ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, } ss.
COUNTY OF COOK. }

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We, the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization, we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is

"The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions"

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and to the purpose of aiding said societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the Church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporation shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio,

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-Presidents, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be a part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago

shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the Directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

In making my report to you today on this our twenty-eighth Annual Meeting, it gives me the greatest pleasure to tell you that the year just closed has been a splendid year, both in expressed interest and in accomplishment.

I congratulate every woman here upon her share in it.

As we come together today from near and from far, and at more or less cost of time and effort, we realize that the service that each woman and each Branch has given to the Auxiliary in her own special field has been absolutely essential to the existence and development of this organization, and that our general happiness today is brought about by this co-operation and devotion.

For the first time in many years we have paid our apportionment from the General Board of Missions in New York in full, as well as our pledges. That we were able to accomplish this is something for which we may be deeply thankful. Some of the money for the apportionment came in response to a special appeal that the deficiency might be made up; most of it came because all but two of the seventy branches that made pledges paid these in full, and then gave more to the apportionment—a most remarkable record.

We have set a new standard for ourselves, never again will be content to do less well.

We have made a gain in membership of individuals, and in Branches. Two Branches revived, and two new Branches have been received into the Auxiliary Family.

Four new Branches have been added to the Junior Department as well, and this is very gratifying, because the bond between the Seniors and Juniors is so close that the new life which comes through the Junior Department is felt all through the Auxiliary. The energy and enthusiasm of the Juniors is as necessary to the Seniors as the tact and experience of the Seniors may be to the Juniors.

Our Vice-President in charge of the Baby Branch, Miss McMurray, resigns from her post, because of prolonged absence from Chicago. We cannot let her go without expressing our sincere regret, and our appreciation of the tender and loving service she has given to this department of Auxiliary work.

I must also speak of the resignation from the office of Recording Secretary of Miss Jannette L. Sturges, who has served the Chi-

cago Branch Woman's Auxiliary in this office for many years. I think I may say that Miss Sturges only leaves us in order that she may have time and strength for the arduous duties connected with Providence Day Nursery. She remains upon our Board as Vice-President, which makes her resignation as Recording Secretary less of a calamity, and assures us that her interest and affection will still be with the Auxiliary.

Perhaps after paying the apportionment, our next best achievement is the launching of the youngest Diocesan Institution—the Providence Day Nursery, our own nursling which has found its wings and flown the Auxiliary Nest. Miss Sturges will keep us informed of our privileges of helpfulness, and woe betide any Auxiliary Branch that does not make provision in its budget for the needs of the Nursery. Let me remind you that the Visiting Committee is always at your service. I am delighted to report that over a hundred visits were made last year. Our new committee, the Promotion and Efficiency Committee, has fully justified its name, promoting a sale of laces for the Indian Schools of the Sybil Carter Association at Grace Church Parish House, Chicago, and also assisting in sending notices for the Diocesan Missionary Dinner given in honor of the meeting of the Board of Missions in Chicago in February.

The committee will soon bring to our notice the great Missionary Exhibition, The World in Chicago, to be held in Chicago in May, 1913.

As today we have brought our gift of love, our United Offering, and have knelt side by side, I know there is in the heart of each one of us the determination to make our offering at the great triennial in New York in 1913 the most generous and loving offering Chicago has ever sent—the outward and visible sign of our thankfulness for the blessings of our lives.

And now how shall we go to meet the New Year, so full of opportunity and blessed privileges, just before us. Sometimes over the sober practical aspect of our work there flashes a glory, and we catch glimpses of a world vision, when all the sons and daughters of our Father shall be gathered into one fold with one Shepherd, and we turn back to our work to find it transfigured, and we know that we have been walking hand in hand with our Master, and we find that we can go forward with a new consciousness of power, a new consecration of our lives, a new joy in service, and a high hope that at the end of the year we may be able to say of ourselves we were "not disobedient to the Vision."

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING.

The Semi-Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held on the 26th of October, 1911, in St. Mark's Church, Chicago.

The meeting was opened at 2 o'clock by the rector, the Rev. W. W. Wilson, with a brief devotional service. After a few words of welcome from Dr. Wilson, Mrs. Greeley, the President, took charge of the meeting.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read and approved, Mrs. F. D. Hoag acting as clerk.

At the roll call 48 Branches responded with a total of 214 delegates, including visitors and clergy.

Announcements were made of the fund to be raised for the Farthing Memorial Chapel at Nenana, Alaska; of a prospective sale of lace work from the Sybil Carter Lace Industry; and of the invitation to hold the Annual Meeting in the Butler Memorial Building.

Dr. John Henry Hopkins, rector of the Church of the Redeemer, was then introduced and gave a graphic picture of "China, her greatness and her awakening". Applying the text, "Behold, now is the accepted time" to China and the Chinese, Dr. Hopkins gave one word-picture after another of the size and vastness of China, of her population, of the wonderful old civilization which for centuries has been held undisturbed by outside influences—and now of her colossal awakening, the first symptoms of which began about 75 years ago, and which is now advancing by leaps and bounds, bringing China rapidly into the foremost ranks of the nations.

Miss Julia C. Emery of New York, Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, then spoke on the "Gift of Life," showing the need for such consecration, now as never before, in the mission field.

During the singing of a hymn the offering was made, the contributions in envelopes being for the Providence Day Nursery, amounted to \$276.25.

The open offering being devoted to the maternity ward of St. Elizabeth's Hospital at Shanghai, amounted to \$78.27.

The meeting closed with the benediction. At the close of the meeting opportunity was given for the people to meet Miss Emery.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The Twenty-eighth Annual Meeting of the Women's Auxiliary, Diocese of Chicago, was held in St. Peter's Church, on Friday, May 31st, 1912.

The morning service began at 10:30, with the service of the Holy Communion, the Bishop of Chicago as celebrant, assisted by the Rev. William C. Shaw, Rector, and other clergy. The Very Rev. Walter T. Summer, preached the sermon.

The morning offering, aside from the annual collection of the United Offering, amounted to \$153.41, and was devoted to Dean Sumner for his work in the Cathedral Missions. The United Offering amounted to over \$1,600.00.

At the roll call an amendment to the By-laws was voted as follows: Amendment to By-law sixth, "The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches."

The roll call showed an attendance of 725 delegates, and 30 visitors and clergy, a total of 755 from 69 branches.

Luncheon was served in the Hermon Beardsley Butler Memorial House.

The afternoon session began at 2 p. m. with an address of welcome by the Rector, after which the President, Mrs. Frederick Greeley, took the chair. The minutes of the last Semi-annual Meeting were read and approved, Mrs. F. D. Hoag acting as clerk.

Bishop Anderson then awarded the gold and silver medals offered by the President of the Woman's Auxiliary for the best books in the Mission Scrap Book Contest in the Junior Auxiliary.

The gold medal was awarded to St. Mark's parish, Evanston, the subject of the book being Alaska.

The silver medal was awarded to the Junior Auxiliary of St. Luke's parish, Evanston, with the same subject.

Honorable mention was given to St. Peter's, Chicago, two books having been made, one on Japan, and one on the Diocese; and to the Junior Auxiliary of the Church of the Atonement, which sent in a book on the "Negroes."

The President gave a short address, reviewing the work done in the past year, and outlining the plans for the coming year.

The address of the afternoon was made by the Rev. Dudley Tyng of Wuchang, China.

Three brief addresses followed: By Mrs. Thomas C. Wetmore, of Christ School, Arden, North Carolina; by the Rev. Kashiri Hayakawa, rector of St. John's Church, Osaka, Japan, and by the Rev. Hunter Lewis, State College, Mesilla Park, New Mexico.

The election of officers was conducted by the Bishop, and the following officers were elected:

PROVIDENCE DAY NURSERY.

3052 Sullivan Court.

Mrs. Edward Horace Hoehne, Matron.

May 1, 1911, to May 1, 1912.

Since May 1, 1911, the Providence Day Nursery has cared for 93 different children, with an average daily attendance of 18. 5,700 days of care have been given to the children. The matron has made 257 visits to the 53 families which have sent their children to the Nursery more or less regularly during the year, as well as to over 20 other families who have come to her for help and advice.

In January the Diocesan Board of Missions took over the work of the Providence Day Nursery, and Dean Sumner was appointed Director by the Bishop of Chicago.

In April the attendance of children increased rapidly, 36 and 37 being taken daily. Owing to the insufficient accommodations and equipment, the number was limited to 20 daily. The demand has since been that 40 should be cared for.

In May, 1912, the Building Commissioner condemned the use of the present building as a Nursery unless extensive repairs be made.

The owner of the cottage gave the house and land to the Bishop of Chicago for use as a Nursery.

It is imperative that a new building suitable for Nursery work shall be erected at once, that it may be in use before cold weather.

Plans are drawn and the work of raising a building fund is being actively undertaken, with the expectation that the first of July will see the building well begun.

The Providence Sunday School held in the Day Nursery building, is now under the care of Dean Sumner, Mr. J. B. McCormick acting as superintendent. Thirty-four children have been enrolled. One boy was confirmed in February, at St. Philip's Mission.

Thanks are due the Rev. William O. Waters for his helpful interest, to the Rev. H. S. Webster and the Rev. E. J. M. Nutter for their earnest work in this Sunday School, and also to Miss Adelia Thompson and her three assistants for their faithful work in its behalf.

The Providence Kindergarten this May makes its final report for what is probably a number of years, as, after it was found advisable to give up kindergarten work on Gault Court, it was voted by the Executive Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary, upon the recommendation of the Providence Committee, to "concentrate all effort for the present upon the Providence Day Nursery."

This decision was made owing to a large settlement of the Roman Church being placed in the near neighborhood of the Providence Kindergarten on Gault Court, which effectually cared for the children, thus removing the need for Providence Kindergarten. This report, therefore, merely contains the two spring months of work since the last annual report, and is included with the financial report of the Providence Day Nursery.

Sumner for personal assistance in the work of reorganization; to the branches of the Auxiliary for the support they have given; to the many individuals who have aided the Nursery financially and by gifts of food, clothing and toys; to Doctor E. C. Fortner, who has given daily attention to the Nursery, and to the specialists who have freely devoted their time and skill to those in need, and to St. Luke's, The Passavant, Wesley, The Provident, and the Children's Memorial Hospitals for the good care given to the patients sent them by Providence Day Nursery.

The Providence Committee in making this last report as a committee of the Woman's Auxiliary, asks that the needs of this infant Diocesan Institution be remembered in prayer by every woman of the Diocese, and that gifts both large and small be sent promptly to the Building Fund, that this coming autumn may see the completion of the new building—one more stronghold for the work of our Lord and Master in the midst of our city's needs.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY.

An Institute for Mission Study was held in St. James Parish House, 666 Rush Street, Chicago, January 24-26, under the leadership of Miss Grace Lindley. Representatives from the twelve dioceses of the 5th department were invited to join in making the Institute a department gathering. The response was most gratifying, as eight dioceses, including Chicago, were represented. Sixteen branches of the Chicago Auxiliary were also represented. The Institute opened with a Corporate Communion on Wednesday, January 24, and during the three days Miss Lindley held four meetings of the class for Junior Leaders using as a text book "Conquerors of the Continent," and Miss Tillotson four meetings of the class for Senior Leaders in "Conquest of the Continent." Miss Lindley also conducted two Bible classes, taking up the Gospel according to St. Matthew, and conducted two conferences, one on Junior work and one on General Auxiliary work. The closing meeting was addressed by Miss Sibley of Detroit, who talked of her experiences in the mission field in the Philippines.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as she may designate for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually, a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

Amendment to By-Law VI. The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason, may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches.

VII. The Treasurer shall furnish bond for such amount as shall be determined by the Executive Committee, such bond to be paid for from the funds of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all parochial branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 29 East Madison Street.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
