ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, }
COUNTY OF COOK. } ss.

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18th, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is "**The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.**"

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and for the purpose of aiding said Societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporation shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio.

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-Presidents, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be a part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago

shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers, to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the Directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

Emma J. Hoyne, Treasurer.

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

It is ten years since we last met in La Grange. The lace-like branches of the trees cast a larger shadow; the houses dot more thickly the expanse of greensward; these Church buildings are more perfectly equipped than of yore, but the loving hearts of this, one of the most devoted branches of the Auxiliary, give us the royal welcome of ten years ago.

The work of the past year shows progress all along the line. I have acted as your representative at eighty-two gatherings, including meetings in the dioceses of Milwaukee and Western New York. Three new branches have been organized,—St. Andrew's, Farm Ridge, St. Jude's, South Chicago and St. Mark's, Geneva. One branch has been re-organized, St. John's, Lockport. The sectional meetings have never been more helpful than during the past year. We have held four, and have been most hospitably entertained at Elmhurst, Harvard, Highland Park and Hinsdale. With many duties to distract and to divert, it has been possible for nearly three hundred women to spend an entire day at one of these sectional meetings during the past year. The mornings have been devoted to service in the Church, where, with the singing of familiar hymns, and the hearing of inspiring addresses, we have glowed with zeal for Missions, no matter how cold the day. The social hour for luncheon has formed and cemented many a close friendship among women of neighboring parishes. The afternoon session has given a golden opportunity for the full reports and the formal discussion of methods of work, for which our larger meetings give no time. Many a missionary box, many an increased pledge can be traced directly to these sectional meetings. For those who are fond of statistics, let us quote the offerings at these four sectional meetings as over ninety dollars. But there are results far above money in value. Our meeting held at Harvard, in a remote corner of the diocese, was attended by a large delegation of women from Lake Geneva, in the diocese of Milwaukee, who contributed much to the success of the day. They became so interested in Chicago's plans that they, most generously, asked to add their offerings to ours, when, last fall, we sent our gift to the branches of California and Sacramento. Who would like to entertain the next sectional meeting? We should have four this coming year. Glen Ellyn has already spoken for one on June 19. Please let me hear of three other branches, willing to entertain about fifty women for one of these inspiring days.

The year just closing has been marked by two events of more than passing importance. For the first time in the history of the Chicago

Branch, we have paid our apportionment to the Board of Missions, New York. Nay, more—we have overpaid it. The reward of our work is an increased apportionment, which is as it should be, for the best reward of work well done is not slothful rest, but the opportunity for more work. The second matter of import is the launching of the plan for a Missionary Kindergarten under the auspices of the Chicago Branch. We are already helping to solve the social and religious problems of Chicago by giving to the support of the Sisters of St. Mary and our two faithful deaconesses, but the time has come when the children of Chicago's submerged tenth clamor at our doors for religious instruction. They will not, as yet, attend our Sunday Schools, and the public schools bar religion from their curriculum. Let us, as Churchwomen, rise to the clarion call of this duty which confronts us, that of character building among the children of the foreigners who come like an invading army with every ship that approaches American shores. As you have heard, plans have been made to open a Missionary Kindergarten in a neglected and thickly settled portion of our city. We are asked to raise five hundred dollars for this purpose, which can easily be done, if everyone will lend a helping hand. I ask every parish branch, therefore, to do something during the month of June to raise money for the Missionary Kindergarten. Please consult with the members of your branch as to methods. Some may prefer the best method of all, which is to ask people to give directly to this worthy cause. Others may prefer the method of a missionary tea, a musicale, a lecture, a sale, a play given by the children, or a social gathering pure and simple, something, anything, dignified and suitable, with the avowed object of raising money, which you are asked to bring with you to the semi-annual meeting of next fall. At the semi-annual meeting of 1905 we made a united effort, and brought about five hundred dollars for the Bishop McLaren Memorial Fund; at the semi-annual meeting of 1906, our offering was about four hundred dollars for our needy sisters of the California and Sacramento Branches. Surely, in 1907 we can do as much, and, perhaps, more for the little children who turn to us in order to learn how to become Americans citizens, rather than American criminals. The semi-annual meeting of next fall will be held on October 31st at the Church of the Epiphany, and I earnestly request every branch in this diocese to send delegates to that meeting. Last fall the attendance at the semi-annual meeting was three hundred, counting all the visitors, when it should have been nine hundred. Let us rally to the call of next October, for we expect to have with us, as our guest and speaker, Miss Eliza W. Thackara, who has carried on for years that splendid work at Fort Defiance, Arizona, where she has established a hospital for the Navajo Indians. Before you leave this meeting, I ask you to arrange that our semi-annual meeting of October 31st shall be the largest in the history of the diocese.

Please allow me to thank those parishes that remembered the president's "valentine" this year. This gracious custom was inaugurated

a year ago by the branch at La Grange, who gave me a five-dollar gold piece on February 14th. That precious money was sent to Mexico, as the work there needed help sorely at that time. This year eleven parishes have contributed to the "valentine," which was sent to the famine sufferers in China through our Bishop there. Who can say how many starving souls were given bread with the sum of \$18.17, contributed by the Chicago branch? The birthday money of the past three years equals my anticipations, for this morning's collection in money and pledges brings our total to five thousand dollars, which will be offered upon God's Altar at Richmond next October at the great United Offering Service. Envelopes will be mailed each branch early in September to collect any birthday money of the summer.

The problem of our annual meeting remains the same, for the hospitality so freely offered becomes a burden to the entertaining branch with our large numbers. Suggestions have been offered, to limit the delegates from each parish; to ask the women to pay for their luncheon, with sundry other suggestions. In order to know what other dioceses are doing, we have corresponded with the officers of New York, Pennsylvania, Newark, Pittsburgh, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Central and Western New York. Everyone seems to admit the necessity of one large yearly gathering, with luncheon. All deplore the luncheon, while admitting its necessity and its pleasant social side. One diocese faces the problem of limiting the delegates from each parish, but shrinks from so doing at present. In another diocese the women are asked to bring their luncheon with them, the entertaining branch furnishing tea, coffee and a place to eat the luncheon. At the next large meeting, this branch plans to order the luncheon from a caterer, and to ask the women who partake to pay. The officer writing, says, "This is a terrible problem, and has been a source of anxiety and much discussion for years." In another diocese where the women have paid for their luncheon, our correspondent says, "Our Bishop thinks it was a mistake, for many come from a distance, and are not able, perhaps, to pay for carfare and for luncheon also." The Pennsylvania Branch writes that they provide for eight hundred women at luncheon, which costs two hundred dollars. They give the order to the best caterer in Philadelphia, who furnishes the following menu: fried oysters, sandwiches, buttered rolls, tea and coffee. The money to pay for this is donated by interested women, but is not paid by each delegate who partakes of the luncheon, nor are the parish branches assessed. I submit these facts for your consideration. Two courses would seem open to us, first to go on in the old way, with no thought of limiting the delegates or of assessing the parishes for the luncheon, but requesting the entertaining branch to serve a simple and inexpensive luncheon of one course. With the increasing number of large church buildings in and about Chicago, there are over one dozen parishes that have thus entertained us in the past. It would fall to the lot of each large parish to entertain the Chicago Branch once in twelve years at the most. The second plan is to have

the Executive Committee take charge of the luncheon, ordering it, raising the money for it, and adding that to our other duties. If you prefer to go on in the old way some parish will invite us for the next annual meeting. If we receive no such invitation, I shall, very reluctantly, take it for granted that you are tired of the old way, and will consult with the Executive Committee as to "ways and means" of changing our yearly custom.

A word as to the future of our beloved branch. In planning the work for the coming year, will you allow me to warn you against the drudgery of the rut and the monotony of routine. What is the difference between work and drudgery? Drudgery comes when we insist upon doing our work in the hardest possible way. Such people are martyrs, and no martyrs are more deceived than self-made martyrs. Watch the earthworm as he toils his weary way at the bottom of the rut of dried mud left by some passing wheel. There he crawls, the hot sun beating down upon him, the walls of his self-inflicted prison rising high above his head, while just the other side of the rut are green grass and wayside flowers and the babble of a little brook. And the pity of it is that our friend, the earthworm, could go just as far in a given time, if he would only get out of his rut. Routine, in moderation, means order and precision, but, carried to excess, it spells dullness unspeakable. We watch, half fascinated, those monster machines of iron and steel that whirr and hammer, year after year, in exactly the same way, until they are worn out and the crash comes, and they are thrown away, for nothing is as worthless as a worn-out machine. Yet some human beings, made in the image of God, with the capacity for endless improvement, do their work, year after year, in precisely the same way. Their methods are like the laws of the Medes and Persians, which never alter, never change, and woe betide the adventurous spirit that dares to speak of progress. If our missionary work has been dull this past year, the fault has been, not with the work, but with ourselves. God has placed us in a beautiful world and He has given us beautiful work to do. We have a right to make our Auxiliary meetings attractive with the most brilliant papers written by Chicago women, to enrich them with the sparkle of humor, to ornament them with the melody of sweet song. If our methods for the past year have not included the literary women of our parish, the worldly women, the young women, with their craving for what is bright and able, then let us not change our methods, but let us enlarge and expand our methods, remembering that the best method in the world is a good servant, but a very poor master. So, in avoiding the drudgery of the rut and the monotony of routine, will we achieve the seeming paradox of being perfectly contented with the opportunity our work affords, and yet of being so discontented with our way of doing it, that we will improve and grow every year we live. This is the key that unlocks the hidden meaning of those closing words of the second great commandment,

that tell us to do our duty in that state of life unto which it shall please God to call us.

“Let me but do my work from day to day,
In field or forest, at the desk or loom,
In roaring market place or tranquil room,
Let me but find it in my heart to say,
When vagrant wishes beckon me astray,
This is my work, my blessing, not my doom,
Of all who live, I am the one by whom
This work can best be done in my own way.

“So shall I see it not too great nor small
To suit my spirit and to prove my powers;
So shall I, cheerful, greet the laboring hours,
And cheerful turn, when the long shadows fall
At eventide, to play and love and rest,
Because I know for me my work is best.”

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The twenty-second semi-annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in the Church of the Epiphany, Chicago, on Thursday, October 25th, at 2:30 P. M. Topics for intercessory prayer, which had been prepared by Mrs. Hopkins, were distributed and used by the women during the half hour preceding service.

The meeting was called to order at half past two by the President. Minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.

Bishop McCormick of Western Michigan presided, and conveyed to the meeting Bishop Anderson's regrets that he was unable to be present.

Bishop Weller of Fond du Lac told of conditions existing in his diocese and made a strong appeal for help. Bishop McCormick followed in the same line, reminding the women not to forget the needs of the churches where their summers are spent.

Mrs. Hopkins expressed satisfaction that the distant branches, that could not be present, had sent offerings.

Pledges were read for Miss Farthing's salary. Junior pledges for scholarships in Honolulu, Africa and Japan were also read.

Miss Farthing was present and spoke a few words of greeting, and thanks for assistance received from the Chicago Branch and from individuals in this diocese.

The offering in the envelopes was divided between the Clifornia and Sacramento Branches, the open offering between Bishop McCormick and Bishop Weller.

Roll call showed an attendance of 227 delegates, from 51 branches.

The meeting closed with the benediction.

The twenty-third annual meeting of the Chicago Branch was held in Emmanuel Church, La Grange, on Friday, May 31, 1907, beginning with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 A. M. Bishop Anderson was the celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Theodore B. Foster, Rector, and visiting clergymen.

The sermon was preached by the Rev. George Craig Stewart, Rector of St. Luke's Church, Evanston. At the close of the service the Rector spoke a few words of welcome, and read a telegram of greeting from Bishop Scadding, after which roll was called, 679 delegates reporting from 71 branches, the total attendance being 705.

A letter of greeting from Miss Emery was read.

Luncheon was served in the parish house by the entertaining branch.

The meeting was called to order for the afternoon session at 1:45 P. M. with prayers by the Rector of the parish.

The minutes of the twenty-second semi-annual meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. Dillon of Santa Rosa, California, said a few words of gratitude for the gifts sent by the Chicago Branch at the time of the earthquake.

The combined report of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer was read by Mrs. MacDermid. Mrs. Lewis gave the report of the Corresponding Secretary of the Junior Department. Reports were given of the Babies' Branch, the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, the Church Periodical Club, the Linen Committee of St. Luke's Hospital, the Lent Study Class, the Noon-day Meetings, and the United Offering.

The committee in charge of the proposed mission kindergarten reported having found a suitable location for the work, and having secured the promise of about one-third of the money needed for its maintenance for one year.

Each report was on motion accepted.

On motion it was voted that the surplus in certain of this year's pledges should be used to cancel the deficit in other pledges.

Bishop Anderson then introduced the speaker of the afternoon, Miss Annie C. Farthing, of Alaska, who gave a most interesting account of her life and work in the missions under Bishop Rowe.

Pledges were read for Assistant City Missionaries, also Junior pledges for scholarships in Alaska, Mexico and South Dakota.

The Bishop presided at the election of officers. A report was read from the nominating committee, and on motion balloting was dispensed with, and the following officers elected by acclamation: President, Mrs. John Henry Hopkins; Vice-Presidents, Miss K. D. Arnold, Mrs. Vincy B. Fullerton, Mrs. W. D. C. Street, Mrs. F. O. Granniss, Mrs. H. B. Butler; Treasurer, Mrs. James T. Hoyne; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. J. J. MacDermid; Recording Secretary, Mrs. W. S. MacHarg.

The Bishop re-appointed chairmen and members of the various committees, and the officers of the Junior department: Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Joseph K. Lewis; Recording Secretary, Mrs. H. B. Gwyn.

The offering was devoted to the needs of Bishop Seadding in his new diocese.

A vote of thanks was tendered to the rector and women of Emmanuel parish for their gracious hospitality, and the meeting closed with prayers and the benediction.

REPORT OF THE BABIES' BRANCH.

While there has been but one new branch started during the year, at S. Augustine's, Wilmette, there has been a very encouraging increase in membership and offerings

The custom is growing of bringing the babies together once or twice a year for a service, at which time the contents of the little boxes are collected and the offering made by the children themselves. This plan has been found to greatly increase the interest of the mothers as well as the little ones. At the Annual Meeting of Branch Secretaries, held in April, the pledges of last year, amounting to \$90.00 were renewed, and we were enabled to make two special gifts of \$25.00 each—one to the rebuilding fund of the Memorial Kindergarten in Akita, which was destroyed by fire last June, and the other to the Milk Fund of the Sisters of S. Mary.

The total offering, given almost entirely in pennies, amounted to \$162.31, or \$50.00 more than last year, and this being the material indication of progress, we feel that it is a most encouraging sign of the growing vitality of the Little Helpers' Society in the Diocese of Chicago.

REPORT OF THE LENT STUDY CLASS.

The Committee for 1907, which was appointed by Mrs. Hopkins to assist the Vice-President, consisted of the following: Mesdames C. A. Switzer, Herbert A. Seymour, the Misses Abby Raymond and Charlotte E. Folds.

The outline of study was as follows: (1) Henry the Eighth, Cardinal Wolsey, Sir Thomas Moore, Peterborough Cathedral; (2) How did the Reformation in England differ from the Reformation on the Continent? John Calvin, John Knox, The Puritan Party in the Church of England; (3) Dissolution of the Monasteries, Tintern Abbey, Fountain's Abbey, Thomas Cromwell; (4) First Prayer Book of Edward VI, The Caroline Revision, The American Prayer Book, The Prayer Book Heroes; (5) The Oxford Martyrs, Lady Jane Grey, Cardinal Role, Philip of Spain; (6) Queen Elizabeth as a Theologian, Consecration of Archbishop Parker, The Spanish Armada, Articles of Religion. Each of the six days papers was cared for by members from some one parish, the six parishes represented being as follows: Grace, Oak Park, S. Paul's, Kenwood; Christ, Woodlawn; S. Andrews, Our Saviour, and S. Bartholomew. One hundred and thirty-four letters were written by the Vice-President. A printed notice program and typewritten letter were sent to the rector of each parish, also a program and personal letter to each branch president.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president as such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Report of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

THE ANNUAL DAY OF PRAYER for Missions is held on the week day preceding S. Andrew's Day, November 30th.

The annual meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 510 Masonic Temple, Chicago.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noonday meetings. Interesting papers are read, and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.
