THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

Once again we are gathered from far and near for our annual meeting, and this year we enjoy the gracious hospitality of the old and historic parish of Trinity. These yearly gatherings are for a threefold purpose: to consider the present, to review the past, and to gather strength and inspiration for the future.

Since our last annual meeting, I have acted as your representative at eighty-seven gatherings of the Auxiliary. This includes Auxiliary services, visits to parishes and missions within the diocese, and to the diocese of Kansas City and the missionary conference at Richfield Springs. Three new branches have been organized during the year—St. Ann's, Morrison; the Advent, Chicago, and St. Mary's, Park Ridge. One branch has been reorganized—St. Alban's, Norwood Park, which was first organized by Mrs. Vibbert many years ago. The collection of birthday money this morning was the fifth annual event of its kind. It is interesting to note that Chicago's plan of a yearly presentation of the United Offering has been adopted by the diocesan branches of Pennsylvania, Newark and western New York. Two sectional meetings have been held during the year, at which we have enjoyed the hospitality of the Annunciation, Auburn Park and St. James' Dundee. The printed pledge blanks and the calendars are doing excellent service, but their value would be doubled if the women of the diocese would read carefully every word printed thereon. So much for the record of the present.

I am sure that you will allow me to review the past a little more fully than usual, for this is the fifth annual message it has been my privilege to give to you, and to-day rounds out practically my sixth year of active service. In the days of beginnings, nearly six years ago, I used to build air castles and to think that, when there were one hundred parochial branches in the diocese of Chicago, and the birthday book contained two thousand names, my work would be finished. To-day there are one hundred and one parish branches in the diocese, and the birthday book contains two thousand and forty-seven names. It is not always wise to limit one's plans or one's work. Our review of the past to-day must be of two kinds, that deep spiritual insight that is silent and is between one's individual conscience and one's God, and those statistics that all the world may know. It is impossible to state how many women in the diocese have remembered during the past six years the first duty of each member of the Woman's Auxiliary, the daily prayer for missions; that withdrawing of the spirit from the noisy world, while we plead with God to bless the missionaries wherever they may be. No one can say how many women have remembered to do

this, but we think that many have remembered so to do. For the work has grown, and we all know that prayer is the most potent force in the world to-day; therefore we must think that our women have prayed earnestly and faithfully. Nor can we number those women who have studied missions during the past six years. It is true that our Lent Study Class and our noonday meetings have grown apace, but it is impossible to say just how many women have written papers on missionary themes, or have promoted the great subject of missionary knowledge in their own parishes. But, since the fruit of knowledge is increased work, and the work has grown, we firmly believe that many women are more intelligent members of the Auxiliary to-day, because of their deeper study of missions in the true spirit of missions. As for the statistics of the recent past, in black and white, we find that during six years, thirty-one new branches of the Auxiliary have been organized and five reorganized, making thirty-six in all, almost a little diocese by itself. It would be wearisome to look over our totals of each year's work for the six years just gone, but let us examine the annual report of 1901, which states as our total for that year in money and boxes the sum of \$22,653.55, and contrast that with the total of 1906, this year's record, just read by our secretary, amounting to over \$35,000.00. This shows a gain of over twelve thousand dollars in five years. Truly, it is encouraging to review the past.

And now let us face the future with a question. What is the motive in your hearts and in mine that has led us to do all this work for missions? It may seem difficult to select any one motive, for there are few unmixed motives in the human heart, but it must surely have been a powerful, an all-compelling motive, to have led us through the strain and stress of missionary work. Let us look into our hearts to-day, very quietly and prayerfully. It may be that our motive for doing Auxiliary work has been personal fondness for our bishop or our clergyman, or, perhaps, our diocesan officers. Friendship is one of the most precious things in life, but it is not safe to build church work on that foundation. It is always unsafe and sometimes unsound thus to build. For personal like is a very whimsical thing. It may crystallize into personal dislike in the short space of an hour. It makes us think of the sugar-plums of childhood, and it does not develop character. Or we may have been influenced to work for missions on account of ambition, diocesan or parochial. We like to have our parish head the list; we like to have our diocese tower above all others. On account of Chicago's geographical and commercial importance, we speak much of ambition here, and it is an excellent motive as far as it goes. But we know of many diocesan branches that, working with all the zeal and consecration possible, can never achieve worldly success. They must eat the bread of humiliation, whenever they stop working and compare their results with those of others. Thus we can see that even ambition in good works is not a sufficient motive for our best efforts. Or some

of us may do church work because we love to work. Here, in the busy, rushing life of this great city, we have caught the spirit of activity, and we transplant it into our missionary work, thinking that an all-powerful motive for even times of stress. But energy is largely due to youth and health, and the work that goes ahead by leaps and bounds when we are young and strong, is apt to dwindle or to die altogether when old age and ill health come, as come they must. No, the words "I love, I admire, I emulate, I work," are splendid words, that speak of a glowing and forceful personality, but they all fade into nothingness before the majesty of the words "I ought," for there we meet the grand idea of duty. And we must go back through the ages to find that grand idea of duty, until we see the Saxon, our ancestor, emerging, a half-barbarous savage, from the swamps and forests of northern Europe. Of him we find it written, "Through all outbreaks of primitive brutality gleams obscurely the grand idea of duty." Those words, "I ought," have made the Anglo-Saxon race the most conscientious and law-abiding race in the whole world. Those words, "I ought," have made the Anglo-Saxon Church, the Church of England, the purest branch of God's Church to-day. At last we have come into our own. We, as Anglo-Saxons, will lay hold upon this grand idea of duty as our lawful heritage, and we will enthrone it as our sole motive for doing missionary work.

Wordsworth, one of our most analytical poets, has much to say about duty:

"Stern lawgiver! yet thou dost wear
The Godhead's most benignant grace;
Nor know we anything so fair
As is the smile upon thy face."

To a privileged few duty vouchsafes the matchless smile, but to the majority of us she seems the stern, strict handmaiden of the law. That is because we know our duty, but we dislike to do it, and, therefore, it is left undone. Let us listen to the words of a master of the human heart: "Nor does spiritual advancement depend so much upon the presence of devotional feelings as it does upon bearing their withdrawal with humility, self-sacrifice and patience." In other words, if we do what we know is right, no matter how we feel, that is the kernel of the whole matter. We must expect to meet obstacles in our missionary work. We must expect to feel lassitude of soul and poverty of spirit; to experience the longing to lessen our church work and to minimize our missionary giving; to really wish to give up our active membership in the Auxiliary because "the work is so hard," or to let some other branch pay the pledge we have paid for so many years because "we have done our share." Do the words sound familiar? Beloved, these are temptations of a personal Evil One; they have come to you and to me oft and again, and the only brave thing for us to do is to resist these temptations and to insist upon doing our duty and to

persist in so doing. People speak of the prowess of valor nowadays, of the physical bravery that fought with wild beasts in the jungles of Africa, or the gladiatorial combats of decadent Rome; they tell us of the heroism of a modern Hobson or a Dewey, who brave all for love of country; they speak to us of the heroism that sparkles like a jewel through the murky smoke of a San Francisco fire. These are victories, it is true, but, believe me, there is nothing of which humankind is capable that approaches the grandeur of a moral victory. To do our duty, whether we feel like it or not; to work side by side with our enemy, the person who hates us, who tries to injure us, because we have no time for mere personal resentment; to do what we most dislike to do because we ought to do it—these are moral victories, and, although there are some who speak of them as bloodless victories, I assure you they strengthen the fibre of the soul.

To-day the women of the Chicago Branch stand upon a tableland of honorable achievement, reached by the ever-ascending steps of each year's work. If our motive has been unworthy or insufficient, the time has come for us to stand still or to go back. But, with this grand idea of duty enshrined within our hearts, as our motive, and with the echo of the words, "I ought," as our watchword, we will press forward to years of ever-increasing work, to outlooks of ever-widening opportunity, until, in God's own time, we shall reach the Delectable Mountains of our Pilgrim's Progress.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The twenty-first semi-annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in the Church of the Epiphany, Chicago, on Monday, October 2, 1905, at 10:30 a. m. The meeting opened with morning prayer and special missionary intercessions, the service being said by the Rev. John Henry Hopkins, rector of the parish, assisted by the Rev. A. W. Little, of St. Mark's Church, Evanston. Bishop Anderson gave a message of greeting and congratulation to the Branch for the completion of so many years of service, and the sermon was preached by the Rev. B. F. Fleetwood, rector of Waterman Hall, Sycamore. At the close of the service the roll was called, and four hundred and eighty-eight delegates, from sixty-two branches, responded. Short talks on "The Noonday Meetings," "The Lent Study Class," and "The United Offering," were given by three of the Vice-Presidents, Mrs. Street, Mrs. Fullerton and Miss Arnold. Luncheon was served by the women of Epiphany parish, and the afternoon session opened at two o'clock, with prayers by the Rt. Rev. Edward W. Osborne, and a greeting from the rector of the parish.

Minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.

Pledges were read for, Miss Farthing's salary, Miss Higgins' scholarship, Miss Carter's lace schools, St. Augustine's School. Also, Junior pledges for the United Offering, and for scholarships in Japan, Africa and Honolulu.

The president read letters and gave sketches of the organization and growth of the Branch, during the period of twenty-one years, especially noting the work of its several past presidents. Mrs. Wm. Vibbert, Mrs. Clinton Locke, Mrs. O. V. S. Ward, and Mrs. D. B. Lyman.

Bishop Osborne made an appeal for assistance in the work of the church at the University of Illinois.

The offering of the morning was given to the McLaren Memorial Fund, and that of the afternoon to Bishop Osborne.

A vote of thanks was offered to the rector and women of Epiphany parish, and the meeting closed with the benediction.

The twenty-second annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in Trinity Church, Chicago, on Thursday, May 24, 1906, beginning with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 A.M. The bishop was the celebrant, and the sermon was preached by the Rev. Charles Scadding, rector of Emmanuel Church, La Grange.

At the close of the service, the delegates organized for roll call, five hundred and eighty-three reporting, from seventy branches.

A letter of greeting from Miss Emery was read.

Luncheon was served in the parish house by the entertaining branch, and the meeting was called to order for the afternoon session at two

o'clock, with prayers by the Rev. W. W. Wilson, and a greeting from the rector of the parish.

Minutes of the twenty-first semi-annual meeting were read and approved.

The President announced the preparation of Articles of Incorporation, and the following resolution was offered by Mrs. W. D. C. Street:

Resolved that: The Constitution and By-Laws, heretofore adopted by the unincorporated Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall continue in force, except wherein modified by the Articles of Incorporation, until otherwise directed.

This resolution was unanimously adopted.

The combined report of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer was read, also the report of the Corresponding Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary. In addition to the reports of the Vice-Presidents in charge of the Junior department and the Babies' Branch, reports were read of the Comfort Club, the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, the Church Periodical Club, the Library Committee, the Linen Committee of St. Luke's Hospital, the Lent Study Class, the Noonday Meetings, and the United Offering. These were each, on motion, accepted.

The address of the President followed.

Bishop Anderson expressed his pleasure at the reports of the Branch, and introduced the speaker of the afternoon, the Rev. J. A. Welbourne, of Tokyo, Japan, who addressed the meeting on student life in Japan.

Pledges were read for Assistant City Missionaries, also Junior pledges for the scholarships in Alaska, Mexico, and South Dakota.

The bishop presided at the election of officers. A report was received from the nominating committee, and, on motion, balloting was dispensed with, and the following officers elected by acclamation: President, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins; Vice-Presidents, Miss K. D. Arnold, Mrs. V. B. Fullerton, Mrs. W. D. C. Street, Mrs. E. M. Duncombe, Mrs. H. B. Butler; Treasurer, Mrs. Jas. T. Hoyne; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. J. J. MacDermid; Recording Secretary, Mrs. W. S. MacHarg.

The bishop reappointed chairmen and members of the various committees, and the officers of the Junior department; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Jos. K. Lewis; Recording Secretary, Mrs. H. B. Gwyn.

A vote of thanks was tendered to the rector and women of Trinity parish, and the meeting closed with the benediction.

REPORT OF THE BABIES' BRANCH.

During the past year there have been four new branches organized—at Atonement, Edgewater; S. Simon's, Sheridan Park; S. Matthew's, Evanston, and Emmanuel, La Grange, while those at Trinity and the Good Shepherd, Lawndale, have been reorganized, after a lapse of about a year. The increase in membership in several of the branches has been most gratifying, and as it has been largely due to the devoted labor of the parochial Secretaries (one of whom has personally visited every mother and child on her list at least once), it seems fair to name two or three of these, such as All Saints, Ravenswood, forty-five members; S. Andrew's, fifty-four, and S. Peter's, sixty-two. A meeting of all the Branch Secretaries was held in April, at which time the various offerings were brought in, and the total of \$109.94, found to be so much in excess of the pledges already made, that it was voted to send of this surplus \$20 to the Sisters' Milk Fund, and \$15 to the Day Nursery at the Cathedral. Encouraged by the increase in the collection from the little boxes, the following new pledges were made for the ensuing year: Gaylord Hart Mitchell Memorial Kindergarten, in Akita, Japan, \$25; Emergency Fund, White Rock Indians, \$10; General Missions, \$10; United Offering, \$10; while renewing our promise of \$30 for the Catharine Anderson Cot in Wuchang, China, and increasing our pledge for the Little Helpers' Bed in Raleigh to \$5.

During the winter just past a letter has been sent to the President of every Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese, inviting her to assist in organizing a band of Little Helpers in her parish. To these letters there have already been some responses, and more are looked for, so that we hope during the coming year there may be many more little ones enrolled in the cause of helping, with prayer and gift, the great army of "Missionaries all over the world."

**REPORT OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE
JUNIOR AUXILIARY.**

Madam President and Women of the Auxiliary:

During the past year eight new branches have been organized in the diocese; these were at Elmhurst, Chicago Lawn, St. Thomas, Grand Crossing, Cathedral, Norwood Park, Park Ridge, and Momence. In the diocese are sixty branches of the Junior Auxiliary, in forty-four parishes and sixteen missions, with a membership of one thousand four hundred and thirty-six children, two hundred and twenty-four of whom are boys.

Through the United Offerings of the Juniors, six scholarships are supported in different parts of the world, at a cost of \$415.00.

Special pledges have been made this past year towards the United Offering Joint Pledge from all dioceses for a class-room at St. Paul's College, Tokyo.

Money and clothing have been sent to San Francisco and the missionary district of Sacramento since the disaster on our western coast.

Four sectional meetings were held in April at St. Peter's, Grace, St. Mark's, Evanston, and the Cathedral, with an attendance of eight hundred and twenty-one members, making an increase of three hundred and twenty-one over last year.

A missionary exhibit was held on the 7th, 8th and 9th of December, with missionary addresses both morning and afternoon of each day.

During the past year it has been my privilege to hold fifty-two meetings in the interest of the Junior work.

CONSTITUTION.**ARTICLE I.**

This Association shall be called THE CHICAGO BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Association shall be to unite all the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards.

ARTICLE III.

Every parish or mission in the Diocese is a member of this Association, and, upon the payment of an annual membership fee of one dollar, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings, each parish or mission voting as a unit, when such vote by unit shall be demanded by two parishes or missions.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. An annual meeting shall be held the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention—except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee shall appoint another day—for the election of officers, the adoption of the annual report, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before such meeting.

SEC. 2. A semi-annual meeting shall be held in the autumn at the discretion of the Executive Committee, the details of which meeting shall be in the hands of the Executive Committee, provided, always, that at such meetings opportunity shall be given for the transaction of business and for missionary addresses made by speakers approved by the Bishop and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The officers shall be a president, five vice-presidents, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a treasurer, who shall constitute the Executive Committee, and meet monthly.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The duty of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers; to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same, and to have the general charge of the work, under the direction of the Bishop.

SEC. 4. The duty of the vice-presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the president, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association, and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 5. The duty of the corresponding secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the recording secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the corresponding secretary in the preparation of reports.

SEC. 6. The duty of the treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds, to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

SEC. 7. There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the treasurer's accounts each year.

ARTICLE VI.

Each branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the corresponding secretary of the Diocesan Branch, to be incorporated in the annual report and read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Report of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

THE ANNUAL DAY OF PRAYER for Missions is held on the week day preceding S. Andrew's Day, November 30.

The annual meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 510 Masonic Temple, Chicago.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noonday meetings. Interesting papers are read, and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as a box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.
