MINUTES

OF THE

Annual Meeting of 1908.

The twenty-sixth annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of Central Pennsylvania was held at St. Stephen's Church, Wilkes-Barre, Wednesday, May 6th, beginning at 11:30 A. M.

After an opening prayer by Bishop Talbot, the President, Mrs. Israel, took the chair. Roll call was made by the Secretary and responses received as follows:

making a total of one hundred and ten representatives from twenty-five parishes, beside the large number from St. Stephen's, Wilkes-Barre.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved and the Treasurer's report read and accepted, after a plea had been made for an increase of the General Fund. An explanation was then made of the Annual Pledges and appropriations made from this fund.

The reports of the Archdeaconries of Reading and Scranton were read by Mrs. Henderson and Mrs Coxe, respectively, and Mrs. Stoek, the Chairman of the Diocesan Committee on Mission Study, reported to what extent Mission Study had been taken up by the parishes of the diocese. A greater interest in this matter was urged and the informal discussion of different methods which followed, with its description of difficulties and suggestions of aid was animated and helpful.

At the close of this discussion the meeting adjourned for an hour and a half, during which luncheon was served, and reopened at half-past two with collects read by the Rev. Mr. Noble, curate of the parish.

The report of the Junior Auxiliary was read by Miss Donnelly, with a brief description of the business meeting of the Juniors which had been held in the morning, and was followed by Miss Troxell's report of the Babies' Branch.

The President then read her annual address and a letter from Miss Emery addressed to the Diocesan Branch.

The list of Annual Pledges was read by the Secretary, the only one on the list causing any discussion being the \$10.00 appropriated to the "Junior Auxiliary Publishing Fund." Upon the ground that literature for Mission Study for the diocese was procured from the Missions House and not from this Publishing Company, it was moved, seconded and carried that the \$10.00 formerly contributed to this fund should be given instead to the Organizing Secretaries of the two Archdeaconries for the use of Mission Study in parishes where it should be needed.

In connection with the remaining list of Annual Pledges the question of the apportionment was brought up and the method explained by the President, with the announcement that certain pledges amounting to \$200.00 would count upon the apportionment. It was moved and seconded that these pledges should be continued, but amended by a motion that

all the pledges formerly made should be continued, which was seconded and carried.

The President then referred to a promise of \$200.00, made by the Auxiliary to Bishop Talbot, to aid in the completion of the Bishop Leonard Memorial Home for Nurses in Utah, and announced that \$125.00 had been given. In order that the whole sum might be completed further contributions were asked for and promises received, as follows: From St. James' Church, Jermyn, \$4.00; Archdeaconry of Reading, \$23.00; St. Mark's, Mauch Chunk, \$5.00; St. Luke's, Scranton, \$5.00; St. Paul's, White Haven, \$5.00; Church of The Good Shepherd, Scranton, \$5.00; St. David's Church, Scranton, \$5.00; Trinity Church, Pottsville, \$5.00; Trinity Church, West Pittston, \$2.00; Church of the Nativity, South Bethlehem, \$6.00; Church of the Redeemer, Sayre, \$2.00; All Saints', Lehighton, \$2.00; St. Stephen's, Wilkes-Barre, \$1.00; Babies' Branch, \$5.00. It was then moved, seconded and carried that a contribution should be made toward the hospital to be erected by the Rev. W. S. Claibourne of Sewanee, Tennessee, if the condition of the treasury should justify it.

The election of officers being in order, Mrs. Coxe was called to the chair. It was moved, seconded and carried that Mrs. Israel be re-elected as President and a following motion that the Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer be also re-elected, was seconded and carried.

It was moved, seconded and carried that a definite time be set for the annual meeting in the future, and that time be the fourth Wednesday in May.

After a standing vote of thanks to the ladies of St. Stephen's parish for their gracious hospitality, the meeting adjourned.

After adjournment short addresses were made by the Rev. D. K. Johnston of Logan, Utah, and Mr. John W. Wood of the Church Missions House, who also made addresses at the missionary service in the evening.

President's Address.

It is my pleasure to welcome the delegates of the Woman's Auxiliary to this the 26th Annual Diocesan Meeting. We have passed our first quarter of a century and are now beginning a new period of work, I trust, with greater inspiration and zeal from the encouragement of the results of past efforts. But let us not rest, with satisfied ease, on what *has* been done, but rather be stimulated into greater energy by that which still remains to be done. When we review the work of the past year we see no startling evidences of growth, but the steady faithful work of untiring officers, both of Diocese and Parish, must with God's blessing, bring forth fruit in His own good time some sixty or an hundred fold.

Owing to the rather early meeting this year, it has seemed impossible to get the parish reports into the hands of the Secretaries. May I suggest to the Parish secretaries that the delay caused by their neglect to send their parish reports on time causes a serious block in the whole Diocesan work? I am unable to summarize the work to-day on this account, and hence we cannot tell where we stand in comparison with other years. From the reports of our Organizing Secretaries you will note their efforts to reach every parish and mission in some way, by sending missionaries to them, by sectional meetings, by letters, and by the regular Archdeaconry meetings. You will have noted the large attendance at these meetings held in the Fall, especially due to the presence of missionaries who had come East to attend the General Convention, and to the interesting reports made by those of our members who had attended the Convention.

When we gathered together one year ago at Reading we were looking forward to the great Tri-ennial Meeting and the presentation of the United Offering. Now we

look back with our hearts filled with wonder, and thankfulness, that we were permitted to take part in such services and meetings. It was the pride of Central Pennsylvania that all of her officers were present in Richmond, except our Honorary President, as well as a large number of her lay members. It was our joy that our United Offering was almost as much as we gave in Boston three years before, when the Diocese was undivided. It was our privilege to attend those wonderful missionary mass meetings, to hear the Bishops and missionaries from all our mission fields, to listen to the clear, forceful words of the Bishop of London, to be present at the great Tri-ennial service when that magnificent offering of the women, \$224,251.55, was thankfully and joyously laid upon God's altar. No one could attend day after day those meetings of earnest women to discuss the best methods of furthering Christ's kingdom on earth, without being filled with enthusiasm and deepest interest. The prevailing tone was one of consecration and prayer. The sad part of it is that we cannot convey that enthusiasm to those who remain at home,—that the chill of indifference strikes us on our return and takes away so much of the zeal which had burned within us.

We have, during the past winter, had the use of the Diocesan Record to make known in a most complete way the work of the Auxiliary in the Diocese. One number was given entire to the Auxiliary, articles being written by the Diocesan officers on each department of the work. A request has been made that the Parish Branches send to the editor of the Diocesan Record accounts of the work done by them so that a department on the Auxiliary be sustained in an interesting way.

I am sure you will all rejoice to know that the united and earnest prayers of the members of the Auxiliary "that God will put it into the hearts of faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field" have been answered in this Diocese by the offering of one young woman of herself for this work. We shall have a special interest in China when we know that one of our own number is laboring there, and the prayers of the women

of this Diocese are specially asked for her and the work upon which she will enter.

By the resignation of Mrs. Wood from her position of Chairman of Missionary Study, which she had inaugurated and carried on so enthusiastically and faithfully in the Diocese, a serious loss was sustained. Mrs. H. H. Stoek, who had charge of that work in the Scranton Archdeaconry was appointed to succeed her, and Mrs. Rodney Mercur has consented to take the Archdeaconry work. Miss Ashley, Diocesan Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, having resigned, Mrs. Carl Jones has succeeded her.

And now, my dear friends, as we close the records of the past year with perhaps a little uneasiness and apprehension, let us lift up our hearts to the sunshine of God's presence and abide with Him, trusting in His strength to help us do this work for Him.



Reading Archdeaconry.

This year we can report thirty-one branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Reading Archdeaconry. Twenty-seven are active branches, two for the present are only able to take up the study of Missions and two branches were organized too late to do any active work. We have in our Archdeaconry two branches of the Young Woman's branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, graduates from the Junior Branch. Their work all goes through the Woman's Branch. Two Archdeaconry meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary have been held. One occurred in November at Mauch Chunk, where the attendance amounted to two hundred delegates, including several clergymen. Bishop Root of Hankow, China, was the speaker, and the collection which amounted to fifty-six dollars, was sent to Bishop Root for his work. At the Archdeaconry meeting held at Easton, there were one hundred and twenty-three present, and Bishop Talbot and Miss Langdon were the speakers. The collection amounted to fifty-four dollars, of which twenty-five was given towards the fund for a motor boat for Bishop Rowe, and ten dollars for the Bishop Leonard Memorial Home for Nurses at Salt Lake City, Utah. Six special parochial meetings have been held, one branch of the Juniors organizing at Minersville by the request of the Directress of the Junior Branch. Six sectional meetings have been held with the following groups: The four parishes in Reading, (Birdsboro, Morgantown and Douglassville were included in this group, but were unable to be present); South Bethlehem with Bethlehem, and Grace Church, Allentown; Frackville with Ashland and Shenandoah; Drifton with Freeland and Hazleton; Grace Church, Allentown, with the Church of the Mediator, and St. Stephen's, Catasauqua. All the meetings were well attended. We hope to continue these meetings next year, as we find them very helpful for both the Organizing Secretary and the members of the Auxiliary. Services

were held in most of the parishes in this Archdeaconry on the Sunday after the Feast of the Annunciation, at which time the Corporate Communion was celebrated for the members of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Scranton Archdeaconry.

During the past year the branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, in this section of the diocese, have been doing their usual faithful and splendid work; but our desire is to have an Auxiliary branch in every organized parish and mission of the Church in this Archdeaconry. At present there are eighteen parishes and missions without an Auxiliary branch. Of these eighteen, however, eleven are small missions, where only occasional services are held, leaving seven parishes and missions where we hope soon to have branches of the Auxiliary. If these weaker parishes and missions would only organize for prayer and study during a part of the year, for instance during Lent, they would be doing missionary work, and no better foundation could be laid for an Auxiliary branch. We need more branches where the women will pray for and study about missions, and more prayer and study by every Auxiliary woman.

Two new Junior branches have been formed and one other reported for the first time. One Babies' Branch has also been added to the list.

Two Archdeaconry meetings have been held during the year. One in November at Calvary Church, Wilkes-Barre, with one hundred and fifty delegates present. The Rt. Rev. Franklin S. Spalding, Bishop of Utah, was the speaker. So convincing were his words that pledges to the amount of one hundred and fifty dollars were made for St. John's Mission, Logan, Utah.

The winter meeting was held in St. Peter's Church, Plymouth. The speakers were the Rev. Everett P. Smith, Educational Secretary to the Board of Missions, and Miss Hubbard of Germantown, Educational Secretary for the Diocese of Pennsylvania. The latter gave a practical demonstration of how to conduct a Mission Study class; this

lesson was inspiring and helpful to all present. Pledges to the amount of fifty-one dollars were made for the Bishop Leonard Memorial Home for Nurses in Utah.

The study of China and our missions in that country was taken up during Lent, many branches using the Educational Secretary's outline for Programme Missionary meetings as their guide.

Numerous leaflets from the Church Missions House have been distributed to all the branches.

An itinerary was made out for Miss Florence Langdon, a missionary from Alaska, through a part of this Archdeaconry during the last week in January. It was planned that she should meet with fourteen different branches, sectional meetings being held in Wilkes-Barre and Sayre. Many of these branches rarely hear a speaker direct from the missionary field. Subsequent reports show that the branches were much interested in what Miss Langdon had to say, and the results growing out of these visits will be helpful to the Auxiliary work.

The United Offering reported at this time is that presented at the tri-ennial meeting in Richmond, Va., in October. The General Fund is incomplete, as many of the Auxiliary reports have not been received.

For the first time no money is reported from either the Junior or Babies' Branches, said money being reported by their respective directresses.

General Report.

The work of the Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania has gone steadily on during the past year. Of the twenty-seven branches reporting at our last annual meeting twenty-one have reported again this year, one at Tamaqua has disbanded and five have no work to report.

Five new branches have been formed: the Daughters of the Church, Trinity Church, Bethlehem, Drifton, Milford, Minersville and Calvary Church, Wilkes-Barre. Those at Milford and Minersville were formed too late for work this year.

The Juniors at Ashley are reporting as such for the first time.

Through some mistake, the two branches at White Haven were not reported last year, but this year they are again on the list, making the total number of branches in the Diocese thirty-four.

Taken altogether, the Juniors have worked with an untiring enthusiasm that is very gratifying, and the outlook for the future is very encouraging. All Diocesan pledges have been met and the total sum of the work is \$104.61 more than last year, with some of the parish pledges and contributions to the United Offering still to come in.

Four Archdeaconry meetings were held during the year, two in each Archdeaconry. The November meeting of the Reading Archdeaconry was held in St. Mark's Church, Mauch Chunk, with twenty-five delegates present, representing eight parishes, and the January meeting was held in Trinity Church, Easton, with twenty-one delegates from nine parishes. The Scranton Archdeaconry held its November meeting in Calvary Church, Wilkes-Barre, with eighteen delegates present, representing four parishes, and the January meeting in St. Peter's Church, Plymouth, with seventeen delegates representing five parishes. These meetings were very satisfactory and, we trust, helpful to all.

The Babies' Branch.

To the United Offering, presented at Richmond in October, 1907, the Little Helpers of Central Pennsylvania contributed \$70.00, a special gift of \$3.00 from the Babies' Branch of Christ Church, Stroudsburg, arriving just in time to be included.

The incompleteness of the present report is much to be regretted, though in some cases it can be accounted for. In Palmerton an epidemic of scarlet fever has prevented the collection of the boxes; and illness and sorrow in the home of the Secretary for Christ Church, Reading, have delayed the organization of that parish branch. Mrs. Austin sends \$1.04 in memory of the two brief years of the Christian life of her grandson, Franklin Hayden Austin. Other Memorial Boxes are kept for ten little ones who are "in Paradise."

From most of the parishes the reports are full of hope and encouragement, but occasional mention is made of lack of interest on the part of parents, indifference and neglect. What can we do to better this condition where it exists? One Secretary suggests occasional meetings for mothers and their children, with a little missionary talk, and tea. Another gathers her Little Helpers together every Saturday afternoon and teaches them. This is in Frackville where the Little Helpers, in addition to their missionary work, have promised to give the Font to their own new parish church. All who have tried the annual service for the presentation of the offering have found it helpful and inspiring. It is my desire to have a meeting of the parish secretaries each year in connection with the annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, when we shall have an opportunity to talk over together our work and its problems.

It has been thought wise to discontinue printing, for the Little Helpers, detailed "reports" in which the long list of figures seems to lay undue emphasis on money. Our aim must always be to kindle in the *hearts* of the children a love

for Missions (of which the money gifts are but the outward and visible sign) which in later life may, by God's grace, manifest itself in personal consecration to His service. Toward this end the Sunday-school, the Junior Auxiliary, and the personal influence of parents and friends must carry on the work which the Babies' Branch begins. The Missionary Spirit must be kept alive in the heart of the growing child. May not this become a very real part of our work as members of the Woman's Auxiliary?

Mission Study for Lent, 1908.

For some years this Diocese has participated in the constantly growing Study of Missions, but for the first time we have recommended to the parishes the course on China, planned by Mr. E. P. Smith, the Educational Secretary of the Board of Missions.

The results reported are not quite so encouraging as we shall hope to have them next year. Except in a few instances, little enthusiasm was shown, due partly to the fact that the course requires something of a reference library, which for many of the parishes was too expensive, and partly to our lack of trained leaders, for many fear to undertake something with which they are unfamiliar. Many of the classes were merely reading classes, the "Uplift of China" being the textbook. One Auxiliary contented itself with readings from the Spirit of Missions. One parish is fortunate enough to have as a summer visitor a trained leader of study classes who is willing to give some of her vacation time to the Master's Cause, and its work is done then.

In the Reading Archdeaconry about the same number as last year report having had classes. One particularly successful one was held in Allentown. Many of the twenty-eight parishes have sent no report.

In the Scranton Archdeaconry, nine parishes report having used this course on China, one studied Alaska, one, the Mountain Whites of North Carolina, and one, Africa, but this one will have its course on China this summer. Three report no work done, and seven have not responded. The report of one of the Secretaries contains this suggestion: "The outlay of money for needed material for study classes is a serious consideration."

May we hope that ere long each Archdeaconry can have its traveling reference library?
