ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, }
COUNTY OF COOK. } ss.

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We, the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization, we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is

"The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions"

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and to the purpose of aiding said societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the Church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporation shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio.

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-Presidents, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be a part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the Directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

It is my privilege to speak to you to-day on the development of our Society.

The Reports, as you have heard them, show good progress and I congratulate each officer and each member of the Auxiliary, who have so loyally worked to keep up to the high standard we have established for ourselves. Again we have paid our entire apportionment and pledges, and in addition have sent out many boxes. We all feel the exhilaration and joy of such service. I have to thank you for so kindly contributing to the "President's Fund." Part of this Fund has gone toward the maintenance of All Saints Bungalow, Phoenix, Arizona; part toward an addition to Miss Langdon's Hospital at Tanana in Alaska; and the rest the President has had the pleasure of sending here and there as crumbs of comfort or to tide somebody over a hard place. It is good to think of the prospect of the completion of the Farthing Memorial Fund. We shall soon see in imagination the Chapel finished and the boys and girls worshipping joyfully in "Miss Farthing's Church" as they love to call it.

I am happy to tell you that the gain in membership in the Auxiliary this year is over three hundred and that we now have over three thousand enrolled members.

Five Branches have been reorganized with new officers: St. George's and The Good Shepherd of Chicago; Grace, Sterling; St. John's, Naperville; and St. Andrew's, Downers Grove.

In the Junior Department five new branches have been enrolled and five are dormant for lack of leaders.

In the Baby Branch:

Two new Branches have been added and none withdrawn.

There are a few changes in the members of the Executive Committee. Mrs. William C. Street, who has served this Society faithfully and honorably for many years, has been obliged to resign on account of prolonged absence from Chicago. It is a pleasure to place on record our affection for her and our appreciation of her labors of love. Mrs. T. Bar-

bour Brown, our Vice-President in charge of the Junior Department, feels that she must be excused from the duties of this office, which she has so graciously and ably performed. Only one thing reconciles us to these changes and deprivations and that is: we believe once an Auxiliary woman, *always* an Auxiliary woman; and we know that we can depend upon both of these friends for interest and loyal co-operation.

The Visiting Committee has continued its devoted and constructive service, visiting meetings of Parish Branches, instructing and inspiring the members through able papers and talks on different divisions of our work.

Next year we are to have a new and valuable officer, an Educational Secretary, who will develop the educational side of missions, both with us and for us.

Our accounts this year have been scrutinized by an expert accountant, who has pronounced them to be in excellent condition. I cannot forbear to make mention of the systematic and perfect way in which our accounts are kept by our treasurer. We are grateful for such able and single minded devotion to the cause.

As we think of these things we thank God for the past year, and rejoice that we are "Forward looking" women; that we are trying to measure up to the standard of women described by Dean Sumner, in an address at a Suffrage Meeting in New York where he says: "Success will be yours when you have in your ranks women who will give of their best, that all men, women and children may have a fair opportunity to enjoy the abundance of life; women whose ears are attuned to hear the far off cry of those in need, the groan of the sick, the moan of the sinful, and hearing the cry, *answer*." The Church knocks at the door of our hearts and asks us to help her in her appointed task of bringing our Lord's message of "Life and life more abundant" to those who are still strangers to Him.

Let us be missionaries, first, last and always, using our enthusiasm, our intelligence, our power, to help bring humanity nearer to the "Goal of God's placing," looking for our inspiration to the Christ, who is your Master, and my Master, and the inspiration of us all.

REPORT OF THE JUNIOR WORK FOR 1912-1913.

We now close another year of successful, happy and helpful work of the Juniors. There are several signs of increased strength and growth in the work—forty-two parishes being represented by forty-six branches, there being in one parish three branches. *Five* new ones have been added to the roll, and there are *five* dormant for lack of leaders.

Before or by the first of May our apportionment of five hundred and twenty dollars was paid in full.

Four Branches (St. Martin's, Austin, St. Peter's, Chicago, St. Mark's and St. Luke's, Evanston) made, I think, the first definite contribution towards the United Offering, \$32.60. The box work consisted of sixty-nine boxes valued at one thousand three hundred forty-six dollars and ninety-six cents (\$1,346.96).

The Juniors rose to the dignity and independence this year of defraying their personal expense for stationery, travel, etc. They have sent to Mrs. Staples eighty-four dollars and thirty-six cents (\$84.36) towards the altar for the Farthing Memorial, with the hope of being able to send later an additional sum that will make their full gift one hundred dollars. In addition to this, the sum of one hundred and sixty-four dollars and fifty cents (\$164.50) must be added which was not sent through the treasurer.

In an educational way they have held monthly meetings since October with a fair attendance by the leaders of the various branches. The scrap book work has, under the leadership of Miss Van Schaick, been most encouraging, four beautiful new books having been sent in this year, and we hope sincerely that many more of the branches will see the value of this work and bring it to their young people.

We feel we may congratulate the Juniors, and urge upon them a continuance in the good work. May the coming year, under the leadership of our younger women, be full of success, full of inspiration, full of love for the work.

PROVIDENCE DAY NURSERY.

Since May 1, 1912, the Providence Day Nursery has cared for 83 different children, with an average daily attendance of 23; 6838 days of care have been given to the children; 46 women, 22 of whom are regular workers, have benefited by this Nursery work; 11 nationalities are included in the Nursery family.

Providence Day Nursery has just passed through a year of strain and stress. The necessity for a new building resulted in a year of great effort. As this report comes to you, it tells of a building about to be begun, but which will cost nearer \$12,000 than the \$10,000 estimated last summer. It also tells of a building fund raised by infinite exertion to the amount of \$8,646.41. As the property cannot be mortgaged owing to the conditions of the deed of gift, this means much hard work yet to be done.

This report finds the Providence Day Nursery occupying two flats and a fine back yard at 1044 West 31st street. It finds the little, old cottage seeking a new home two blocks away, and the ground ready for the new brick, two story and basement house which, it is fondly expected, will be a house of happiness to many little ones, and will stand for much that is best and brightest in their lives.

The Committee makes grateful acknowledgment to everyone who has helped in any way with the work this year.

Many generous friends have given money to the Building Fund and to the running expenses. Many have sent food, clothing, toys and furniture; many have given hours of personal service on the various entertainments and benefits, and many parish organizations have responded untiringly to the Nursery appeals.

At Christmas time a constant stream of Good Fellows went in and out of the little Nursery, all entering heavily laden, and coming out with empty hands, but with full hearts. Through the generosity of these friends every family on the Nursery list was remembered with food, clothing and toys, while the Christmas tree and the Christmas dinner made two red-letter days in the Nursery Calendar.

Many thanks are due to our good friend, Dr. E. C. Fortner, who in co-operation with Mrs. Hoehne the Matron, has brought the Nursery family through the year with increased health and vigor.

Nineteen hospital cases have been cared for in St. Luke's, Provident, Michael Reese and Wesley hospitals, and in Grove House and the Chicago Home for Convalescent Women.

Sincere appreciation is also given to our architect, Mr. John N. Tilton, who has patiently worked out the requirements of the Nursery in accordance with the limited means of the Committee, in a most satisfactory manner.

The task of placing the Nursery on a strong financial basis, by means of the membership plan has been begun most encouragingly. Twenty parishes have undertaken it with good results. If special attention can be given to this method, the Nursery will soon be secure of its maintenance, and the burden of financing it will be spread so thin among so many that no burden will be felt.

The Sunday School has had a fairly prosperous year, with a very steady attendance on the part of both teachers and pupils.

For the coming year a strong plea is made that each communicant will give a helping hand to this Nursery work, remembering that work of this kind is as much a blessing to the Church as to those mothers and little children for whom it is supported.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each parish or mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as she may designate for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually, a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

Amendment to By-Law VI. The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason, may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches.

VII. The Treasurer shall furnish bond for such amount as shall be determined by the Executive Committee, such bond to be paid for from the funds of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all parochial branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 29 East Madison Street.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
