From the Bishop, April 21, 1898.

Prayer to be used only at the organization of new branches. Set forth by the Bishop, November 14, 1901:

Almighty and Most Merciful Saviour, we hear and would obey Thy call to service, for the world is weary with many masters, and knoweth not Thy yoke which is easy and Thy burden which is light. Help us in this day of our opportunity, so soon to end, that we may serve Thee in all godly quietness and confidence, and may our hearts and hands be wholly given up to Thee who hast befriended us even unto death. To Thee and to every good work in Thy Church we humbly consecrate ourselves anew, desiring nothing so much as that all men may Love Thee, who, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, are One God, world without end. Amen.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, } ss.
COUNTY OF COOK. }

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We, the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization, we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is

"The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and to the purpose of aiding said societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the Church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporation shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio.

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-President, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be a part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers, to arrange for the organization of branches; to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

 Emma J. Hoyne, Treasurer.

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

HISTORICAL.

The Chicago branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was organized on the second of October, 1884, at Grace Church, under the fostering care of Bishop McLaren. At this meeting forty-one Parishes were represented. Stirring addresses were made by the Bishop and clergy and by Mrs. Twing, the Honorable Secretary of the General Board, and the choice of officers was most happy. Who can ever forget our first President, Mrs. Vibbert, with her warm heart, her unfailing sympathies, her gracious manner and her delicious wit? And her incomparable helpers, Mrs. Phillips, Miss Stahl, Miss Drummond, Mrs. Raymond and Mrs. Locke.

It is interesting to note that in framing the constitution as with that of our country, the Spirit of Wisdom, so guided the hearts of those who compiled it, that few changes have had to be made. It was built upon symmetrical lines and Foreign and Domestic, Colored, Indian and Diocesan Missions each had its place. The rule of having different localities and Parishes represented on the Board that the interest might be enlarged and unified prevailed from the very first. In fact except under very unusual circumstances two officers were never chosen from the same Parish, and to this we may largely attribute the immediate and widespread interest.

The reasons for the annual and semi-annual meetings have proved themselves in the passing years. The annual with its great sacramental service of worship and praise, its missionary sermon to stir our hearts up to good works, its pleasant social hour and the afternoon session for business; and the semi-annual coming as it does at the time of the General Convention, so that we may join in the great Triennial offering, though absent in body, and realize the Communion of Saints. As Miss Drummond said, "They make us more than Diocesan, they make us one with all the workers." It also gives us many opportunities to hear directly from the missionaries who are too busy to leave their Dioceses except to come to convention, but plan to give some time to telling the story of their labors to the Branches who invite them to come to them after the sessions are over.

From this promising beginning the work has gone on, sometimes falling back during periods when we have had no President, but always with a strong upward trend.

During the thirty years which expire in October, we have had but six Presidents.

But is it not an honor roll? Each one with her great individual gifts and to each the Auxiliary pays a debt of grateful love.

Space is too limited to speak of the other officers, but their virtues are written in our hearts. We must, however, mention our beloved Miss Arnold who, elected in 1888, served the longest term of any Diocesan officer.

There have been thirty annual and twenty-nine semi-annual meetings held. Monthly meetings of the Diocesan officers have obtained from the first, and in 1893, these were followed by a general meeting for all Auxiliary women in the Church club rooms. These meetings have done everything in promoting the intelligent interest in the work and we could not do without them now.

The second annual meeting was held at Grace Church following the General Convention in 1886, and at this seven hundred women were present representing forty-three Dioceses.

The most notable gathering of our own branch was held at Emmanuel Church, La Grange, in 1897, when eight hundred women answered to roll call. Many others have been nearly as large and from that time they have run from four to over seven hundred.

What these thirty years of service mean in love and self-denial, devotion and inspiration, we cannot measure. Nor yet the gifts whose increase makes us glad. But in the heart of everyone who has been privileged to do her little in God's great vineyard, I know the overpowering thought is, "How much more this work has done for me than I can ever do for it."

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

DEAR FELLOW WORKERS:

Before I make my report, I want to give you greetings from our National Secretary, Miss Julia C. Emery.

I wish to make clear to you something of the work accomplished, not only during the past year, but during the last few years, through your gifts, your interest and your prayers.

As you have listened to the Reports of Officers and Committees of the Chicago Branch Woman's Auxiliary, you have rejoiced, as I have, in the strong and vigorous conditions of our society.

I congratulate each officer and member who has so loyally and faithfully worked to keep up the high standard we have set for ourselves.

Perhaps I can appreciate better than anyone the splendid, earnest efforts of individuals and parishes, which has produced such satisfactory results.

Our Treasurer has received from 89 organizations in 82 branches, the sum of \$19,572.00, which has been distributed, as you have heard, and which indicates that the comfort of our assistance and help has extended over a large territory.

We have again paid our apportionment in full and more, besides other pledges and special gifts; and in addition have sent out many boxes.

These gratifying statistics are largely the results of the systematic methods of our Treasurer and Secretaries. The responsibility of the apportionment having been honestly and wisely distributed among the parishes, has been honestly and faithfully met by them. This is service that studies detail in the light of the vision of work to be accomplished.

With an advance in methods there has been a corresponding increase of interest. This has been shown by the splendid attendance at the Monthly Meetings in the Church Club rooms, during the past winter. The gatherings have been so large that it is obvious that a more commodious room will soon be necessary. Perhaps this need will open the way for a Diocesan House, where not only the Woman's Auxiliary but all the organizations of the Church may find shelter.

Last year the gain in membership was over 300, making our enrolled membership 3,005. This year, just closing the new membership is 737 and is found in 44 parishes. Fifteen parishes have lost 158 members, leaving us a net gain of 59, bringing our enrolled membership, not counting Juniors and Little Helpers, up to 3,594. This is good, but when one realizes that out of the 30,808 Communicants of

the Church in this Diocese, that probably 18,000 are women and girls, we must feel that we are hardly touching our resources. Of 12,000,000 women members of Protestant Churches, only 2,000,000 are actively connected with any missionary effort.

The number of Parish groups has not materially changed during the last five years, but the weak places have been strengthened and re-organized. This year five branches have been re-organized and four new groups have been received into the Auxiliary family. There are now 97 active branches, in the 114 Parishes and Missions of the Diocese. In some parishes, there are two or three Auxiliary organizations. In the Junior Department, as you have heard, there has been marked growth and development.

I feel sure that a great deal of new interest has been aroused in both the Senior and Junior branches, through the able work of our Educational Secretaries, Miss Griswold and Miss Van Schaick. Probably no greater Auxiliary service can be rendered to the Board of Missions, than to try to reach every man and woman in the Diocese with vital information, concerning the Church's Missions.

Mission Study, by every member of a class or Parish, develops intelligent knowledge of the problems which the Board of Missions sets before us for solution, and also sets free for action, forces of interest and enthusiasm, which should awaken the Church to meet her opportunities. In the Diocese of Chicago, the results of Normal classes held in January by Miss Griswold and Miss Van Schaick, was over a *thousand* women and girls studying Missions during Lent. One likes to think of the enrichment and enlightenment of the lives of these women and their Parishes.

One hundred and thirty-nine visits have been made by our Visiting Committee. Three new officers were added this year. A Field Secretary, a Delegate to Girl's Friendly meetings and conferences, and the Educational Secretary.

One hundred and eighty-five visits to parishes have been made during the year by Officers and Visiting Committees of the Auxiliary. Please let me thank you personally for the many kind invitations and opportunities given to me to know my fellow-workers. I have been encouraged and inspired by these friendly gatherings. In addition to meetings in the Auxiliary, I have attended three inter-denominational conferences. The Annual Day of Prayer, on January the ninth, in the Woman's Building of the Moody Church, where the honor of opening the Conference fell to your Representative. Later on, I took part in an all-day Missionary Meeting for all the Churches in Evanston, and on April 23rd and 24th, I had the privilege of being present at the meeting of the Federation of Women's Foreign Missionary Societies meeting in Chicago. I also took part in a Conference of Church Workers in Milwaukee.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The thirtieth Annual Meeting of the Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held May 28, 1914, in St. James' Church, Chicago.

The morning service began at 10:30 a. m., with a celebration of the Holy Communion. Bishop Anderson, Celebrant, assisted by Dr. James S. Stone, Rector, and other clergy.

The sermon was preached by the Rev. Edward A. Sibley, of Bontoc, P. I. The open offering of the morning service, amounting to \$101.25, was devoted to the work at Boncic. The United Offering was also collected at the morning service.

Address of Welcome by the Rev. Dr. James S. Stone, the Rector.

The roll was called, showing an attendance of 559 from 74 Branches.

Notice was given by Mrs. Greeley, of an amendment to the Constitution to be voted at the afternoon session.

Luncheon was served in the Parish House, and during the noon hour a reception was held for the former Presidents and other officers.

The afternoon session began at 1:45 p. m., with Mrs. Greeley in the Chair.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read, the Rev. Frank Wilson acting as Clerk, and approved.

The following reports were read by Mr. Wilson, and on motion, accepted:

1. Report of the Providence Day Nursery.
2. Report of the Monthly Meetings.
3. Report of the Visiting Committee.
4. Report of the Church Periodical Club.
5. Report of the Society for the Relief of Aged and Infirm Clergy.
6. Report of the Society for the Relief of Widows and Orphans of Clergymen.

The combined report of the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary was read by Mrs. George O. Clinch, Treasurer, and accepted on motion. Miss Eleanor Van Schaich read the report of the Junior Auxiliary, which was accepted on motion. Miss Clara C. Griswold read the report of the Educational Society and Library Committee; these reports were accepted on motion.

Mrs. Greeley then gave the President's address.

The Amendment to Article 6, Section 1, of the Constitution was then read.

It was moved by Mrs. Ruthren Dean, that the number 15 be stricken out and the number 18 substituted; the amended article to read:

"The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine nor more than eighteen members." This motion was seconded and carried.

Bishop Anderson then awarded the medals for the two prize scrap books, the first prize going to the Junior Auxiliary of Grace Church,

Oak Park, and the second prize to the Junior Auxiliary of S. Bartholomew's, Chicago. Representatives of each Auxiliary were present to receive the medals.

The election of officers followed. The following were elected:

Educational Secretary—Miss Clara C. Griswold.

The address of the afternoon was made by Bishop Anderson, who spoke on the events of the recent Diocesan Convention.

Bishop Anderson prefaced his address by a few words of appreciation of the character of the work done by the retiring president.

An invitation from St. Mark's Church, Evanston, to the Woman's Auxiliary, to hold the next Annual Meeting in that parish, was accepted by vote.

The offering of the afternoon, amounting to \$119.05, was devoted to Miss Langdon's work in Alaska.

The United Offering of the morning amounted to \$1,283.00. \$25.00 was also given to St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio, and \$25.00 to the New China Fund.

A vote of thanks was extended to the Rector of St. James, the women of the parish, and to all who had shared in the hospitality of the day.

After the singing of a hymn, the meeting was closed by Bishop Anderson, with prayers and the benediction.

Perhaps this is the time for me to mention some of the things that have helped me through doubtful or discouraged moments. I shall not forget the little band of women, who themselves cleaned the woodwork of their Church for Easter. Two or three women, taking turns of two hours each, and doing it themselves that they might save money for their Easter Offering. The Font Roll in one parish of 95 names of babies enrolled among the Little Helpers, brings tears of joy. The increase in one parish in one year of 59 members and the voluntary assuming of half-as-much again of their apportionment warms our hearts. The splendid record of a Parish sending out 83 periodicals, weekly and monthly, through the Church Periodical Club, and the 291 social calls made by an enthusiastic Auxiliary Branch during the last winter, the splendid act of a new Branch, increasing their apportionment to the Board of Missions from \$13.00 to \$110.00, together with the happy remark of a new member "how had she ever lived so many years without the Auxiliary," encourages us to feel that the Auxiliary is growing to be an inspiration in the lives of Church women, and that this is only the beginning of the time when the Auxiliary will be a force, not only within the Church, but in the Community.

Every year increases our debt to the able and generous-hearted women of the Promotion and Efficiency Committee. This year, we have called upon them for help for the luncheon for the Officers' Conference; for a sale of embroidery and lace work, held at the residence of Mrs. George S. Isham, in behalf of the Embroidery School, of the House of the Holy Child, Manilla, Phillipine Islands; and for help with the arrangements of the Stereopticon Lecture given on the Diocesan United Offering Day. We must not fail to speak of the far-reaching spiritual and intellectual help given by the Church Periodical Club.

This Society publishes its own report, but the relation between it and the Auxiliary is so close, it seems fitting to make mention here of books, magazines and libraries sent to sparsely settled districts of our country, and to hard working missionaries, whose slender salaries will not permit them to indulge in the mental refreshment of such publications.

Our report would be incomplete, if we did not remember and speak of the beautiful Presentation Service at the United Thank Offering of 1913 in October last, in the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City. The offering was over \$307,500 and together with it over 3,000 women representing the Womanhood of the Church offered themselves anew—their "souls and bodies to be a reasonable, Holy and living sacrifice" unto their Lord. Our share of the offering was a little over \$7,500. During the past year, three young women from the Diocese of Chicago, made the gift of life. Miss Helen Hendricks, of St. Paul's Parish, went to St. Hilda's School, Wuchang. Miss Ethel

Haist and Miss Louise Hammond, both from St. Luke's Parish, Evans-ton, are at work in China.

Summing up the year's work in figures, 3,594 women from 97 organizations in 84 parishes sent \$35,579.28 in money and values of boxes as follows:

Please note carefully the proportions. As a Society Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, I cannot think this is satisfactory to you. Must we continue to go on with our eyes holden, so that we cannot see beyond the confines of our own Diocese, beyond the boundaries of our own Parish, the work lying out there in the world for us to do?

Unless we escape from the blight of individualism, of thinking of ourselves first, we cannot enter freely and generously into the task set before us. The Christian ideal calls for no soft or smooth ways of living or working. Christianity breathes into the souls of men a mighty force. Then life is nothing if it be not dedicated to the ideal, and death for the ideal is sweeter than life. Such moments of re-vitalization are the flood-tide of religion, of patriotism, of freedom and of all the noble expressions of zeal.

Let us dedicate ourselves anew to this ideal. Let us rejoice in the splendid hardness of our task. Let us realize that the Woman's Auxiliary is *not* a "poor, dear thing," to be coddled and patronized, but a challenge royal to the spirit of adventure that is in the hearts of each one of us, which drives us forth upon the endless quest. Let us give thanks here today, that the darkened windows of our souls have been opened to the vision of the whole world waiting for the Christ ideal, and pray that our consciousness may be awakened to feel that to us has been entrusted the high duty of carrying to hungry souls, the light and deathlessness of the Gospel.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE
JUNIOR DEPARTMENT, 1913-1914.**

The Annual Report of the Junior Department cannot record very accurately the work of the Juniors during the year, as our effort has very largely been spent in fostering and developing the spiritual side of the organization, which cannot be expressed in figures or words. The Treasurer's and the Corresponding Secretary's reports give the financial value of the offerings that we have made; the Educational Secretary reports a very encouraging growth of interest in the study of Missions; and the President reports the united effort of the Executive Committee to bring the Junior Department to a fuller realization and the importance of its opportunities and its responsibilities; but none of these reports tell of the development in the spirit of the Department, which will, in its growth, bring about the fulfillment of its great purpose.

During the last year we have had 5 leaders' meetings, which have brought us more closely together in the vision of our work. We have held 3 sectional meetings for the Juniors, giving them the opportunity to feel the sisterhood of their organization. Our Educational Secretary has conducted a normal class of 14 members, which was followed by mission-study in 19 branches, and the making of 9 mission scrap-books, of which only 2, however, were entered in our competition. So the unity and coherence of our organization is increasing.

In numbers we grow more slowly, for, although we report 9 new branches and 3 re-organized, we have had to drop 9 branches from our roll, through lack of parish leadership, a weakness which is one of our problems. In the re-organization of our administrative work, we have laid emphasis on section III, for older girls, and we now report 5 branches of girls between 16 and 21 years of age. The Little Helpers are not yet enrolled in our Department; they have added 3 branches to their roll.

The Junior Treasurer reports that we have paid our apportionment of \$520.00 and further added \$28.60 to that amount, and have contributed \$53.58 as special gifts. Through the Corresponding Secretary we have also reported gifts amounting to \$257.00, and have recorded 62 boxes, valued at \$1,174.00.

The Committee of the Junior Department feels that the Juniors have completed a year of excellent service, with every promise of greater achievement and fuller development in the years to come; and to that end, we beg the sympathy and co-operation of the Woman's Auxiliary, to whom we look for our example.

REPORT OF THE JUNIOR EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY.

One of the greatest values of the Junior Department of the Woman's Auxiliary is that it exists only to train the young people and children to take their part in the mission of the Church. It is the men and women of the Church of tomorrow whom we must train today. The Edinburgh Conference, in stating this fact, said: "The leaders of the missionary enterprise are unanimous in their judgment as to the imperative importance of interesting the boyhood and girlhood of the Churches in the work of foreign missions. It is coming to be recognized as a scientific fact that the future depends upon the education of the childhood of the race in missionary matters as in all others."

It was because they believed in these great truths that the officers of the Junior Department established the Educational work in Chicago. As a beginning a Normal Study Class was held in the spring of 1914, using as a text-book the new Junior book on China, Chin Hsing. As a result of this class, twelve branches studied the work of our Church in China. Seven branches studied Domestic Missions. While this is a most encouraging report for the first year's work, the officers feel that all our Juniors should take part in this most interesting department of the Juniors' work.

Next year, in addition to the mission text-books, the course will include lessons on the making of articles for the Christmas boxes, as the officers feel that the Juniors should learn that activity follows prayer and study.

REPORT OF THE MONTHLY MEETINGS.

The increased attendance at the Monthly Meetings of the past year indicates the growing interest of our women in the work of the Auxiliary. There have been eight meetings, with an average attendance of 140.

The offerings have been \$540.67.

An average of 43 branches have been represented, this also being a gain over last year.

The class of presidents conducted by Mrs. Greeley in September proved helpful and instructive. There were 38 present.

About 300 women gathered at the Cathedral for the annual Quiet Day on September 29th, which was conducted by Bishop Anderson.

The Officers' Conference in February was a large and enthusiastic meeting with an attendance of 140.

The Executive Board has held 11 meetings.

**REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY
AND THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE.**

During the past year the Educational Secretary has visited eleven (11) parishes in the diocese, to awaken interest and give information in regard to Missionary Education.

On eight consecutive Fridays, January 9 to February 27, inclusive, the Educational Secretary held a Normal Class for Leaders in the Church Club Rooms. The text book used was "The Emergency in China," by Dr. Pott, president of St. John's University, Shanghai, supplemented by the books published by the Board of Missions to give more detailed information as to the work of our own Church in China. Fifteen were enrolled for this class, and the average attendance was twelve.

Letters addressed about a month ago to the ninety-five (95) parish branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese have been answered in fifty-eight (58) instances, giving the following record:

There has been some sort of Missionary Education in thirty-one (31) parishes. Of these ten (10) have had Study Classes on the regular subject for the year's work—China—with a total enrollment of one hundred and forty-eight (148) members. Fourteen (14) parishes have held Program Missionary Meetings on various subjects, with an attendance of three hundred and ten (310). Seven (7) parishes have had some sort of Reading Circle—in two instances the Rector was the reader at Lenten services. As some of these last have not reported the number in attendance, it is only possible to estimate that there were about one hundred (100) in the "Circles."

None of these figures are very exact, as some branches reported the average, and some the largest attendance, but certainly over five hundred and fifty (550) of our more than three thousand (3,000) active Auxiliary members have had some Missionary Education during the past year—about one in six.

In this connection the Library has been of less use than might have been hoped, partly because it does not contain many up-to-date books for reference in regard to present conditions in the Mission fields, and only three new ones have been added during the year. Most books of this sort are rather high priced, but if each parish branch of the Woman's Auxiliary would contribute each year one recently published book, we should soon have a fine collection, which would prove of great value to the constantly increasing number of students and readers on such subjects.

VISITING COMMITTEE.

The Spring Meeting of the Visiting Committee was held on May 21st, at the residence of Mrs. Robert Gregory, in Highland Park, following a luncheon. Mrs. Greeley presided. Eleven members were present and three guests. The minutes of the Autumn Meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. Greeley reported 139 visits made by members of the Committee during the year. Fifty-one parishes were visited, some of them having from three to six visits, others only one, and a number of addresses were made at inter-denominational meetings and associations of various kinds.

It is the purpose and aim of the Visiting Committee to spread information and instruction regarding the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, and its work for the year has brought most satisfying results.

The reports of members present seemed to indicate that while there were a few discouraging meetings, these were a very small number compared to the enthusiasm of the majority.

One new branch has been organized, and one re-organized, during the year. Miss Griswold reported the growth of Missionary Education everywhere, and

the stimulating effect of the summer conferences in preparation for class work of next year.

Mrs. Greeley spoke with interest of the classes at Lake Geneva, and asked that each Parish send one delegate.

Over one thousand women and girls studied Missions in China in this Diocese last year, as the result of the work of the Educational Secretaries, Miss Griswold and Miss Van Schaick.

Deaconess Clare told of the eagerness of the women in many parishes she had visited for the first time, to learn of the Auxiliary and the work the Church is doing.

It was moved, seconded and carried, that the Secretary be instructed to write to officers of branches, asking that appointments be made for members of the Committee.

On motion the meeting adjourned.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each Parish or Mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the Diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as she may designate for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually, a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

Amendment to By-Law VI. The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason, may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches.

VII. The Treasurer shall furnish bond for such amount as shall be determined by the Executive Committee, such bond to be paid for from the funds of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

The Semi-Annual Meeting is held in the autumn, generally in October, the date being fixed by the president, and due notice being given to all parochial branches.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 29 East Madison Street.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary, are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
