THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

Once again are we gathered here in Annual Meeting assembled. My first message to you is a personal one of gratitude unspeakable. At last, after two and a half years of travel, I have visited everyone of the eighty-six parishes and missions in the diocese containing a branch of the Auxiliary, and have thus had the opportunity of meeting the members of each parish branch, face to face. It has been my privilege to visit the branches in the city and suburbs of Chicago not only once, but several times, but not until now has it been possible for me to state that every parish branch, from the diocese of Milwaukee on the north to the diocese of Springfield on the south, from Lake Michigan on the east to the Mississippi river on the west, has been visited at least once by the diocesan president. What a joy this has been to me no words can express. The many miles of travel have seemed but few; the long hours of waiting have seemed but short, for we have shared the same joys and the same sorrows, you and I.

Nay, more. These journeyings have taught me that Chicago is a missionary diocese. The greatest poet of the English-speaking race has told us that we can find "sermons in stones," but we can also find sermons of heart-searching import along the twin steel rails that bind together in one diocese the towns and villages about Chicago. One of our Missionary Bishops, in a recent report of his distant field, speaks with honest pride of the fact that every town containing 2,000 inhabitants in his district, has regular services. We are not so fortunate in Chicago, where there are towns of 4,000, 5,000, yes, of 12,000 people with no organized mission of the Church. What is the Woman's Auxiliary doing to better this condition? We are paying the salaries of the assistant city missionaries, but their work is almost wholly in the City of Chicago and in Cook County. We contribute \$600 towards the support of the Sisters of St. Mary, money well spent, for it is to the devoted labors of Sister Frances that we own the astounding fact that the number of women criminals in the bridewell has diminished one-half.

We also pay the entire salary, \$500, of Sister Clare, our one faithful and efficient deaconess, who began her work among us in January. And that is all we are doing. We need another deaconess at once to help Sister Clare in the city work, and we should not rest until we are paying the salaries of five deaconesses, whose field shall be not only the city, but the diocese of Chicago.

Since the last Annual Meeting eight new branches of the Auxiliary have been organized, All Saints', Cuyler, St. Andrew's, El Paso, Holy Comforter, Kenilworth, Christ, Waukegan, St. Simon's, Sheridan Park, St. Ambrose, Chicago Heights, St. Timothy's, Chicago and St. Bartholomew's, Chicago. During the past year I have acted as your representative at eighty-nine services and meetings of the Auxiliary. This includes fifty-two visits to parishes and missions in this diocese, and one visit to the diocese of Milwaukee. Five sectional meetings have been held, thus giving the opportunity of an all-day conference on missionary work to many women in the diocese who are unable to attend the Annual and Semi-annual Meetings. The birthday plan for the United Offering is more than holding its own, for the president's birthday book now contains 1,566 names, and the offertory this morning, the second of its kind, amounted to \$1,204. We are indeed grateful for this most generous response. The ten questions have again proved their value, and the suggestion that every parish branch should send a Thanksgiving donation to the Champlin Memorial Home and a Christmas donation to St. Mary's Home needed only the larger co-operation of the branches to have been a complete success. Until a better suggestion is made, will each parish branch follow this simple plan, thus remembering at least once a year two very deserving departments of our missionary work. In February last the Chicago Branch received the sum of \$100.88 from the estate of Mary Elizabeth Shields, formerly of Wheaton, Illinois. Miss Shields entered the rest of Paradise many months ago, and, on her deathbed, left her entire estate to the Northern Trust Co., with instructions that its income should be divided among three beneficiaries, the Chicago Branch being one of the three. Thus the unselfish devotion of this good woman enriches our treasury with this yearly gift for missions. The experiment of the year, the Lent Study Class, is an experiment no longer. This class met in the Church Club Rooms every Saturday morning during Lent with an average attendance of thirty-two

women. Two papers were read at each session, the first being historical, and dealing with the beginnings of Church life in this country; the second describing fully some part of the great missionary field of today. These papers have been borrowed by some of the parish branches and have been found of such value that they will be retained in the diocesan library for future reference.

And now for a few words above and beyond statistics. As we think at all seriously of life, we become convinced of the fact that there are very few things of which we are absolutely certain. We are told that Shakespeare did not write the plays that bear his name; we are assured that William Tell, the idol of our childhood's days, is but a myth; we are not sure of our friends, for, in time of adversity they fall away; we are not even sure of ourselves, for the desperate weakness of the human heart and will become sadly apparent with the gathering years. It is true we are wiser than we used to be, but, like the Vicar of Wakefield, we are tired of being wise, and we long regretfully for the golden age of childhood, when everything seemed so certain. But there is one fact that pierces all the mists and uncertainties of this modern life with the clear radiance of the polar star, and that is the fact that Christ will come again to judge the living and the dead. Of that fact we are absolutely certain.

In the celestial radiance of that truth, how many of our present thoughts and plans and ideals fall from us like useless garments as we are brought face to face with the few fundamentals of life. For the missionary message of the Day of Judgment is this: if we have done our best, no matter how small that best may be, for the cause of missions, we will be found on that great Day co-workers with our God. When Christ ascended into the heavens, He did not give the precious missionary work of His Church into the care of the angels, those pure and mysterious beings, who could so easily and so gladly have carried the tidings of His Gospel to the limits of the earth. No, He gave that missionary work, with its dread responsibility and its heavenly reward, into the hands of sinful human beings like you and me. And if we do even the smallest part of that sacred work as best we can, we will be found on the Day of Judgment, co-workers with God Himself.

Such certainty gives us strength, strength to beat down the obstacles, strength to bear the friction and annoyance that come with

everyday's routine, strength to have patience, the patience that endures.

The lesson of patience is taught us by the desert, that vast and arid waste that is slowly disappearing from the American continent. Since men have discovered that its glittering sands have a money value, they live and work there, and the place where men live and work is no longer a desert. It seems almost impossible to discover any traces of vegetation in the heart of the real desert, but a careful search will disclose some plant life, stunted and half-developed, scorched by the burning sun, stung by the icy touch of the hail, mocked by the vanishing snow-wreath, yet waiting, waiting patiently for the rain that so seldom comes. Yet it does rain sometimes in the desert. Perhaps once or twice in the course of a whole lifetime, the clouds gather and the great warm drops fall upon the thirsty sand. There they find hidden the little seeds that have been waiting twenty or thirty years for the rain, and,—wonder of wonders—in a short week the desert blossoms in purple and in red. They last but a short time, these frail flowers. Today they are here; tomorrow they are gone, but they have fulfilled their mission in teaching us of the patience that endures. Made strong by the certainty of our calling we, too, will be patient, as we wait and work and pray for the second coming of our King.

“Thou art coming! we are waiting
“With a hope that cannot fail;
“Asking not the day or hour
“Resting on Thy word of power,
“Anchored safe within the veil.
“Time appointed may be long,
“But the vision must be sure;
“Certainty shall make us strong,
“Joyful patience can endure.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The eighteenth semi-annual meeting of the Chicago branch was held in Christ Church, Woodlawn, Thursday October 30, 1902.

Bishop Anderson presided at the afternoon session which began at 2:30 o'clock.

The minutes of the eighteenth annual meeting were read by the recording secretary and approved.

Roll-call showed the presence of two hundred and twenty delegates from forty branches.

A short address of welcome was given by the acting rector of Christ Church, Rev. A. W. Shaw.

The President, Mrs. Hopkins, announced the resignation of Mrs. R. Floyd Clinch as corresponding secretary and the appointment of Mrs. C. L. Chenoweth, one of the vice-presidents, to fill her place. Mrs. J. J. MacDermid of Grace Church, Mrs. Hopkins also announced would assume the office of vice-president left vacant by Mrs. Chenoweth.

Mrs. Hopkins spoke, at length, of her plans for a study class during Lent enumerating the advantages of an intimate knowledge of Church history and setting forth the value of comparing it with Modern Missionary methods.

The principal speaker of the afternoon, Miss Sybil Carter was introduced by Bishop Anderson and gave an address of more than passing interest on "Missionary Work Among Indian Mothers."

An appeal was made by the Rev. J. J. P. Perry of S. Athanasius College, Brunswick, Ga., for funds to continue the work of rebuilding the college.

The offering of the afternoon was given the Rev. Mr. Perry.

In response to a call from the president for \$300.00 for Miss Carter's work, \$300.00 for Miss Higgins' work and \$200.00 for Miss Farthing, the following amounts were pledged: \$204.00 for Miss Carter, \$195.00 for Miss Higgins, and \$136.00 for Miss Farthing.

After adjournment supper was served by the women of the parish.

The session at 7:30 p. m. began with evensong, and was followed by an eloquent sermon by the Rt. Rev. John Hazen White D. D., Bishop of Michigan City.

The nineteenth annual meeting of the Chicago branch was held in S. Paul's Church, Kenwood, Thursday, May 28, 1903.

The morning session beginning at 10:30 o'clock consisted of the usual celebration of the Holy Communion and a sermon by the Rev. Z. B. Phillips, rector of Trinity Church. Bishop Anderson was the celebrant with the Rev. Herman Page, the Rev. J. H. Hopkins and the Rev. C. H. Bixby as assistants.

Before dispersing to enjoy the luncheon provided by the entertaining branch, the delegates assembled by parishes for roll call; five hundred and fifteen representatives from sixty-four branches responded.

At this time the president Mrs. Hopkins read the message sent by Bishop McLaren to the women of the Chicago branch.

On the motion of Mrs. MacDermid of Grace Church, it was voted to send a telegram to Bishop and Mrs. McLaren bearing the affectionate greetings of the women of the diocese.

A telegram was received from Mrs. O. V. S. Ward, a former diocesan president, now visiting in Baltimore, containing greetings from the Maryland branch.

The afternoon session convened at 1:45 o'clock. Bishop Anderson presided. The Rev. Herman Page rector of S. Paul's Church, delivered the address of welcome.

The minutes of the eighteenth semi-annual meeting were read and approved. The president announced that the S. Batholomew branch had extended an invitation to hold the semi-annual meeting next October in its Church.

The combined report of the corresponding secretary and treasurer showed that one hundred and twenty-two organizations from eighty-one parishes had contributed \$9,838.12 in boxes and \$13,562.10 in money. The total receipts for the year including the balance of \$844.19 in the treasury amount to \$24,244.81. The contributions, in money and boxes of the Junior Department have been more than two thousand dollars.

Mrs. Hopkins chose for the subject of her annual address, "The sure reward of patient but persistent effort." She announced that the "birthday" money for the United Offering placed that day on the alms basins amounted to \$1,210.90.

Short reports were read from the Junior Department, the Society for the relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, the Comfort

Club, the Church Periodical Club, the Library Committee and the Linen Committee of St. Luke's Hospital.

Missionary addresses were given by Bishop Anderson and the Rev. W. O. Waters rector of Grace Church.

\$1,654.50 was the amount pledged for the assistant city missionaries. \$56.00 was pledged by the Junior branches for the Mexican-McLaren scholarship and \$64.00 for the McLaren scholarship in South Dakota.

In the election of officers for the ensuing year, balloting was dispensed with and the secretary was instructed to cast the ballot for the following officers:

President, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins; Vice-Presidents, Miss K. D. Arnold, Mrs. V. B. Fullerton, Mrs. W. D. C. Street, Mrs. E. M. Duncombe, Mrs. J. J. MacDermid. Treasurer, Mrs. Jas. T. Hoyne; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. C. L. Chenoweth; Recording Secretary, Miss Florence Beckett.

Before adjournment and the benediction a vote of thanks was extended the women and rector of S. Paul's Church for their cordial welcome and kind hospitality.

**REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON LINEN, WOMAN'S BOARD OF
ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL.**

Madame President and Women of the Auxiliary:

The Committee on Linen of the Woman's Board of S. Luke's Hospital begs leave to submit the following report:

During the six months since the annual meeting in November, the Committee has received 4,500 new articles of linen. These articles are the donations of 60 societies, 25 of which are branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, representing 40 parishes and missions of the diocese.

While the total number of articles is less than at the same time last year, the Committee feels encouragement from the fact that the work is more representative by reason of its greater distribution.

The plea is often made that S. Luke's does not need the efforts of the parishes because so much is done for it. Let us not speak from the superficial wisdom that comes of ignorance. The Hospital invites you to visit the wards and the patients, come to the new linen room and see your own gifts on the shelves, ready to help relieve suffering, and learn for yourselves what the needs of the Hospital are. All things are relative, and though much is done, more is needed. The Hospital cannot go on by its own inertia, it can only give out what is put in. Every large gift to the Hospital in permanent improvements, increases its field of activity among those who need its ministrations, and, in like ratio, increases the demand for those things which perish in the using, and which it is the privilege of the Linen Committee, through the co-operation of the parishes, to supply.

Often there are ten operations a day and for each of these at least 60 surgical towels must be used, and before these can be made ready again as many more may be required.

The Committee is often asked to value donations made to the Hospital, but this it is impossible for the Committee to do, for the standard of worth to the Hospital is utility, not money value, and the small parcels often bring needed articles which the larger ones have not contained.

The Hospital has now a larger number of patients than ever before in its history. One third of these are free and many more pay only what they can afford, but the skill and service are given according to the need, not the recompense.

The Committee on Linen begs the Women of the Auxiliary to accept its sincere thanks and grateful appreciation for the help given to meet the increased demand of the year, and asks them to remember that it is by continued, not intermittent effort, that the good work can go on.

REPORT OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY.

Madame President and Women of the Auxiliary:

During the past year I have visited 29 parishes and missions. On October 10th, I held a special meeting for Junior Auxiliary officers, to discuss the plans for the coming year. On April 2nd at the monthly meeting at the Church Club Rooms were read papers on the Junior Scholarships. Instead of one annual meeting, as heretofore, there were held sectional meetings, on January 17th, at S. James Church, January 31st, at Grace Church, and February 14th at S. Barnabas Church.

Six new branches have been organized during the year, namely: Waterman Hall, S. Paul, Rogers Park; S. Paul, Riverside; S. Philip, S. Agnes' Mission, and Grace, New Lenox. Six branches have organized Boys' Departments and in two of our parishes, Boys' Clubs of over 30 members have devoted one evening a month to missionary study, and have made pledges for our Alaskan Scholarship. The Junior Auxiliary commenced its work this year with two new objects in view. First, is united work for pledges, assuming the two McLaren scholarships in South Dakota and Mexico (hitherto supported by the Woman's Auxiliary), and, later, one in Alaska. The second object is united work for boxes. The Juniors of this Diocese were asked to provide 1,000 gifts for children at Pine Ridge Agency for next Christmas. As this box will not be sent until the fall, a large portion of the work already completed will not be reported until next year. There are 1,373 members of the Junior Department in this Diocese. Six new branches of the Babies' branch have been organized in the following parishes: All Saints', Ravenswood; Mediator, Morgan Park; S. Luke, Evanston; S. Paul, Rogers Park, having in all 110 of these little helpers. Next fall a missionary study class will be formed, at the Church Club rooms, and held monthly, for officers, helpers and girls over fourteen years of age.

Total number of branches in this Diocese are 40 of the Junior Auxiliary, 9 Babies' Branches, 6 branches with Boys' Departments.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards.

ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual membership fee of one dollar, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings, each parish or mission voting as a unit, when such vote by unit shall be demanded by two parishes or missions.

ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention—except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee shall appoint another day—for the election of officers, the adoption of the annual report, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn at the discretion of the Executive Committee; which meeting shall consist of an afternoon session for the transaction of business, followed by a general missionary meeting in the evening, when addresses shall be made by speakers approved by the Bishop and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, five vice-presidents,

a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee, and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop.

SEC. 4. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association, and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 5. The duty of the corresponding secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the recording secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the corresponding secretary in the preparation of reports.

SEC. 6. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

SEC. 7. There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the treasurer's accounts each year.

ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the corresponding secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the Missionary work of the church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

THE ANNUAL DAY OF PRAYER for Missions is held on the week day preceding S. Andrew's Day, November 30.

The annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.
