### THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

Greetings and a heartfelt welcome do I extend to you, as you gather here from all parts of the diocese for this, our 18th Annual Meeting. Just think, eighteen years ago the Woman's Auxiliary was first organized in the diocese of Chicago. Many of those here present can recall the day. And the tiny plant has grown during all these years by the law of natural growth; first, the blade, then, the ear, then the full corn in the ear, until to-day there is hardly a parish or mission in the diocese, that has not learned to lift up its eyes beyond its own borders, and to know the blessings of that primary truth of our existence, "not for ourselves but for others."

To-day marks the close of a year of progress and of growth. I have acted as your representative during the past year, at eighty meetings. This includes visits to parishes and missions; sectional, monthly and other meetings in Chicago; and addresses given here and in the neighboring dioceses of Iowa and Nebraska. Seven new branches have been organized during the year: Holy Cross, Chicago; St. Stephen, Chicago; St. Andrew, Downers Grove; St. Augustine, Wilmette; St. Paul, De Kalb; St. Peter, Sycamore, and Holy Spirit, Lake Forest. Four sectional meetings have been held; two, in connection with meetings of the Northern and Southern Deaneries, at the kind invitation of their respective deans. These sectional meetings are shaping themselves to resemble the Annual Meeting in miniature. When possible, Morning Prayer is said in the parish church, and addresses are then made by the clergy. The afternoon is devoted to the business session, which consists of roll call, reports of parish branches, and missionary addresses and papers, followed by an informal discussion of methods of work.

This has been a year of progress and of growth for the Junior Auxiliary. The vice-president in charge of that work reports thirty-three meetings, including visits to parishes and missions, and twelve new branches organized. In spite of two very successful Junior Annual Meetings, it has been deemed expedient to discontinue them for the present. In a city of such distances as Chicago, it is well-

nigh impossible to gather together all the children of the diocese even once a year. Hence it has been suggested that several sectional meetings take the place of the one yearly gathering, thus affording every Junior Branch in the diocese the opportunity of attending one of these meetings, without undue expense or inconvenience. This change of plan will cause all business connected with the Junior department to be transacted at this, the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary. Thus we can watch, with lawful pride, the growth of our own child, whose development will enrich, not impoverish, the parent stock.

A record of the year would be incomplete, were no mention made of two new plans of work, both used for the first time during the past year. A few weeks ago, a list of ten practical questions on Auxiliary work was mailed to every parish branch in the diocese. The experiment has been received with widespread interest. Although the questions were intended to serve as a reminder, rather than as an examination, no less than fourteen branches have sent carefully written answers. Such a review, in black and white, of the strength and weakness of our work, is of great value to those who plan the missionary activities of the diocese. On January 2nd, the birthday plan for the United Offering was introduced, and has been adopted with practical unanimity. The first collection of the birthday money has just been made, and includes the birthdays of five months. It amounts to \$560. Next year it should be twice as much, for it will then include the birthdays of twelve months. The president's birthday book now contains over eleven hundred names, which is a good working basis, and, if the women of the diocese carry out this plan as well as they have begun it, Chicago's share of the United Offering of 1904 will be truly representative.

Now let us speak briefly of the future. Let us take as our guiding thought for the year before us, the one word, "Enthusiasm;" not that enthusiasm that is but the froth and effervescence of the shallow and the talkative, but the enthusiasm that springs up from the very bottom of the heart in a lambent, burning flame. And let us always remember that action is the first step towards enthusiasm, for that blessing has never yet come to the sluggish soul. Action means health, strength, life. Inaction means poison, stagnation, death. We find this truth writ large on nature's glowing page. The water of the mountain torrent may be defiled with sand and stones and debris

but it is, nevertheless, pure because it is constantly in motion. The water of the pool, while it may seem crystalline in its purity, is poisonous because it is stagnant and inactive.

Let us translate this truth into the language of the Auxiliary. Work is the very life of the Woman's Auxiliary. To stop work is to invite stagnation. In nine cases out of ten it is impossible to resume work with the old time zeal. During the interim, something very precious has vanished. Yet this temptation to stop work comes to every parish branch, and it comes in manifold and specious guise. The parish may be living through that very trying ordeal between the going of the last clergyman and the coming of the next; or the building of a new church makes it seem unwise to divert parochial funds into outside channels; or some of the strong workers of the parish have died or moved away, and for one or all of these reasons it seems best to stop work for a time. It may seem best to stop work, but, believe me, it is a very dangerous experiment. The reason is simple; in nature and in human nature, when the tree stops growing, it begins to die.

Let us consider that very ordinary form of activity evidenced by regular attendance at the monthly meetings in the Church Club Rooms. There are many noble women in our diocese, who give largely of their time and money for missionary work, and yet whose faces are rarely seen at the monthly meetings. It may be that some of those who absent themselves think that a missionary meeting consists of only two elements, the element of receiving instruction or inspiration, and the element of giving time, attention or money. Hence, they argue, if they read "The Spirit of Missions" at home, and give to the extent of their ability, it is unnecessary for them to attend the monthly meetings. But these meetings represent a third element, perhaps not more important than the other two, but certainly of equal importance. They are the only regular opportunity given the women of the diocese to meet together for the discussion of the missionary problem, not as a parochial organization, but as a diocesan family. Surely, one hour a month is not too much time to devote to this very important duty. You know the requisites of the ideal family gathering; the kindly greeting, the tactful word, the flow of small talk that leads to talk that is not small, the determination not to shirk, but to do one's part—in short, to make one's self a helpful and harmonious member of the family circle. And it is well to recall that some members of our

family have journeyed from fifty to one hundred miles, in order to be present at the monthly meetings, and, if they are not made to feel the family atmosphere, they may return to their distant homes, chilled and discouraged. By such homely tests as these, can we discover whether our missionary zeal be alive or stagnant.

Yet, with all this work, enthusiasm is not sure to come. The opportunity for work comes to every human being born into this world, but enthusiasm comes to only the favored few. Yet, if it be God's will that we should work on, day after day, in the same dull routine, with no hope, with little faith, with small result, with no reward, it is better, far better to work thus with God and for God than to do anything else in the world. But enthusiasm does come to some, and, strangely enough, it is usually found along the well-worn path of some familiar duty. Those who dwell in mountain lands tell us that it is no uncommon thing for persons who live at the foot of some great mountain to become very familiar with its giant shape. They have seen it so many recurring years, clad in the purple haze of summer, or in winter's icy cloak, that every line of its contour is indelibly engraved on the tablets of the mind, and they can reproduce it with their eyes closed. Everyone is familiar with the outline of the mountain. But to those who love it best a rare experience comes. It is in the early morning, at that mystic hour when the night is trembling into dawn, and, as they gaze upon that snowcapped peak, they see it bathed in the soft rose glow that comes from the first rays of the rising sun. And, although they thought that they knew the mountain before, it seems to them that they have never seen it, so transfigured is it before their wondering gaze. This is enthusiasm.

“Tired feet shod with strength to run,  
“Bitternesses turned to sweets,  
“Shadows lost in noonday sun;  
“New joys risen, old cares ended,  
“Peace and hardship strangely blended.”

And those who have known enthusiasm care little that their friends call them, half pityingly, mere enthusiasts, for they know that one hour of life upon that sun-kissed summit is worth a whole year of routine in the valley below.

The highest point of enthusiasm we call consecration. Consecration is a direct act of the individual will towards God, as in the matchless prayer of our Liturgy, we offer ourselves, our souls and

bodies to God for His service. To the truly consecrated soul it makes small difference what the world says of praise or blame, for that soul walks with God. Such consecration was that of the missionary Judson, who left his comfortable home to take the Gospel to a heathen land. As the ship, on which he had embarked, drew near the shadow of that dark continent, a fellow-passenger remarked sneeringly, "Do you expect to find yonder heathen anxious to receive the Gospel"? Judson replied, "I expect to find among yonder heathen, some souls so purified by self sacrifice, some characters so ripened by suffering that they will be glad and eager to receive the Gospel of Our Lord and Savior." When Judson died, there were, in that heathen land, thirty thousand souls who had been led to Christianity through the human instrumentality of that one man. Thirty thousand souls won for Christ—that was worth living for, that was worth dying for!

Let us take then, as our guiding thought for the year before us, the one word, "Enthusiasm," remembering always that action is the first step towards our goal, and that God may crown our efforts by sending to us the priceless gift of consecration.

## RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The seventeenth semi-annual meeting of the Chicago branch was held in St. James Church, Chicago. Tuesday, Nov. 5th, 1901, at 2:30 p. m.

In the absence of the Bishop the Rev. Jas. S. Stone, D. D., rector of St. James' presided and introduced the speakers. Dr. Stone also delivered the address of welcome to the visiting branches.

Addresses were delivered by Mrs. John Henry Hopkins on the triennial meeting of the Auxiliary, held in San Francisco, Oct. 3rd, by the Rev. C. H. Evans of Tokyo, Japan, on work among the Japanese women, and by Miss Higgins on the achievements and needs of the Mission Station at Cape Mount, Africa.

Pledges amounting to \$304.00 were made for Miss Higgins' work. The sum of \$208.00 was also pledged for the Mrs. Twing Memorial in Shanghai. A bountiful supper was served by the women of St. James' parish to those who remained for the evening session.

At the afternoon session roll call showed the presence of three hundred delegates from forty-three parishes.

The evening session opened at 7:45 o'clock with evensong. Rev. T. A. Snively of St. Chrysostom's Church read the lessons. The Rt. Rev. W. H. Hare, Bishop of South Dakota, made the address of the evening on "The Indians and their White Neighbors." The offering was for Bishop Hare's work.

The second annual meeting of the Junior branches in the diocese of Chicago was held in Trinity Church, Chicago, Saturday, February 22nd, 1902, at 10:30 a. m.

The morning service was read by the Rev. W. A. Guerry, and the Rev. W. C. DeWitt of S. Andrew's Church preached a sermon on the "Spirit of Giving," especially arranged for the children.

Luncheon was served by the women of Trinity parish to two hundred delegates and children.

The afternoon session was devoted to addresses by the Rev. Mr. Guerry, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins and Mrs. E. M. Duncombe, Vice President in charge of junior work. Stereopticon views of

Alaska were shown with descriptive remarks by Rev. A. B. Whitcombe, of the Church of the Good Shepherd. Roll call was responded to by two hundred and forty delegates and children from fifteen branches. The offering was for Bishop Rowe's work.

The eighteenth annual meeting of the Chicago branch was held in Grace Church, Oak Park, Thursday, May 29th, 1902, at 10:30 a. m.

The morning session consisted of the celebration of the Holy Communion, and a sermon by the Rev. John Henry Hopkins, of the Church of the Epiphany. Bishop Anderson was the celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Chas. Scadding, the Rev. E. V. Shayler, the Rev. E. J. Randall and the Rev. W. B. Hamilton.

Luncheon was served between 12:15 and 1:30 o'clock by the women of Grace Church.

The afternoon session was called to order at 1:55 by Bishop Anderson who presided. The customary devotions preceded a short address of welcome by the Rev. E. V. Shayler, Rector of Grace Church.

The minutes of the seventeenth semi-annual meeting were read by the recording secretary, and approved.

Fifty-six branches represented by four hundred and eight delegates responded to roll call.

The combined report of the treasurer and corresponding secretary was read by Miss Banks, and showed the largest receipts in the history of the Chicago branch.

During the year one hundred and twenty-five organizations belonging to seventy-six parishes have contributed \$24,709.13 in money and boxes. Of this amount \$7,938.68 represents the value of the boxes; the remainder is in money.

Short reports from the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, from the Comfort Club, from the Church Periodical Club, and from the Linen Committee of S. Luke's Hospital were read.

The President Mrs. John Henry Hopkins, in her annual address urged an ever increasing enthusiasm upon her hearers. Mrs. Hopkins announced that the amount placed upon the alms basins in the birthday offering envelopes was \$520.52.

The following resolution was offered by the committee on the distribution of the remnant of Miss Prophet's salary.

Resolved, that the \$81.00 accruing from Miss Prophet's salary be tendered Miss Hibbert as a gift in recognition of faithful service.

The resolution was adopted.

\$1,200.00 were pledged for the work of the Assistant City Missionaries.

The junior branches of the diocese in response to a recent appeal assumed the responsibility of the McLaren and Mexican-McLaren scholarships, pledging \$52.50 for the former, and \$58.00 for the latter.

The speaker of the afternoon was Mr. John W. Wood, Corresponding Secretary of the Board of Missions, New York. His subject was "General Missions."

The last item of business before adjournment and the pronouncing of the benediction was the election of officers for the ensuing year. On motion of Mrs. Phillips of S. Paul's Church, Kankakee, balloting was dispensed with and the voting was by acclamation with the following result:

President, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins; Vice Presidents, Miss K. D. Arnold, Mrs. V. B. Fullerton, Mrs. W. D. C. Street, Mrs. E. M. Duncombe and Mrs. C. L. Chenoweth; Treasurer, Mrs. Jas. T. Hoyne; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. R. Floyd Clinch; Recording Secretary, Miss Florence Beckett.

The offering of the afternoon was for Bishop Rowe, of Alaska.

The session closed with a few words of appreciation by the Bishop Coadjutor, and a resolution of thanks offered by Mrs. Fullerton to the rector and women of Grace Church, Oak Park, for their hearty hospitality.

### REPORT OF THE CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB.

To the President and Women of the Auxiliary:

Before giving the exact figures of this report, the Treasurer of the Church Periodical Club desires to state a few facts in regard to some steps recently taken to increase the much depleted fund. We had come to a very low ebb as far as money was concerned, when it was proposed to ask each Librarian of this Western Branch to find ten subscribers of 25 cents each, and thus not only to raise money but also to circulate information as to our organization. The responses to the appeal were more than gratifying. Librarians of ten parishes have been heard from, with more promised. Private donations have also been received. Within the scope of the work of the Church Periodical Club comes the widening influence, not only of furnishing periodicals from our own homes, but the purchasing of books for Mission Libraries, Sunday School, the sending of much needed books now and again to Clergymen out of touch with Library centers, the distributing of Christmas cards in Mission Schools, and much more besides. It is our hope to steadily increase the fund already started so that like the larger branch of the work in the East, this Western Branch may be able to meet many more if not all appeals that come naturally and topographically within her borders.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON LINEN, WOMEN'S BOARD OF  
ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL.

To the President and Women of the Auxiliary:

The Linen Committee of S. Luke's Hospital begs leave to submit the following, being its report from June 5, 1901, to May 14, 1902.

During the past year eight regular meetings of the Committee have been held at S. Luke's Hospital and one of the semi-annual meetings at the Church Club Rooms.

The Committee voted at the regular assembling in April to abandon the semi-annual meetings, and have only an annual one, to be held in November in the Church Club Rooms, when the delegates would read their reports and hand them to the Secretary for publication in the printed report of the Committee.

During the year the number of Parishes enlisted in our work has increased from 58 to 71, these being divided into 17 Districts, three more than last year.

The total number of articles supplied to the Hospital during the above stated period is 3,104.

Of these funds \$421.00 was given by friends of the Hospital.

\$920.00 from an entertainment for the benefit of the Linen Committee.

The purpose of the Committee is to expend this last for the establishing of Linen Rooms with a woman to look after and repair the supply. To do this will cost about \$600.00 and with the rest we hope to fill out the entire requisition required for this year.

This will leave us with very little money with which to start the new year, and as the Hospital must of necessity use enormous quantities of linen the list required for the coming year will be exactly as large as heretofore, the advance being in that we are enabled hereafter to economize to the fullest extent the use and wear of the linen.

We heartily thank you for your splendid co-operation, and truly hope that the coming year will find the Woman's Auxiliary as ever prepared to help on this Diocesan charity for the sick and helpless.

## CONSTITUTION.

---

### ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

### ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards.

### ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual membership fee of one dollar, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings, each parish or mission voting as a unit, when such vote by unit shall be demanded by two parishes or missions.

### ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention—except when that day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee shall appoint another day—for the election of officers, the adoption of the annual report, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn at the discretion of the Executive Committee; which meeting shall consist of an afternoon session for the transaction of business, followed by a general missionary meeting in the evening, when addresses shall be made by speakers approved by the Bishop and the Executive Committee.

### ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, five vice-presidents,

a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee, and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop.

SEC. 4. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association, and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 5. The duty of the corresponding secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the recording secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the corresponding secretary in the preparation of reports.

SEC. 6. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

SEC. 7. There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the treasurer's accounts each year.

#### ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the corresponding secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

**BY-LAWS.**

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings may be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the Missionary work of the church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

THE ANNUAL DAY OF PRAYER for Missions is held on the week day preceding S. Andrew's Day, November 30.

The annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 510 Masonic Temple, Chicago.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the President in taking charge of the noonday meetings. Interesting papers are read, and Missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.



### **REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.**

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the Corresponding Secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as a box is sent please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
