bethlehem, on February seventeenth, with Dr. Mary Gates, of China, and the Rev. A. B. Hunter, of Raleigh, N. C., as speakers. The other at St. Michael's Church, Birdsboro, on the fifteenth of May. The Rev. W. A. Fair, spoke of his work in Africa and Mrs. G. C. Thomas, of Philadelphia, gave us a talk on the United Offering.

The committees appointed in each Parish for the raising of the Bishops Fund—which was created at our last Annual Meeting—have not as yet perfected their plans, so that only a few Parishes have responded. It is hoped that by another year every parish will have given its share towards this much needed fund. But this must not interfere with either the General Fund—sometimes called the Diocesan Envelope—or the United Offering. It calls for increased effort on the part of all women in the Diocese.

The value of boxes is not as great as that of last year. This is probably due to the sending of large boxes to the sufferers from the flood in Galveston, Texas. Unfortunately, these can not be reported here unless they were sent to the clergy at Galveston. The amount of money given is much larger than usual, and this, with the value of boxes, makes the sum total of \$3,329.32.

If progress means life, then the Archdeaconry of Reading can say it is alive, but whether it is living up to its fullest opportunities must be left to the conscience of the individual Parishes.

The work in the Harrisburg Archdeaconry has progressed during the past year in a most healthy manner. Everywhere a deeper interest is shown and a greater number of church women are proud to call themselves members of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. The very delightful meeting held in Carlisle in January, in connection with the meeting of the Clergy, stirred up that old parish to greater endeavors, the substantial results of which are shown in the report.

The great success which has rewarded the efforts of the Bishop's Committee proves that there is no difficulty in creating an interest in special gifts. This is also seen in the amount of the United Offering, presented in San Francisco on October third. But we have not ceased to have an uphill work with our General Fund, collected by means of the Auxiliary envelopes. Judging then from the success

of the special offerings I feel sure that if the members of the Woman's Auxiliary would acquaint themselves better with the works benefitted by the money from this fund, such as the Church Home at Jonestown, the Rosebud School for Indian girls in South Dakota, the Mission School at Anvik, Alaska, Bishop Kinsolving's work in Brazil, etc. There would not be the anxieties and disappointments felt at the end of each year by the officers of the Central Pennsylvania Branch.

Before closing my report I wish to say that the women of the Harrisburg Archdeaconry join in the universal sorrow felt in the loss of our beloved Honorary Secretary, Mrs. Twing, who was taken from us while in San Francisco, at the General Convention, working for the Woman's Auxiliary.

Scranton Archdeaconry.

In reviewing the work of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Archdeaconry of Scranton for the past year, we find advancement in every department. This must mean either greater interest and generosity in those who have been the toilers, or an increased number of workers. In either case we rejoice, and trust that another year may show even larger results. We believe that to the Archdeaconry meetings may be traced the cause of much greater knowledge and consequent interest in our missionary work. Two meetings have been held during the past year. The first was held in January at St. Luke's Church, Scranton, at which time the Auxiliary met with the clergy of the Archdeaconry. At this meeting we were favored with the presence of Miss Emery, who spoke in her usual charming and earnest manner, inspiring all who heard her to better things, and also of Rev. Mr. Gring of Japan, who told us of the life and needs of that most interesting country.

The second meeting was held at the Church of the Good Shepherd, Scranton, when Bishop Talbot and the Rev. Mr. Huntington of Hankow, China, were our special guests and filled us with enthusiasm and desire to do more not only for our own diocese but for the far away land of China. The Bishop spoke specially of the

"Bishop's Fund," which branch of the Auxiliary work is not fully established as yet.

The work of preparing and sending boxes is always interesting to women and needs no urging. The raising of money seems a more difficult task. However, we are happy in reporting this year forty boxes sent by this Archdeaconry, valued at \$2,064.27. To the General Fund \$349.29 and to the United Offering \$501.12, while special gifts have been given by various parishes amounting to \$352. making a total of \$3,266.68, an increase of \$705.67 over last year's report. Of this the Juniors have sent eleven boxes valued at \$209.53; to the General Fund \$15.00, to the United Offering \$20.30 and special gifts amounting to \$136.00.

The Babies have come forward with their mite for the United Offering amounting to \$24.35.

A plan for missionary study is to be arranged during the coming winter in which it is expected that all the parishes will unite during Lent. With this increased knowledge we hope for a more intelligent interest and greater gifts for the Master's work. May I suggest that it be the aim of each active member of the Woman's Auxiliary in this coming year to interest one another woman in the cause of Missions, and thus unite in spreading Christ's kingdom throughout the world.

But let us not forget in our active work the devotional purpose of the Woman's Auxiliary. Let me quote from the last report and almost dying words of Mrs. Twing, who for so many years has been our Honorary Secretary, and whose sudden death in California has been a shock and grief to us all. In speaking of the aim of the Auxiliary, she said: "It has striven to increase the fund of the Board, directly and indirectly, and to be a true helper in every department of missionary service, both at home and abroad, in ways which the Board recommends or the several Bishops endorse; but, beyond all that, it has ever sought to keep a single eye to God's glory, and, by increase of fervor, renewed self-consecration, deepening of personal piety, the more frequent observance of special services, quiet days, and celebrations of the Holy Communion in connection with its anniversaries, to turn the minds of its members upwards from material things to the divine source of all spiritual strength, relying upon more than human help and guidance to bring to fair and abundant fruitage the seed-sowing and fragile planting of so many years ago."

To the President and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania:

The report of the Bishop's Committee for Diocesan Missions, for the year beginning June 1, 1901, and ending June 1, 1902, is as follows:

Of the 179 Parishes and Mission Stations in the Diocese, containing 12,133 families and 17,501 communicants, contributions were received from 33, as follows:

Reading Archdeaconry, 50 Parishes and Mission Stations, 3,514 families, 5,307 communicants, 9 Parishes and Stations, with 837 families and 1,195 communicants, contributed \$430.79.

Harrisburg Archdeaconry, 33 Parishes and Mission Stations, 2,369 families, 3,490 communicants, 11 Parishes and Stations, with 1,240 families and 1,728 communicants, contributed \$367.35.

Williamsport Archdeaconry, 48 Parishes and Mission Stations, 2,608 families, 3,673 communicants, 9 Parishes and Stations, with 1,062 families and 1,509 communicants, contributed \$397.67.

Scranton Archdeaconry, 48 Parishes and Mission Stations, 3,642 families, 5,031 communicants, 4 Parishes and Stations, with 1,435 families and 2,045 communicants, contributed \$173.75.

The appended lists give the Parishes and Stations contributing, with the number of families, communicants, pledges and amounts, and also those in which no contributions were made.

An examination of these lists shows that in but one case (that of St. Mark's Church, Jonestown, the Church Home, where the communicants are the orphans and teachers in the Home), have contributions been received from every communicant in the parish, and in but a few cases, from every family. The best reports come to us from our mission stations and poorer parishes.

It is not forgotten that in addition to what has been raised for the Auxiliary, the Parish Pledge for Diocesan Missions has been paid in many cases; but a careful inquiry has proved to the committee that the contributions still come from a few people. We feel, however, that a good beginning has been made, and a principle established, so that next year our record will show every communicant in each parish giving something to sustain our Bishop in Missionary work.

This report is based upon the reports received from the Sub-Chairmen or the Parishes themselves. The money having been sent directly to the Organizing Secretaries, the Bishop's Committee had nothing to do with the amounts paid to the fund.
