Secretary's Report

The Spring and Fall meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Convocation of Chester were both well attended, with about three hundred present.

The Spring meeting, Ascension Day, May 17th, was held at St. Paul's, West Whiteland. Bishop Garland spoke of the missions and the work on the buildings being done this year. It was with great satisfaction that the \$2,000.00 pledged could be given to the Bishop at this time.

Dean Taitt stressed earnestly the interest we should feel in the Woman's Auxiliary, for of that we are a constituent part.

The Church at Collingdale was reported finished and the Rector hopes to have the Auxiliary meet there before long to see their handsome new building.

The plans for the new church at Springfield were shown by the Rector and the work is to be started soon.

The luncheon and the afternoon session were held at the Church Farm School, where time was given to see the buildings and to learn of the splendid work being done there.

Mrs. Thomas Reath, President of the Diocesan Altar Guild, was the afternoon speaker, explaining how the Guild helps Diocesan Institutions, the City Mission, Army and Navy Chaplains and small Missions with altar linens, etc. She asked for individual members at \$1.00 a year, and corporate Altar Guild members at \$2.00 a year or more, as money for material is obtained in that way.

There have been six new names added to the Memorial List.

The Fall meeting was at Holy Trinity, West Chester, All Saints' Day, November 1st, instead of the usual date,

so as not to conflict with the Triennial Convention held in Washington in October.

The Bishop spoke of the the work which was progressing at the missions. It was voted that the Auxiliary give \$500.00 additional to the Bishop for St. John the Evangelist, Essington, as they are working very hard for a suitable building.

The President spoke of the importance of giving the younger members of the Parishes something to do, and hopes that every Parish in the Convocation either has or will start a young peoples' organization.

The afternoon session was full of inspiration, as we heard from several who had the privilege of being at the Convention.

The report of the Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council was given by Mrs. Edward Ingersoll. Mrs. Harry F. Baker spoke of the presentation of the United Thank Offering.

Dean Taitt gave a beautiful resume of the Convention, giving the high lights from those great gatherings, so that we all felt the enthusiasm to press ever forward for the cause of Christ.

An invitation was given and accepted to hold the Spring meeting at St. John's, Pequea.
