From the Bishop, April 21, 1898.

Prayer to be used only at the organization of new branches. Set forth by the Bishop, November 14, 1901:

Almighty and Most Merciful Saviour, we hear and would obey Thy call to service, for the world is weary with many masters, and knoweth not Thy yoke which is easy and Thy burden which is light. Help us in this day of our opportunity, so soon to end, that we may serve Thee in all godly quietness and confidence, and may our hearts and hands be wholly given up to Thee who hast befriended us even unto death. To Thee and to every good work in Thy Church we humbly consecrate ourselves anew, desiring nothing so much as that all men may Love Thee, who, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, are One God, world without end. Amen.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, }ss.
COUNTY OF COOK. }

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We, the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization, we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is

"The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and to the purpose of aiding said societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the Church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporation shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio.

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-President, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be a part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers, to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

Emma J. Hoyne, Treasurer.

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is inevitable that reports should consist largely of figures and statistics, and such facts presented so simply and modestly as they have been today, unless we read between the lines, seem to tell a plain and everyday story, without striking effect. But many of you have felt some personal knowledge of the work which has been accounted for, and you know that these reports stand for something far beyond what figures can ever tell; they mean personal service, offered with unflagging enthusiasm and sustained through months of effort. It is this spirit of unselfish devotion, inspiring these leaders of our various activities and your faithful co-operation with them, which enables us to present so trustworthy a record of accomplished work.

Early in the fall, the Executive Board lost a valued member in the resignation of Mrs. Belding, who found herself unable to serve as Vice-President in charge of the Western District. Mrs. Edwin J. Randall was elected to fill this position, and has brought us much inspiration, and we have been happy to add to the Committee a new officer in the Director of the Young Woman's Auxiliary, Miss Harriot Houghteling. The Board owes a debt of gratitude to Mrs. Bailey, who, during the prolonged absence from town of Miss Field, very kindly undertook and most efficiently fulfilled the duties of Recording Secretary, in addition to those belonging to her own office as Assistant, Corresponding Secretary.

At the Officers' Conference of last year, it was resolved to increase our apportionment to the Board of Missions by \$500.00, to assure ourselves that we were moving forward and not merely "marking time," and feeling sure we could count on the response of our Parish Branches. You have already heard how loyally and readily they rose to this larger obligation, so that the increased apportionment has been paid, with something over.

Early in the fall we learned that our own beloved missionary in Alaska, Miss Langdon, owing to lack of funds, would be unable to complete the rebuilding of her little hospital at Tanana, which had been destroyed by fire. When her letter, telling of this great disappointment, was read to the women gathered together for one of our monthly meetings, the response was immediate, and in ten minutes the needed amount of \$425 was pledged and the rebuilding of the little hospital assured. Nor was this our only special of the year, as the joy which that first effort brought seemed to quicken a spirit of giving, and this spring various Branches have joined in raising \$400.00 for the salary of a missionary in the mining town of Roslyn, Washington—this last a token of affection for Bishop Page. I speak particularly of these special gifts in order to amplify some items of the Treasurer's Report

that we may all rejoice in having been able to take a somewhat larger share than usual in the great work to which we are pledged.

New Branches have been organized during the year at St. Paul's Church, De Kalb, and St. Peter's, Sycamore, both of which, under splendid leadership, have already formed Mission Study Classes and taken up work with intelligence and enthusiasm, and we have also added a new and vigorous member to our list in St. Timothy's Church, Chicago, which has decided, with the Rector's approval, to form its Parish Guild into a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

At the time of the Mid-West Provincial Synod in October, there was held a Conference of representatives of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Province, and the Chicago Branch had the pleasure of entertaining 33 delegates from 10 dioceses. At this meeting, held in the Cathedral, it was resolved that this body should form an organization under the name of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Province of the Mid-West, which should meet at the same time and place as the Provincial Synod. A simple form of constitution was adopted and one officer elected, a Secretary-Treasurer, to conduct all necessary correspondence and receive the dues of \$5.00 from each Diocesan Branch.

In February the yearly Officers' Conference took place, attended by 125 women, the general subject for discussion being—our weaknesses; our failures; our inability to grasp larger opportunities; our lack of appeal to the indifferent and uninterested woman. This attempt to face and to analyze our own shortcomings proved to be a wholesome experiment in calling forth so many helpful and constructive suggestions, that it seems certain to result in a definite strengthening of the weak spots in our work.

At this Conference it was decided that each Branch be asked to send a representative to the M. E. Conference at Lake Geneva this summer (paying her expenses when necessary), and I am happy to say that several such delegates have already been appointed, so that we have reason to hope for a good representation of the Woman's Auxiliary at this Conference, and may confidently expect next year's work to show the effect of the deepening and broadening of missionary interest among our women.

Our always deep interest in Alaska Missions made us specially prize the opportunity of having several neighborhood meetings of the Auxiliary addressed by Arch-deacon Stuck. These were arranged on the North, South and West Sides, to enable as many as possible of our women to hear his profoundly moving story, and no one who heard can ever forget the ringing charge—"Only one direct command have we from our Lord—to go into all the world and preach the Gospel."

As this was the last full year for gathering the United Offering of 1916, we have made a great effort to put the subject before every woman in the Auxiliary, in order that no one should miss the happiness of sharing in our gift of love and thankfulness. It was not actually possible to reach every Branch in the diocese by word of mouth, as some were unable, from illness among their members or other disability, to arrange a meeting, but the Director of the United Offering and the Committee who assisted her did succeed in taking the personal message to more than 60 Branches, in some of the more distant places speaking to a group of women from several parishes who had gathered together for the purpose. About 1,400 boxes were given out, with Leaflets and Prayer-cards, and on this last aspect of the Offering we have laid more stress than ever before. At every meeting the women have been asked to pledge themselves to pray daily for the United Offering, and surely we have a right to expect that these faithful prayers will bring God's blessing upon our gift of love. Let us have it on our hearts during these summer months, continuing to make our gifts of thankfulness, so that when October sees the final gathering in of the United Offering, we may send to the Triennial Meeting a gift which should be a true expression of our gratitude for God's great mercies to us—Church-women of America. This brings me to the word I would leave with you in closing this brief sketch of our year's accomplishments. Last week I heard of a Junior Branch where each member had pledged herself to pause at the noon hour every day and say "Thy Kingdom Come"—This thought has been repeating itself in my mind and heart ever since. Here in our Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, we do work—we do give—but **do we pray?**

I believe if our whole Auxiliary life were more permeated with the spirit of prayer, daily, earnest, heartfelt prayer, that our plain tasks would be glorified, our poor gifts sanctified, our weak efforts for the spread of Christ's Kingdom infinitely blessed, and that each woman of us would feel a deepened sense of fellowship with Him, whose we are and whom we serve.

ANNUAL MEETING, 1916.

The thirty-second Annual Meeting of the Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held May 25, 1916, in St. Chrysostom's Church, Chicago.

The morning service began at 10:30 with a celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishop Anderson, Celebrant, assisted by Dr. Hutton, Rector, and Rev. G. A. MacWhorter, the Curate. The interesting sermon of the morning was preached by Dr. G. H. Thomas, of St. Paul's Church, Kenwood.

The offerings of the morning and afternoon were divided between General Missions and Diocesan Missions. At the morning service the United Offering was presented, amounting to \$3,219.31.

Dr. Hutton gave a most gracious address of welcome and the 554 members and guests from 66 parishes present adjourned to the Parish House for luncheon.

The afternoon session began at 1:45 with our President, Mrs. Butler, in the chair.

The Secretary read the report of the last meeting and it was accepted on motion. The Treasurer read her report and that of the Corresponding Secretary. Both reports were approved.

The report of the Junior Auxiliary was read by Miss Lydia Brown; the report of the first year of the Young Woman's Auxiliary by Miss Houghteling and that of the Little Helpers by Mrs. Henry Mason. Miss Griswold, the Educational Secretary, read a most encouraging report, showing an increase of 50% in work and interest. The Rev. Mr. Wilson read the following reports, which were accepted on motion:

The Secretary read a Spring Message to all the Auxiliaries from Miss Emery in New York. The President and Vice-President of the California Branch of the Auxiliary, Mrs. Monteagle, and Mrs. MacLeish, the latter an old member of our Diocesan Branch, gave us most enthusiastic and stirring talks of the work being done by the Western Dioceses, and the many women helping them from the Diocese of Chicago.

Following the collection of the offering and the singing of the Doxology, the Rev. E. L. Andrews, of St. Peter's Community, Abashiri, Japan, told us of his struggles to earn a living and start the first self-

supporting Community in Northern Japan. He also spoke of the great need for native Priests and asked for assistance to make the continuation of his work possible.

The President's report followed. In it she made reference to the increased apportionment, the money raised in ten minutes for Miss Langdon's work in Alaska, the money sent to Bishop Page for "Roslyn in the Snows," the forming of three new Branches, and the many enthusiastic meetings held during the year in different parishes.

Bishop Anderson then took the chair, and awarded the following prizes to the Junior Auxiliaries having made the most attractive scrap books during the year:

Mrs. Butler thanked the women of St. Chrysostoms for their hospitality. An invitation to hold the next Annual Meeting at St. Paul's, Kenwood, was read and accepted.

The annual day of prayer is to be held September 29, St. Michael's and All Angels' day at the Cathedral.

The Rev. H. W. Prince spoke a few words in behalf of the Lake Geneva Conference.

After the benediction, the meeting adjourned on motion.

**REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY AND THE
LIBRARY COMMITTEE.**

Though, of course, no Educational Secretary is likely ever to be satisfied with the interest in Mission Study shown in her diocese, still there is no doubt that the reports received this year from the various parishes and missions are distinctly encouraging, showing, as they do, an increase over last year of very nearly fifty per cent.

It does not seem possible to make the figures very exact, since it is hard to classify some of the work done under any one of the three heads—Mission Study Classes, Mission Study Meetings and Reading Circles—but something has been reported from thirty-six (36) branches, some of which had been so modest that their good deeds were unsuspected until the filled-in blanks were returned, and in several of these more than one method was made use of.

Beside two classes for Leaders conducted by the Educational Secretary, Mrs. Greeley held a Normal Class for members of the Young Woman's Auxiliary, for which she prepared an original course on Missions to the Indians. The Educational Secretary also held a three days' Institute in Aurora, hoping to reach many branches in the Fox River Valley district, but only two besides Aurora sent representatives to the Class.

There is cause for congratulation in the fact that there have been many more Study Classes than ever before, three hundred and two (302) out of the grand total of six hundred and seventy-one (671) having been enrolled in them, for there seems no doubt that this is the best method for increasing intelligent interest in Missions. Several parishes which desired to organize a Class reported that they had no Leader, and through the kindness of the Junior Educational Secretary and some ex-leaders from other parishes it was possible to supply their needs. It does seem strange that some of our strongest city parishes should not number a Leader among the Auxiliary members.

The text books most used were "The Why and How of Foreign Missions," "Japan Advancing—Whither?" and "The Conquest of the Continent."

There is also more interest manifested in Summer Conferences than ever before, which gives reason to hope that we shall be well represented at Lake Geneva this summer.

A few books from the Woman's Auxiliary Library in the Church Club Rooms have been used, chiefly as supplementary reading in Study Classes, and about half a dozen new ones have been added. Probably most of those who would be interested in Missionary literature have been engaged in definite study, and not had time for more reading.

Altogether we may "thank God and take courage."

REPORT OF MONTHLY MEETINGS, YEAR 1915-1916.

Eight meetings have been held in the Church Club rooms during the year, the attendance of 1,350 showing a gain over last year, both in delegates and number of branches.

The average attendance has been 168 from 46 branches.

The offerings have amounted to \$456.47, an average of \$57.05 per meeting.

The money has been given to three objects in the Diocese and five outside.

The Quiet Day conducted by the Right Reverend J. N. McCormick, Bishop of Western Michigan, on September 29th, was an inspiration to us as we began our year's work. The attendance was 185. The offering of \$43 36 was given to the Sisters of St. Mary.

At the sixth meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Province of the Midwest, held in the Cathedral in October, there was an attendance of 193, of whom 33 were delegates from 10 Dioceses. The offering at the morning service of \$20.00 was added to the United Offering.

The Officers' Conference, held in February, with an attendance of 150, was one of the most useful meetings of the year.

The Executive Board has held 10 meetings.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF THE VICE PRESIDENT IN CHARGE OF THE
JUNIOR DEPARTMENT, 1915-1916.**

The Junior Auxiliary of the Diocese of Chicago completed its year's work at the Annual Meeting, held on Saturday, May 20th, at the Church of the Epiphany. After a morning of reports our afternoon session opened with a program by the Juniors, followed by an interesting talk by Miss Helen Hendricks about St. Hilda's School, China, from which she has recently returned. There was a total attendance at this meeting of 157, including representatives as Juniors, leaders or visitors from 21 parishes.

For the year's work our treasurer, Mrs. Spence, reported that we have met our apportionment of \$325.00 to General Missions and paid \$102.00 on our Anvik, Alaska, Scholarship and \$101.00 on our Honolulu Scholarship, besides giving \$81.50 in special gifts.

For our box work Mrs. Easton reported that 48 branches shared in the work, 3,227 gifts were sent, 49 boxes inside the Diocese, and 67 outside, a total of 115 boxes valued at \$1,596.23. Money not sent through the Treasurer, amounted to \$96.50, so that the Corresponding Secretary concludes her report with a total value of \$1,692.73.

In regard to the educational work, our Secretary, Miss Van Schaick, reported that 23 branches have notified her that some form of missionary study has taken place in their parish this year. There were six scrap books in the prize contest, and an institute of three days was held at the Church Club Rooms, at which the attendance was good. Miss Van Schaick has herself made six visits among the branches.

The South Side Vice-President, Miss Pardee, reported seven visits, the North Side, Mrs. Phillips, two. Under the leadership of the Vice-Presidents this year there was a combined South and West Side Sectional meeting held November 27th, at the Church of the Epiphany, that had an attendance of 58 children, 12 grown people from 8 parishes. A Christmas stocking valued at \$25.00 was filled for the work of Deaconess Clare. The following Saturday the North Side Sectional meeting took place at St. Luke's, Evanston, and reported an attendance of 75 children from 6 branches and their stocking to the Deaconess amounted to a value of \$15.00.

Besides these meetings there have been 8 Executive meetings for the Junior Diocesan Officers and six (6) regular leaders meetings with a total attendance of 74.

The report of the President's work is as follows:

She has written something over 150 letters, made 30 telephone calls, attended 40 meetings, visited 11 branches, established 12 new branches: St. Stephen's Mission, St. Mark's, Chicago; St. Alban's, De Kalb; St.

Christopher's, Oak Park; Elgin; Dixon; La Salle; Grays Lake; Trinity, Chicago; Cicero; Glen Ellyn; and reorganized two old ones: All Saints, Chicago, and Christ, Chicago. She reported 63 branches in the books, of which 48 are active, 8 unaffiliated, but working on boxes or sending money, 7 are dormant, due in most cases to a temporary lack of leadership.

In conclusion, despite the loss of 8 branches, more or less closely allied with the Juniors, that have this year definitely affiliated with the Y. W. A., we can confidently speak of growth in all branches of the work. At this time the President wishes to take the opportunity of thanking those members of the Woman's Auxiliary who have so kindly entertained the Juniors or their officers, those who have served so faithfully as leaders; but above all she wishes to express her gratitude to those who, acting as the Executive Committee of the Juniors, have through their untiring energy and enthusiastic work made possible this growth and extension.

YOUNG WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT.

The Young Woman's Auxiliary rounded out the first complete year of its existence on Saturday, May 27th, when, at 10:30, we met at the Cathedral for our first Corporate Communion, followed by a business meeting and a missionary address. Therefore we beg the Woman's Auxiliary to look upon the record of these 16 months since our organization as a promise rather than as an achievement; for we hope for great things and our accomplishment has been small. We owe much to the Junior Auxiliary, for most of our parish branches have come from that department, and in return we hope to render real service to them, as one of our most devoted and efficient members is going to assume the responsibility of leadership among them next year. As you consider the report of the Junior Department, will you please bear in mind that a certain part of their financial support was diverted to the Young Woman's Auxiliary when their older branches entered that department, and appreciate the success of their effort to make up this loss in order to meet their pledges?

Last summer, through the effort of Mrs. De Witt, the Young Woman's Auxiliary was able to send four delegates, under the leadership of Miss Aimee Drake, to the Lake Geneva Conference. These girls have since then been constantly ready to give their time and thought to the Auxiliary as members of the Committee on Organization. Miss Drake has gone out to teach in St. Hilda's School, Wuchang, China, and, although we cannot assert that the incentive to go into the mission field came through the Young Woman's Auxiliary, yet we are proud to claim her as ours. We are organizing a campaign to send our members to the Conference at Lake Geneva this July.

The Executive Committee of the Young Woman's Auxiliary did not plan to hold central meetings at any regular intervals this year, because our members are so variously occupied in school, business and home that frequent Diocesan meetings were found to be difficult to arrange, but we have tried either to have a meeting or to send out some printed matter each month, suggestions for practical work in the parish branch and for individuals, notices and information in regard to mission study, etc. Next year we hope to hold several general meetings, and especially to arrange for some gatherings in the evening, so that our members who are occupied in the day time may have the chance to meet with other members outside their parish organizations.

Last spring members of the Young Woman's Auxiliary took mite boxes to fill during the summer for the scholarships voted on at the last meeting, and with the money thus collected, together with pledges from branches and from individuals and contributions from the Woman's Auxiliary and from other sources, we have met out pledge to support two scholarships of \$60.00 each in our Indian Schools in South Dakota. This sum counts in the Diocesan Apportionment. This is not a large contribution, but it represents the first effort of the Young Woman's Auxiliary to bear a share of the Church's responsibility for Missions.

As we pledged our money to these Indian Schools, we decided to study about our church's work among these people. We feel ourselves very fortunate to have had Mrs. Greeley as our leader in the class held in the Church Club Rooms during Lent, both for girls who would report back to their parish branches and for those who came for instruction as individuals. The enrollment of the class was 20 from nine or ten parishes, a very promising beginning.

The Yound Woman's Auxiliary sent at Christmas a Unity Box to Columbia, Tennessee, valued at \$15.00, Parish branches have also sent 8 missionary boxes and 5 Diocesan boxes, valued at more than \$130.00, and have made money gifts amounting to \$228.00, besides the two scholarships.

The roll of the Department shows 11 parish branches and a list of individual members difficult to tabulate accurately. We have hopeful indications of several new branches next fall, both graduates from the Junior Department and independent groups of girls who desire to join in this organized missionary movement among young women. Two Girls Friendly Society chapters have invited us to tell them about our educational work, and through this phase of our work we hope to co-operate closely with that other society for young women.

And we hope that, as our organization grows in definiteness, in efficiency and in spiritual vitality, we shall have a constantly increasing group of young women who will be ready and eager to step up from our department into the Woman's Auxiliary, to whom we look always for encouragement and example, even as we hope always to offer very loyal service.

**REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY OF THE
JUNIOR AUXILIARY.**

During the month of January, 1916, the Junior Leaders met three times to consider ways and means of interesting Juniors in the "Cause of Missions." Among the subjects discussed were text books, mission plays and the making of maps, charts and models. At one meeting Mrs. Easton showed the charts and maps made by the Juniors of the Church of the Epiphany and explained the uses to which they were put in the parish work.

In response to letters, twenty-six branches reported mission study. Six branches made Missionary scrap books for the medal contest. This year the gold medal was awarded to the Juniors of the Church of the Epiphany, whose book dealt with the Missionary Districts of the United States. The silver medal was awarded to the Junior Branch at the Church of the Transfiguration, whose books dealt with Alaska. Silver crosses were awarded to the Juniors of St. Mark's and St. Luke's, Evanston, the Holy Communion, Maywood, and St. Christopher's, Oak Park, for the excellent work done by them on Missionary scrap books.

The leaders, with few exceptions, report increased interest in Missions, directly traceable to the year's study.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each Parish or Mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the Diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

Amendment to By-Law VI. The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches.

VII. The Treasurer shall furnish bond for such amount as shall be determined by the Executive Committee, such bond to be paid for from the funds of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 29 East Madison Street.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary, are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
