In April, 1920, the first collection of the new triennial was taken. Notices were sent to 105 women of the parish. Sixty-six of these responded with their contributions, making an amount of \$603.

A large part of this amount was given in memory of Mrs. F. W. Morris' faithful and loving service, as Parish Treasurer for the United Thank Offering. It was she who first brought the knowledge and information about the United Offering to the parish—and she never ceased to create interest and enthusiasm during all the years that followed. She often met with disappointments and discouragements but her fine spirit never failed. Her great wish was that all the women of the parish gave to the United Offering. If that could be accomplished now it would indeed be a tribute worthy of her.
