MINUTES

OF THE

Annual Meeting of 1905.

The twenty-third annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of Central Pennsylvania was held in the Parish House of the Church of the Nativity, South Bethlehem, Wednesday, November 8th, 1905, beginning at 11:30 A. M. After a prayer offered by the Bishop, Mrs. Israel, the President, took the chair.

making a total of twenty-seven parishes represented by one hundred and fifteen members from the Woman's Auxiliary, and seventeen from the Junior Branches, besides the large number from the Church of The Nativity, South Bethlehem.

The minutes of the last meeting and the Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were read and approved. The President, after expressing thanks in the name of the Auxiliary for the faithful and accurate work done by her assistants in office, read, from the General Report of the Woman's Auxiliary, Miss Emeny's statement of the work done by the Central Pennsylvania Branch during the past year.

At that point, as it drew near to one o'clock, the President suggested a movement to adjourn, but a motion to continue longer in session was carried, and the report of the Archdeaconry of Reading was read by the Secretary, Mrs. Henderson being unavoidably absent, followed by that of the Archdeaconry of Scranton read by Mrs. Coxe.

A motion was then carried for adjournment until half-past two o'clock, at which hour the meeting reassembled.

Bishop Talbot made a short address in which he announced that the Bishop Rulison Memorial Fund had been equally divided between the Dioceses of Central Pennsylvania and of Harrisburg by the action of the Incorporated Trustees of the two dioceses who held it in trust. The Bishop asked for an increase in the list of subscribers to the Diocesan Record and urged the formation of new branches of the Auxiliary in the Diocese.

The President then addressed the Auxiliary informally. She referred first to the ever delightful hospitality of The Church of the Nativity and the pleasure of the Auxiliary in accepting it, and followed with expressions of regret at the narrowing of the circle and the loss of those valued officers, Mrs. Ramsay, Mrs. Bausman and Mrs. Almy, reminding the Auxiliary of the duty before it, in electing a new Vice-President and appointing a new Directress for the Junior Auxiliary in the place of Mrs. Ramsay, who had so ably united the two offices. Turning from this to the brighter view of the changes caused by the division of the diocese the President referred to this as

a season for hopefulness in both dioceses, as giving opportunity to each for greater work within its own limits, and suggested a message of greetings and good cheer to the Auxiliary of the Diocese of Harrisburg, which was to assemble the following day for its first annual meeting. She also congratulated the Auxiliary upon having contributed to the apportionment of the past year \$845.00, being \$45.00 more than was expected of it.

A message of farewell to the Juniors of Central Pennsylvania from their former Directress, Mrs. Ramsey, was read by the Secretary, followed by an account of the meeting of the Juniors held that morning under the direction of Mrs. Sterling of South Bethlehem, and an appeal made for a few more gifts for a Christmas box from the Juniors which received a prompt response.

It was then moved, seconded and carried, that the address just delivered by the President should be printed and copies sent to all the branches of the Auxiliary. The President then read the report of the Babies' Branch for the Directress, Miss Troxell, who was unable to be present.

Mrs. Wood, the Chairman of the Diocesan Committee on Missionary Study, reported the growth of intelligent interest in missions throughout the Diocese. Mrs. Sterling of the Archdeaconry of Reading, had reported that seven branches had followed the course on Alaska and one that on Japan, while in the Archdeaconry of Scranton Mrs. Stock reported fourteen branches having followed the course. The subject for the Inter-diocesan Course of Study for Lent, 1906, is "Some Strategic Points in the Home Field" and the programme as follows: Lessons I and II: "The Colored Problem in the South" with introductory paper by the Bishop of Georgia. Lesson III, "Okalahoma with its immense increase of white settlers and home-seekers and its pitifully small mission staff. Lessons IV and V, "The Mormon Problem undermining the home life and morality of the Nation." Lesson VI, "The Northwest (Washington State), the gateway to the trade of the East and to Missions to the Heathen."

A. Mrs. J. S. Robertson of the Church of The Good Shepherd, Scranton, then gave an interesting description of the Missionary Conference at Richfield Springs.

The report of the Church Periodical Club was read by Miss Ashley, the Diocesan Correspondent.

The President announced that the report of the Committee appointed the previous year to confer upon the division of the Bishop Rulison Memorial Fund would not be called for as the Bishop had already reported the division of the Fund.

Election of officers being in order it was moved, seconded and carried, that the present officers be re-elected with the addition of Mrs. Sterling as Vice-President.

The President then announced the appointment of Miss Elinor Ruddle of East Mauch Chunk, as Directress of the Junior Auxiliary.

The matter of Annual Pledges and appropriations was then considered, after the announcement that the Auxiliary of Harrisburg had promised to assume a number of those that had been contributed before by the undivided diocese. Of the former pledges it was voted that the Bishop Rulison Memorial Scholarship (\$100.00), the Rev. Mr. Gring's Life Insurance (\$50.00), the contribution to St. Paul's Industrial School, Lawrenceville, Va. (\$50.00), and the contribution to the Church Home, Jonestown (\$100.00), should be continued unchanged, while the contribution to the Cashier Valley Mission should be increased to \$25.00, and that to the Junior Auxiliary Publishing Company reduced to \$10.00. It was then voted and carried, separately for each, that contributions should be made of \$50.00 for the support of a Mission Woman in the District of Shanghai, \$50.00 to the work of Bishop Nelson in Georgia, \$50.00 to the work of Bishop Knight in Cuba, and \$25.00 to the work of Miss Thackara in Arizona. It was then moved, seconded and carried, that if the condition of the treasury should permit at the end of the year, \$25.00 should be given to Bishop Van Beuren of Porto Rico.

The Auxiliary then listened to two short addresses from the Rev. Mr. Lindstrom of Ngankin, China, and the Rev. Mr. Meem of Pelotas, Brazil, and with the blessing from the Bishop the meeting adjourned.

Secretary's Report.

The record of the efforts and achievements of our Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary during the past year should give us new hope for the future. The vacancies in our official staff that caused us much anxiety a year ago were happily filled at the time of the annual meeting by the election to the Vice-Presidency of Mrs. Sterling, doubly welcome to our ranks because of her intimate association with the Auxiliary in former years, and by the appointment of Miss Elinor Ruddle to the directorship of the Junior Auxiliary of the Diocese. Miss Ruddle's first report of this Branch is proof of the ability and enthusiasm with which she has taken up her work and all the other departments, as well, give evidence of a healthy and progressive condition.

To these reports has been added this year the first one given officially by the Chairman of the Committee on Missionary Study. This is a significant fact indicating as it does the prominence now given throughout the Diocese to the acquiring of that knowledge about the mission field, without which so many of our best efforts for Missions must fail of their mark.

The sum total of our contributions will be noted as somewhat less than that of last year, but this may be explained by the fact that the report this year is printed in August instead of October, and too early to include the United Offering which, in most parishes, is not collected until September. The announcement of the amount collected for this offering will be made by the Treasurer at the annual meeting. It will be received with interest of course, and dare we hope that it will be large enough to create also enthusiasm? The Triennial Meeting at Richmond is only one year away and we must not fall behind our record of past years.

The items of the United Offering, with other contributions that are too late for this report, will be printed in full next year.

It has been thought well to at least try the experiment of this slight change in our methods in order to make the reports of our year's work coincide with those of the General Work as given out by Miss Emery, and also to follow the logical plan of giving an account of any work as soon as possible after its completion. This year the members of the Auxiliary throughout the diocese will have the opportunity to know what the Auxiliary has been able to do during the past year, and will come to the annual meeting just so much better prepared to decide what it shall do during the coming year. We must remember that we come together at our annual meeting not for the purpose of celebrating the past, but to plan for the future and that it is not the end, but the beginning, of a year's work. Having now readjusted our forces and closed up our ranks after the crisis of separation and division through which we have passed, there is every reason to make our approaching annual meeting a starting point for better and stronger work than ever before.

Reading Archdeaconry.

The report of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Reading Archdeaconry for the past year shows an increase in the value of boxes sent out, and an increase of nearly twenty-two dollars in the collections received from the Babies' Branch. The General Fund, we are sorry to say, is nearly eighty-four dollars short of the amount received last year. The United Offering will not be noted in this report, as it is not collected until September. Owing the the United Offering from Christ Church, Reading, not being received until November of last year, it will be credited in this report, and part of the collections for this Offering have been received from Easton and Tamaqua. The Juniors have been doing very good work this year. Three new branches of the Woman's Auxiliary have been organized, one branch reorganized and three which needed a little encouragement in their work were visited. So that in all we hope to have a fine report to give of their work this year.

Two Archdeaconry meetings have been held, one at Hazleton in January, where there was a fair attendance. The collection amounted to twenty-one dollars, which was later made up to twenty-five dollars, and given to the Rev. Carl L. Lindstrom of Ngankin, China, for bells for the Chapel, of which he has charge. The spring meeting was held at Birdsboro, nineteen parishes being represented by one hundred and fourteen members. The collection amounted to twenty-nine dollars, twenty-five of which was sent to Bishop Nichols.

The speakers at this meeting was the Rev. Mr. Smith, the Educational Secretary; Rev. Isaac Dooman, a Persian, one of our Missionaries in Kobe, Japan; Rev. Mr. Henkell and Rev. Mr. Thomson of Reading.

The Study of Missions has been taken up in some of our parishes. We hope all the members of the Auxiliary will see the necessity of this study, and take it up next year, for without it our work lacks the interest and intelligence which we need, with God's help, to make it a success.

Scranton Archdeaconry.

During the past year three branches of the Woman's Auxiliary have been organized. One Junior and one Babies' Branch have been added to the list. Last year reports from sixteen branches were received, this year we have reports from twenty branches.

Two Archdeaconry meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary have been held during the year. At the October meeting, held in St. Stephen's Church, Wilkes-Barre, the speakers were Rev. Isaac Dooman, Japan, and Miss Julia Emery.

At the January meeting, held in St. Luke's Church, Scranton, one hundred and sixty-two delegates were present. This is the largest attendance we have ever had in this Archdeaconry, and we hope this increased attendance means an increased interest in missionary work. The speakers were Bishop Talbot, Mrs. Kaji and Rev. Arthur Sherman, Hankow, China.

The "Chicago Birthday Plan" for increasing the United Offering, was adopted at the October meeting, but, as our report goes to print before the United Offering is due, it is impossible to tell whether it has proved a success or not.

The united study course was taken up by most of the Auxiliary branches.

This year, as for several years past, talks on the various topics in the Study Course have been given by several of the Auxiliary officers.

Although we have tried each year to call the attention of the Auxiliary to the necessity of increasing our General Fund, so that we may be able to meet our pledges and pay our apportionment, still the members of the Auxiliary cling to the "Specials," making their offerings this year larger than ever.

Let us try during the coming year to give the General Fund and United Offering the preference.

Thirty missionary boxes, valued at \$1,497.71, have been sent out from sixteen Auxiliary branches.

Junior Auxiliary.

In making a report of my first year as Directress of the Junior Auxiliary in Central Pennsylvania, I will state my efforts to have been largely devoted to learning the field and the methods of work. After a winter of working and corresponding with the Juniors, I feel I know how we stand, and where effort should be expended to bring forth fruit in the future. I am sure every member of the Woman's Auxiliary joins me in hoping and praying that the next year may see a large increase in the number of branches, so that at least in every parish and mission where there is a Woman's Auxiliary there will be more work done among and by the Juniors. To the members of the Woman's Auxiliary I confidently look for help in opening new branches during the coming winter, for if they truly care for missions they will be ready and anxious to extend the interest in and zeal for the cause in their own parishes. Babies' Branch.

During the year ending Easter, 1906, five new branches have been started in the Diocese, as follows: St. Peter's, Hazleton; St. Stephen's, Catasauqua; St. Michael's, Birdsboro; St. David's, Scranton; and Lehighon Mission. The branch in Trinity Parish, Carbondale, has been revived under a new secretary; and the branch in St. Peter's, Plymouth, has been given up. The new branches were all organized too late in the year to contribute to the present offering which, nevertheless, is somewhat larger than that of last year. In the Church of the Good Shepherd, Milford, a Society of Little Helpers was organized two years ago, but the offering of 1905 was not sent through the officers of the Babies' Branch.

The Little Helpers of Christ Church, Frackville, at Easter time, contributed to Diocesan Missions by giving \$4.25 of their offering to the building fund of their own Church.

The Gaylord Hart Mitchell Kindergarten in Akita, Japan, started and supported by the united work of the Babies' Branch in memory of the first Little Helper, was burned to the ground on the night of June 7th, Miss Mead and the other inmates of the house escaping only with their lives. To replace the building \$5,000 is needed, and so, naturally, these Little Helpers of Central Pennsylvania have made a contribution toward this work which Bishop McKim describes as so successful in the past, so full of promise for the future. Other objects for united work are day schools in Nuchang and Shanghai, and an Emergency Fund for the White Rocks Indian Mission, Salt Lake.

Our yearly contribution to the fund for the relief of aged and infirm clergymen, emphasizes the lesson of thoughtfulness and care for these faithful missionaries who are no longer able to go out into the world to preach the gospel.

Ten dollars has been added to the United Offering Fund.

First Printed Report of the Inter-Diocesan Study Course.

A short review of the work of the Study Classes, 1905, may prove of interest. A foot-note on page eight in a leaflet of general instructions sent out to Class Organizers in the United States, compiled by the editors of the Church Missions Publishing Company, and the Educational Secretary of the Board of Missions, states, "In the two Archdeaconries of Scranton and Reading, Central Pa., every parish was in 1905 brought in touch in some measure with the Study Course on Alaska. This represents faithful work on the part of the class organizers and the people." These words of commendation of the work of the two Archdeaconry class organizers is well deserved, not only for 1905, but for the work of 1906.

The enthusiastic study given the Alaska Course was not created by the Mission Study Course of 1906, "Some Strategic Points in the Home Field."

This lack of interest was not in the cause of Missions in general, or in the parts of the field selected for study, but rather due to the unavoidable delay in receiving the course from the Church Missions Publishing Company, and the excessive length of papers and meetings when the class leaders gave out all the papers to be read in classes by members, in place of selecting either Method A, or Method B, to suit the special requirements of each class.

The preliminary circular prepared by the Mission Study Committee was sent to every parish in the two Archdeaonries in the Diocese by the Mission Study secretaries, Mrs, Elizabeth Sterling and Mrs. Miriam Stock. From their systematic, thorough work the following report is made:

Auxiliaries in Reading Archdeaonry, 25; number reporting mission study, 11. Three parishes report having taken China, Japan and Alaska. Two parishes find it impossible to carry out any scheme of study, and from the remainder no report has been received.

Scranton Archdeaonry—Auxiliaries in Archdeaonry, 24; Auxiliaries reporting Study Course, 11. One reports the Heroes of the Mission Field. Six branches used no course. Six branches made no report. Five dollars was given to purchase six sets of the lesson course to send to small parishes.

Success in Mission Study is not always gained through large numbers in classes, but rather that the study should make each member realize her personal responsibility toward the missions studied. There is no question about success when that end is attained.
