## SECRETARY'S REPORT.

---

**D**URING the year last past, we have held our two general meetings, the annual and semi-annual, the reports of which are as follows:

The seventh semi-annual was held at S. James' Church, Chicago, October 27, 1891. At the celebration of the Holy Communion at the morning service, nearly three hundred were present. Addresses were made by the rector of the parish, the Rev. Mr. Tomkins, and by Bishop Atwill of West Missouri and Bishop Graves of The Platte, all of which were listened to with much interest.

In the interval between the service and the afternoon meeting, lunch was served by the ladies of S. James' at the Parish House. The afternoon meeting was presided over by the president, Mrs. Ward. The roll-call showed thirty-nine parishes represented. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved, after which the letters sent by Miss Emery were distributed, and the winter's work arranged as far as possible. Addresses followed by the president; Mrs. Cust of Joliet; and Miss Stahl of Galena. Miss Mailes of Osaka, Japan, was then introduced, and read a most delightful and instructive paper on the work among the Japanese. A collection, amounting to about \$90, was taken for Miss Mailes' work. After a hymn and a few collects, the meeting adjourned.

The eighth annual meeting was held at S. Mark's Church, May 31, 1892, at 2.30 p.m. The opening prayers were said by the rector, the Rev. Mr. Wilson, who also, in a few words, welcomed the women of the Auxiliary to S. Mark's. The president, Mrs. Ward, then took charge of the meeting. After the roll-call and the minutes of the last meeting, the reports of the treasurer and secretary were read, following which were papers by the president, on the work in general, and Miss

Arnold, on the Ministering Children's League. Next in order were reports by Mrs. Starbuck, on the Church Periodical Club; Mrs. Hibbard, on the Clergy Retiring-Fund and the Fund for Widows and Orphans of Clergy in this diocese; Miss Grosbeck on the work of the Girls' Friendly Society; and Mrs. Brower on the Library Committee. The election of diocesan officers followed. Mrs. Clark of Kankakee, Mrs. Locke of Grace, Mrs. McClurg of S. James, and Mrs. Brower of Epiphany, being named as a nominating committee. They reported the names of the former officers, with the exception of treasurer, Mrs. C. L. Raymond having declined to allow her name to be used. Mrs. O. W. Barrett of Trinity Church was nominated in her place. The secretary being instructed to cast the ballot for the officers nominated, they were declared elected.

While waiting the return of the nominating committee, Mrs. Ward spoke of several subjects which she wished to bring to the notice of the Auxiliary, among which was the suggestion that each member make, during the summer, some useful or fancy article, so that there might be a stock in hand when we were called on in the fall for contributions to Christmas-boxes, church-fairs, etc. She also made an earnest appeal for money for the education of an Indian boy, a work to be done in memory of the late Rev. C. S. Cook. A collection amounting to about \$100 was taken for this purpose. Mrs. Ward then introduced Miss Adams, president of the Michigan branch, who read a graceful greeting from our sister branch of Michigan to the Chicago branch. Miss Adams then spoke on the subject of the Enrolment Fund, with a knowledge of her subject, an interest and enthusiasm that should bear fruit in our increased offering in Baltimore.

During the meeting it was voted to appropriate \$25 for the memorial fund of the C. P. C., in loving memory of Mrs. Fargo. An invitation was given by Mrs. Locke, and accepted by the Auxiliary, that the annual meeting of 1893 be held at Grace Church, Chicago. A resolution was passed that the semi-annual meetings be hereafter held at the Cathedral, the Auxiliary bearing the expenses of the lunch served at that time. The following resolution was adopted by a rising vote:

The members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Chicago have heard with the greatest regret the announcement from Mrs. Chas. L. Raymond that she can no longer, consistently with home duties, retain the office of general treasurer of this branch. They can not allow her to retire without unusual expressions of regard and appreciation;

*Resolved, therefore,* That the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Chicago feel that, in the resignation of Mrs. Chas. L. Raymond, they are sustaining a great loss. To her unceasing care and devoted spirit they owe much of their success. They thank her most heartily for the same, and trust that, although no longer one of their general officers, they may not be deprived of her counsel and the inspiration of her presence.

Immediately prior to adjournment, resolutions of thanks were offered to Miss Adams and to the rector and ladies of S. Marks', after which the meeting adjourned to partake of a bountiful tea, provided by the ladies of S. Mark's.

The evening meeting was presided over by the bishop of the diocese, who gave a short but interesting address on Domestic Missions, being followed by the Rev. Mr. McGrath of Morgan Park, on Diocesan Missions, and the Rev. Sidney Partridge of Wuchang, China, on the work in that country.

In offering the report of this year, the secretary desires to call attention to the fact that although our figures fall behind those of last year about \$2000, this is owing to the completion and paying over last year of the sum of \$4000, the result of many years' diligent work by a few of the ladies of Trinity Church, Chicago, for the endowment of a bed in S. Luke's Hospital. Deducting this large offering from our last year's work, we have a gain in the general work of the branch of over \$2000 over last year's work. And yet, notwithstanding this encouragement as compared with the general work of last year, it is also true that we have fallen below our "high-water mark" of the reports offered at our annual meetings of May, 1889, and May, 1890. Surely it is not Christian progress if "like a crab we do go backward." Reports matter little except as they show an interest, an earnestness, a love, and enthusiasm that *must* prove themselves by their fruits. Of the sixty branches on our list, eleven have this year maintained a silence

which, in this case, is not golden. We would gladly welcome their voices in the coming year. We give a cordial welcome to three new branches: the Atonement, Chicago; S. Mathias, Fairbury; and S. Paul, Rogers Park. While not yet numbered with us by regular organization, S. Luke's of South Evanston has made a noble contribution to our report.

At the general meeting at Baltimore in October, the offering of the Auxiliary for the Enrolment Fund is to be made. If our prayers and gifts have been equal to our ability, then we may rest content, no matter what the result. If we have done *our best* in this, as in other work, we may be satisfied with small results; if not, *large* results should bring no satisfaction.

In closing, a few grateful words may surely be spoken of her who has given up her work as treasurer, an office filled by her so ably and faithfully since the organization of the Chicago branch, in October, 1884. Untiring, accurate, business-like, with clear judgment and warm interest, she has been a treasurer it is hard to spare. But the loss to the diocesan officers is even greater; only they can know how helpful have been the clear brain and warm heart that have worked so faithfully for over seven years. With grateful thanks to her who has laid down the work, we turn with earnest welcome to her who has taken it up, giving to her and to all the members of our Auxiliary for the new year of our work a hearty "God speed."

## CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB.

TWENTY parishes in the diocese contribute to the work of this Society. Reports have been received from fourteen: Christ, Epiphany, Grace, S. James, S. Mark, S. Paul, S. Peter, and Trinity, Chicago; S. Mark, Evanston; Christ, Joliet; S. Paul, Kankakee; Emmanuel, LaGrange; Grace, Oak Park; and Emmanuel, Rockford.

In these 14 parishes there are 201 members, who have contributed during the year 349 periodicals and 100 Sunday-school papers, sent regularly, and 231 books, besides numerous other papers, Christmas cards, odd numbers of magazines, etc.

During the year, \$12.00 was given by the Branches for the general fund of the C. P. C. The expenses of printing, etc., being met by the Woman's Auxiliary. Since January, 1892, six parishes have contributed \$8.72 toward expenses.

Several other parishes are interested in this work, in addition to those above named, but the reports of their librarians did not reach me in time to be included in this year's report.

## CONSTITUTION.

## ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

## ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, with special reference to the necessities of the field in our own Diocese.

## ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual-membership fee of one dollar, may be represented in its meetings by not more than five delegates.

## ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held during the session of the Diocesan Convention for the election of officers, the reception of reports from the various branch societies, the adoption of the annual report, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A public meeting shall be held, in conjunction with the Board of Missions, on the evening of the first day of the Diocesan Convention, in one of the churches of the city of Chicago, at which meeting the annual report shall be read, and addresses shall be delivered by speakers appointed by the Bishop.

## ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, three vice-presidents—one from each deanery—secretary, and treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the directions of the Bishop.

SEC. 3. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, and to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association in the deaneries to which they respectively belong.

SEC. 4. The duty of the secretary shall be to keep a record of the meetings and to conduct the necessary correspondence.

SEC. 5. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

## B Y - L A W S .

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee, the president, or in her absence, the other members of the Executive Committee, shall call a meeting of the parochial officers of the diocese, at which meeting the vacancy shall be filled by the election of an officer chosen by a majority of those present. The officer so elected to serve until the next annual election.

III. Special meetings may be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion to the Missionary work of the church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
3. Reports of officers and committees.
4. Election of officers.
5. Unfinished business.
6. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of a majority present.
