### SECRETARY'S REPORT.

**N** offering our report for the year, it is necessary first to put on record a short account of the semi-annual and annual meetings. The first of these, our sixth semi-annual, was held in the Church of Our Saviour, October 16, 1890. Morning services were held in the church, Holy Communion being celebrated by the rector, the Rev. Mr. Petrie, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Locke. At the close of the services, Mr. Petrie introduced the Rev. Mr. Massiah of Cairo, Ill., and Rev. Mr. Cain of Galveston, Texas, who made interesting addresses on the work among the colored people of our land.

After a most hospitable luncheon, served by the ladies of the parish, the afternoon meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. Locke. After the calling of the roll and distribution of the annual reports, an address was made by Mrs. Locke on the work of the Auxiliary. This was followed by ten-minute addresses, by Miss Arnold on the Ministering Children's League; Mrs. Coleman on the Girls' Friendly; Miss Drummond on the Enrolment Fund; Mrs. Ward on the Fund for Widows and Orphans; Mrs. Starbuck on the Church Periodical Club; Mrs. Phillips on the Work in Africa and Miss Stahl on the Mission at Norwood Park. At the close of the meeting, letters sent by Miss Emery were distributed, and the work for the winter arranged as far as possible.

The morning collection amounted to \$43; the afternoon collection was \$56, and was appropriated for the mission at Norwood Park. Notwithstanding the severe storm, over one hundred women were present at each meeting.

The seventh annual meeting was held at S. Andrew's Church, Chicago, Tuesday, May 26th, 1891. The afternoon meeting was opened by Rev. Mr. Kinney of Holy Trinity, Union Stock-Yards, who made an interesting address on his work at that mission. The reports of the Treasurer, Secretary, Widows' and Orphans' Fund, Clergy Retiring-Fund, and Church Periodical Club, were read and approved, and Mrs. Coleman of Grace Church, spoke of the work of the Girls' Friendly Society. This was followed by a few words from the President, Mrs. Locke, who told of the work already accomplished, and bade us God speed in that lying before us. The election of officers being in order, Mrs. Locke desired that her name should not be used, as she felt that she must give up her work as President. Her resignation was accepted with great regret. The election of officers resulted in the election of Mrs. O. Van Schaack Ward of Grace Church (nominated by Mrs. A. C. McClurg of S. James) as President, in place of Mrs. Locke, and the reëlection of all the other officers. A resolution of regret at Mrs. Locke's resignation expressive of grateful and loving appreciation of her services, offered by Miss Foot of S. James, was adopted by a rising vote.

Mrs. Ward not being present, the Vice-President of the Northeast Deanery, Miss Arnold, took the chair, and introduced Miss Julia C. Emery, our General Secretary from New York, whose presence with us at this meeting added very greatly to its pleasure and success. Miss Emery gave a most delightful address on the missionary work of the church. A collection, amounting to \$101, was taken for Mr. Kinney's work. At the close of the service, tea was served by the ladies of S. Andrew's, to which all members of the Auxiliary as well as the clergy were heartily welcomed. At the evening meeting, which was presided over by the Bishop, addresses were made by Dean Peabody of Rockford, on Diocesan Missions. Mr. Camp of Joliet, on Domestic Missions, and Mr. Rouse of Trinity, Chicago, on Foreign Mis-

sions. The Bishop then spoke most kindly of the work of the Auxiliary, paying a graceful and well-earned tribute to Mrs. Locke.

It is impossible to send forth this report without a few words of loving recognition of the services of our retiring President, Mrs. Locke. Her long residence in the Diocese and familiarity with its needs, her earnest interest in missions, her never-failing kindness and warm sympathy, her capacity for work, together with her ability and faithfulness, made her an officer who will be greatly missed and whose loss will be deeply regretted. We are fortunate in being able to welcome as our leader one who will faithfully carry on the work so well begun under Mrs. Vibbert and Mrs. Locke, and we bespeak for her a helpful loyalty from every branch.

It is a matter of regret that in so many Branches this last year the gifts for our work have fallen off. In the following Branches there has been an *increase* in gifts: Trinity, Aurora; S. Mark's, S. Peter's, and Trinity, Chicago; S. Mark's, Evanston; Redeemer, Elgin; Emmanuel, LaGrange; S. Alban's, Norwood Park; The Cathedral, Grace, and S. Phillip's, Chicago; Grace, Galena; Grace, Hinsdale; S. John's, Naperville; Grace, Pontiac, and S. Paul, Riverside. In the first seven of these the increase has been very decided, in the remainder the gain has not been so great.

We have added to our list of contributors the names of Morgan Park, Wilmington, and Windsor Park. All the Branches not mentioned above have fallen off in their gifts; five having sent their annual dues only. While in many cases this deficit is owing to special and temporary circumstances, and while it is also true that some of our Branches have always been "merciful after their power," and so can not increase their gifts, still it remains that in many Branches these reasons can not hold good, and there surely needs to be among us a "searching of hearts"

as to why our special Branch is numbered among those who have wearied in well-doing. While it is true that we should not "despise the day of small things" when it *is* that day, we should take care that when the day of *large* things comes to us we should be ready to respond to its call. Will we not find, if we answer our own questions truly, that we have fallen behind, not "of necessity" but because we have been indifferent and have not realized that mission work (and by "mission" is not meant what the Secretary of the California Branch calls "an ecclesio-geographical term to indicate the remote from the speaker") is *our* work: as much our duty as that of any foreign missionary in the field, though we may only scrape the lint and wind the bandages for those who handle the guns. Let us see to it that this coming year finds us, each in her "little corner" ready to respond heartily, intelligently, and generously to the calls that may come to us from our own Diocese or elsewhere. The time for rest comes only when our power for work is gone, or when the sin and misery and darkness of this world shall cease. While there is work to do and we have power to do even a very little, *our* resting-time has not come.

### CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB.

HERE are at present nineteen parishes coöperating in the work of the Church Periodical Club: Trinity, S. James, Grace, Epiphany, and S. Marks of Chicago; Grace, Galena; Grace, Oak Park; S. Thomas, Amboy; S. Paul, Hyde Park; Emmanuel, LaGrange; Christ, Joliet; S. Peter, Lake View; Trinity, Aurora; Christ, Woodlawn; S. Luke, Dixon; S. Luke, South Evanston; Emmanuel, Rockford; S. Mark, Evanston; and Christ, Ottawa.

One hundred and ninety-eight persons contribute, sending out regularly 337 current numbers of periodicals; 550 books, including Bibles, Sunday-school books, and hymnals, have been distributed; also 1200 Christmas and Easter cards, 75 tracts, carols, and catechisms, and 4000 numbers of papers and magazines, including past years of periodicals and current numbers not sent regularly.

## CONSTITUTION.

### ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

### ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, with special reference to the necessities of the field in our own Diocese.

### ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual-membership fee of one dollar, may be represented in its meetings by not more than five delegates.

### ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held during the session of the Diocesan Convention for the election of officers, the reception of reports from the various branch societies, the adoption of the annual report, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A public meeting should be held, in conjunction with the Board of Missions, on the evening of the first day of the Diocesan Convention, in one of the churches of the city of Chicago, at which meeting the annual report shall be read, and addresses shall be delivered by speakers appointed by the Bishop.

### ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, three vice-presidents—one from each deanery—secretary, and treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the directions of the Bishop.

SEC. 3. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, and to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association in the deaneries to which they respectively belong.

SEC. 4. The duty of the secretary shall be to keep a record of the meetings and to conduct the necessary correspondence.

SEC. 5. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

## ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

## ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee, the president, or in her absence, the other members of the Executive Committee, shall call a meeting of the parochial officers of the diocese, at which meeting the vacancy shall be filled by the election of an officer chosen by a majority of those present. The officer so elected to serve until the next annual election.

III. Special meetings may be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion to the Missionary work of the church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
3. Reports of officers and committees.
4. Election of officers.
5. Unfinished business.
6. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of a majority present.
