From the Bishop, April 21, 1898.

Prayer to be used only at the organization of new branches. Set forth by the Bishop, November 14, 1901:

Almighty and Most Merciful Saviour, we hear and would obey Thy call to service, for the world is weary with many masters, and knoweth not Thy yoke which is easy and Thy burden which is light. Help us in this day of our opportunity, so soon to end, that we may serve Thee in all godly quietness and confidence, and may our hearts and hands be wholly given up to Thee who hast befriended us even unto death. To Thee and to every good work in Thy Church we humbly consecrate ourselves anew, desiring nothing so much as that all men may Love Thee, who, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, are One God, world without end. Amen.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

STATE OF ILLINOIS, } ss.
COUNTY OF COOK.

To James A. Rose, Secretary of State:

We, the undersigned, Marie M. Hopkins, Emily Pardee Street and Frances E. MacDermid, citizens of the United States, propose to form a corporation under the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act Concerning Corporations," approved April 18, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof, and that for the purpose of such organization, we hereby state as follows:

I. The name of such corporation is

"The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II. The object of this corporation shall be: (a) To interest all of the congregations in the Diocese of Chicago in the different branches of missionary work, as conducted by the General and Diocesan Boards, and to the purpose of aiding said societies in carrying on the said missionary work in connection with the said Diocese and the said General Church. (b) An Auxiliary to the General Board of Missions and to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Chicago of the Church known in law as "The Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States," and its management is to be in accordance with the constitution and canons of said Diocese of Chicago and of said Protestant Episcopal Church and not for pecuniary profit.

The corporations shall have power to receive donations, subscriptions, legacies and bequests to be used for the carrying on of the said missionary work and of the said Church in the said Diocese of Chicago and of the missionary work under the jurisdiction of the General Board of Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States.

III. The Board of Managers shall have power to organize branches or recognize existing branches in every parish or mission in said Diocese under the rules as they may adopt from time to time. Any branch so organized, upon payment of the Annual Membership Fee, to be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws, shall be entitled to representation at the meetings of this Board, each Parish or Mission voting as a unit when demanded by two Parishes or Missions.

IV. (1) The officers of the Society shall be a Patron, a President, not less than five (5) Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer. (2) The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Patron ex-officio.

V. The management of The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions shall be vested in an Executive Board of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) Directors, of whom the Patron, the President, the Vice-President, the two Secretaries and the Treasurer shall be part.

VI. (1) The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than nine (9) nor more than eighteen (18) members, of whom the Bishop of said Diocese of Chicago shall, ex-officio, be one. All of the elective Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of said corporation, which shall be held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention, except when the day falls on a legal holiday, when the Executive Committee of the Board shall appoint another day for the election of officers. The number of said Directors may, with the approval of the Bishop from time to time, be varied, and the Directors shall be elected in accordance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the By-Laws of said corporation, to be hereafter adopted. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except during the months of July and August.

(2) The Executive Committee shall have power, as necessity may arise, to appoint annually, with the approval of the Bishop, other officers, who shall not, however, be members of the Executive Committee.

(3) The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association and of the officers, to arrange for the organization of branches, to visit the same and to have the general charge of the work under the direction of the Bishop.

(4) The duty of the Vice-Presidents shall be to choose one of their number to preside in the absence of the President, to co-operate with her in the general supervision of the work of the Association and to take charge of the departments of work to which they may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

(5) The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the necessary correspondence required by the Auxiliary, and to prepare such reports as are needed. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to send out notices of all meetings, to keep a record of the same, and to assist the Corresponding Secretary in the preparation of reports.

(6) The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive all special and general funds; to disburse the former as the donors indicate, and the latter under the direction of the Executive Committee, and to render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

(7) There shall be a committee of two appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts each year.

VII. The following persons are hereby selected as the directors to control and manage said corporation for the first year of its corporate existence:

Emma J. Hoyne, Treasurer.

The said Directors shall hold office until the next annual meeting of said corporation and shall then be elected at the said annual meeting herein provided.

VIII. The Bishop of the Diocese of Chicago shall ex-officio be the Patron of the said corporation, and all of the acts of the Executive Committee and Society shall be subject to his approval.

IX. These Articles of Incorporation may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, subject to the approval of the Bishop, and by complying with the statutes of the State of Illinois.

X. The location is in the Diocese of Chicago, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, and postoffice address of its business office is at No. 510 Masonic Temple, State Street, Chicago, Illinois.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

An eventful year in our Auxiliary life has just drawn to a close, and in reviewing it we shall see much to be thankful for, some things left undone, and many new obligations laid upon us.

In beginning my report, I must speak of the retirement early in the year of Miss Julia C. Emery from the position of General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary—a position which she had filled with whole hearted devotion for more than forty years. Those of us who are veterans in the ranks will always cherish an affectionate and grateful remembrance of Miss Emery's untiring devotion to the cause she served so long and so faithfully, and we are glad to know she will continue to direct some part of the work at Church Missions House.

It was in natural and happy succession that Miss Grace Lindley, for some years Associate Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, should be appointed by the President of the Board of Missions to take the position left vacant by Miss Emery's resignation, and we have felt it a joy to assure Miss Lindley of the loyal support of the members of our Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

In October occurred the great Triennial Meeting, held in St. Louis; and not only to your five delegates and their alternates, but to the many other women from Chicago who attended this meeting, was it a memorable experience. The glorious Presentation Service of the United Offering, the great Missionary sermons, the inspiring contact with workers fresh from the field, the daily meetings for prayer study,—all combined to create an indelible impression. During the days immediately following the Triennial, echo meetings were held in various parts of the city and suburbs. At several of these we had the opportunity—so needed, to enlarge our vision—of hearing a message from men and women who are giving their lives to work in the Mission field.

Through Bishop Roots and Deaconess Stewart he heard of some of the accomplishments in China. Miss Barton-Myers spoke to us of St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, to which a special Auxiliary pledge has been made. Bishop Page opened to us the vision of work in his distant jurisdiction. Mrs. Wetmore claimed our interest for the Southern Mountaineers, and Mrs. Biller for the great Indian work in South Dakota. To all these speakers we owe a debt of gratitude for the inspiration they so richly gave us.

In November, an Institute was held in the Church Club Rooms, consisting of six sessions—four of which concerned phases of Auxiliary work; the other two being talks on public speaking—

attended by about forty women, who took an interested part in the discussions which occupied the second hour of each session.

A matter of deep concern to all members of the Chicago Branch this year has been the retirement from active service of Miss Langdon, our "own Missionary" at Tanana, Alaska, whose uncertain health obliged her to resign her post and seek rest in a milder climate. We must hope and earnestly pray for Miss Langdon's restoration to health and active service; and in the meantime, as there is no woman worker stationed at Tanana, our support has been transferred to Miss Eleanor Ridgway, who has taken charge of the isolated Mission of St. John's in the Wilderness, Allakaket, ten miles north of the Arctic Circle. For Miss Ridgway in her lonely outpost, ministering to a tribe of Esquimaux and the most northerly tribe of Indians, I bespeak your continued interest and your prayers.

An Officers' Conference was held on the second Friday in February, and was devoted to discussion of Auxiliary methods, administrative and educational, and those relating to Junior and United Offering work along lines suggested by the speakers on these topics at the Institute in November.

A number of visits to Parish Branches, which are always the happiest part of the year's work, were made during the winter, some of them to new or distant Branches, giving one a pleasant sense of enlarging our Auxiliary family and strengthening our hold upon one another.

In January a number of our members attended the Interdenominational Day of Prayer held at the Woman's Building of Moody Institute, and our organization was honored by having its President invited to lead the Quiet Hour which closed the morning session.

In February I attended two meetings in New York of the Conference Committee appointed at the Triennial to confer with the Committee of the Board of Missions on the subject of the United Offering and the general relation of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. The action of that Committee has already been placed before you. More recently, I have taken part in a meeting of the Territorial Committee of the Missionary Educational Movement, especially concerned in promoting the Lake Geneva Conference.

To sum up our year's work, I am sure we have reason to feel encouraged and to believe we are still marching forward. Good progress has been made in the Junior work, among young women, and the Little Helpers. Two newly formed missions—that of the Messiah at Avalon Park, and the Holy Apostles at Albany Park, have set a fine example by immediately proceeding to organize a

Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, that they might begin without delay to carry out the great commission of our Lord. These youngest members of our family are heartily welcome, and we rejoice to number them among us.

Our share in the United Offering presented in St. Louis was \$8,554.00; that is to say, about \$800.00 more than the previous Triennial, which had exceeded the offering of 1910 by \$2,500.00, or 50%. I am sure you will agree with me that we ought not to be satisfied with merely marking time in this, our greatest gift, which ought steadily to increase with our increasing members, our enlarging vision, and with our widening knowledge of the crying need in the field. Our apportionment to the Board of Missions has been paid, and something more, and we must never cease to be thankful for the awakened conscience which has come to be ours in regard to this responsibility. On the other hand, the pledge which we make toward the Deaconesses and Sisters at the Mission House has not been entirely met, and we can hardly feel content with the year's record while this near and dear obligation is only partially fulfilled.

The remarkable address on "Mission Study," presented by Dr. Jefferys at the January meeting, undoubtedly served as a strong stimulus to our interest in this subject, and there has been a definite increase in the number of women who have taken up this work in classes, largely taught by leaders trained by our educational committee. If we may believe that the object of these classes was, as has been said of one in another Diocese, "to bring their members into living union with Christ that they may become an active part of God's mission in the world," this record may well be a cause for rejoicing.

I have left until the end the subject which is uppermost in our minds today. During the past six weeks our Country has entered into a great War,—a war greater and more terrible than has ever been waged on earth before. The shadow of it must touch every man, woman and child, and its touch should fill our hearts with love and loyalty and the spirit of service. New calls, new interests, new duties, will claim us, and we must heed them. But let us, like the women of Canada, first maintain our chosen work, the support of the soldiers of the Cross on the far-flung battle-line of the Mission Field; hold up their hands as they labor on; and then give to the soldiers of the Flag, in overflowing measure, the labor of our leisure, the fruits of our self-denial, the toil of our times of ease. So shall we, too, share in the glorious task of serving with untiring devotion our God and our Country.

ANNUAL MEETING, 1917.

The Thirty-third Annual Meeting of the Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held May 31st, 1917, in St. Paul's Church, Kenwood.

The morning service began at ten o'clock with a celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishop Anderson, Celebrant, assisted by the Rector of St. Paul's, the Rev. Geo. H. Thomas, the Rector Emeritus, the Rev. Charles Bixby, the Rev. Herbert W. Patton, D. D., and the Rev. T. R. Pickells. The sermon of the morning was preached by Dr. Patton and was an earnest appeal for the American Institute for Negroes. The offering at the morning service, amounting to \$108, was given to Dr. Patton for the Institute.

After a delicious luncheon served by the members of St. Paul's Branch of the Auxiliary the afternoon session began at 1:45 with our president, Mrs. Butler, in the chair. The roll call showed an attendance of 475 members representing 62 branches. The secretary read the report of the last meeting and it was accepted on motion. The report of the treasurer and corresponding secretary having been printed and placed on each pew, Mrs. Clinch added a few words giving us a resume of the work for the year. The reports were accepted. Miss Janet Childs, director of the Junior Department, read the report for the year, and Mrs. Henry E. Mason read that of the Little Helpers. It was moved and seconded that both reports be accepted. Because of the absence of Miss Houghteling the report of the Young Woman's Auxiliary was read by Rev. Mr. Wilson, also that of the Church Periodical Club, Aged and Infirm Clergy and Comfort Club. The four reports were accepted on motion. The Educational Secretary, Miss Griswold, read her report explaining that the Library Committee had been merged into the Educational Committee and spoke of the difficulty to obtain information on the educational work going on in the Diocese. The report of the monthly meeting was read by Mrs. Kirkland and the report of our co-operation with the Chicago Red Cross by Mrs. Edward Bailey. Mrs. Bailey asked for a discussion after the meeting to decide just what our part is to be in this work.

Business was suspended for a moment while Dr. Patten called our attention to the pamphlets and subscription cards that had just arrived about the Church Institute for Negroes, to be distributed at the door.

The Conference Committee, which consists of one woman from each province, held two joint meetings, and as a result sent to each parish branch, two weeks ago, a copy of a letter which was read by Mr. Wilson. It was resolved that we commend this resolution

to the careful study and consideration of the members of the Auxiliary and that formal action concerning it be deferred until the next annual meeting.

Mrs. Butler spoke of the three special pledges made by her at the Triennial and she asked that the members of the different branches make extra pledges in their behalf. As a result St. Agnes, Kyoto, received \$313.00, St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio, \$126.00 and Technical High School, Sagada, \$200.00.

It was moved and seconded that we change the fiscal year of the Auxiliary from April 30th to December 31st. We are following the decision of the Diocesan Convention in so doing.

In the president's message Mrs. Butler paid a gracious tribute to the work of Miss Emery and to the splendid future of the Auxiliary under Miss Lindley. In her resume of the work of the year she made reference to the Triennial, the Institute, held in the Church Club rooms, our new missionary to Alaska, Miss Eleanor Ridgway, the establishment of two new missions, the Holy Apostles and the Church of the Messiah, and the great work before us in the future in the upholding of our missionaries in the field in the face of the tremendous demands placed upon us on all sides.

Bishop Anderson presented the report of the Nominating Committee. The following officers were elected:

Bishop Anderson made a stirring address of the part to be played by us in the World Struggle, reminding us that England, whose taxes have almost reached confiscation, has not let her missionaries suffer in one single instance.

He spoke of the American people as the most generous and at the same time extravagant people in the world, and made a strong plea for prohibition and for meatless days. War has not touched us as yet, but it is the women who will suffer. War is not Hell; it is Purgatory. It is for the people, the rich, and not the poor, pay its debts and there should be no hatred in our hearts, for this is a conflict between ideals, and the American nation must discover her own soul and discover the purpose of God in its outcome.

A vote of thanks was given to the women of St. Paul's Auxiliary for their hospitality, and the annual Day of Prayer at the Cathedral on St. Michaels and All Angels Day, September 29th, was announced.

The meeting adjourned on motion.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY.

1916-1917.

At the risk of departing from the rule so well illustrated by St. Paul of always beginning by saying something pleasant, it seems necessary to preface the report of the Educational Secretary by stating that her greatest difficulty is the getting information as to Mission Study from the parish branches of the Auxiliary. It is perhaps natural that those branches which have nothing to report should shrink from saying so; but when no statistics are received from places where the Educational Secretary knows there has been some sort of work done, it is trying to her soul.

According to the latest returns, there have been nineteen Mission Study Classes in the diocese this past year. Five of these were in one parish and two in another. Ten parishes report Reading Circles, and four Mission Study Meetings. The new course on Latin America prepared for us by the Board of Missions in the text book "The New World" was followed in a majority of instances.

The Library Committee has been merged this year in the Educational Committee of three members. Most of those who are interested in reading of Missions naturally wish for the recent books now published in such numbers, so the standard works on our library shelves are seldom called for.

It was a disappointment that the registration for Leaders' Classes was not large enough to utilize more than one member of the Committee in that way.

The Educational Secretary has made five visits to parish branches during the year, going as far afield as Kankakee and Freeport. Another member of the Committee has made three visits. It may be interesting to know that three hundred copies of the Missionary Calendar for 1917 have been sold.

Prospects seem good for our representation at the Lake Geneva, and other summer conferences, this year. The same parish which had five classes studying "The New World" expects to have five delegates at Lake Geneva.

REPORT OF MONTHLY MEETINGS.

May 1, 1917.

The Chicago Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary began the year's work on Sept. 29th, with the Day of Prayer conducted by the Right Rev. John P. Tyler, Bishop of North Dakota. One hundred and eighty women were present and the offering of \$1,100 was added to our United Offering.

Eight meetings have been held in the Church Club Rooms with an attendance of 1,285. This is an average of 160 from 45 branches. The offerings have been \$391.66. The new rooms of the Church Club, with better lighting and seating facilities, have added greatly to the comfort and convenience of our meetings, and the extension of the time until 12:30 will enable us to get through the business and program without crowding.

The Officers' Conference, held in February, with an attendance of 126 delegates and eight of the Clergy, was a most enthusiastic meeting, with free and general discussion on topics of interest to everyone.

The Executive Board has held 10 meetings.

REPORT OF ST. AGNES SCHOOL, KYOTO.

As the Representative of Province V on the St. Agnes' Committee I have sent to the Woman's Auxiliary in each of the 12 dioceses in the Province a statement of the St. Agnes' Fund, both in its general aspect, and in regard to its status in this Province. With my financial report I have sent a letter urging the active co-operation of the Woman's Auxiliary in a campaign to increase the share that our Province will have in the whole Fund, and putting before them the real needs of the School, which to be fully met, calls for \$70,000 rather than the \$50,000 which the Woman's Auxiliary has pledged itself to provide. Therefore we must feel more deeply than ever our obligation to this Auxiliary enterprise. I suggested in my letter the following means of developing the full power of the Auxiliary in this campaign:

1. By making this appeal at the Annual Meeting, explaining the status of the Fund and of the Diocese in relation to the Fund, and asking that the School be added to the budget for next year.

2. By emphasizing this Fund as a possible special effort for the summer, both for Auxiliary branches and for individuals.

3. By asking that a committee be appointed to take up this campaign both in the Auxiliary and among other Church people, to make this appeal vital and important, by letter, meetings in the interest of the School, and by public notice and appeal in parish, diocesan and local papers.

I most earnestly urge that the Woman's Auxiliary in our Diocese consider with great seriousness this pledge, made as a solemn undertaking of the whole Auxiliary at its last Convention, and by its interest and financial support, take a glorious share in insuring the future of St. Agnes School, Kyoto.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE JUNIOR DEPARTMENT OF THE DIOCESE OF CHICAGO.

The Junior Department of the Diocese of Chicago completed its year's work at the Annual Meeting held on Saturday, May 19th, at St. Mark's Church, Evanston. After a morning service the reports of the treasurer, Box Secretary, and the Educational Director were given, and the delegates adjourned to the Parish House for luncheon. The afternoon session consisted of a Christmas Tree and generous shower of gifts, for the mission at Wrangell, Alaska. Each branch sent one useful and one joyful gift, and these were presented at the tree by the Juniors themselves. After singing a Christmas hymn, all took part in a service of presentation. This was followed by a delightful lecture on Alaska by Miss Van Schaick, illustrated by lantern slides, showing the work of our Church in the Far North. There was a total attendance of 180 delegates and visitors, from twenty-nine parishes. Our treasurer, Mrs. Spence, reports that we have paid our apportionment to general missions of \$325 and \$101 on our Alaska scholarship, and \$101 on the Honolulu scholarship. For our box work, Mrs. Easton has reported a considerable increase in the amount of work done. Fifty-three branches in fifty-one parishes shared in the work; 4,114 gifts were sent; 45 boxes inside the diocese and 78 outside; a total of 123 boxes valued at \$2,046.97. Money not sent through the Treasurer \$133.35, so that the Corresponding Secretary concludes her report with a total of \$2,182.30. Miss Van Schaick, our Educational Director, reports that twenty-two branches notified her, that some form of missionary study has been undertaken in their parish branch this year. There were six splendid scrap-books in the contest, and a series of three conferences for leaders, on the Junior text book, was held in the church club rooms during February. In the fall uniting with the Young Woman's Auxiliary the Juniors held three sectional meetings, one on each side of the city. Deaconess Clare, Deaconess Elizabeth and Deaconess Fuller gave the programmes at these meetings, and the Juniors and young women bought gifts of jellies, pickles, crackers and other dainties, for distribution in the institutions visited by the deaconesses. The attendance at the North Side meeting at St. Augustine's Church, Wilmette, was sixty-three, at the West Side meeting at St. Barnabas Church thirty-five, and at the South Side meeting at the Church of the Transfiguration sixty-nine. The Executive Board has held nine meetings, and there have been six regular leaders' meetings with a total attendance of eighty-four. The president can report attendance at forty-four meetings. She has visited seven branches and has the names of seven to add to our list: Kenilworth, Hinsdale, Holy Cross, a boys'

branch at the Church of the Epiphany, St. James', Providence Day Nursery and one being organized at St. Edmund's Church.

Two of our best branches—St. Paul's Kenwood and St. Bartholomew's—have graduated into our big sister organization, The Young Woman's Auxiliary. While we let them go with regret, we congratulate the Young Woman's Auxiliary, and hope that as the years go on, every Junior group will follow them in an unbroken line, from Juniors through The Young Woman's Auxiliary into the Woman's Auxiliary.

The new Junior plan is in operation in three branches with some of its ideas adopted in a fourth, but has not yet received a sufficient test, so that much that is definite can be said concerning its success or failure.

In conclusion we may summarize concerning the three departments of material missionary work. Our financial campaign shows a slight decrease over last year's work, the educational side shows results, practically parallel, and the box work has increased considerably. Of the spiritual side of missionary work—prayer—it is hard to say or know. But this is certain: if our work is valuable now, how much more so would it be if with every mite box or pledge, every gift or box, and every inspiring missionary story, could go our earnest prayers for those on the field, those whom they toil to win, and those at home who are trying to do their lesser part in this, the greatest of all campaigns.

**REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT OF THE JUNIOR
AUXILIARY.**

In past years the study of Missions in the Junior Auxiliary has proved a problem to many Leaders. With this fact in mind the Junior Department at the beginning of the work in the fall of 1916 urged all Leaders to see that their Juniors received Missionary Instruction in the Sunday School. In twenty-two branches this plan was followed, however, thirty-one of the Leaders desired to continue study at the week-day meeting of their branches. With the younger children results of study can only be drawn from the gifts of money and boxes. These are in every instance larger than last year. The Missionary Scrap Books turned in for the contest were well made and showed a grasp of the subject studied. The gold medal went this year to St. Bartholomew's and the silver medal to The Epiphany. Both books were well made and showed hard work on the part of these Juniors.

Silver crosses were presented to the following branches for good work done in Mission Study: Elmhurst, Maywood; St. Christopher's, Oak Park, and the Atonement, Chicago.

The Leaders, with few exceptions, report increased interest in Missions, directly traceable to the year's study.

YOUNG WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT.

The Young Woman's Auxiliary brought its second active year to a close at its Annual Meeting at St. Paul's Church by the Lake, on Friday, May 11th. As we are still in a formative state, each new step is an experiment, and this latest plan for our Annual Meeting, undertaken with some question as to its advisability, proved itself an immediate success. In order to meet the convenience of our business and school girls, we this year planned for an evening meeting, and began with a Vesper-service at 5:30, followed by a social hour and a delightful supper. Then followed the business meeting and a talk by Mrs. Butler, and at 9 o'clock the meeting adjourned, each of the 50 members present taking away with her a mite-box to be filled during the summer for St. Agnes' School, Kyoto. This gathering for worship, social intercourse and business brought the Young Woman's Auxiliary together in a closer bond of fellowship than we have ever felt before, and pointed out to us a clearer and more definite path on which to set our feet next year.

The Young Woman's Auxiliary has held five central meetings in the Church Club Rooms during this year, at which various questions of organizations and missionary activity have been discussed. And in November, at the time of the Woman's Auxiliary Institute, an evening meeting was arranged in St. Peter's Parish House, especially for those members who are occupied in the day-time; at this meeting we had the pleasure of entertaining Miss Alice Lindley, President of the Junior Auxiliary in the Diocese of New York, who brought us an inspiring message to broaden our vision and increase our sense of responsibility.

Our roll makes a list of fifteen organized branches, with the sixteenth formed within the last week. The Treasurer's report shows that the Young Woman's Auxiliary has paid its pledge of \$120, counting on the Diocesan Apportionment, to support two scholarships of \$60 each in our two Indian Schools in South Dakota, and has given through the Treasurer \$15.50 to other objects. We have sent five Christmas boxes, containing 300 gifts, valued at \$78, to Mission stations assigned to us from the Church Missions House, and have sent sixteen boxes, valued at \$167, and other moneys amounting to \$209.50, direct to their objects.

Last summer the Executive Committee raised a fund wherewith three delegates were sent to the Lake Geneva Conference, and this year by taking our part in the definite campaign that is to be carried on throughout the Diocese to increase the interest in and attendance at the Conference, we hope to have a much larger representation.

On the six Saturdays before Ash Wednesday Miss Van Schaick led a Mission Study Class in the Church Club Rooms, under the auspices of the Young Woman's Auxiliary, using as a text-book the "Why and How of Foreign Missions," and emphasizing *Method*, so that the fifteen members enrolled might use the material that they gathered there in their own parish groups. The seed of missionary education is slowly developing in our Department, but this function of our Auxiliary life seems to be the one which calls for the most patient devotion and the most thoughtful encouragement through many years before it reaches its full strength. The group which our Department is intended to reach and serve is one which presents some aspects very different to those in our other Departments—these young girls and women are all very *busy* with very definite matters—school or business, as a rule, or are just leaving behind the affairs of childhood, and are turning eagerly

to the activities of womanhood: and the Auxiliary appeal has to be particularly vital in order to find a response in their crowded days. And in order to give them what they ask—something *big* to *do*—we must be able to convince them of the importance of *knowing* about the Great Cause, so that their eager, alert minds may see the full significance of Missions, and wish to do their share. When we shall have been able to create a real passion for missionary information in our Auxiliary, we shall feel perfect confidence in our ability to achieve great results.

The Young Woman's Auxiliary this Spring followed the example of the Juniors and sent out a questionnaire, which brought back to us much helpful and illuminating information. Every branch that answered told of co-operation with and sympathy from the Woman's Auxiliary, and almost all recommended a closer alliance with that organization. Therefore I shall close my report with a most sincere assurance of our desire to serve the Woman's Auxiliary, and an expression of our real gratitude for their encouragement and helpfulness.

BY-LAWS.

I. The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot, each Parish or Mission having one vote.

II. When a vacancy shall occur in the Executive Committee by death or resignation, or removal of residence from the Diocese, the members of said Committee shall have power, with the advice and consent of the Bishop previously obtained, to appoint an officer to fill the vacancy. The officer so appointed to serve until the next annual meeting.

III. Special meetings shall be called by the president, at such time and place as he may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

IV. It shall be the duty of every parochial branch to contribute annually a sum of money, the amount thereof to be determined by itself, to the Executive Committee of this Diocesan Branch, to be appropriated by them according to their discretion in the missionary work of the Church, which money shall constitute the General Fund of the Chicago Branch, and shall be so designated by the contributors.

V. The regular order of business at the annual meeting shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.
2. Calling of roll by branches.
3. Reading of minutes of last meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committees.
5. Election of officers.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

VI. These by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a majority vote of the branches present.

Amendment to By-Law VI. The Annual Day of Prayer for Missions; the Annual Meeting; the Executive Committee and Monthly Meetings, heretofore held on fixed dates, will be subject to change, and for a sufficient reason may be held on dates to be determined by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, due notice of such change being given to all parochial branches.

VII. The Treasurer shall furnish bond for such amount as shall be determined by the Executive Committee, such bond to be paid for from the funds of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The Annual Meeting is held on the day after the close of the Diocesan Convention.

A meeting of the Diocesan officers is held on the first Thursday of each month, at the Church Club Rooms, 29 East Madison Street.

Different branches are asked to co-operate with the president in taking charge of the noon-day meetings. Interesting papers are read and missionaries speak on the work in their jurisdiction.

It is hoped that each branch will send at least two representatives to these monthly meetings.

REQUESTS TO PARISH SECRETARIES.

Please write to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for letters from missionaries. Return the same within one week, unless accepted. If a letter is accepted, inform the corresponding secretary at once.

Please write at once to the missionary, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom. As soon as the box is sent, please notify the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, giving its estimated money value.

Please send the names and addresses of all parish officers to the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary, and notify her at once of any change of officers.

Please see that all notices of meetings sent out by the Diocesan Recording Secretary are read by your Rector at the Church Services.
