Chicago shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers, to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the Directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

I am sure you will pardon me if I make this last address as your president of a somewhat personal character. On October 20, 1908, the Missionary Council of the Fifth Department met in Chicago, a new force in the life of the church, meeting for the first time. They elected Dr. Hopkins to act as traveling secretary, to go up and down the twelve dioceses of the Fifth Department, an area over twice as large as Great Britain, to carry the missionary message wherever he can find a hearing. This meant that his home life must be given up and that he should become a messenger, taking to all who may receive him the most important message in the world.

It seemed to me that my first duty and privilege was to go with him, and after long and serious thought, I made up my mind so to do, feeling that a wife's place is beside her husband. Of course it is impossible for me to travel almost constantly, and yet to perform, at the same time, my duties as president of the Chicago Branch. Therefore, with the utmost sadness and reluctance, I am obliged to resign as your president. Thank you, one and all, for the faithful and loving support you have ever given me. To that support I owe some of the happiest years of my life.

This does not mean that I am saying "Goodbye" to you this afternoon. On the contrary, it is my hope to meet you many times as we travel through the great Middle West, for Chicago is the very center of the Fifth Department, and Dr. Hopkins, who has an official relationship with everyone of the eight hundred parishes and missions within the Department's boundaries, must spend several weeks in this diocese every year.

Let me introduce you to the Fifth Department. It is a great tract of land, comprising the five states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin. These states include the dioceses of Ohio, Southern Ohio, Michigan City, Indianapolis, Chicago, Quincy, Springfield, Michigan, Western Michigan, Marquette, Fond du Lac and Milwaukee—twelve in all. Here we are—a great pocket of the Middle West, set apart by God's boundaries of the Great Lakes, the tawny floods of the Mississippi and the Ohio rivers, and now organized as a new force in the Church's life by the order of our General Convention.

This work is most important and it is not easy. It means the giving of an unpopular message to people who do not wish to hear it. It sometimes seems like the melting of consecutive icicles, thankful, indeed, for any sign of thawing, and richly rewarded if even one icicle stays melted. Yet it is the kind of work that men do all the time for politics, for fame and for business. Surely there are those in the Church

who are glad and willing to do God's work! The surprising thing about it is that everywhere we have been received with a kindness so unflinching that my heart has been deeply touched. We started out on this new work on the second day of last February and have traveled almost constantly ever since, covering many thousands of miles and visiting many scores of cities, towns and villages.

Since the last annual meeting, I have acted as your representative at fifty-four gatherings in the diocese of Chicago, and have organized two new branches at Blue Island and St. Paul's, La Salle, making one hundred and six branches in the diocese at present. Outside the diocese of Chicago, I have organized eleven new branches, including the Junior and the Babies' Branches and have addressed sixty gatherings in the Fifth Department. These gatherings have varied in size from hundreds of women in diocesan meeting assembled, to smaller gatherings in Parish Houses, Schools, Hospitals and Private Houses. It has been my privilege to address Auxiliary women and women who had never heard of the Auxiliary Church women and women belonging to other religious bodies, boarding schools, Sunday schools and gatherings of children—wherever there has been an opportunity to speak even a few words for Missions.

It has been a source of deep joy to me that the Valentine, so generously given by the members of the Chicago Branch and by others, has been such a substantial sum that it has paid all my expenses of travel since February 2nd. The total has been about two hundred and fifty dollars, and at the rate of two cents a mile, will carry me twelve thousand, five hundred miles. There has been almost no other expenses in the way of travel, for people have opened their homes to us with the truest hospitality and we have found in the Fifth Department dozens of households that have extended a welcome worthy of the Acts of the Apostles. Should the Chicago Branch feel able to continue this Valentine another year, it will knit them in closest bonds of missionary interest to the other dioceses of the Middle West, and it will be a bulwark of strength and of comfort to me in a wandering life.

Although I go in an unofficial way to any town or village where we may find a footing, there are two duties constantly before me, all important, if unofficial. The first is to urge the women of the church to make a home of the Fifth Department. Women are the home-makers of the Church and of the nation. The general convention may frame laws that shall erect boundaries, but unless the dioceses included within these boundaries become a home place, the power of the organization is largely lost. If the Auxiliary women make of this great Fifth Department a home, feel at home in it themselves, that is the root of the matter. To arouse this home-making instinct seems most essential.

The second unofficial duty near my heart is that of planting a neighborly feeling among the twelve diocesan branches of our home. They are widely separated, these twelve dioceses. They embrace almost every variety of climate and of American life. Yet they know

far more of Alaska's needs and of those of the Brazilian Mission, than they do of the joys and sorrows of their next-door neighbors in the Fifth Department. It has been a pleasure to attend many diocesan gatherings of the Auxiliary, not as a visitor, but as a member of the family, and to tell the women of conditions in other portions of the Fifth Department. Everywhere I have found the pure gold of true and sisterly interest; everywhere I have stood amazed, before that most priceless of all attributes—the warm and loving heart of woman.

You may wonder what message could be taken to so many persons, a message that would ring true in every phase of Church work. I found it in my journeyings. Listen to the Parable of the Tree:

As the train bore us over great stretches of winter landscape in those early February days, I learned to look with eagerness for the bits of woodland that are doubly attractive in the bleakness of a world of snow. There they towered—those great monarchs of the plain—giant oaks and elms and maples, each spreading branch and tiny twig etched in lace-like blackness against the dull gray of the wintry sky. But many a tree was disfigured by the dead leaves that clung fast to its branches, like little brown ghosts of yesteryear. They seemed to defy the icy fingers of the sleet, the wild fury of the hurricane to make them loose their hold. But as winter melted into spring, strange forces were astir in the brown earth and in the trees that grow therefrom. All nature seemed to quiver with the joy and hope that springtime brings. So it happened that the mysterious force we call life, stole quietly up the great trunks of the trees and out to the most distant twig. As the sap penetrated to the withered leaves themselves, lo! they loosened their grip and fluttered softly to the ground like so many gauzy butterflies. It was the old, old story. Love had conquered hate; gentleness had overpowered force; the new life had supplanted the old. That this missionary life may bud and blossom in your hearts, gently taking the place of the old methods, of the cut and dried ideals, is my last message to you as president of the Chicago Branch.

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING

The Twenty-fourth Semi-Annual Meeting of the Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held October 20, 1908, at the Church of the Epiphany.

Previously to the meeting, nearly 350 women enjoyed the hospitality of the Rev. L. B. Hastings and his boys, a generous luncheon being served at the Chicago Homes for Boys, for all who attended the meeting.

The President, Mrs. Hopkins, opened the meeting at two o'clock. The minutes of the annual meeting of May 28th were read and approved. The roll-call followed, showing an attendance of 327 delegates, and 58 visitors, making a total of 385. 52 parishes were represented.

The Rt. Rev. Joseph Marshall Francis, Bishop of Indianapolis, presided in the absence of Bishop Anderson, and gave an address full of interest and help.

The Rt. Rev. William Walter Webb, Bishop of Milwaukee, gave a stirring account of the work of the Church, and the needs in upper Wisconsin.

Mrs. Hopkins then gave several notices, and spoke of the next semi-annual meeting as being the silver anniversary, and appointed the vice-presidents as a committee to arrange a special programme of interest for that meeting.

The Rt. Rev. Gershom Mott Williams, Bishop of Marquette, was the last speaker, and his address was full of inspiration as he told of the growth of the work in his diocese, and of the faithful work of his clergy.

The offering was then collected, the special offering in envelopes being devoted to Providence Kindergarten, and the undesignated money being divided among the three visiting bishops, for their work.

Bishop Francis, in his closing remarks, told of the honor that had come to the rector of the Church of the Epiphany, Dr. John Henry Hopkins, who had just been elected Representative of the Fifth Department Missionary Council.

Bishop Francis then closed the meeting with prayer.

REPORT OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY, 1908-1909.

Of the sixty-one branches of Juniors in the Diocese, forty-nine have taken part in the work this year.

One of the greatest obstacles to the growth of the Juniors is the difficulty of finding leaders for the children. In many cases branches have lapsed because the Director has been obliged to resign, and no suitable person has been found to take the place. (As I write this report, word comes of the resignation of two leaders of important branches.) The children cannot continue the work without an older head to guide. Therefore, we implore the aid of the clergy and members of the Woman's Auxiliary in helping to keep leaders in office, and to find new ones when necessary. The Junior Auxiliary is to the Missionary life of the church what West Point is to the United States' Army.

For some years the Chicago Branch has supported scholarships in six church schools, under the care of the Bishops of South Dakota, Mexico, Alaska, Honolulu, Kyoto and Cape Palmas, aggregating \$415.00. For two years we have also paid a special African scholarship of \$25.00.

This year an additional pledge is assumed, which calls for \$105.00. This is known as "The Juniors' United Gift," and is to be devoted to the work in New Mexico and Arizona. This, together with certain of our scholarships, will complete the apportionment to General Missions.

Three hundred and twenty-seven dollars and eighty cents (\$327.80) has been given for Diocesan and Domestic Missions.

The Juniors' Christmas boxes have been generous. Thirty-one branches have sent ninety-three boxes, valued at \$1,634.51 to various stations at home and abroad, fifty of them within this Diocese. In many instances the gifts were the children's own handiwork, and it is not easy to estimate the benefit to themselves in doing this for others.

The total given in money for scholarships and other missionary work is \$760.27. The total value of boxes is \$1,634.51.

The Corporate Communion of the Junior officers was held at the Church of the Redeemer in October, as the first step in the year's work.

In January a most enthusiastic meeting was held at the church club-rooms, with a large attendance. The Eastertide meeting was also well attended. Reports were read, and the work for the coming year planned. So great was the interest aroused by Miss Sleppy's visit at the time of the April session of the Woman's Auxiliary that the Juniors voted to invite her to come again. Arrangements are being made for a general meeting of Juniors in October, when more may have the benefit of Miss Sleppy's help. This meeting will be held in St. Luke's Church, Evanston.

At the Eastertide meeting it was voted to make the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels the time of our Corporate Communion, each branch to attend service in its own parish church, asking the Priest to offer special intercessions for the Junior Auxiliary and its work.

Much benefit is derived from these officers' meetings of the Juniors. They help to a better understanding of the work we are doing as a Diocese, and by showing that each branch, however small and weak, is an efficient part of the great whole, they stimulate all those interested to perseverance in the endeavor to train the children in the missionary school and army of the church.

The excellent paper on "The Ideal Christmas Box" which our Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Lewis, read at the Epiphany Officers' meeting has been published by the Board of Missions and circulated as one of the Junior Leaflets.

REPORT OF THE BABIES' BRANCH OF THE DIOCESE OF CHICAGO.

The general text book was "The Church in the Prayer Book," by E. L. Temple.

The three writers for each of the six days were from some one parish, with one exception, when they were S. H. S. H. S. students. They were, respectively, February 27, from S. James'; March 6, S. Barnabas'; March 13, S. H. S. H. S.; March 20, Trinity, Highland Park; March 27, S. Augustine's, Wilmette; April 3, S. Simon's.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

The annual day of Prayer for Missions is held on the week day preceding St. Andrew's Day, November 30th.

The annual meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all Parochial Branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 510 Masonic Temple, Chicago.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
