THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER.

TO THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE CHICAGO
BRANCH, GREETING:

AGAIN we are called to review the accumulated record of an eventful year, which puts a new song of thanksgiving into our mouths; because, in the face of great national and local depression and of many personal difficulties, there is manifest *growth*. And this growth, under the Divine blessing, may be traced to two special influences. Firstly, to the devotion of the acting members of your executive committee, (a devotion which might shame the truant president, had not a due portion of her time and thought been given to missions in distant fields). And, secondly, to the increasing interest apparent in the parochial branches; including the fresh impulse given to the Junior work, the root and branch of the future.

Doubtless the spirit of the missionary council left its impress upon the work of the year. And it is also encouraging to note that some seed-thoughts, dropped by the way of a former letter, having been diligently watered by other hands, have borne early fruit at the annual meeting, in the successful effort "to promote general expression and to increase the interest of the meeting;" and also in the Offering, which shows the beginning of interest in "the United Offering," which calls for yet closer attention since it must be presented in one short year.

From personal experience we can now attest that in "all the world around" no land is so favored as our own, and none in which woman finds so glorious an heritage. But there are many who should be heirs with us, some of whom have not even heard the summons across the great waters which lie between, while others are struggling for life against fearful odds.

And shall not we, who have entered upon privileged possession, resolve to twine together our time and talents, means and strength, as the strands of a strong rope, which shall be

thrown out to hold up those who far and near are plunging into the breakers to rescue the perishing?

At home, the year is scarred by want and strife and fire; abroad, by earthquakes, war, and pestilence. Yet by the grace of God, more freely than ever before, have clear heads and noble hearts given themselves for the salvation of the weak, the erring, and the ignorant. But even greater vigilance seems needed in the Church militant. It has been said that God's work among men will never be accomplished, according to His perfect Will, until *every one* of His children has done a little of it.

With this in mind, then, and remembering too that by your own election your committee is called to lead in

"Another year of service,
Of witness for His Love,
Another year of training,
For holier work above"—

work upon which we may be called to enter ere the year has flown)—shall we not put forth fresh efforts to attract and to hold some earnest souls to whom we have failed to say "come with us and we will do thee good?" And that the Semi-Annual may be the door of entrance to a higher and nobler service, let us daily ask for each other and for ourselves "that we may both perceive and know what things we ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfil the same."

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

IN giving a report of the meetings held by our Diocesan Branch this last year, we have the pleasure of counting among them the one held at the time of our usual semi-annual. The presence of the Missionary Council of 1893 in Chicago enabling us to combine, in some measure, our meeting with the annual meeting of the diocesan officers. This meeting was held in S. James' Church, Chicago, on Monday, October 23. It was called to order by Miss Emery, who asked the president of the Chicago Branch to take the chair. After an opening address by Dr. Langford and a graceful and hearty welcome from Mrs. Ward, the reports of the various committees appointed at the last triennial meeting were read. These committees being those on "Systematic Giving," "Publications," "Missionary Workers," and "The Junior Auxiliary."

The afternoon meeting was opened with a hymn, which was followed by an address by Mrs. Tilton of Ontario; Mrs. Brierley of Africa, who was expected, being prevented from coming by illness. Addresses followed by Mrs. Twing, on her missionary journey around the world; Miss Carter, on her work in Minnesota; Miss Jarvis, on the Junior Auxiliary; and Miss Emery, on "The United Offering." The collection amounted to a little over \$100, and was divided between Mrs. Brierley's work and that in Florida.

Owing to the expected absence of our President, Mrs. Ward, from the country for nearly a year, and the many obstacles that prevented the vice-presidents from assuming her duties in her absence, a special meeting was called (under By-Law 3 of the Constitution) for Tuesday, November 7, at Grace Church, Chicago. Mrs. Ward being absent, the Vice-President of the Northeast Deanery presided, and read Mrs. Ward's letter of resignation. Mrs. Locke offered a resolution that the resignation should not be accepted. After some discussion the vote was put and Mrs. Locke's resolution carried.

There being no further business before the meeting, it was declared adjourned.

The tenth annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in the Cathedral, Thursday, May 31, 1894. Morning services, with celebration of the Holy Communion, were held at 10.45, and were in charge of the Bishop. After an address of welcome and "Godly counsel" by the Bishop, the sermon was preached by the Rev. C. P. Anderson of Oak Park. About three hundred women were present at these services.

In the interval before the afternoon meeting, lunch was served in the Mission House by the Sisters of S. Mary. The afternoon meeting, in the absence of the President, was presided over by Miss Arnold, vice-president of the Northeast Deanery; the opening prayers being read by the Rev. Mr. Wright. The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved, and the roll called, forty-one parishes responding to their names.

Then followed reports of the Secretary and Treasurer, the Fund for Widows and Orphans, the Comfort Club, and the Church Periodical Club. Miss Stahl then read a letter from Mrs. Ward from Thessalonica, giving a partial account of her journey. Miss Arnold followed with a few words, speaking, among other subjects, of the great missionary council being held in London. She also read a telegram from Mrs. Ward, desiring to be permanently relieved of her duties as President.

The election of officers being in order, a resolution was adopted that the chair appoint a nominating committee. Mrs. McDermid of Grace, Mrs. Wilson of S. Mark, and Mrs. Street of S. Chrysostom were appointed, and, in consideration of the doubt as to Mrs. Ward's acceptance of the office, reported the following names for president: Mrs. Ward, Mrs. Lyman of LaGrange, Mrs. Brooks of S. Paul, and Mrs. Brower of the Epiphany; the names of the other officers remaining the same. After some discussion, the balloting was proceeded with, and resulted in the election of the officers of last year.

A collection, amounting to about \$66.00, was then taken for the United Offering. Papers on the subject of the United Offering were then read by Mrs. Raymond of Trinity and Mrs.

Wilson of S. Mark, and a resolution was adopted that "it is the desire of this meeting that the next United Offering be considered a fund for furnishing the support of a missionary bishop for all time to come." Then followed papers on "Printed Reports," by Mrs. Meacham and Mrs. Losey of Grace and Mrs. Frank Pardee of S. Andrew, the speaker on the subject being Mrs. Gregory of Grace. Owing to the lateness of the hour, the other subjects appointed for discussion were necessarily omitted.

After resolutions of thanks to the Bishop, the Sisters, the Rev. Mr. Anderson, and the Clergy of the Cathedral, the meeting adjourned.

CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB.

DURING the past year, twenty-one parishes have taken part in this work, not all of which have sent in reports. There have been sent regularly during the year, by 160 persons, 295 periodicals, 334 Sunday-school books, 145 books of general character, 245 prayer-books, 16 hymnals, 3 Bibles, 245 leaflets, and 29 catechisms have been donated. 122 Sunday-school papers are regularly sent. 10,000 odd numbers of papers and magazines, 165 Sunday-school cards, 3487 Christmas cards, and 1250 Easter cards have been sent.

The money contributions have been as follows: From the collection at the annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, \$5.00; from Rockford, \$1.00; Grace Church, Chicago, \$5.00; S. James, Chicago, \$5.00; Trinity, Chicago, \$7.00; total, \$23.00. Of this, \$10.00 has been sent to New York for the general fund and \$6.00 has been used for postage, leaving a balance on hand of \$7.00.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards.

ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual-membership fee of one dollar, may be represented in its meetings by not more than five delegates.

ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, for the election of officers, the reception of reports from the various branch societies, the adoption of the annual report, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn, at the discretion of the Executive Committee; which meeting shall consist of an afternoon session for the transaction of business, followed by a general missionary meeting in the evening, when addresses shall be made by speakers approved by the Bishop and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, three vice-presidents—one from each deanery—secretary, and treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the directions of the Bishop.

SEC. 3. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, and to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association in the deaneries to which they respectively belong.

SEC. 4. The duty of the secretary shall be to keep a record of the meetings and to conduct the necessary correspondence.

SEC. 5. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

B Y - L A W S .

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee, the president, or in her absence, the other members of the Executive Committee, shall call a meeting of the parochial officers of the diocese, at which meeting the vacancy shall be filled by the election of an officer chosen by a majority of those present. The officer so elected to serve until the next annual election.

III. Special meetings may be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion to the Missionary work of the church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
3. Reports of officers and committees.
4. Election of officers.
5. Unfinished business.
6. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by vote of a majority present.

THE Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close
of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally
in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due
notice being given to all the Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan Officers is held on the first
Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, room
510, Masonic Temple, Chicago.
