SECRETARY'S REPORT.

IN presenting our Sixth Annual Report, we are fortunate in having to record two as successful general meetings as those of this last year. The first of these, the fifth semi-annual, was held at the Church of the Epiphany, Thursday, November 7, 1889. After the opening services, an address was made by Bishop McLaren, who spoke of the regret felt at the absence of the Bishop of Fond du Lac and of the needs of the church in that diocese. He then went on to speak of the pressing needs in our own diocese, especially in our great city and among the German population. The Bishop then introduced Bishop Gilbert of Minnesota, who made an inspiring address, in which he spoke of the work done by the Woman's Auxiliary in the past and the present needs of the work in Minnesota. The addresses were followed by a celebration of the Holy Communion, nearly three hundred being present and receiving.

At the close of the services, lunch was served by the ladies of the Epiphany, after which the afternoon meeting was called to order by Mrs. Locke. The opening prayers were followed by short addresses by Archdeacon Bishop and the Rev. Mr. Cory-Thomas of Grand Crossing. After the roll-call, to which thirty-four parishes responded, Mrs. Locke read an address, giving an account of the W. A. meetings in connection with the General Convention. Reports from the Correspondence and Library Committees followed, and Miss Arnold read a paper on the work of the Ministering Children's League. Appeals were made for help in various quarters, closing with a few words from Mrs. Phillips in behalf of foreign missions, especially for the work in China. The collection, which amounted to \$34, was to help purchase a horse for a missionary in Fond du Lac. The collection at the morning service amounted to \$67.75, of which \$30 was appropriated to Bishop Gilbert's work, \$10 to the church at Morgan Park, and \$27.75 was sent to Bishop McLaren for work in the diocese.

The sixth annual meeting was held in S. James' Church, Tuesday, May 27, at 2.30 p.m. In the absence of the secretary, Mrs. D. S. Phillips was elected secretary *pro tem*. Thirty-seven branches were represented and answered to their names. The annual reports of the

secretary and treasurer were followed by the report of Mrs. Starbuck, of the Church Periodical Club, who stated that whereas last year only ten dioceses were engaged in the work, this year thirty-one were "busy here and there" in sending books, cards, and periodicals where they are most needed. In our own diocese, eighteen parishes are helping in this good work, sending out during the year last past 244 papers and periodicals. The reports of the Library and Correspondence Committees were given by Miss Lee as librarian, and Miss Stahl, chairman of the C. C. The reports of the Clergy Retiring and Widows and Orphans' Funds were read by Mrs. Hibbard. Mrs. Locke then read an address in which she spoke of the fact that in our six years' of work we had given over \$50,000 to the work of missions. The election for officers resulted in the reelection of the officers of the preceding year. The offering amounted to \$54.93, and was for the work of the Sisters of S. Mary, in connection with the Cathedral. A resolution was passed, that "It shall be the aim of all branches in the diocese to send some special offering for Africa during the year, asking Miss Emery to designate some point of interest to which our offering shall be sent."

After a generous tea, served by the ladies of S. James, all reassembled for the evening meeting, which was presided over by the Bishop. After the opening hymns and prayers, the Bishop spoke a few kindly words of welcome and then introduced the Rev. Cabraith Perry of Tennessee, who spoke on the needs of the work among the colored people. He was followed by Bishop Dudley of Kentucky, who made an eloquent address on the same subject. It is earnestly hoped that the words heard that night may give an impetus to the work done by us for the colored people this year.

The work of the year, so far as it can be estimated by figures, compares favorably with the work of preceding years, being a slight advance over any heretofore reported, amounting in all to over \$1300. Of this, boxes and money to the amount of \$2003.10 have gone to S. Luke's Hospital, and \$2623.48 to other diocesan work. Of the whole amount given, therefore, inclusive of gifts to S. Luke's, nearly one-third has gone into the diocese, and, exclusive of gifts to S. Luke's, nearly one-fifth has been thus given.

During the year only one new branch, that of the Church of the Redeemer, Wilmington, was added to our number. A few parishes in the diocese are still unrepresented in our work. We hope the time will come when we may have the pleasure of numbering every parish

among us. Our work has, perhaps, now reached the time which is to try "what spirit we are of"; the zeal which is apt to accompany a newly-undertaken work has had time to die out, and the realization that we have upon us a work, not for a few years of impetuous feeling, but for a lifetime of quiet, steady labor, is growing upon us.

When we, not as officers or members of the Auxiliary, but as "members of Christ and children of God," have learned the lesson that missionary work is a matter, not of choice or feeling, but of sober duty and obedience, there will be no fear of failure in our work, only a calm assurance that it will go on steadily to the end. Surely our prayer for ourselves in this work to which we are called should be, in the words of the collect as given in the English prayer-book, "That we, *being ready* both in body and soul, may cheerfully accomplish *those things that Thou wouldst have done.*"

 DURING the past year an interest has been awakened in the Clergy Retiring-Fund Society. Forty of the clergy in the diocese have been made members and fourteen of that number have been made life-members. These results have been attained almost entirely through women's gifts and efforts.

A membership means the payment of a \$10.00 initiation fee and \$12.00 annually until the clergyman has reached the age of 60 years, and has been a member for five years.

We earnestly desire that an annual collection should be taken up in each parish for this object, of which due notice would be given. May I ask of my sisters that they remind the men of their households of their duty to the aged and infirm clergy; and also to pray for a liberal response?

SOCIETY FOR THE RELIEF OF WIDOWS AND ORPHANS OF CLERGYMEN.

THE Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen is an outcome of the Clergy Retiring-Fund Society.

While the clergy expressed their gratitude for the thought which provided for their old age, their earnest desire was that some provision might be made for their wives and children in case of their death. How could I resist their appeal and not "go forward."

With the sanction of the bishop, the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen in this diocese was organized and incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois.

An interest was quickly awakened among church people, and friends not of our communion also showed their approval of this work, by words and deeds. Subscription-books were sent out and the response has been liberal, but there is much to be done.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO-BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, with special reference to the necessities of the field in our own Diocese.

ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual-membership fee of one dollar, may be represented in its meetings by not more than five delegates.

ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held during the session of the Diocesan Convention for the election of officers, the reception of reports from the various branch societies, the adoption of the annual report, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A public meeting shall be held, in conjunction with the Board of Missions, on the evening of the first day of the Diocesan Convention, in one of the churches of the city of Chicago, at which meeting the annual report shall be read, and addresses shall be delivered by speakers appointed by the Bishop.

ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, three vice-presidents—one from each deanery—secretary, and treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization

of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the directions of the Bishop.

SEC. 3. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, and to coöperate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association in the deaneries to which they respectively belong.

SEC. 4. The duty of the secretary shall be to keep a record of the meetings and to conduct the necessary correspondence.

SEC. 5. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the bishop.

BY - LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee, the president, or in her absence, the other members of the Executive Committee, shall call a meeting of the parochial officers of the diocese, at which meeting the vacancy shall be filled by the election of an officer chosen by a majority of those present. The officer so elected to serve until the next annual election.

III. Special meetings may be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion to the Missionary work of the church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
3. Reports of officers and committees.
4. Election of officers.
5. Unfinished business.
6. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of a majority present.
