## SECRETARY'S REPORT, 1920

---

Thirty-five years ago the Woman's Auxiliary to the Convocation of Chester was organized at a meeting where eleven parishes were represented. To-day there are over forty on its roll. The large attendance at the two meetings held during the past year vouch for the interest which is taken in the work done by the Auxiliary.

1920 gave us a new presiding officer, Mrs. Harrison B. Wright, whom we welcome with many wishes for a long and inspiring term of office, at the same time thanking Mrs. Lynch and the other retiring officers for their years of faithful service.

The meetings during 1920 were held at St. Paul's, Chester, and St. Mary's, Ardmore. Of the money contributed, \$100, was voted for repairs to St. Giles' Mission at 69th and Chestnut Streets, and \$600, for repairs to the rectory at Morton. Thinking that you might like a definite report from a member of this Organization about the places where assistance has been given, I visited both.

At Morton. I found a pleasant rectory of stone and frame, standing close beside the attractive stone church, with a many-windowed stone parish house in the rear of the lot. The parish house consists of two good-sized rooms, a small kitchen with gas stove and a lavatory. The most urgent repairs to the rectory are done,—leaking roof mended and inside painting and papering finished. The outside painting is to be done in the Spring when the weather is more suitable. The new Rector and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Scofield, are now there.

St. Giles' Mission, a small gray frame building, stands solitary at the end of 69th Street in a vacant field several steps above the street level, looking rather lonely. The door was locked, but through the windows I could see a bright, pleasant room. Near at hand are quantities of nice looking new houses. It seems as if the work there might grow to large proportions, and the present church building is very tiny.

There were two important motions passed during the year: one, to have the date of the Fall Meeting changed so that it would occur after the meeting of the Convocation,

thereby enabling us to have a report from that meeting at our Fall gathering; the other, offered in response to a very urgent appeal from Mrs. Wright, to consider the desirability of paying off the various mortgages that are now handicapping a number of the missions—mortgages that the Bishop has raised so that the missions might be started, but which they, themselves, are unable to pay off although they are working hard and valiantly to that end. Such an accomplishment would be of permanent value to the Convocation. The motion that “each section of the Convocation shall accept the duty of paying off one mortgage” was passed with enthusiasm.

At the Spring Meeting the Rev. G. N. Holcomb spoke on rural work, and in the Fall Bishop Garland told about the Lambeth Conference, especially the part that referred to woman's position in the Church.

The announcement that “Bishop's Day,” which originally included only the Main Line and vicinity, now would take in the whole Convocation, is an example of what seemed to Bishop Garland the key note of the Conference, a movement towards unity in the Church, a unity that is not incompatible with individuality but which will surely tend to bring out the best in each separate unit and group of the whole.
