THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Dear Woman of the Auxiliary:

This missionary work, so dear to our hearts, is God's work, and, as such, it deserves our best thought and action. As we have dwelt so recently upon the necessity of prayer and devotion and consecrated effort in making Auxiliary plans, we will now consider, with your permission, the plain and prosaic topic of methods of work.

The Chicago Branch is a great diocesan family, including active members in ninety-one parishes and missions. So large and comprehensive is our rule of service that each one of these branches does missionary work in its own individual way. Yet, as all are in the same diocese, a uniform pattern runs throughout the work, in order that each may fit more exactly into its own place in the great diocesan mosaic. To strengthen this sense of diocesan relationship has been our constant effort. For this reason your president has visited the parishes and missions more often than seemed necessary. Printed lists of ten questions have been sent throughout the diocese for two consecutive years, in order that each branch might be presented with the ideals of the whole. Six hundred calendars were distributed at the last Annual Meeting, with suggestions concerning Auxiliary work for each month of the twelve. Similar calendars will be distributed to-day, and every woman here present is asked to take one, and to read the suggestions printed thereon, for it is felt that each branch will do its work with redoubled zeal, if it knows that every other branch is doing the same thing at the same time. If every parish and mission would claim, as a privilege, its share in every obligation assumed by the diocesan officers, one-half of the burden of doing missionary work would melt away. Surely, in considering methods of work, our primary need is to deepen and to strengthen the sense of diocesan relationship.

Let us consider the duties of the parochial officers, that band of devoted women to whom we owe so much. It is generally admitted that the parochial president should plan the work, in consultation with her officers, that she should preside at the meetings, and that she should know the women who are members of her branch. But she has a responsibility over and above all these. The parochial president should know, not only the women who are members of her branch, but she should know that far larger number in every parish,—the women who are not members of the Auxiliary, and who frankly

avow that they are not interested in missions. These women have warm hearts, that are touched into generosity by the starving child in the next street, or the needy woman in the slums, but to them the language of the mission field is but an unknown tongue. They are not interested in missions in the abstract, but it is possible to interest them in some specific case of need. This is the duty of the parochial president. She should go to these women, one by one, armed with photographs, letters and her own knowledge of the field, and she should present to each in turn the specific case of need that is most fitted, in her judgment, to arouse interest, until she has brought the great mission-field of the Church to the very door of her hearer. Some of the women who are thus interested may give money. Others cannot afford to give money, but they can give time and thought and work, and from these two classes of givers we should send next year some of the best missionary boxes ever sent by the Chicago Branch. For example, six yards of white linen can be bought for three dollars. The same sum of money will buy a given measure of silken material, including lining and embroidery silks. These can be bought with the money of the woman who can afford to give money. Placed in the hands of the women who can give time and skill and work, these materials can be changed into two of the most acceptable gifts that can be sent to the mission-field, a linen surplice made by hand, and a silken stole, on whose lustrous surface blossom forth jewelled Cross and Holy Name. Would that fifty such surplices and fifty such stoles could be sent next year from the Chicago Branch to the struggling clergy in the mission field, who are unable to buy suitable vestments from their scanty stipends! The parochial president will find some women in her parish whose library tables are burdened with the attractive weight of books and periodicals. To them she should present the aims of the Church Periodical Club, that admirable department of Auxiliary, which gives to clergymen the books and periodicals they cannot afford to buy. Nor are its ministrations confined to the clergy. They include little knots of Church families scattered over the farm lands of this great country, who rely upon the box or barrel of reading matter sent by the Church Periodical Club, to brighten their long winters of enforced idleness. Other women in the parish may be attracted by the modest claims of the Comfort Club, that club so rightly named, for it provides needy clergy with clerical suits, bought with the small gifts of its many members. These departments of Auxiliary work should be understood by the parochial president, and should be presented by her to the women of her parish whenever possible.

It is generally understood that the parochial secretary should keep the records of her branch in a book, not on detached bits of paper, that are easily lost or mislaid. The secretary's book should contain an alphabetical list of the names of the members of her branch, and, from this list, the roll should be called at every meeting. It should contain the minutes, copied with such care that they will prove invaluable records in the years to come. The secretary's book should also contain a record of every missionary box sent by her branch, whether it be a box of new clothing for the family of a missionary, or a barrel of groceries for one of the diocesan institutions, or a package of second-hand clothing sent, by request, to some mission swept by fire or flood. The record of every box should be kept in the secretary's book, and should include an itemized list of every article in the box, with its money value; the date on which the box is sent; the address to which it is sent, and the total money value of its contents. That would seem a complete record of any missionary box, but it is not complete, and the parochial secretary who has done this and no more, has left a very important part of her work undone. The record of a box is not complete until the secretary's book contains the entry that she has notified the corresponding secretary of the Chicago Branch, in writing, that the box has been sent, giving her the date, the address and the total money value. Then and not till then, should the parochial secretary consider the record of that box complete, and turn over the page to begin the record of another box. The secretary's book should contain a record of money reported to her, and not given through the treasurer. The request has been often made that all missionary money should be paid to the parochial treasurer, to be sent by her to the diocesan treasurer, Mrs. Hoyne, who in her turn forwards it to the missionary objects specified. But the women sometimes forget to do this. As the treasurer is utterly unable to report money that does not pass through her hands, we are obliged to depend upon the parochial secretary for the report of money thus given. Last year many hundreds of dollars were given by the women of this diocese for missionary objects, that did not pass through the hands of the treasurer, and we were indebted to the accuracy of the various parochial secretaries for the report of that money, which could thus be included in the totals of the Chicago Branch.

The parochial treasurer is a very important person. She needs all the courage and assertion at her command, for it is her duty to proclaim in season and out of season the fact that every penny of missionary money should be paid to her, and is sent by her to the

diocesan treasurer, Mrs. Hoyne. The treasurer's book should contain a record of these receipts and disbursements. When, as is the case in many parishes, the treasurer also takes care of the birthday money, which is a separate fund, it can be easily seen what a busy woman she is, and that she needs the active co-operation of every member of her branch.

An outline of methods of work would be incomplete were not two suggestions made that are applicable not only to the diocesan and parochial officers, but to every member of the Auxiliary. The first suggestion is: In planning the work for next year, let us try to interest some woman not a member of the Auxiliary. We read of the blessings that come to those who give a cup of cold water to a thirsty traveller, but the pain of physical thirst is not to be compared with the spiritual condition of the woman whose soul is parched with selfishness. The second suggestion is: Use the summer. Yes, use the summer. Do not wait until next fall before beginning the work of next year. Next year begins to-morrow. Let us begin to-morrow to work for next year. Many of our parish guilds and societies close shortly after Easter, and the summer is a long vacation from many parish activities. Therefore the summer is the time for doing the sewing for the missionary boxes of the fall. Those of us who remain at home during the summer, can easily find time to make the surplice or stole for the missionary, to hem the table linen for the missionary's wife, to make the gingham or dimity dresses for the missionary's children. Those of us who spend the summer at some mountain or seaside resort can surely find time to do at least one piece of needle work for the missionary box of the fall. It may be possible for us to interest in this good work some of the women we meet at these summer resorts, and to organize impromptu sewing circles that shall put into practice the theory of missions.

In planning for the future, let us not forget the past. God has blessed the work of the past year. Since the last Annual Meeting I have acted as your representative at ninety-two gatherings of the Auxiliary, including visits to the dioceses of Minnesota, Milwaukee, West Missouri and Michigan. Five new branches have been organized during the year: St. Agnes, Chicago; Christ, Harvard; St. Michael and All Angels, Berwyn; The Incarnation, Fernwood, and St. Ann's, Humboldt Park. The third collection of the birthday money this morning amounted to over \$1,400, which, with the sum already in the bank, brings our total to over \$3,300, a larger sum than was asked for when the plan was originated two and one-half years ago. The total raised by the Chicago Branch in money and

boxes for the past year amounts to over \$25,000, the largest sum reported at an Annual Meeting. Truly, God has blessed our work together. And He has also allowed us to experience deep and abiding sadness. The shadow of that fateful day of last December is not yet lifted from our hearts. There perished that day in the Iroquois fire a devoted member of this parish and of the Auxiliary, Fanny Guthrie Meriam, president of the board of managers of the Church Home for Aged Persons. Mrs. Meriam's birthday, as entered in my birthday book, is June 16th, and I ask the Chicago Branch to take that day as the date of our annual donation to the Church Home for Aged Persons. June 16th comes during the summer, in the long vacation from many parish activities, and I ask every parish branch to send on that day a gift of money, if possible, to the Church Home for Aged Persons, in memory of Mrs. Meriam, thus remembering her own work on her own day.

Rarely have the ranks of the parochial officers been thinned by death, as has been the case during the past year. There are many vacant places here to-day. Those who have been called from their earthly work are Emily Fox, vice-president of Christ Branch, Winnetka; Emily Astle, president of Good Shepherd Branch, Momence; Mary Elizabeth Nye, president of St. Mark's Branch, Chicago; Grace Lee Mortimer, vice-president of St. Paul's Branch, Glencoe; Mary Gorton Snow Ritchie, vice-president of Grace Branch, Oak Park. May they rest in peace and may light perpetual shine upon them! We thought of them this morning as we knelt at the Altar Rail, and we think of them this afternoon as we consider the work so dear to them and to us, for we believe in the Communion of Saints. It brings us unspeakable comfort to mention the names of those we love and mourn, as we plan the work of the coming year, for we begin that work strengthened and ennobled by their good examples. We sometimes speak of "the Auxiliary bond" or "the Auxiliary tie," and the words would seem to mean a contraction. But we know better. This Auxiliary work of ours is no contracted sphere of life, for it girdles the great round world and extends from the foundations thereof up to the Throne of God.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The nineteenth semi-annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in the Church of St. Bartholomew, Englewood, Thursday, October 29, 1903.

The Rev. Dr. Fawcett, rector of St. Bartholomew's, presided at the afternoon session, which began at half-past two o'clock, and delivered a short address of welcome to the assembled delegates, of whom two hundred and fifty-six from forty-five parishes were present.

The minutes of the 19th annual meeting were read by the recording secretary and approved.

A letter from Miss Emery was read by Miss Arnold.

The president, Mrs. Hopkins, spoke of the gratifying results of last year's work, which amounted in round numbers to twenty-five thousand dollars. The theme of her address was "Prayer."

The speakers of the afternoon were the Rev. Richard Rowley of Wheaton, who spoke of his former experiences as a missionary in Labrador, and Mrs. Hector Baxter, president of the Minnesota Branch, who spoke of the individual traits of the work in the Northwest.

A sketch of Ciattee Crispi Soni, the young African whom the Chicago Branch is educating in England, written by his former teacher, Miss Higgins, was read by the Rev. Dr. Fawcett.

The last address upon the "Missionary Aspects of the Church of England" was delivered by the Rev. John Henry Hopkins, rector of the Church of the Epiphany.

In asking for pledges Mrs. Hopkins spoke of her desire to raise the entire amount of Miss Farthing's salary \$500 as a memorial to Mrs. Vibbert, the first president of the Chicago Branch.

Pledges amounting to \$305.50 for Miss Farthing, and \$222 for Miss Higgins were made.

The junior branches pledged \$56 toward an Alaskan scholarship.

During the supper hour, when a substantial repast was served by the entertaining branch, a vote of thanks was offered the rector and women of St. Bartholomew's for their hospitality.

A little book on the life of Emily Bronte, written by Mrs. Hopkins, was placed on sale for the benefit of Miss Carter's lace work.

At the service, which began at 7:30 P. M., evensong was said by the Rev. J. M. Chattin; the lessons were read by Dean Moore of Quincy, and the sermon was preached by the Rev. M. E. Fawcett, Ph. D., bishop elect of Quincy.

The twentieth annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in St. Chrysostom's Church Thursday, May 26, 1904.

The morning session, beginning at 10:30 o'clock, consisted of the usual celebration of the Holy Communion and a sermon by Rev. Herman Page, rector of St. Paul's Church, Kenwood. Bishop Anderson was the celebrant and was assisted by the Rev. T. H. Snively, the Rev. J. H. Hopkins and the Rev. Herman Page.

Before proceeding to the parish house, where a tempting luncheon had been prepared by the women of St. Chrysostom's branch, the delegates assembled by parishes for roll call. Four hundred and forty-eight delegates from sixty-four branches were present.

At this time a telegram bearing the affectionate greeting of the Chicago Branch was forwarded to Bishop and Mrs. McLaren. Letters from Miss Higgins and from Dr. Glenton, in China, were read by the president, Mrs. Hopkins. Mrs. Hopkins announced that the Church of Our Savior had extended an invitation to the Diocesan Branch to hold its semi-annual meeting there next October.

The afternoon session was called to order by the president at 1:45 o'clock. The Rev. T. A. Snively, rector of St. Chrysostom's Church, delivered an address of welcome.

The minutes of the nineteenth semi-annual meeting were read by the recording secretary and approved.

The combined report of the corresponding secretary and treasurer showed that the year's work amounted to \$25,684.47. Of this sum \$17,554.66 is in money and \$8,129.81 represents the value of boxes sent. These amounts include \$2,257.98, the portion in money and boxes, contributed by the junior department.

In addition to the report of the junior branches, short reports of the Comfort Club, the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, the Church Periodical Club, the Library Committee, and the Linen Committee of St. Luke's Hospital were made.

The president, Mrs. Hopkins, presented the practical side of Auxiliary work in her annual address by choosing "Methods of Work" as her subject. She announced that the birthday offerings placed during the morning service on the alms basins exceeded \$1,400.

The two speakers of the afternoon, Rev. C. E. Rice, of Circle City, Alaska, and Rev. L. H. Roots, of Hankow, China, were introduced by Bishop Anderson. Both presented phases of missionary life and needs peculiar to the land in which they labor. The offering of the afternoon was to be equally divided and added to the funds which shall provide memorial buildings to the late Bishop Ingle of China and the late Bishop Leonard of Salt Lake City.

A motion was made by Mrs. Ward of Grace Church, and carried by the assembled representatives, that the evening service should be discontinued at the coming semi-annual meeting.

A list of the pledges for Assistant City Missionaries was read by the president from the pledge cards previously sent in. These pledges provide more than \$1,800 for this purpose. The assistant in junior work, Mrs. J. K. Lewis, read the amounts pledged on the junior pledge cards for the McLaren and Mexican-McLaren Scholarships. The McLaren Scholarship in South Dakota received pledges amounting to \$57.50 and the McLaren Scholarship in Mexico received pledges for \$55.50.

Bishop Anderson presided at the election of officers for the ensuing year. Balloting was dispensed with and the secretary was instructed to cast the ballot for the following officers: President, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins; vice-presidents, Miss K. D. Arnold, Mrs. V. B. Fullerton, Mrs. W. D. C. Street, Mrs. E. M. Duncombe, and Mrs. H. B. Butler; treasurer, Mrs. Jas. T. Hoyne; corresponding secretary, Mrs. J. J. MacDermid; recording secretary, Mrs. C. L. Chenoweth. The chairmen of the various committees were reappointed by the Bishop-Coadjutor. Before adjournment, a motion of thanks was offered by Miss Arnold to the rector and women of S. Chrysostom's Church for their kind welcome and cordial hospitality.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON LINEN, WOMAN'S BOARD OF S. LUKE'S HOSPITAL.

The Linen Committee of the Woman's Board of S. Luke's Hospital takes pleasure in submitting the following report:

In November, the beginning of the working year, the Linen Committee found itself confronted by a serious problem. The linen requirements of the hospital were greater than ever before; the sum in the treasury less. Eight thousand articles were needed and there was little more than \$100 to begin the work. A bazar was undertaken and successfully carried out, bringing into the treasury a satisfactory sum. A portion of this was at once applied to the purchase of material for parishes willing to give their work, but unable to do more; another sum was set aside to buy the large articles, such as blankets, bed spreads, table cloths, etc.; always needed but rarely contributed.

As the result of the work of the past seven months, 59 societies, 27 of which are branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, have contributed 4,100 articles.

The Linen Committee has purchased 1,500 articles, making a total of 5,600, and leaving 2,400 articles on the list of requirements for the year still unprovided for. A committee is now investigating these needs, and money from the bazar fund will be used to supply the most urgent, in quantity sufficient to last until the beginning of the next working year.

During the past year the demand for hospital service has greatly increased; 19% more patients have been received, and 54% of all the hospital work done has been free.

It is desired to increase still further the free work, and to this end it is the aim of the Linen Committee to furnish all the linen needed by the hospital, which now expends \$60 a month for linen, in addition to the parish donations.

The Committee thanks the Woman's Auxiliary for its generous support during the past year, and asks for its continued interest, reminding the various branches that hospital needs, like woman's work, are never done.

In the year just finished S. Luke's has cared for 2,877 patients, representing 16 different nationalities and 22 religions, including, Greeks, Hebrews, Mennonites, Disciples, Quakers, and Christian Scientists.

Will not every branch of the Woman's Auxiliary share in the work of this our only Diocesan Hospital? for to minister to the sick and needy of many nations and many faiths is surely one of the ways of obeying the command of the Master.

**REPORT OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE
JUNIOR AUXILIARY.**

Madame President and Women of the Auxiliary:

The Junior Auxiliary began its work last fall with a series of four meetings, at the Church Club Rooms, for officers and older girls, to discuss the different departments of the work. These were followed by four sectional meetings, secretaries of branches making their reports. Most interesting lectures were given on our Indians, with lantern slides. At the Woman's Auxiliary meeting of April 7th the Junior officers were asked to contribute one dozen or more articles for an exhibit of Junior work to be made next fall. The hearty co-operation of all branches is earnestly requested, in order to make this exhibit a success and helpful to new officers and workers. A prize will again be offered at the Sectional meetings next winter for the best scrap book, the subject being China and Japan. The most important work of the Junior Auxiliary is the support and education of children. We have three new scholarships added to the list this year, namely: In Memoriam Scholarship, St. Andrew's Priory, Honolulu; Bishop Philander Chase Scholarship, Langford Memorial Hall, Cape Mount, Africa, supported by the Boys' Department; Katherine McLaren Anderson Cot, Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital, Wuchang, China, supported by the Babies' Branch. There are in the Diocese 60 branches of the Junior Department in 41 Parishes and Missions, of which fourteen belong to the Babies' Branch and five to the Boys' Department. I have visited 30 Parishes and Missions and organized new branches in St. Augustine's, Wilmette, The Redeemer, Trinity (older girls), Atonement, St. James, Dundee, St. Peter; Babies' Branches in Holy Cross Mission, St. John the Evangelist, Redeemer, Grace, Trinity (reorganized).

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards.

ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual membership fee of one dollar, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings, each parish or mission voting as a unit, when such vote by unit shall be demanded by two parishes or missions.

ARTICLE IV.

SEC. 1. An annual meeting shall be held the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention—except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee shall appoint another day—for the election of officers, the adoption of the annual report, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn at the discretion of the Executive Committee; which meeting shall consist of an afternoon session for the transaction of business, followed by a general missionary meeting in the evening, when addresses shall be made by speakers approved by the Bishop and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee, and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop.

SEC. 4. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, to cooperate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association, and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 5. The duty of the corresponding secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the recording secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the corresponding secretary in the preparation of reports.

SEC. 6. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

SEC. 7. There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the treasurer's accounts each year.

ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the corresponding secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the Missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

THE ANNUAL DAY OF PRAYER for Missions is held on the week day preceding S. Andrew's Day, November 30.

The annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 510 Masonic Temple, Chicago.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the President in taking charge of the noonday meetings. Interesting papers are read, and Missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the Corresponding Secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as a box is sent please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
