From the Bishop, April 21, 1898.

Prayer to be used only at the organization of new branches. Set forth by the Bishop, November 14, 1901:

Almighty and Most Merciful Saviour, we hear and would obey Thy call to service, for the world is weary with many masters, and knoweth not Thy yoke which is easy and Thy burden which is light. Help us in this day of our opportunity, so soon to end, that we may serve Thee in all godly quietness and confidence, and may our hearts and hands be wholly given up to Thee who hast befriended us even unto death. To Thee and to every good work in Thy Church we humbly consecrate ourselves anew, desiring nothing so much as that all men may Love Thee, who, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, are One God, world without end. Amen.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, }
COUNTY OF COOK. } ss.

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We, the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization, we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is

"The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and to the purpose of aiding said societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the Church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporation shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio.

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-President, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be a part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers, to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

We have listened with interest and thankfulness to the report of work done by the various officers and Committees of our organization, and we have just cause for rejoicing in the healthy development, its increasing efficiency, its growing sense of responsibility.

The fact that we have again more than met our apportionment fills us with a great sense of satisfaction and confidence that this good record will always be maintained. While we still fall somewhat short of our full obligation toward the Assistant City Missionaries, the deficit this year was less than last, and we feel sure that in the year just opening, the Auxiliary will unite in an effort to discharge in full this pledge, which is our contribution to the work of the Deaconesses and Sisters at the Mission House.

There has been little change in our membership enrollment during the year, small gains here and losses there keeping our numbers about the same.

One or two items, gleaned from the 68 postals received in reply to requests for statistics, are interesting to note: In 25 Branches there has been a gain of 225 members; in 19 a loss of 219; but of this loss, 96 are in 3 Branches, one reporting 43, another 36 fewer members than last year. That these changes may be caused by reorganization, and not by lessening interest, we dare to believe, when the statistics of pledges show that 36 Branches have increased their gifts over those of last year, while only 6 have fallen behind, and the net gain in pledges was more than \$160.00.

A splendid growth in the Junior Department is shown in the addition of 14 new Branches, and their record is one of which they and we may well be proud. The formation of Section III, or the Young Woman's Auxiliary, marks a long step forward along this line, supplying the much-needed link between the work for children and that of the women, and we heartily welcome this new daughter into our Auxiliary family. As has been often said, in the Junior Auxiliary lies the hope of our future, and we must rejoice to see that hope daily grow brighter.

Several changes have taken place in the Executive Committee, the first occasioned by the resignation of Miss Arnold, who felt obliged to give up the work after many years of faithful and devoted service. Her helpful counsel and sound judgment have been sorely missed.

Early in the year, Miss Mary Morrell, our Recording Secy., was forced by the pressure of other duties to resign the position she had filled so efficiently, and we were fortunate to secure in her place, Miss

Margaret Field, who had been elected Asst. Cor.-Secy., and kindly consented to undertake as well the work given up by Miss Morrell.

The plan of having 3 Vice-Presidents, in charge respectively, of the Northern, Southern and Western District, has proved thus far most successful, and I hope during the coming year, more of the Branches will invite their own special Vice-Presidents to visit them, and become better acquainted.

It is safe to say that Mission Study has grown to a recognized part of Auxiliary work in this Diocese, largely owing to the untiring labors of our Educational Secys., whose intelligent, unselfish and devoted work has borne fruit in increasing numbers of women enlisted in Normal and Study Classes, entering with enthusiasm into work which meant research, application and hard study at home as well as the weekly hour spent in class, and could not fail to deepen and vitalize their interest in the whole great subject.

It is a great satisfaction to know that larger use than ever has been made of the Visiting Committee this year, as their report, together with that of the Officers show more than 200 visits, touching fairly distant parts of the Diocese. These visits mean not only a missionary paper or talk, but the exchange of ideas, and the stimulus on both sides of coming into contact with people working for a common cause in different environment from their own, and I hope that this year some of the more distant Branches will arrange neighborhood meetings, and invite one or two members of the Visiting Committee, so that there may be some short talks and much friendly intercourse.

Besides Aux. visits among our own Branches, I have attended two interdenominational missionary meetings, in January and April, in October went to Detroit to take part in the Conference of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Province of the Mid-West, and during this present month I have attended a meeting in Kenosha, Wis., of the Milwaukee Branch, and the Annual meeting of the Iowa Branch, held in Des Moines.

On Feb. 2nd, I called a meeting in the Church Club Rooms, of Women Members of Missionary Committees, asking them to come prepared to make suggestions as to methods of raising the Parish Apportionments. Though the attendance was small, ten women representing seven Parishes, the discussion was interesting, and, I believe, profitable. It is hoped that more women will be appointed this year on these Committees, and that their co-operation will prove effective and valuable.

We have had the opportunity of hearing two notable Missionary speakers during the year, the Rev. Chas. E. Betticher, who came in January, and gave several inspiring addresses at neighborhood meetings arranged by the Woman's Auxiliary on the Church's work in Alaska, and on March 17th, Mrs. Charles R. Pancoast, of Philadelphia, spoke morning

and afternoon to the members of the Woman's Auxiliary, and in the evening gave a stereopticon lecture before a general gathering, all on the subject of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo. This is the great international opportunity which is being offered to the Church in America, and those of you who heard Mrs. Pancoast, can not fail to have been stirred by her appeal, which has well been called "a message and a challenge from the Land of the Rising Sun."

Much work has been done in behalf of the United Offering, many visits made, and nearly 800 boxes distributed, which bare statement does not half do justice to the time, the strength and devotion which have been so unstintedly given, not only by the Dioecesan Director, but by many of the Parochial officers. The result of their labors will be shown as the months go by, but when I recall that in one Parish, not large, house-to-house visits were made, a blue box and a Leaflet telling the story left at each one, and when the boxes were gathered in again, the total offering was found to be five times as great as it had ever been before, then I think we may "thank God and take courage." What has been done there may be done anywhere, given the woman to do it, and I believe there are many who would offer for this service.

If this plan were faithfully carried out in all our Branches, we should no longer deserve the kindly reproach conveyed to me in a letter from Miss Emery last week, which showed that our last United Offering of \$7,500.00, which seemed rather large to us, meant an average gift of 18 cents per year from each woman Communicant in the Diocese. Surely not a just measure of our thankfulness. I must not fail to speak of the urgent appeal which has come from the Board of Missions, that every member of our Church should contribute one day's income or wage, toward the \$400,000 needed to make up the deficit in the treasury of the Board. One half of our open offerings today will be devoted to this purpose, and I ask you to take this message home and urge your friends in the Auxiliary and the Parish to send their gifts to this Emergency Fund.

In concluding this report, I thank you everyone in behalf of the Executive Committee for your loyal, faithful work of the past year, for your generous response and your ready co-operation; and in my own behalf, I thank you for your patience with my inexperience and my mistakes. For the whole Woman's Auxiliary I desire to take this occasion to thank our kindest friend, the Bishop, whose understanding sympathy has never failed to strengthen and encourage us. Let us go forth into the work of a new year with a deepening sense of our responsibilities, a greater joy in our opportunities and a strong determination, God helping us, to make of the Woman's Auxiliary a spiritual force that shall be felt in the Community, in the Church, and in the great field which is the world.

ANNUAL MEETING, 1915.

The thirty-first Annual Meeting of the Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held May 27th, 1915, in St. Mark's Church, Evanston.

The roll was called before luncheon, showing an attendance of 737 representing 64 Branches.

Mr. C. V. Vickrey, Secretary of the Missionary Educational Movement, spoke a few moments on the Silver Bay and Lake Geneva Conferences.

The report of the Junior Auxiliary was read by Miss Houghteling, and that of the Educational Secretary by Miss Griswold. Both reports were accepted on motion.

Mrs. Kirkland read the report of the Monthly Meetings, which showed a gain in attendance and a decrease in offerings. The report was accepted on motion; also the following, which were read by the Rev. Frank Wilson:

The President's annual address followed, in which she spoke of the steady growth and development of the work during the past year, mentioning especially the formation of the Young Woman's Auxiliary.

Mrs. Lawrence told, in a most touching way, of the gift to the "Church Home for the Aged," in memory of Mr. T. E. Wells, as a direct answer to prayer.

Bishop Anderson then awarded the medals for the two prize scrap books, the first prize going to the Junior Auxiliary of St. Bartholomew's Church, Englewood, and the second prize to the Junior Branch of the Church of the Transfiguration, Chicago. Representatives of each Auxiliary were present to receive the medals. The "Church of the Holy Communion," at Maywood, and "Emmanuel Church," of La Grange, received honorable mention.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE
JUNIOR DEPARTMENT, 1914-1915.**

The Junior year came to an end last Saturday, May 22nd, at its Annual meeting at St. Martin's Church, Austin. The reports were read, and exhibits were shown, and at the afternoon session the Juniors had the privilege of hearing Miss Grider, our missionary in charge of St. Mark's Mission, Nenana, Alaska, and of meeting Laura, the Indian girl, whom she had brought out with her for a year. The roll-call showed an attendance of 120, including Juniors from 21 branches, officers and visitors. The reports submitted at that meeting gave the results of our year's work in figures, as follows: We have paid our pledges to the Board of Missions, \$327 for General Missions, and \$100 each to our special scholarships in Alaska and Honolulu. We have also given \$64.74 in special gifts through the Treasurer, and \$298.40 in gifts direct to the recipients. We have sent 63 boxes valued at \$1,182.71. We report 7 regular Leaders' meetings, beginning with a conference in September, with Miss Thomas of Detroit as our guest and speaker, and ending with a meeting April 17th, when we were happy to have Miss Grace Lindley of the Church Missions House with us.

Our Educational Secretary held six classes for leaders, organized the scrap-book competition, which included 8 books as against 2 last year, and reported to New York 11 study classes, 3 reading circles, and 10 Mission study meetings.

In making up the records of our numbers, we find on our books 55 branches, not including the Little Helpers, who are reported separately, a gain of 11 new or reorganized branches. Of this number, 5 are inactive, but 3 have promised re-organization next autumn.

The Junior Executive Committee has been increased in size and in strength by the addition of three Vice-Presidents, in charge of 3 geographical districts, divided along the same lines as those of the Woman's Auxiliary. A sectional meeting was held in each district in November, to foster the sentiment of fellowship and co-operation which we are so eager to strengthen and vitalize.

Perhaps the most important development in the Junior Department this year has been the organization of Section III into the Young Woman's Auxiliary. We have for many years had several branches of girls of high school age and over, but not until this year have we formed a definite group for them. In January a meeting, under the leadership of Mrs. DeWitt, our Vice-President in charge of Section III, was held in the Church Club Rooms, to which girls both in and out of the Junior Department were invited, and the Young Woman's Auxiliary was then organized among the 84 girls present. The branch includes both individuals and parish branches, as our plan has been to work through the

individual to the parish branch, where there is not already some organization. To this end we have held bi-weekly meetings in the Church Club Rooms, with Mission study, Parliamentary Law, and Bible talks, all to train the young women to go into their parishes to lead in the formation of Auxiliary groups there. The closing meeting was addressed by the Bishop and numbered 80 members, a very promising force with which to begin our work next year in the 30 parishes that have been represented at these meetings and in the Diocese in general.

Another significant activity has recently been launched under the auspices of the Junior Department, although not exclusively a Junior movement. A committee of young women of the Diocese, with the Junior Department behind them, has organized a campaign to raise a fund of money to be given to the building fund of the Children's Ward of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, to which all the young people of the Church are asked to contribute. On the 17th of April Miss Grace Lindley addressed a meeting of 90 young women on the subject of the Hospital, arousing in them such interest that \$1,000 was pledged, to be paid January 1, 1916. This movement will, we hope, interest in Missions and in the Auxiliary many young women who have never before taken any active part in such work.

These facts and figures show an encouraging growth in numbers and in interest among the Juniors; yet more important perhaps than our numerical and financial development is the spirit of co-operation and mutual understanding that is growing up among us. Both leaders and Juniors seem to feel more and more the relationship of each branch to all the others, to the Woman's Auxiliary, and to all Mission work. As we feel that the purpose of our organization is largely educational, we hope that this increasing sense of responsibility and co-operation, together with our increasing numbers, will mean much to the Church in the future.

**REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL WORK OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY
1914-1915.**

In January, 1915, six meetings were held for Junior Leaders, at which the subject of interesting children in missions was discussed. Twenty-three leaders attended. Later twenty-four branches took up some form of mission study. As a result of their study, several branches made models of the missions in which they were most interested. These models were well worked out and showed better than a written examination the impressions that the children had received. Among the models should be mentioned that of the mission at Nenana, Alaska, made by the Juniors at the Church of the Transfiguration, the Philippine models made by the Juniors at St. Thomas', Chicago, and the Holy Communion, Maywood, and the Chinese paper dolls, made by the branch at St. Ambrose, Chicago Heights.

Nine branches entered the "Missionary Scrap-book" contest. The gold medal was won by the Juniors of St. Bartholomew's, and the silver medal by the Juniors of the Church of the Transfiguration. Prizes were also won by the Juniors in the following parishes: St. Mark's, Evanston; the Holy Communion, Maywood; and Emmanuel Church, La Grange.

The books studied by the different branches were: Building the City, Good Bird, the Indian, The Conquest of the Continent, and Winners of the World. Several leaders made use of missionary articles in both the Young Churchman and the Spirit of Missions.

REPORT OF MONTHLY MEETINGS.

Eight meetings have been held in the Church Club Rooms during the year at which programs designed to illustrate the work of the Auxiliary in its various branches have been given. We are glad to report a gain in the attendance, both in the number of delegates and in the branches represented, but there is a very perceptible decrease in the offerings. Possibly this may be accounted for by the financial stringency of this year and the unusual demands for charity, at home and abroad, that have come to every one.

The average attendance has been 146 from 44 branches.

The offerings have been \$282.00.

Beside the monthly meetings we have had the privilege of a most helpful Quiet Day, conducted by the Rev. J. H. Hopkins, in the Cathedral, on September 29th. There was an attendance of 100, the offering of \$20.00 being given to the Sisters of St. Mary.

There were 130 delegates to the Officers' Conference, held in February, a meeting that is gaining every year in significance and usefulness.

Three meetings were held in March in the interest of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, Mrs. Charles R. Pancoast being the speaker. The Executive Board has held 10 meetings.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY AND THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE.

If we hold to the proverb, "figures cannot lie," we shall be obliged to conclude that Mission Study has retrograded rather than progressed during the past year, for, according to the forty-seven (47) replies resulting from ninety-six (96) requests for a report, sent out by the Educational Secretary, only twenty-four (24) parishes have done anything in that line this year, against thirty-one (31) last year, with a total enrollment of one hundred (100) less—four hundred and fifty (450).

In one respect, however, the figures are larger. The Educational Secretary has visited eighteen (18) parish branches, seven (7) more than last year, and all but one for the first time, and though it has been a great disappointment to have no work done in the several parishes where something was accomplished the year before, nevertheless the prospects for next year seem bright, for many branches show interest and promise to have a class next winter.

The majority of classes have followed the course prescribed by the Missionary Education Movement and our Church Educational Department. "The Social Force of Christian Missions," with great interest, though a few have studied other subjects. This was the course used in the Normal Class of fifteen (15) members that met on six Fridays between the Epiphany and Lent.

The suggestion, made a year ago, that each parish branch should contribute one more book to the Library each year, has been followed in only one instance; however, there are a few new books in the Library, but it is discouraging that so few care to borrow and read them. The circulation during the year is really too small to report—only ten books out of over one hundred, with more than three thousand women enrolled in the Chicago Branch of the Auxiliary.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each Parish or Mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the Diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as she may designate for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually, a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

Amendment to By-Law VI. The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason, may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches.

VII. The Treasurer shall furnish bond for such amount as shall be determined by the Executive Committee, such bond to be paid for from the funds of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 29 East Madison Street.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary, are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
