THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

Welcome, one and all, as we gather for our twentieth annual meeting in the beautiful Church and new and commodious parish house of S. Mark's, Evanston. Our first thought is of our increasing years. Next fall the Chicago Branch will be twenty-one years old, and we should fitly celebrate our coming of age. On October 2nd, 1884, the Woman's Auxiliary in this diocese was organized. The meeting was held in Grace Church, Chicago, and the records state that about three hundred women were present, and that the interest was "unmistakably deep." We are planning to keep our twenty-first anniversary in a fitting way, and ask every member of the Chicago Branch to reserve October 2nd for this happy event. that we may come together and "keep the feast."

Last fall it was my privilege to place in the alms-basin in Trinity Church, Boston, a check for \$3,725.40, as Chicago's share in the great United Offering of \$150,000. We have now begun to save for the United Offering of 1907, with the ideal of \$5,000 in view. This morning the collection of birthday money amounting to nearly \$1,100, a most encouraging beginning. Since the last annual meeting, I have acted as your representative at one hundred and ten gatherings. This includes visits to parish branches in our own diocese, Auxiliary function in connection with the General Convention in Boston, and meetings in the dioceses of Western New York, Western Michigan, Michigan, Missouri, and Milwaukee. Four new branches have been organized during the year; Holy Nativity, Longwood; S. Elizabeth's, Chicago Lawn; All Saints, Pullman, and S. Joseph's West Pullman. One branch has been reorganized, S. George's, Grand Crossing. The printed pledge blanks are used this year for the second time, taking the place of the old system of oral pledges for missionary work, made at the annual and semi-annual meetings. This new plan grows in favor year by year. The calendars are issued again to-day, and their general use is urged as a simple method of systematizing our work. Four sectional meetings have been held. The Lent Study Class is steadily increasing in scope, interest and attendance, and the various departments of our routine work are in excellent order at present.

Yet this very prosperity that seems to attend our efforts, brings with it a subtle danger. We are apt to think that it is easy to do Auxiliary work, and when obstacles thicken and discouragements come, as come they must, we are inclined to grow faint hearted or to deteriorate, if we cannot have our way in matters religious and missionary. This is one of the dangers of prosperity that we must face calmly, as we strive against it. Let me speak to you very confidentially to-day. We have

in our ranks women who are real missionary enthusiasts, and we glory in having such members of the Auxiliary. Now, a woman who is a real missionary enthusiast has very little patience with those who clog the work by their indifference. To such an ardent soul it is a real trial to find her clergyman so engrossed by parish cares that he is indifferent to the Auxiliary, or to meet friends of her own circle who give all to the parish and nothing to missions. She is apt to speak her mind, bravely and strongly, in season and out of season, and, by so doing, she may injure the cause so dear to her heart. She will find that her wiser course lies in another direction. She should first prove without question her loyalty to her own clergyman; she should then show clearly that her interest in her own parish is paramount, and, after those duties are done, then let her pursue her own quiet, individual missionary work, but without fault finding, and without antagonizing others.

"What!" some of you will say, "give up an aggressive campaign for missions?" "That would be defeat." Not at all. One of the most crushing defeats in all history was that received by a king who always seemed to conquer with a blare of trumpets and beating of drums, and his most dreaded enemy was a quiet, conscientious man, who bided his time with such consummate skill and patience that he turned his defeats into victories, and at last he won the day. "Sweet are the uses of adversity." Our hours of failure are often more fruitful than our hours of success. This is my word to the Chicago Branch to-day: Never give up Auxiliary work; but, "if it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men." When a woman meets an obstacle in her parish path, an obstacle so large that she cannot surmount it or go around it, it is the part of wisdom to recognize that obstacle. Then, if she will call into action the powerful forces of prayer, patience and perseverance, it is possible for her to turn that apparent defeat into a victory. Such a victory will strengthen tenfold the moral fibre of any Auxiliary worker, and will strengthen more than tenfold the cause of missions. No work for Christ is easy, nor would we have it easy if we could, for there would be no merit in doing such work.

Some months ago one of our Missionary Bishops visited Chicago, and told us in plain, straightforward words of his distant field, which he at that time had not seen. He said that his reason for accepting the work offered him in that lonely land was that he had seen a vision. In the light of that vision, all thought of loneliness and distance, of hardship and uncongenial surroundings, was counted as but the shadow that makes the light more glorious.

What is our vision, that should serve as our cloud by day and our pillar of fire by night to lead us into the promised land? It is the drama of the ages. We see that barren, wind-swept hill of Calvary, and on its Cross is stretched the Sinless One, the Son of God and the Son of Man Who is dying for the sins of the world. We see the little band of apostles, starting forth, after His Ascension, to meet cruel martyrdom, in obedience to that Lord's command. We witness their stupefied amaze-

ment when they realize that the pearl of great price, which they had thought their own possession, belonging to the Jews alone, is also the heritage of the despised Gentiles, and, with the journeys of S. Paul, a new era dawns in the history of the world. The Cross of Christ appears to Constantine, and becomes the symbol of salvation to great Rome, toppling to her fall. Yea, and the fair-haired barbarians, who come from the North, sweeping all before them, bow in reverent homage before their unseen Lord. Thus Asia, Europe, Africa, little Britain and the isles of the sea are won for Christ. Christianity is brought to our own new land, and the great American continent echoes from ocean to ocean with the sound of the church bell calling men to prayer. And then, when every nation shall have had the opportunity of knowing Christ, He will come to claim His own. What a throng will assemble to greet Him! Not only the dwellers in great cities will gather, but the poor and obscure from the distant cross roads, the isolated inhabitants of the Rockies and the Andes, the dark-skinned savages from the jungles of Africa, the little people of Japan; all those to whom we have sent the Gospel, will hurry forth to meet their Lord. And, as they journey, the ineffable joy in their hearts will find expression on their lips in tones of piercing sweetness, for they will sing the song of Moses and the Lamb. It will be music never heard before by mortal ears. It will be more majestic than the sonorous burst of the full orchestra, more melodious than the softest stops of the organ. It will be like the deep diapason of Niagara and the sounding surge of the great sea, for it will be "the voice of many waters."

That is our vision. Let us pray God earnestly that our petty personalities and annoyances and trials may melt into nothingness, as we think upon this vision, until, in its completeness, it shall include and hide and cover them all, "as the waters cover the sea."

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT

The twentieth semi-annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in the Church of Our Saviour, Chicago, Friday, Oct. 28th, 1904. The meeting was called to order at half past two o'clock by the President, Mrs. Hopkins, and an address of welcome was given by the Rev. J. H. Edwards, rector of the church, to the women present, who numbered about three hundred and fifty, of whom two hundred and seventy-nine reported as delegates from forty-four branches.

The minutes of the twentieth annual meeting were read by the recording secretary and approved.

A message was read from Bishop McLaren, expressing regret at his absence, and assuring the women of his continued interest in the work. This was fitly responded to by a telegram to Bishop and Mrs. McLaren, conveying the sympathy and greetings of the Branch.

The President, Mrs. Hopkins, spoke of the happy results of the year's work in money and boxes, amounting to over \$30,000. She also referred to the United Offering, which has been presented in Boston, and the large increase made by the Branch in that respect.

Bishop Anderson introduced the speakers of the afternoon, Bishop Van Buren of Porto Rico, Miss Le Hew, deaconess in the missionary district of Laramie, Mrs. Hubbard, of the Los Angeles Branch, Mrs. Mann, President of the Fond du Lac Branch, and the Rev. Frank Du Moulin, rector of S. Peter's Church, Chicago. These speakers dealt with work in their respective parts of the country, and with the general attitude toward missions as presented in the General Convention in Boston.

The president read from pledge cards amounts pledged for the following objects: For Miss Farthing's salary, over \$450.00; for Miss Higgins' scholarship, over \$260.00; For Miss Carter's lace schools, over \$260.00; for S. Augustine school, over \$120.00.

Junior pledges for scholarships were: In Alaska, \$94.81; in Honolulu, \$101.19; in Cape Mount, Africa, \$18.50.

The meeting closed with prayers and the benediction, and tea was served by the entertaining branch.

The twenty-first annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in S. Mark's Church, Evanston, Thursday, May 25th, 1905.

The morning session began at 10:30 o'clock with a celebration of the Holy Communion. Bishop Anderson was the celebrant and he also addressed the women on the general subject of missionary work, and its close connection with the diocese.

At the close of the service the women organized for roll call, and seven hundred and nine delegates reported from sixty-three branches.

Resolutions on the death of Bishop McLaren were presented by a committee, consisting of Mrs. Lyman, Mrs. Locke and Mrs. Ward, and these resolutions were adopted by a rising vote.

Greetings were received from Miss Emery, Mrs. Andrews, of Mito, Japan, Miss Farthing and Miss Higgins.

The women of S. Mark's Branch entertained the guests with unbounded hospitality, serving luncheon in the new parish house, and at nearby homes.

The afternoon session was called to order by the president at 1:30 o'clock, and the Rev. A. W. Little, rector of S. Mark's Church, welcomed the delegates to the parish.

The minutes of the twentieth semi-annual meeting of the branch were read by the recording secretary and approved.

The combined report of the corresponding secretary and treasurer showed that the year's work amounted to \$31,900.66. This includes \$2,530.07, contributed in money and boxes by the Junior Department.

In addition to the reports of the Junior Department and the Babies' Branch, short reports were read from the Comfort Club, the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, the Church Periodical Club, the Library Committee, and the Linen Committee of S. Luke's Hospital.

Miss Arnold offered an amendment to Section 2, Article IV, of the Constitution, to read as follows:

"A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn, at the discretion of the Executive Committee, the details of which meeting shall be in the hands of the Executive Committee, provided, always, that at such meetings opportunity shall be given for the transaction of business and for missionary addresses made by speakers approved by the bishop and the Executive Committee."

On motion, this amendment was adopted.

Mrs. Fullerton offered a vote of thanks to the rector and women of S. Mark's Branch for their generous hospitality.

The address of the president, Mrs. Hopkins, dealt with the forward vision of the Woman's Auxiliary, and showed much progress made during the year just closed.

Bishop Anderson introduced Dr. Mary V. Glenton, of Wuchang, China, who spoke of her work at the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital in that city. The offering of the afternoon was given to Dr. Glenton for her work.

The pledges received for Assistant City Missionaries, amounting to \$1,500, were read. Pledges were made by the Junior Department to the amount of \$146.30, to be applied to scholarships in Dakota, Mexico and Alaska.

The bishop presided at the election of officers for the ensuing year. A report was received from the nominating committee, and the secretary was instructed to cast a ballot for the following officers: President, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins; vice-presidents, Miss K. D. Arnold, Mrs. V. B. Fullerton, Mrs. W. D. C. Street, Mrs. E. M. Duncombe and Mrs. H. B. Butler; treasurer, Mrs. Jas. T. Hoyne; corresponding secretary, Mrs. J. J. MacDermid; recording secretary, Mrs. C. L. Chenoweth.

Bishop Anderson reappointed the chairmen and members of the various committees, and the corresponding secretary of the Junior Department, Mrs. Jos. K. Lewis.

REPORT OF THE BABIES' BRANCH.

Since its organization in the Diocese, the Babies' Branch has been under the care of the officers of the Junior Auxiliary, but their work has grown and extended to such dimensions that last fall a special officer was appointed for the Babies' Branch, thus taking a small but appreciable burden from the shoulders of the Junior officers.

Since that time two new branches have been organized, at Epiphany and St. Paul's, Kenwood, and three reorganized, making a total of fifteen in the diocese—a slight gain over last year, but still too few in proportion to the great number of Mother and older Sister Branches, of which we are so justly proud.

The collections from the Babies' boxes since the semi-annual meeting in October have amounted to \$43.46, with several branches still to be heard from, which is an encouraging increase, showing almost twice as many pennies, each one sped with a little prayer, have gone into the small red boxes this year. This money will go about as follows, after making up a small deficit of last year: \$30.00 to support the Katharine McLaren Anderson Cot in the hospital at Wuchang, China; \$1.75 to the "Little Helper's Bed," St. Agnes' Hospital, Raleigh, N. C., and a balance of several dollars to the Milk Fund of the Sisters of S. Mary, thus fulfilling the three-fold obligation to Foreign, Domestic and Home Missions.

The plan which is so happily followed in several Eastern Dioceses of having a special service for each Parochial Babies' Branch, at which the little ones place their own boxes on the offertory plate, repeating the missionary prayer, was suggested and adopted in several of our parishes this spring, with the effect of inspiring both mothers and children with a stronger feeling of the vitality and the beauty of this organization of Christ's little ones, who are learning thus early to pray for and give to those who are laboring "in His Name."

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON LINEN OF THE WOMEN'S BOARD OF S. LUKE'S HOSPITAL.

The Linen Committee of the Women's Board of S. Luke's Hospital begs to make the following report:

Our working year began November 1, 1904, at which time we found ourselves very handicapped by an undeserved reputation of great riches, brought about by the widespread knowledge of the wonderful financial success of our bazaar the year before at Mrs. Pullman's. As a matter of fact, we started the year poorer than ever, having appropriated our funds with long and careful thought to the pressing needs and future good of the hospital.

Not feeling that we ought to bring the Linen Committee before the general public so soon again, we realized that we must find all the help possible in our own dear Church, and our appeals to the parishes were very earnest, and most gratifyingly responded to with but few exceptions.

Sixty-six church societies (49 of which are auxiliary branches), representing 41 parishes of the diocese, have worked for S. Luke's through its Linen Committee; so that we have added this year to our list 22 new auxiliary societies; and it is with most grateful hearts that we make this report to you.

Our report then stands as follows:

Number of articles through auxiliary branches	3,585

Each day the hospital uses from 200 to 400 sheets, 300 surgical towels, 200 to 300 hand towels, 50 to 70 bed spreads and about 130 nightgowns. The average life of a sheet is from six months to a year and the other articles in proportion; so that any housekeeper can realize the vast linen needs.

Thirty-five per cent of the work of S. Luke's last year was absolutely free, a really noble record and one that as a diocese we may be very proud of.

In thanking the Woman's Auxiliary for its most generous help, we beg that you will continue with redoubled efforts, for the daily needs are ever before us and ever growing larger through the great growth of the hospital.

Let us do our Lord's work as did that good Samaritan who, "When he saw him, he had compassion on him, and went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him, and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee."

**REPORT OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE JUNIOR
AUXILIARY.**

Madame President and Women of the Auxiliary:

A unity of purpose and work among the branches has marked the progress of the Junior Department this year. This was very noticeable on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd of last November, when the officers and helpers of nearly every branch in the city banded themselves together to make the first Junior Auxiliary Missionary Exhibit of this diocese, a success. If the officers would ask each boy and girl of their branch to make one or more articles this summer for the next exhibit, think of what a splendid collection we would have, as it is the purpose to assist our scholarship fund by the sale of these articles at that time. Four sectional meetings were held during January and February at S. Andrews Chicago; Redeemer, Chicago; All Saints, Ravenswood, and S. Paul's, Rogers Park, at which time our Juniors made their reports and were entertained with missionary slides and lectures on China. At our sectional meeting at the Church of the Redeemer, the offering presented was given to our new scholarship at S. Agnes' School, Kyoto, which was named unanimously, at our officers' meeting March 17th, Bishop Charles P. Anderson Scholarship, making in all six scholarships that the Junior Auxiliary of this diocese is supporting. To increase the interest in our missionary work in Japan, a study class was inaugurated after Lent. Three meetings were held at the Church Club rooms and five short papers on Japan were read at each meeting by our Junior Auxiliary officers or helpers. There are in the diocese fifty-eight branches of the Junior Auxiliary in forty-six parishes and missions, seven of which belong to the Boys' Department. The branches belonging to the Babies' Branch were transferred to Mrs. H. B. Butler on the separation of the Babies' Branch from the Junior Auxiliary last November. I have held forty-one meetings devoted to the interest of the Junior Auxiliary, including a meeting in the diocese of Michigan City, and have organized six new branches in the following parishes and missions: Transfiguration; S. John the Evangelist; Trinity, Highland Park; S. Margaret's, Windsor Park; S. Simon's, Chicago; S. Bartholomew, Chicago; Grace, Sterling. The officers of the Junior Department feel there is no limit to the missionary spirit that may, if properly directed, be aroused among the young girls and boys of the church. The great thing needful is consecration of the workers, the officers of the branch. To this end, it is urged advantage should be taken of the different opportunities offered that every officer consecrate a special time to study and prayer, that knowledge may be a power and prayer a sanctifier.

CONSTITUTION.**ARTICLE I.**

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards.

ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual membership fee of one dollar, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings, each parish or mission voting as a unit, when such vote by unit shall be demanded by two parishes or missions.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. An annual meeting shall be held the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention—except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee shall appoint another day—for the election of officers, the adoption of the annual report, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn at the discretion of the Executive Committee, the details of which meeting shall be in the hands of the Executive Committee, provided, always, that at such meetings opportunity shall be given for the transaction of business and for missionary addresses made by speakers approved by the Bishop and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The officers shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee, and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop.

SEC. 4. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association, and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 5. The duty of the corresponding secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the recording secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the corresponding secretary in the preparation of reports.

SEC. 6. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

SEC. 7. There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the treasurer's accounts each year.

ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the corresponding secretary of the diocesan branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this diocesan branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the Missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Report of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

THE ANNUAL DAY OF PRAYER for Missions is held on the week day preceding S. Andrew's Day, November 30.

The annual meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 510 Masonic Temple, Chicago.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noonday meetings. Interesting papers are read, and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the Corresponding Secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as a box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
